

#### CONDITIONS OF SALE

- 1. On all lots sold a commission of 10% on the hammer price is payable by the buyer.
- 2. The terms of sale are strictly cash on delivery to the highest bidder unless special arrangements have been made prior to the sale. The fact that an item is placed on extension (submitted to an expertising committee for certification) does not relieve the successful bidder from this condition of sale.
- 3. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalogue unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to group two or more lots; to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale, or to act on behalf of the seller. Cherrystone will bid on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of bidding instructions. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and in the event of any dispute his decision shall be final.
- 4. All lots are offered subject to a reserve price. The auctioneer may implement such reserve price by bidding on behalf of the seller. It may also be inferred that all sellers have been given advances against the sale of their material and therefore we have a financial interest in such lots over and above the sellers commission they are charged.
- 5. Any lot, the description of which is incorrect, is returnable, but only within 14 days of receipt. All disputed lots must be returned intact as received. The following lots may not be returned for any reason whatsoever: Lots containing ten or more stamps; Lots from buyers who have had the opportunity to examine them before the sale; Lots described as having defects or faults may not be returned because of any faults. No illustrated lots may be returned because of centering, margins or other factors shown in the illustrations.
- 6. Successful bidders, unless they are known to us or supply acceptable references are expected to make payment in full before the lots are delivered. Mail bidders will be notified of the amounts of their purchases. All mail bidders who have established credit with us must make payment within three days after receipt. We reserve the right in our sole and absolute discretion to demand cash payment at the time a lot is knocked down to any bidder who has not previously established credit with us or whose account is in arrears. In the event any buyer refuses to pay cash for any lot at the time it is knocked down to him, the auctioneer reserves the right to reoffer the lot immediately for sale to the highest bidder. Sales tax will be added to purchases where applicable.
- 7. If the purchase price has not been paid within the time limit, nor lots taken up within seven days from date of sale they may be resold and any loss arising from such sale will be charged to the defaulter. Any account more than thirty days in arrears is subject to a late payment charge of 2% per month so long as the account remains in arrears. If the auctioneer, in his discretion, should institute any action to secure payment of a delinquent account the defaulting purchaser shall pay all expenses incurred by the auctioneer and such charges will be added to the amount owed.
- 8. All lots are sold as genuine, but should any lot be proved otherwise by written opinion of any competent, responsible authority acceptable to us, immediate refund of the full purchase price will be made, provided that such claim is made in writing within 25 days from date of sale. If claim is not made within this period, no lots are returnable for any reason at any time. So long as we are notified within the 25 day period that an opinion is being sought and the material is submitted to an acceptable authority within that period the matter will remain open until such opinion is rendered. All "Extension" lots will be considered cleared and satisfactory to the buyer if we are not notified to the contrary within six months from date of sale. We will not be responsible for any charges incurred by the buyer for expertization fees and costs unless the opinion states the item is not genuine, in which case we will pay actual costs up to a maximum of \$50.00. In the event an item is proved "not as described" it is returnable for full refund, and the buyer will be paid interest (at the prevailing Treasury Bill Rate) for the time his funds have been on deposit with us during the extension period.
- 9. Until paid for in full, all lots remain the property of Cherrystone Stamp Center, Inc. on behalf of the seller.
- 10. Some consignors have been advanced monies against the sale of their properties.
- 11. All forwarding and handling charges will be added to the purchase price. The mode of shipment shall be at our option unless we are given specific instructions.
- 12. Lots may be sent for inspection to buyers known to us upon written application. All such lots must be returned to us by registered mail, adequately insured and within 24 hours after receipt. The applicant assumes all responsibility and will provide insurance against all risks from time of receipt until they are actually received back by us, and is to pay all expenses of postage and insurance. No lots can be sent for inspection within ten days from date of local viewing. Large lots and collections cannot be sent for inspection. Photocopies of lots are available at 50c per page.
- Agents are responsible for all purchases made on behalf of their clients unless other arrangements are made prior to the sale.
- 14. The placing of a bid shall constitute acceptance of the foregoing conditions of sale.

#### Robert Winton Dickgiesser

#### 1947-1997

Bob Dickgiesser was both the consummate collector, and ultimate philatelist. He energetically studied, researched, published and exhibited his philatelic collections. Collecting stamps and postal history of both Bermuda and the United States led him far beyond the four corners of his stamps and into the studies of the people, history, politics and cultures of these countries.

As a child, Bob collected bottle caps and matchbook covers, paying the same close attention to labeling and cataloguing them, as he would as an adult, especially with his world famous Bermuda King George V and King George VI Key Plate Issues, which were last shown at the **London '90** Philatelic Exhibition. While his primary interest was Bermuda, Bob also exhibited his U.S. material, including specialized 1901 Pan-American Exposition Issues.

As a student and researcher, Bob endeavored to spread his knowledge, by speaking and writing about his beloved Bermuda collections. He authored Bermuda: King George VI High Values (1980), and later, with Eric P. Yendall, co-authored King George VI: Large Key Type Stamps of Bermuda – Leeward Islands – Nyasaland (1985). He acted as the editor of Charles E. Cwiakala's book, Bermuda by Air: A Handbook and Catalogue of Bermuda Aerophilately (1996).

In addition, Bob was the original editor of *Bermuda High*, the specialized journal for the King George VI Key Plate Issues of Bermuda. He was a founding member of the Bermuda Collectors Society (USA), and a long-term member of many other philatelic groups, including the American Philatelic Society and the British Caribbean Philatelic Study Group (USA).


In addition to his classical studies of Postmaster Provisionals, Queen Victoria-era definitive issues and George V-VI Key Plates, Bob had an inquisitive and in-depth interest for the modern issues of Bermuda including the Queen Elizabeth definitives, Bermuda Building Issues and their 1970 decimal surcharges. As a fun side of his stamp hobby, and during their many visits to Bermuda, he and his wife Nancy, photographed the original items depicted on the Flower and Building sets, duplicating their exact postures.

Although most of you knew Bob as a philatelist, his wife, children and friends, knew the affectionate, nurturing, intellectual, and sometimes devilish, but endearing sides of him. While spending most his adult life managing a family owned, engineering based manufacturing business, he was also an avid community volunteer, a dedicated and involved father, a good friend and a loving husband.

Bob spend hundreds of hours volunteering for his community's needs, and was instrumental in raising thousands of dollars for local academic scholarships through his membership activities in the Rotary International organizations. He coached youth sports, participated as a Leader in both the Boy Scouts of America and YWCA programs for girls, and was an active participant for his Church's various maintenance and charitable requirements.

Bob was a vibrant, passionate, and caring person, who is missed by all who knew him.

#### Early Bermuda

#### Representative Preadhesive Postal Markings and Postmaster Issues

From the earliest recorded usage of a handstamp in Bermuda in 1820 until the advent of adhesive stamps in 1865, mail was often handstamped. This period saw numerous varieties of handstamps although very few examples have survived the passage of time.


During this period, a few Bermuda postmasters produced and sold prestamped gummed pieces of paper to pay for the carriage of mail. Erroneously called "Postmaster Provisionals", they were not issued provisionally. These Bermuda Postmasters, as they are now called, were issued to allow senders to prepay and post letters after hours at the same time ensuring the postmaster he would be remunerated for his services.

According to Robert Dickgiesser, this is the first time that all four known types of Bermuda Postmasters are offered at the same time. Apparently, even the Royal Collection is missing one type.

Classification of the various handstamp markings follows that used by Morris Ludington in his definitive work, "The Postal History and Stamps of Bermuda."

This collection contains representative examples of: A) Bermuda Postmasters, B) General Datestamps, C) Paid Datestamps, including Crowned Circles, D) Forwarding Agents and Forwarding Marks and E) Ship Letter Markings.

#### THE BERMUDA POSTMASTERS' STAMPS - 1843-1861

The Postmasters' stamps, also referred to as Postmasters' Provisionals of Bermuda are among the rarest and most valuable stamps in the world. Surrounded by considerable mystique, each of these small treasures has its own history and provenance. From 1818, postmasters were permitted to retain any postage paid at their respective office for inland mail. A slot was provided for mail to be posted with the necessary sum for postage, should it be required to do so after the post office was closed. The money and the number of letters did not always tally, and rather than penalize those who had been dishonest, some mail was effectively sent post free. It was to counter this fraud, that in 1848, William Bennet Perot, postmaster at Hamilton, introduced "his" stamps. They were essentially handstamps, produced from already existing date-stamp, with the name and date of the month removed, leaving only the year-date. They were sold to customers wishing to potentially post letters after the closing hour. In 1848 and 1849, the impressions were struck on pieces of paper in black. Shortly after, the ink pad was changed to red. Ten examples are known, four in black, six in red. White paper was used for these stamps; from 1854 onward, blue paper was employed by Perot's counterpart at St.George's, J.H. Thies and later Perot's successor at Hamilton, Robert Ward. The Dickgiesser collection contained four different Postmasters' stamps.




