CONDITIONS OF SALE

ALL BIDS SHALL BE TREATED AS OFFERS MADE UPON THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS OF SALE

- Christie, Manson and Woods Ltd. ("Christie's-Robson Lowe") act in all respects, save where otherwise appears, only as agents for the Seller of each lot and shall not be liable for any default of the Buyer or Seller.
- 2. The highest bidder acceptable to the Auctioneer shall be the Buyer but if, during or immediately after the sale of the lot, the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen or that there are other reasons for so doing, he may at his absolute discretion immediately put up the lot again for sale.
- 3. (a) The Auctioneer has the right at his absolute discretion to refuse any bid and to advance and regulate the bidding as he may decide.
- (b) Christic's-Robson Lowe have the right at their absolute discretion to withdraw or divide any lot or to combine any two or more lots.
