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Conditions of Business

Buyers and Sellers are requested to read carefully the Conditions set out below. Conditions A1 to 9 inclusive are of particular relevance to Buyers and Conditions B1 to 13 inclusive to Sellers.

A.

THE BUYER

1. Christie, Manson and Woods Ltd. ("Christie's-Robson Lowe") act in all respects, save where otherwise appears, only as agents for the Seller of each lot and shall not be liable for any default of the Buyer or Seller.
2. The highest bidder acceptable to the Auctioneer shall be the Buyer but if, during or immediately after the sale of the lot, the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen or that there are other reasons for so doing, he may at his absolute discretion immediately put up the lot again for sale.
3. (a) The Auctioneer has the right at his absolute discretion to refuse any bid and to advance and regulate the bidding as he may decide.
(b) Christie's-Robson Lowe have the right at their absolute discretion to withdraw or divide any lot or to combine any two or more lots.
(c) The Seller shall be entitled to place a reserve on any lot, and the Auctioneer or the Auctioneer's agent shall have the right to bid on behalf of the Seller for any lot on which a reserve has been placed.
4. (a) The purchase price payable by the Buyer shall be the aggregate of the final bid and a premium of 10% of the final bid (together with any V.A.T. chargeable on the final bid and such premium). "The final bid" shall mean the price at which a lot is knocked down to the Buyer.
(b) The Buyer shall forthwith supply his name and address and, if so required by Christie's-Robson Lowe, his bank or other suitable references. The Buyer may be required to pay forthwith the whole or any part of the purchase price and, if he fails to do so, the lot or lots may at the Auctioneer's absolute discretion be put up again and resold, any deficiency in the purchase price attending such resale to be made good by the defaulting Buyer, and any surplus (after retention by Christie's-Robson Lowe of the premium) to be the seller's.
(c) Where an agent purchases on behalf of an undisclosed principal, such agent shall be personally liable for payment of the purchase price to the Auctioneer and for safe delivery of the lot to the said principal.

(b) Each lot must be paid for in full before delivery and must be taken away at his expense by a United Kingdom Buyer within seven days of the date of the sale and by an overseas Buyer within a reasonable time, not exceeding 21 days.
(c) If the Buyer fails to pay for any lot in accordance with Condition 5 (b), Christie's-Robson Lowe shall be entitled, at their absolute discretion:—
 - (i) without notice to the Buyer to resell the lot or cause it to be resold by public or private sale. Any deficiency in the purchase price attending such resale after crediting any part payment and after deducting full costs incurred in connection with the lot to be made good by the defaulting Buyer and any surplus (after retention by Christie's-Robson Lowe of the premium) to be the Seller's.
 - (ii) to charge interest at 2% per month, or part of a month, on the amount due.
- (d) The property in a lot shall not pass to the Buyer until he has paid the purchase price and any other charges in full but the lot shall be at the Buyer's risk in all respects from the fall of the hammer. Notwithstanding that Christie's-Robson Lowe act only as agents for the Seller, they shall be entitled to retain the premium referred to in Condition 4 (a) hereof, irrespective of and in addition to such remuneration as they may receive from the Seller. Christie's-Robson Lowe shall be entitled to a lien on any lot sold until the purchase price is paid in full by the Buyer.
6. (a) (i) All descriptions of lots in the catalogue and statements as to the genuineness of lots are statements of the opinion of Christie's-Robson Lowe and are not nor are they to be taken to be statements or representations of fact. Estimates are the approximate prices expected by Christie's-Robson Lowe to be realised and are not definitive. Estimates are made long in advance of the sale and may be revised by Christie's-Robson Lowe.
(ii) Unless made by Christie's-Robson Lowe, comments and opinions concerning the description or genuineness of any lot which may be found in or on lots in the form of notes, lists, writing up or any other means of expression, do not constitute part of the lot description and are not to be taken as such.
(iii) Illustrations in the catalogue, advertisements or brochures of forthcoming sales are an integral part of the description and lots cannot be rejected pursuant to the following provisions of this Clause on account of any defect in their condition mentioned in the description or apparent from any such illustration.
(b) (i) Notwithstanding (a) (i) above, each lot (other than a mixed lot or lot containing undescribed stamps) is sold as genuine (unless otherwise described in the catalogue or by the Auctioneer) and correctly described; if the Buyer has paid the purchase price in full for any such lot and either has given notice pursuant to paragraph 4 of the Notice in the Catalogue ("Extensions") such notice having been accepted by Christie's-Robson Lowe or gives written notice to Christie's-Robson Lowe within seven days (or in the case of an overseas Buyer fourteen days) after the date of sale of his intention to question the genuineness or as the case may be the correctness of the description of such lot and, in respect of any such lot which has been taken away, returns the lot to Christie's-Robson Lowe within thirty days from the date of sale in the same condition as at the time of the sale and proves within ninety days of the date of the sale that such lot is not genuine or was not correctly described then, provided the lot has not subsequent to the sale been marked, immersed in water or treated by any other process whatsoever without the prior written consent of Christie's-Robson Lowe to such marking, immersion or treatment, the sale of the lot will be rescinded and any purchase price will be repaid to the Buyer.
(ii) The onus and cost of proving a lot to be not genuine or incorrectly described is on the Buyer; proof of the inability of an expert committee to express a definite opinion will discharge this onus.

- (iii) Christie's-Robson Lowe may at its discretion on receiving a request in writing from the Buyer extend for a reasonable period the time for the return of the lot under (i) above to enable it to be submitted to an expert or an expert committee.
- (c) Neither the Seller nor Christie's-Robson Lowe nor any person in their employ, make or have any authority to make any representation or warranty, nor are they responsible for any representation or warranty or for any statement in the catalogues, or advertisements or brochures of forthcoming sales or illustrations therein.
- 7. (a) Christie's-Robson Lowe shall not be liable for any omission or errors made by clients when sending their instructions to bid by post.
- (b) Lots purchased by mail bidders will be forwarded by the most practical method at the risk of the Buyer who shall bear all charges incurred.
- 8. (a) Christie's-Robson Lowe reserve the right to refuse admission to the Auction Room.
- (b) New clients must send references in advance or a cash deposit of the purchase price in full.
- (c) Failure on the part of a bidder or Buyer to comply with these conditions will entitle Christie's-Robson Lowe to forfeit any deposit held on behalf of such bidder or Buyer.
- (d) If payment is made in any currency other than sterling, 1% of the amount of the payment must be added to the account to allow for transfer costs. The amount credited to the Buyer's account will be the amount credited to Christie's-Robson Lowe by the transferring bank.
- 9. (a) Any notice given hereunder shall be in writing and if given by post to the address of the Buyer any such notice shall be deemed to have been delivered in the ordinary course of post.
- (b) The respective rights and obligations of the parties shall be governed and interpreted by English law and the Buyer hereby submits to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts.

B.

THE SELLER

Christie, Manson & Woods Limited's current scale of professional fees shall apply to determine the commission and all other charges payable by the Seller. At all sales in London and Bournemouth, there is a Buyer's premium of 10% of the final bid price (together with any V.A.T. chargeable thereon). At all sales in Zurich, a commission of 12½% of the final bid price is charged to the Buyer. V.A.T. at the standard rate is payable on the Seller's commission. Private foreign residents, except those within the E.E.C., are exempt from V.A.T. on the Seller's commission.

CONDITIONS

1. Christie, Manson & Woods Ltd. ("Christie's-Robson Lowe") act only as agent save as hereinafter appears of the person or persons (in these conditions called the Seller) sending material to or leaving material with Christie's-Robson Lowe for sale. The Seller warrants to Christie's-Robson Lowe that he is entitled to sell. Unless specifically stated otherwise all material is received by Christie's-Robson Lowe for sale by auction.

Christie's-Robson Lowe accept property for sale only on the basis that if they sell the same on conditions which provide that the Buyer shall pay a premium or commission Christie's-Robson Lowe will be entitled, in addition to commission from the Seller, to retain that part of the purchase price representing the premium/commission payable by the Buyer as set out, in the case of sales in London and Bournemouth, in paragraphs 4 (a) and 5 (d) of their Conditions of Sale as follows:

5. (d) The Property in a lot shall not pass to the Buyer until he has paid the purchase price and any other charges in full but the lots shall be at the Buyer's risk in all respects from the fall of the hammer. Notwithstanding that Christie's-Robson Lowe act only as agents for the Seller, they shall be entitled to retain the premium referred to in Condition 4 (a) hereof, irrespective of and in addition to such remuneration as they may receive from the Seller. Christie's-Robson Lowe shall be entitled to a lien on any lot sold until the purchase price is paid in full by the Buyer."

and in the case of sales in Zurich, in Condition 3 of their Conditions of Sales as follows:

- "3. The lot will be sold to the highest bidder for payment in Swiss Francs. A Commission of 12½% will be charged on the price at which each lot is sold".

Similarly, in the event of the failure by the Buyer to pay the purchase price, and on a resale there being a surplus over the purchase price after payment of all expenses, Christie's-Robson Lowe shall be entitled to retain the premium. 4. All albums, tins, boxes, cartons, cases, deed boxes, trunks and any other kind of container or mounting will be disposed of by Christie's-Robson Lowe (or sold as part of the lot if considered appropriate by Christie's-Robson Lowe) unless instructions for return are given within 21 days of the date hereof.
5. The Seller shall not bid for his material or employ any person to bid for him save that he may impose a reserve in which case either the Auctioneer or the Auctioneer's agent shall have the right to bid on behalf of the Seller. Unless the contrary is expressed in writing by the Seller and confirmed on the advice note accompanying the catalogue, each lot is received for unreserved sale and will be sold absolutely without reserve. The material may be withdrawn by the Seller before the sale but only on payment of a reasonable fee for services rendered by Christie's-Robson Lowe up to the time of withdrawal plus out-of-pocket expenses of Christie's-Robson Lowe, such fee to be not more than ten per cent of the reserve (together with any V.A.T. chargeable thereon) or if there is no reserve, ten per cent of the figure at which the material has been valued by Christie's-Robson Lowe (together with any V.A.T. chargeable thereon).
8. If, prior to or within seven days (or in the case of an overseas Buyer fourteen days) after the date of the sale Christie's-Robson Lowe have received from the Buyer of any lot (other than a mixed lot or lot containing undescribed stamps) notice in writing of his intention to question the genuineness or, as the case may be, the correctness of the description of such lot and, in respect of any such lot which has been taken away, the Buyer returns the lot to Christie's-Robson Lowe within thirty days from the date of sale in the same condition as at the time of the sale and proves within ninety days of the date of the sale, the onus and cost of proof being on the Buyer, that such lot is not genuine or was not correctly described then, provided the lot has not subsequent to the sale been marked, immersed in water or treated by any other process whatsoever without the prior written consent of Christie's-Robson Lowe to such marking, immersion or treatment, Christie's-Robson Lowe are authorised to rescind the sale of the same and to refund to the Buyer any purchase price paid. Proof of the inability of an expert committee to express a definite opinion will discharge the onus of proof. All material being held by Christie's-Robson Lowe for sale or otherwise and not otherwise covered by insurance whether on Christie's-Robson Lowe's premises or elsewhere will automatically be covered for insurance against normal insurable risks by Christie's-Robson Lowe. Material will be insured in the amount of the valuation by Christie's-Robson Lowe unless another figure has been previously agreed in writing with the Seller. Neither Christie's-Robson Lowe nor their employees or agents shall be liable for damage or loss howsoever caused beyond the insured sum. The sums for which material is covered for insurance under this condition shall not constitute and shall not be relied upon by the Seller as a representation, warranty or guarantee that the material will, when sold by Christie's-Robson Lowe, be sold for such amount.
10. Lots bought in and material not being kept for sale will be returned to the Seller by ordinary post at the Seller's expense and to his address or to such other address as shall have been notified by the Seller to Christie's-Robson Lowe in writing. Material so returned to the Seller will be insured in transit to the amount of the valuation by Christie's-Robson Lowe unless Christie's-Robson Lowe have received special directions.
11. 3. V.A.T.
