Conditions of Business

These Conditions of Business represent the terms upon which Christie's, the fine art auctioneers, contracts with Sellers and, acting in its capacity as agent on behalf of Sellers, contracts with Buyers. These Conditions of Business shall supersede and take precedence over any Conditions of Business previously entered into or otherwise agreed between Christie's and the Seller.

Buyers and Sellers are advised to read carefully the Conditions of Business and the explanation of cataloguing practice set out below which contain the terms on which Christie's conducts sales and handles other related matters. Conditions A.1 to 12 inclusive and the explanation of cataloguing practice, where applicable, are of particular relevance to Buyers and Conditions B.1 to 14 inclusive to Sellers. Definitions of words and phrases with special meanings appear in Condition C.8.

A The Buyer

1. Christie's as agent

Save as otherwise appears, Christie's acts only as agent for the Seller.

2. The Buyer

(a) The Buyer shall be the highest bidder acceptable to Christie's and Christie's shall have absolute discretion to settle any dispute;

(b) every bidder shall be deemed to act as principal unless Christie's has, before the date of the auction, acknowledged in writing that the bidder is acting as agent on behalf of a disclosed principal;
 (c) every bidder shall, if required by Christie's, complete and sign a

(c) every bidder shall, if required by Christie's, complete and sign a Registration Form and provide identification before making any bid at the auction.

3. Catalogue Descriptions

- (a) Any representation or statement by Christie's whether in the catalogue or other publication or in a condition report as to the authorship, origin, date, age, size, medium, attribution, genuincness, provenance, condition or estimated selling price of any Lot is a statement of opinion only. Any illustrations in the catalogue are solely for guidance and are not to be relied upon in terms of tone or colour or necessarily to reveal imperfections in any Lot:
- (b) in addition, many Lots are of an age or nature which precludes their being in pristine condition and some descriptions in the catalogue or given by way of condition report make reference to damage and/or restoration. Such information is given for guidance only and the absence of such a reference does not imply that a Lot is free from defects nor does any reference to particular defects imply the absence of others;

(c) Buyers must satisfy themselves as to all matters referred to in (a) and (b) above by inspection or otherwise prior to the date of the auction. The attention of Buyers is also drawn to the explanation

of cataloguing practice contained in the catalogue.

4. Premium

The Buyer shall pay to Christie's a Premium at the Rates of Premium set out in Condition C.8 together with VAT at the standard rate and the Buyer acknowledges that Christie's may also receive commission from the Seller in accordance with Condition B.4.

5. Value Added Tax

In the case of a lot marked with a dagger [†] in the catalogue, VAT is payable by the Buyer on the Hammer Price at the rate prevailing on the date of the auction which may be refundable in certain circumstances where the Lot is removed from the United Kingdom.

6. Currency Converter and Video

For the guidance of Buyers:

a) a currency converter will be operated at some auctions based on the one month forward rates of exchange quoted to Christie's by Lloyds Bank Plc at opening on the date of the auction. Christie's shall not accept any responsibility in the event of error on the currency converter as to the accuracy of the Lot number displayed or as to the foreign currency equivalent of bids in pounds sterling or otherwise; and

(b) videoed or other images of Lots will be screened in connection with some auctions. Christic's shall not accept any responsibility in the event of error in the screening whether to the relevance or

accuracy of any such image or otherwise.

7. Payment

(a) Upon sale of a Lot, the Buyer shall:

 unless he has already done so, give to Christie's his name and address and, if so required by Christie's, his bank or other suitable references; and

(ii) pay to Christie's the Purchase Price within seven days from the date of sale, notwithstanding that, where the Buyer wishes to export the Lot, an export licence may be required.

(b) Christie's may, at its absolute discretion, agree terms for credit with the Buyer under which the Buyer will be entitled to take possession of the Lot before payment is made in full.

c) The property in a Lot shall not pass to the Buyer until he has paid the Purchase Price in full.

8. Collection of Purchases

(a) Subject to Condition 7(b) above, no Lot may be taken away during the auction, nor may any Lot be taken away until the Purchase Price has been paid in full;

b) the Buyer shall remove all purchased lots within seven days of the

date of the sale;

c) in the event that Lots remain uncollected, the Buyer shall be responsible for all storage charges from day 28 after the sale;

(d) any packing and handling of purchased Lots by Christie's staff is undertaken solely as a service to Buyers, and will only be undertaken at Christie's discretion and at the Buyer's risk. Christie's shall not be liable in any event for any damage to glass or frames, irrespective of cause. In addition, Christie's shall not be liable for any errors or omissions or damage caused by packers and shippers that Christie's has recommended to Buyers.

9. Responsibility for purchased Lots

The purchased Lot(s) shall be at the Buyer's risk in all respects from the time of collection or the expiry of seven days from the date of sale, whichever is the sooner, and neither Christie's nor its employees nor agents shall thereafter be liable for any loss or damage of any kind, whether caused by negligence or otherwise, while any Lot is in or under their respective custody or control.

10. Remedies for non-payment or failure to collect purchases If a Buyer fails either to pay for or to take away any Lot, Christie's shall, without further notice to the Buyer and at its absolute discretion and without prejudice to any other rights or remedies it may have, be entitled to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies:

(a) to issue proceedings against the Buyer for damages for breach of contract together with the costs of such proceedings on a full

indemnity basis;

b) to rescind the sale of that or any other Lots sold to the Buyer at the

same or any other auction;

c) to resell the Lot or cause it to be resold by public or private sale. Any deficiency in the Purchase Price resulting from such resale (after giving credit for any payment) together with full costs incurred in connection with the Lot shall be paid to Christie's by the Buyer and any surplus over the Proceeds of Sale shall belong to the Seller and in this Condition the expression 'Proceeds of Sale' shall have the same meaning in relation to a sale by private treaty as it has in relation to a sale by auction:

(d) to store the Lot or cause it to be stored whether at its own premises or elsewhere at the sole expense of the Buyer, and to release the Lot only after payment in full of the Purchase Price, the accrued cost of removal, storage and insurance and all other costs incurred

in connection with the Lot;

(e) to charge interest on the Purchase Price at the rate of 4 per cent above Lloyds Bank Plc base rate to the extent that it remains unpaid for more than seven days from the date of sale, or, after judgment shall have been entered, at a rate of whichever is the higher of 4 per cent above Lloyds Bank Plc base rate and any statutory rate for the time being in force in relation to unpaid judgment debts;

f) to retain that or any other Lot sold to the Buyer at the same or any other auction and release the same only after payment of the

Purchase Price:

(g) to apply any proceeds of sale of any Lot then due or at any time thereafter becoming due to the Buyer towards settlement of the Purchase Price and Expenses, and Christie's shall be entitled to a lien on any property of the Buyer which is in Christie's possession for any purpose;

(h) to apply any payments by the Buyer to Christie's towards any sums owing from the Buyer to Christie's or to any associated company of Christie's without regard to any directions of the

Buyer or his agent, whether express or implied.

Guarantee

Subject to the obligations accepted by Christie's under this Condition, none of the Seller, Christie's, its employees or agents is responsible for the correctness of any statement as to the authorship, origin, date, age, size, medium, attribution, genuineness or provenance of any Lot, for any other errors of description or for any faults or defects in any Lot and no warranty whatsoever is given by the Seller, Christie's, its employees or agents in respect of any Lot and any express or implied conditions or warranties are hereby excluded;

if, within five years of the date of the auction (1) Christie's has received notice in writing from the Buyer of any Lot that in his view the Lot is a Forgery, (2) within fourteen days of such notice, Christie's has the Lot in its possession in the same condition as at the date of the auction and (3) within a reasonable time thereafter, the Buyer satisfies Christic's that the Lot is a Forgery and that the Buyer is able to transfer a good and marketable title to the Lot free from any liens or encumbrances, Christie's will set aside the sale and refund to the Buyer any amount paid by the Buyer in respect of the Lot provided that the Buyer shall have no rights under this Condition if:

(i) the catalogue description at the date of the auction was in accordance with the then generally accepted opinion of scholars or experts or fairly indicated there to be a conflict of

such opinion; or

(ii) it can be established that the Lot is a Forgery only by means of a scientific process not generally accepted for use until after publication of the catalogue or by means of a process which at the date of the auction was unreasonably expensive or impracticable or likely to have caused damage to the Lot;

the Buyer shall not be entitled to claim under this Condition for

more than the amount paid by him for the Lot and in particular shall have no claim for any loss, consequential loss or damage whether direct or indirect suffered by him;

the benefit of this guarantee shall not be assignable and shall rest solely and exclusively in the Buyer who shall be the person to whom the original invoice was made out by Christie's in respect of the Lot when sold and who has since the sale retained uninterrupted, unencumbered ownership thereof.

Commission bids

Prospective Buyers are advised to attend at the auction. Christic's will, however, if so instructed, execute bids provided in writing in advance of the auction or bids by telephone (at Christie's discretion) on their behalf, but neither Christie's nor its employees nor agents shall be liable to either the Buyer or the Seller for any neglect or default in so doing or for failure to do so;

in the event that Christie's has received commission bids on a Lot for identical amounts and at auction those commission bids are the highest bids for that Lot, the Lot shall be knocked down to the person whose commission bid (for the relevant amount) was

received first.

Note: Clause A.11(b) does not apply to Coins and Medals, or Jewellcry.

Buyer's VAT status

The buyer shall give Christie's prior to the auction all relevant information as to his VAT status which he warrants shall be correct and on which Christie's shall be able to rely. Once a Lot has been purchased on the basis of such information, no alteration so as to affect liability to VAT shall be made.

C Christie, Manson & Woods Limited (1994)

The Seller

Christie's discretion Christie's shall have absolute discretion as to:

whether the Lot is suitable for sale by Christie's, and if so as to the place and date of sale, the conditions of sale and the manner in which such sale is conducted;

(ii) the description of any Lot in the catalogue;
(iii) whether the views of any expert shall be obtained (including the submission of items of precious metal to the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths and/or the London Assay Office); and

(iv) the illustration of any Lot in the catalogue which will be at the Seller's expense up to a maximum of £90 for black and white and £500 for colour (together with any VAT chargeable thereon);

Christie's reserves the right to withdraw any property at any time before the actual sale if, in Christie's sole judgement:

there is doubt as to its attribution or to its authenticity; there is doubt as to the accuracy of the Seller's representations

or warranties set forth herein in any respect; the Seller has breached or is about to breach any provision of

these Conditions of Business; or

(iv) any other just cause exists. In the event of a withdrawal pursuant to Condition (ii) or (iii) above, the Seller shall pay a charge as provided in Condition B.9.

Warranties and Indemnities

The Seller warrants to Christie's and to the Buyer that he has and will be able to transfer good and marketable title to the Lot free from all third party rights or claims; the Seller shall indemnify Christie's, its employees and agents and the Buyer against all claims made or proceedings brought by

persons entitled or purporting to be entitled to the Lot; the Seller warrants to Christie's and to the Buyer that he has complied in all respects with any applicable laws, regulations and requirements relating to any export of any of the Lots from any country or any intermediary country and also to the import of any such Lot into the United Kingdom, including (without limitation) payment of any duties or taxes relating to, and obtaining all licences, permits or other authorisations necessary for, such export and import; the Seller shall provide such available documentation as necessary;

(d) the Seller shall indemnify Christie's, its employees and agents and the Buyer against all claims made or proceedings brought due to

any default of the Seller in complying with any applicable requisite export and/or import legislation, regulations or requirements; and (e) the Seller shall reimburse Christie's in full and on demand for all payments, costs, expenses or any other loss or damage whatsoever made, incurred or suffered as a result of any breach by the Seller of (a) and/or (c) above.

Reserves

All Lots will be offered subject to a reserve as agreed in writing between Christie's and the Seller and, once a reserve has been agreed, it may be changed only with the consent of Christie's;

the Seller shall not bid for his property nor employ any person to bid for him and Christie's alone shall have the right to bid on

behalf of the Seller up to the amount of the reserve; if a reserve is placed in a currency other than sterling, such a reserve will be calculated at the one month forward rate of exchange quoted to Christie's by Lloyds Bank Plc at opening on the date of the auction, the certificate in writing of Christie's as to such rate to be conclusive except in the case of manifest error;

(d) the sterling equivalent of the foreign currency reserve calculated in accordance with (c) above may at Christie's absolute discretion be increased or reduced during the course of bidding to the nearest multiple of pounds sterling by which the bidding is being

advanced:

(c) the Seller authorises Christie's to accept bids of less than the amount of the agreed reserve provided that for the sole purpose of determining any amounts due to or from the Seller under these Conditions the Hammer Price for any Lot sold at less than the agreed reserve will be deemed to have been the full amount of the agreed reserve and not the lower price at which the Lot was actually sold.

Commission and Expenses

The Seller authorises Christie's to deduct commission at the Published Rates and Expenses from the Hammer Price and notwithstanding that Christie's is his agent, acknowledges that Christie's may retain the Premium payable by the Buyer in accordance with Condition A.4;

if a Lot fails to reach its reserve, the Seller authorises Christie's to deduct unsold commission at the Published Rates calculated on the

last bid for the Lot and Expenses.

The Seller shall pay, and/or authorise Christie's to deduct, an administration charge of ten per cent of all costs incurred on behalf of the Seller together with any VAT thereon.

Unless otherwise instructed by the Seller, all Lots will automatically be covered by insurance under Christie's own Fine Arts Policy for such sum as Christie's shall from time to time in its absolute discretion estimate;

the rate of insurance premium payable by the Seller is 1 per cent of the Hammer Price plus VAT and the Seller shall also pay to Christie's any applicable charge for transit insurance together with any VAT thereon. The sum for which a Lot is covered for insurance under this Condition will not constitute and shall not be

rehed upon by the Seller as a representation, warranty or guarantee as to the value of the Lot or that it will, if and when sold by Christie's, be sold for such amount. Such insurance will subsist until payment is due from the Buyer or, in the case of Lots bought in or otherwise unsold, until the expiry of seven days after the receipt by the Seller of notice from Christie's requiring the Seller

to collect:

(c) if the Seller instructs Christie's not to insure a Lot, it shall at all times remain at the risk of the Seller who hereby undertakes (1) to indemnify Christie's against all claims made or proceedings brought against Christie's in respect of loss or damage to the Lot of whatever nature howsoever and wheresoever occurring and in any circumstances even where negligence is alleged or proven (2) to reimburse Christie's on demand for all payments, costs or expenses made, incurred or suffered by Christie's in consequence thereof or arising therefrom. Any payment which Christie's shall make in respect of such loss or damage or payments, costs or expenses shall be binding upon the Seller and shall be accepted by the Seller as conclusive evidence that Christie's was liable to make such payment (3) to notify any insurer of the existence of the indemnity contained in this Condition;
(d) Christie's does not accept responsibility for Lots damaged by

woodworm or by changes in atmospheric conditions and Christie's shall not be liable for such damage nor for any other damage to picture frames or to glass in picture frames;

the sum for which a Lot is insured under Christie's own Fine Arts Policy in accordance with subclause (a) above shall be the total amount due to the Seller in the event of a successful claim being made under the Fine Arts Policy.

Rescission of the Sale

If before the Proceeds of Sale have been paid to the Seller, Christie's receives notice from the Buyer under Condition A.11(b) that, in the Buyer's view, the Lot is a Forgery, and Christie's agrees with that view, Christie's will rescind the sale and refund to the Buyer any amount paid to Christie's in respect of the Lot.

7. Payment of Proceeds of Sale

Christie's shall pay the Proceeds of Sale to the Seller thirty-five days after the date of sale if Christie's has by then been paid the Purchase Price in full by the Buyer and Christie's has not received any notice from the Buyer under Condition A.11(b);

(b) if by the due date Christie's has not received the Purchase Price in full from the Buyer, then Christie's will pay the Proceeds of Sale within seven working days after the date on which the Purchase Price in full is received from the Buyer;

(c) if before the Purchase Price is paid in full by the Buyer, Christie's

pays the Seller an amount equal to the Proceeds of Sale, property

in the Lot shall pass to Christie's;
(d) the Proceeds of Sale will be paid to the Seller in such currency available to Christie's as may be agreed provided that the Seller specifies to Christie's in writing before the date of the auction the currency required. A charge of £25 (together with VAT thereon) may be deducted from the Proceeds of Sale in the event the Seller elects for payment to be made in a currency other than sterling, such sum representing costs and expenses incurred by Christie's.

The sum to be paid to the Seller shall be calculated at the one month forward rate of exchange for the Proceeds of Sale quoted to Christie's by Lloyds Bank Plc prevailing on the next working day after the date of the auction, the certificate in writing of Christie's as to such rate being conclusive. If no currency is specified and agreed, the Proceeds of Sale will be paid in sterling.

8. Collection of the Purchase Price

If the Buyer fails to pay to Christie's the Purchase Price within one month after the date of sale. Christie's will endeavour to take the Seller's instructions as to the appropriate course of action to be taken and, so far as in Christie's opinion is practicable, will assist the Seller to recover the Purchase Price from the Buyer save that Christie's shall not be obliged to usue proceedings against the Buyer in its own name. Estimates for shipping and advice as to the most economic means of despatch can be obtained at any time from our contracted shippers, telephone (071) 389 2552/3.

- (d) Transit Insurance can be arranged by the nominated shipper to cover your property from collection at our premises to arrival, if requested. Please indicate if you require this service or will be effecting transit insurance yourself. Please also note that Christie's own insurance cover on all purchased Lots ceases at the time of collection from our premises or seven days after the sale, whichever is the earlier. (See Conditions of Business A.8 & 9.)
- c) Works of art being handcarried outside the EC must be correctly declared to Customs at the port/airport of departure from the EC. If evidence of removal from the United Kingdom is required for refund of VAT the carrier should approach HM Customs and Excise prior to departure. The Shipping Department can give advice and assistance in arranging for the correct paperwork to be completed on your behalf.

IV. Sellers overseas

- (a) Importing works of art for sale. It is essential that all items imported for sale must be declared as such to Customs at the point of entry into the EC, and appropriate documents be obtained for presentation to Christie's. Particular attention should be paid to items containing ivory or other material from endangered species.
- (b) Paintings, drawings, prints, sculpture disposed of by the creator or as part of his or her estate before 1 April 1973, collections and collectors' pieces and antiques more than 100 years old, all at present enter the United Kingdom free of duty and without payment of VAT (explanatory leaflet available on request).

V. Export licensing regulations for works of art, antiques and firearms

Christie's can advise buyers on the detailed provisions of the export licensing regulations and will submit the relevant export licence applications on request, provided that the items concerned are then exported by Christie's via their nominated shipper. If hand carried by the Buyer, the Buyer will be required to produce a valid export licence to Christie's or sign a waiver document stating that a licence will be applied for.

Buyers should always check whether an export licence is required before exporting. Export licences are usually obtained within two or four weeks but delays can occur which are outside Christie's control. For further information, please contact the Shipping Department on (071) 389 2886.

I. General

In general, under both UK and EC regulations, an export licence is required for the export of any item manufactured or produced more than 50 years before the date of exportation that falls into certain categories.

If the item falls in one of these categories and is to be exported outside the EC, the export is controlled by EC Regulation (EEC No. 3911/92), an EC licence will be necessary. A UK licence will be required if the item is valued at or above the UK limit but below the EC limit.

If the item is to be exported to another EC member state and falls in one of the categories, it will require a UK licence.

This information is included for guidance only and no representation is made by Christie's as to its accuracy. Full details of the value limits at or above which either a UK or an EC licence is required are available upon request.

II. Firearms

Firearms of between 50 and 100 years of age, and firearms of over 100 years with a value of £39,600 or more, require a licence. In addition, all firearms of 100 years of age or less require a DTI strategic licence in order to leave the UK.

III. Ivory and Endangered species

An export licence issued by the Department of the Environment will be required for the export of any item made of, or incorporating (irrespective of percentage) animal material such as ivory, whalebone, tortoiseshell, rhinoceros horn, etc. This may take up to eight weeks to obtain. Clients are advised to check with the regulating body in the country of importation regarding any possible restrictions on the importation of items within this category — some countries have an absolute bar on the importation of certain materials.
