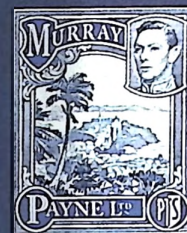

We were very pleased to be selected to offer the 'Foxley' collection of Bermuda KGV and KG VI. It has been a privilege to describe the collection, which has been formed over a 50-year period with much discrimination, and selective buying in the 'named' sales during that period. Many items have come from the finest collections, and 'Foxley' ranks alongside them.

The ordering of this sale is necessarily arbitrary. We have chosen to order by issue/value/printing/position, with a nod to catalogue order. So we commence with proofs, then Specimens, basic stamps with blocks including unlisted varieties, then listed varieties.

There are six primary sources for the information incorporated in the descriptions. These are the Stanley Gibbons 2017 Commonwealth & British Empire Stamps 1840-1970, otherwise known as 'Part 1', on which the ordering of the KG V is based; The Commonwealth King George VI Catalogue, 20th edition; Dr Myles Glazer's The King George V High-value Stamps of Bermuda, Calaby Publishers, 1994; the 1985 KG VI Large Keytype volume by Dickgiesser and Yendall, Triad Press, and Yendall's 2008 revision (RPSL); and the Bermuda Specialised Catalogue (2012).

In addition, reference has been made to a large number of auction catalogues; the pile of those frequently referred to is over a foot high and will take some time to return to their positions on our library shelves! They are usually named in the text.

The identification of the flaws is determined by their position in the sheet, as per the system utilised by Dickgiesser, Yendall and Glazer. Thus R4/9 (as per SG) becomes #45 (three rows of 12 stamps = 36, plus 9), and 5/12 becomes #60. HPF refers to Headplate flaw and FF to Frameplate flaw. In general we have described the SG- and CW- listed flaws in the text, but merely given the position where the flaws are of a lesser nature, on the grounds that those who are interested in the minor flaws will probably own the relevant literature and can look them up for themselves.

Allocating stamps to printings is often an art, rather than a science. With the KG VI we were on a relatively sure footing, but where the KG V is concerned we have chosen to go with the allocations made by 'Foxley' on the grounds of much greater experience, but also (as could be seen from many notes in the collection) because much comparing of notes and stamps took place at Bermuda Collectors' Society meetings, ASDA shows and the like; often opinions were arrived at by consensus.

Your describer's limited understanding of Bermuda philately owes much to the great names of the fairly recent past; Reid Shaw, Harry Whitin, Bob Ingalls, Bob Dickgiesser, Eric Yendall, Perry Delman, Myles Glazer, David Springbett and Michel Forand, to name but a few. Denis Littlewort has allowed us to consult him on a few critical printings identifications. My most sincere thanks go to David Cordon, who has been admirably patient in the face of a barrage of queries; if you ever get the chance to see one of his Bermuda displays, don't miss it! Any errors in the catalogue have nothing to do with him.

As always, if you have any queries regarding the sale, please don't hesitate to contact us. We will try to fulfil all reasonable requests. We are intending to follow this sale with a general sale in fairly short order so if you have anything you wish to consign, please let us know soon.

How to Bid by Post.

Simply enter on the Postal Bidding Form the maximum amounts that you are prepared to pay, for as many lots as you wish to bid for, and then return it to us. **Please remember to sign the bid form.** We will enter these bids on your behalf and will buy at the lowest possible price subject to other bids received and reserves.

Bids can be made in writing, by fax, by email or by telephone. Telephone bids must be confirmed in writing when they will be entered into the auction (but with a date when first notified).

How to Bid Live Online.

Murray Payne Ltd offer an online bidding service via the-saleroom.com for bidders.

In completing the bidder registration on www.the-saleroom.com and providing your credit card details and, unless alternative arrangements are agreed with Murray Payne Ltd. authorise:

1. *Murray Payne Ltd, if they so wish, to charge the registered credit card in part or in full payment, including all fees, for items successfully purchased in the auction via the-saleroom.com, and*
2. *confirm that you are authorised to provide these credit card details to Murray Payne Ltd. through the-saleroom.com and agree that Murray Payne Ltd. are entitled to ship the goods to the card holder name and address provided, in fulfilment of the sale.*

Please note that any lots purchased via the-saleroom.com live auction service will be subject to an additional 3% commission charge +VAT at the relevant rate, on the hammer price.

Prices

Estimates given in the catalogue are in GBP (£sterling). All bids must be in GBP and when entered as a bid GBP is assumed.

Bidding Steps

Bids will be increased by the following steps:

* up to £50	in £1 steps
* £50 to £100	in £5 steps
* £100 to £250	in £10 steps
* £250 to £500	in £25 steps
* £500 to £2000	in £50 steps
* £2000 to £5000	in £100 steps
* £5000 to £10,000	in £250 steps
* £10,000 to £20,000	in £500 steps
* Above £20,000	in £1000 steps

Any bids received not conforming to the above will be rounded down to the next bidding step.

Limit Bids

Reserves

Are usually 80%-90% of the estimates. Bids below these levels may not be entered.

Viewing

Items are available for viewing either by post or by prior appointment at our offices. For postal viewing all lots must be returned within 48 hours of receipt (by the viewer) and all costs of transit and insurance are to be paid by the person making the request to view. Note: The person making the request to view is responsible for any loss or damage to the item(s) from time of receipt (by the viewer) to the time of return to Murray Payne offices.

Minors

Bids from minors cannot be accepted unless accompanied by a suitable guarantee.

Value Added Tax (VAT)

All items are sold under the UK 1995 rules for "Global Accounting". No charge for VAT will be added/deducted to/from your invoice.

Refunds

All lots are offered fully guaranteed but may be returned within 48 hours of receipt, stating the reason for return. However the Buyer will be expected to pay the postage costs both ways, unless the reason for return is due to any fault in the auction lot description.

Extensions

Any request for an Extension for an opinion by an Expert Committee must be made in writing prior to the closing date for bids. We accept BPA (and Murray Payne!) Expertisation. Prior agreement must be sought in writing for any other expert opinions. Full payment is due on receipt of invoice. Any extra extension costs or refunds will be invoiced later.

Ownership

All items remain the property of the vendor until our bank has received full payment.

Payment

Payment is due immediately upon receipt of invoice. Unless alternative arrangements have been agreed in advance, amounts outstanding after 15 days will be charged interest at the rate of 2¼% per month or part thereof.

In order to participate in the live auction you will need to register on thesaleroom.com website. Please note that if you are already registered on the Murray Payne website you will still need to register with thesaleroom.com website. This can be done at any time right up to the point when you wish to place a live bid (i.e. even during the live auction).

Any winning bid placed with the-saleroom either during the live internet bidding or entered previously by them as a 'commission bid' will be charged a 3% +VAT commission by thesaleroom.com. Although this is not a buyer's premium levelled by us it will still be collected via the Murray Payne invoice after the auction. Murray Payne will then pay this over to the-saleroom on your behalf. Thus, unless you wish to be independent of Murray Payne, we would suggest that you leave any 'book bids' with Murray Payne who will bid on your behalf without any charge. 'Commission bids' placed with the-saleroom.com must be placed before commencement of the live internet auction. Prices realised will be available from www.murraypayne.com shortly after the close of the Auction.

Just a word of warning, like all public auctions, you must be wary of bidding against yourself! If you leave a commission (or book) bid whether it be with Murray Payne or via the-saleroom.com site and you subsequently decide to bid live then you must either take into account the bids that you have already placed or you should cancel your commission (book) bids in good time.

Although the-saleroom.com site is very intuitive and thus easy to use, we do recommend that prospective bidders 'view' another auction before participating in the Murray Payne live internet auction. Go on thesaleroom.com site and there are plenty to choose from almost every day. This will also confirm that there are no system problems. In fact thesaleroom.com site is simply constructed and is built around the use of Adobe Flash Player, which is a free download, although in all probability most PCs will already have this program loaded/activated. The system can also be run on iPad and Android tablets but requires the Puffin Web Browser App. This can be downloaded by going to the relevant app store.

Some notes/information/advice about the live internet system:

- There will be an audio (but not video) feed from the Murray Payne auctioneer
- Withdrawn lots will be skipped over. The auctioneer will advise bidders if this should occur
- Bid increments are the same no matter how bids are placed
- With the proviso stated above, bids can only be placed when the bid button is activated
- Bid early. Do not be tempted to hold back to the last second as you will only succeed in risking missing the placement of your bid
- There is an alarm facility on the system but if you place this to activate on the actual Lot in which you are interested, then by the time that you get your act together the lot will probably have gone. We recommend placing the alarm (say) 5 lots before you wish to participate
- You can view the auction in any major currency in addition to GBP
- You are able to view your successful purchases.
- The catalogue can be viewed and searched on thesaleroom.com website
- Contact us on 01934732511 (before, during and after the auction) in the first instance. The-saleroom can be contacted on +44 (0)20 7420 6670 to assist with any system related issues.
- As each lot completes a 'FAIR WARNING' message is displayed, indicating that the lot is about to close. After this one of three messages will be displayed, viz:
 1. 'You have won this lot'
 2. 'Room/Internet bid' indicating that you were not the winner
 3. 'PASSED' indicating that the item remains unsold as it failed to reach its reserve

In the case of a tied bid, the first bid received takes preference so it is worth getting your bids in early!

The Bermuda Specialised Catalogue (Stamps and Postal History, 1812-1970, 193 pages) was twenty years in the making and was published in 2012. The list of those involved makes for impressive reading and represents most of those who formed the major collections of recent decades. Although the results are modestly described as a work in progress, it is likely that this catalogue will remain the 'last word' for at least another twenty years. Pricing is based on realistic retail levels in US \$s.

The information given in the handbooks by Glazer and Yendall is incorporated in abbreviated form, with admirably clear illustrations of the flaws. There is much information on material outside the scope of the general catalogues with sections on (amongst others) Postal Stationery, Proofs, Revenues, Railway stamps, Military mail and Censorship, Paquebots, cancellations, Aerophilately and Charity seals.

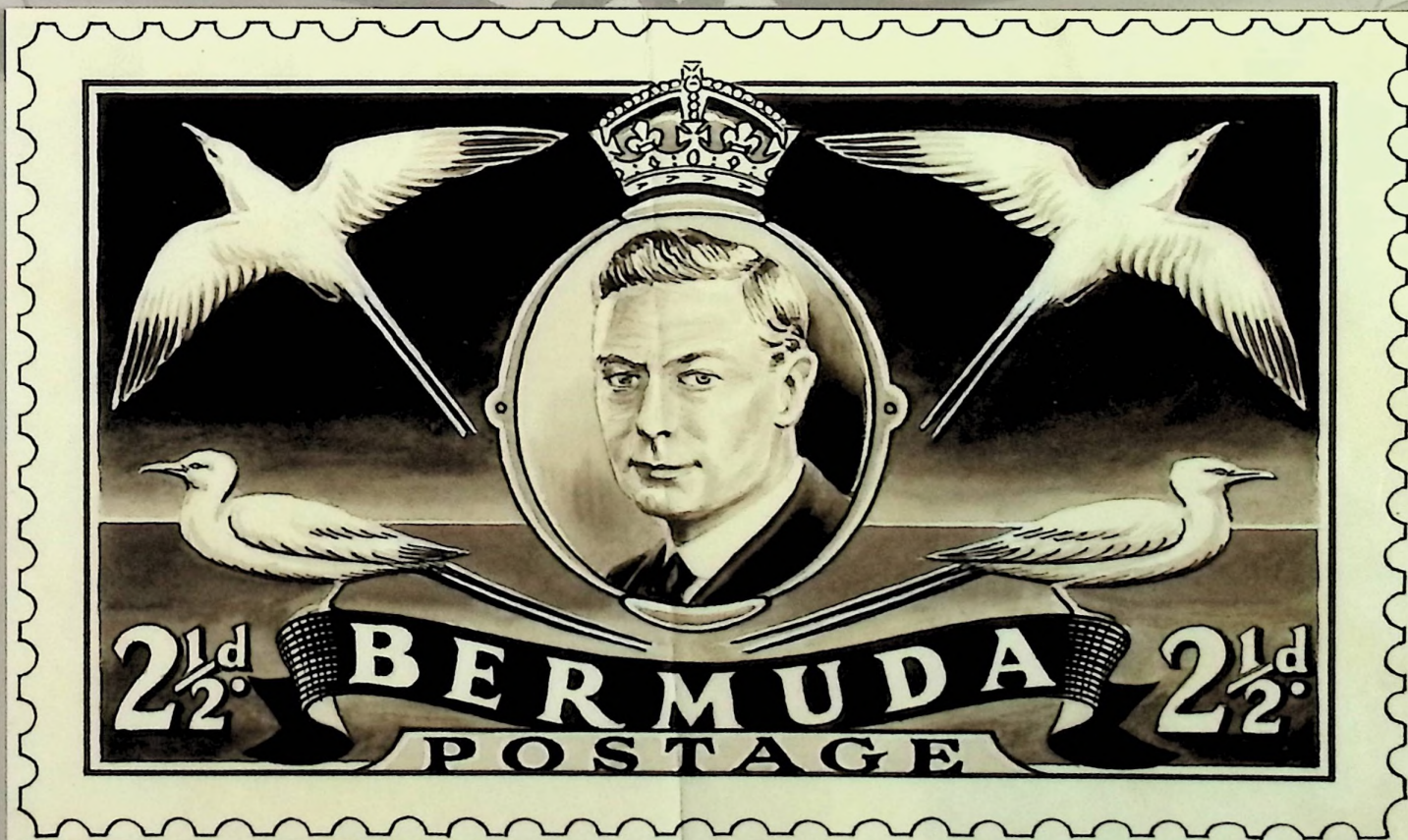
