I.

The highest bidder to be the purchaser; and in case of any dispute the lot or lots in question to be put up again at the discretion of the Auctioneer. The advance on each lot to be fixed by the Auctioneer.

Purchasers to give their Names and Places of Abode, and to pay down 10s in the pound, if required, in Part Payment of the purchase-money; in default of which the Lot or Lots so purchased shall be put up again and re-sold.

III

All lots to be cleared within seven days from date of Sale; and not to be delivered until paid for. Lots not paid for during above period from date of sale may be re-sold by Public or Private Sale, and the defaulting bidder in such case to make good any loss arising from such re-sale.

IV.

All stamps are believed to be genuine in every respect and according to description. Should any stamp dscribed in the catalogue be doubtful and the purchaser wishes to obtain an expert opinion as to authenticity and condition, a **reasonable** extension of time for this purpose will be given if applied for within seven days of the date of sale, and if the stamp or stamps are pronounced other than genuine, or according to description in catalogue, and are returned to the Auctioneer in the same condition as they were sold and delivered to the purchaser, the purchase money will be refunded.

V.

If not satisfied with description, purchasers must obtain the Auctioneer's sanction before soaking or submitting a stamp to any other process, and under no condition will a stamp be accepted back unless in the condition in which it was sold. SCHOOLBOY TO ADDRESS PHILATELIC CONGRESS.

ETAILS which are beginning to leak out about this year's Philatelic Congress of Great Britain, which is to be held in London from May 29th to June 2nd, under the auspices of the British Philatelic Association, suggest that the keynote of the gathering will be originality.

There have been many suggestions for linking the younger generation with Congress, but it has remained for the B.P.A. to take the very practical step of inviting a youth who is still at school to read a paper at one of the sessions.

He is Mr. R. H. Douglas, of Derby, who won the Stamp Collectors' Challenge Cup last year at the age of $15\frac{1}{2}$, and twice previously won the Silver Cup in the Junior Philatelic Society annual essay competition. He was just over 13 when he first astonished a large audience at Caxton Hall with a remarkable paper on Persian reprints. Mr. Douglas has done some careful work in the study of Persian stamps and, as he is still young enough not to have forgotten what general collecting is like, it will be interesting to see what he makes of his subject "Microscopical Philately; Is it Good or Bad?"


We learn that several well known Congress figures are contributing papers, the subject of which will be announced later, and we understand that the "highbrow" paper will be rigorously banned on this occasion. Certainly, if rumour does not lie, some of the subjects will provide material for good cutand thrust debate, with coats trailing and wigs on the green!

There is no doubt of the enthusiasm aroused by the invitation to philatelists to visit the Derby under Congress auspices. Quite a number have already announced their intention of attending and as the number of places available is limited, readers should get in touch immediately with Mr. Cuthbert Greig, the Congress Secretary, at 3, Berners Street, London, W.1, or they may find they are too late.

It should perhaps be made clear that not only Delegates and Members of Congress can take part in this visit to the Derby and other social functions, but also any who are attending the Congress meetings as visitors, and anyone interested in stamps may attend the session in that capacity.
