THE postmaster's provisionals of Bermuda are among the rarest and most valuable stamps in the world. They were made by the postmaster of Hamilton, W. B. Perot, from the current date-stamp after removing the plugs with the name and the day of the month, leaving the year date. They were sold to those who wished to post letters after the post office was closed. In 1848 and 1849 they were struck in black, subsequently in red. Ten examples are known, four in black and six in red, of which the finest and largest is the example illustrated here.

These stamps were not known to collectors until 1897 when this particular example was sent from Bermuda to Alfred Smith, the stamp dealer of Bath, who described it in his *Monthly Circular* for July 1897. Some years later it passed into the famous collection formed by Philipp la Renotiere von Ferrary. At the sale of the latter's collection, on 15th November 1922, it was bought by the late Maurice Burrus.

It is the only example known on an entire letter and is now lot 478 in the "Burrus" sale of 24th July 1963.

ILLUSTRATED here are a few of the choice classic stamps of New Zealand in the "Burrus" collection which will be sold on 23rd July 1963. These stamps are deservedly popular for their bold and beautiful design, the fine and varied colours in which they are printed, the scope for philatelic research and their usage on covers which travelled to Europe by both eastern and western routes.

On 24th July the Bahamas, Bermuda, Cyprus and Hong Kong sections will be sold.

The most famous of the British Empire collections formed by the late Maurice Burrus was the Mauritius, which includes the unique cover bearing both 1d. and 2d. "POST OFFICE"— a coloured photograph of which, together with other rarities, costs $\pounds 2$. Included in this catalogue is one of the eight colour plates which will illustrate the auction catalogue of 1st October 1963 when these remarkable stamps come up for sale under the hammer in the sale room of Robson Lowe Ltd., 50 Pall Mall, London, S.W.1.

THE BURRUS BOLIVIA

We have been authorised to sell by private treaty this attractive collection formed by the late Maurice Burrus of Ste. Croix-aux-Mines, housed in one volume and mounted on the original pages.

The early issues are strongly represented and the 1866-67 5c. green includes five blocks of 72 in different shades and there are two entires of this value, one a pair from Cobija and a strip of four from La Paz from the Tarolara correspondence. There is a block of 32 of the 5c. mauve unused and a wonderful cover to Tacna bearing six copies (ex Caspary). Among the used are two pairs and two with red cancellations and a bisected copy used with another on a small piece with the ornate cancellation of Sagainago (ex Caspary). There is a corner block of 28 of the 10c. brown and marginal blocks of fifteen and twelve; a vertical pair used on cover from La Paz to Arcquipa is among the used.

The 50c. yellow has a block of thirty showing all the types and there are no less than eight unused copies of the rare 50c. blue in varying shades and one used; there is also a pen cancelled block of four and all these stamps have been plated. There is a block of thirty of the 100c. blue and a block of ten of the 100c. green, both fine unused. Used examples of this issue include, among others, some of the photographed lots from the Caspary Sale (lots 489, 490 and 491).

The fine cover bearing a strip of four and a pair of the 5c. mauve

The rare 500c. black of 1868 and 1871 are represented by four and two copies respectively and there are eight covers of these issues bearing various values.

There is a fine lot of covers bearing franks of the Chile-Bolivian War period and earlier. Among them is a remarkable cover* from Antofagasta to New York, which is franked with a British 1/- green, plate 13, cancelled with the blue octagonal 10c. Antofagasta; another strike of this mark appears on the letter as well as the Arms of Bolivia in a circle surrounded with the words "Admon. de Correos de Bolivia" with "Antofagasta" at the foot. In all there are thirty, with La Chimba (7), Potosi, Salta, green, Franca Sucre on an 1852 letter to Paris and others.

There are fifteen copies of Garcias Post of 1863, some proofs and essays, as well as other interesting items. The early issues include varieties of cancellations and a certain number of entire letters. From 1893 onwards, the collection is not specialised and consists largely of single items, but many varieties are to be found and included are some of the rare 1930 air stamps.

THE BURRUS CHINA

Instructions have been received from the Amhelea Trust that we are to offer this valuable collection for sale by private treaty. There are many remarkable items, of which the following brief description includes a synopsis.

The first setting of the 1878 issue includes complete mint sheets of thirty of all three values, as well as a number of blocks and singles; used include two blocks of the 3c. and one of the 5c. There are six covers including one dated 1880 from Tientsin bearing the 3c., an 1881 entire to England with French adhesives as well as the Chinese 1c. and a pair of the 5c. cancelled at Newchwang, an 1881 "On Service" front to Shanghai with the 1c. and 5c. cancelled at Chinkiang, an 1884 cover to France with the French 1 fr. cancelled at Shanghai and a pair of 1c., 3c. and a pair and two singles of the 5c. cancelled at Peking. The wide setting includes two unused copies of the 3c and two of the 5c., as well as a large front showing all three values cancelled at Newchwang.

The second Customs issue of 1885-88 includes complete mint sheets, blocks and used, as well as four covers and a postcard.



The 1894-97 Dowager Empress Jubilee issue is very strong and the first printing includes five covers, some in combination with French, French China, Hong Kong and German adhesives. There is also a complete set of the rare Mollendorf reprints in blocks of four. Among the provisionals there is a mint marginal block of four of the inverted 10c. on 9c. and eight colourful covers, most of which are in combination with the Consular postage stamps of various European countries. The 1897 provisionals include the inverted 2c. and the S5.

The 1897 Imperial Chinese post lithographs include two mint and one used of each of the dollar values, as well as some attractive covers. The later issues are complete mint and include many covers and among the rarities are the 1912 provisional neutrality overprints in one line on the dollar values and the Republic of China provisional neutrality set complete to \$2 mint and used with an additional copy of the \$5. Later Shanghai and Waterlow printings are well represented.

The Postage Dues include the 1912 Provisional neutrality overprints $\frac{1}{2}c$, to 30c, complete mint and there are also Express letter stamps, the B.R.A. 5c, on $\frac{1}{2}c$, on cover used with the C.E.F. 3p, pair, the overprinted stamps for Kirin, Heilungchang, North Eastern provinces, Sinkiang, Szechwan, Yunnan and Japanese Post Offices in China, the latter including four copies each of the 1908 4 yen and 10 yen.




