ALL BIDS SHALL BE TREATED AS OFFERS MADE UPON THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. Robson Lowe Limited ("Robson Lowe") act in all respects, save where otherwise appears, only as agents for the Seller of each lot and shall not be liable for any default of the Buyer or Seller.
2. The highest bidder acceptable to the Auctioneer shall be the Buyer but if, during or immediately after the sale of the lot, the Auctioneer considers that a dispute has arisen or that there are other reasons for so doing, he may at his absolute discretion immediately put up the lot again for sale.
3. (a) The Auctioneer has the right at his absolute discretion to refuse any bid and to advance and regulate the bidding as he may decide.
 (b) Robson Lowe have the right at their absolute discretion to withdraw or divide any lot or to combine any two or more lots.
 (c) The Seller shall be entitled to place a reserve on any lot, and the Auctioneer or the Auctioneer's agent shall have the right to bid on behalf of the Seller for any lot on which a reserve has been placed.

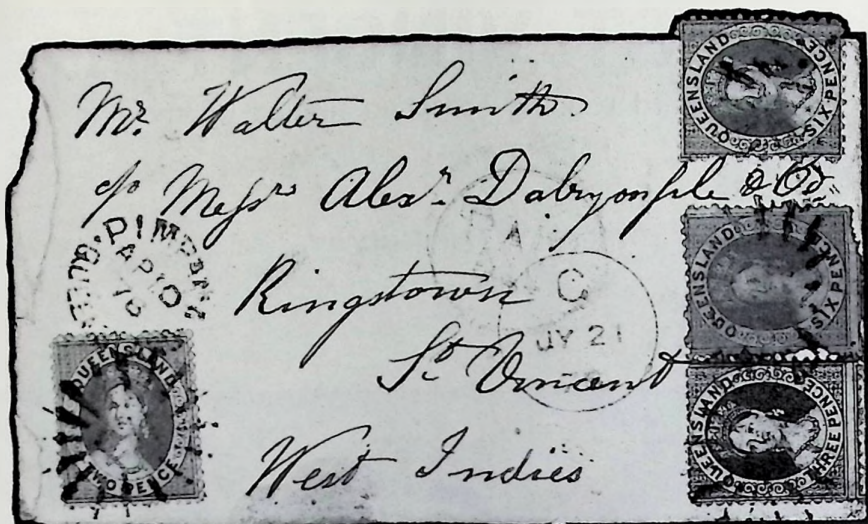

3. V.A.T.

In addition there were many displays to local philatelic societies and study groups.

In 1971, the standard work on St. Vincent was published. This work had been started by Arthur Pierce in 1966 but he had completed less than a fifth of the work when he died. John Messenger led others interested in various aspects of the subject to contribute, wrote half the book and edited the whole. During 1971 to 1975, this volume received five major awards including three gold medals in the philatelic literature class at five international exhibitions. It was at John Messenger's request that these awards were presented to Margaret, the widow of Arthur Pierce.

In 1979 J. L. Messenger signed the Roll of Distinguished Philatelists.
