 of this Catalogne, issued ly Mr. Wm. Lineoln. of 239 , High Holborn, if fomewhat later than usual in raaking its appearance, redeems nny fault of delay hy its accuracy and completeness in every detail. Stamp collecting is necessarily a momparatively modern pnstime, and, until very recently, had but few devotees, who were gene ally regarded as "cranke," or at beat as rillictinti. Of late yearg, however, the educational value of the pursuit has heen recognised, and it is to meet this conviction, and assist collectors, that Mr. Lincoln has issued the very complete catalogue which bears his name. The volume itselt is a handsome ato., consisting of about 150 pages, beautifully printed on toned paper, and giving illustrations of nearly every known stnmp, and sells at 2 s . Ged. In the catalogue the stamps are alphabetically arranged according to the countries and localities from which they issue, beginning at Alphanistan, and ending at Zululand. Each bears a footnote giving tho date of isane, the different colnurs of the different values. the watermarks, perforations amd all information regarding those now in use and those that have gone out of use. In cnses where stamps bear portraits, such ns those issued by the United States wh re nearly every one bears the impress of some man distinguished in American history, full particulars are given of the date of jssue and the partraiture adopted in ench instance. The very rare stamps whirh now command phennmenal prices are dealt with, so that collectors may be guided in their purchase of these prizes. The catalogue is illustrated with 1,800 engravings of stanps, sund conthins an allus of sixteen maps. engraved by W. \& A. K. Johnston, the well known gcographers, showing nearly everystampissuing couvtry in the world; and is so arranged that the collector may distinguish the various issues of every country ataglance. In the futire such a volune as that now produced will be necessary for exhibiting specimens of the stamps of nearly cuery nation, so ?requently are changes now made, sometimes necessarily, as in countries which have experienced a change of constitution, and often, as in America, where the necessity for stich frequent change is not so apparent ; but, at present, philatelists, who have had to pursue their studies to a certain extent in the dark, will find the volume handy and
useful; and a really handsome and useful article is in the hands of the trade, for which there ought to be a large and ready sale.-The Stationery Trades Journal.
