

OPINIONS OF THE PRESS OF THE LINCOLN STAMP ALBUM AND CATALOGUE.

THE LINCOLN POSTAGE STAMP CATALOGUE.—The ninth edition of this Cavalogue, issued by Mr. Wm. Lincoln. of 239, High Holborn, if somewhat later than usual in making its appearance, redeems any fault of delay by its accuracy and completeness in every detail. Stamp collecting is necessarily a comparatively modern pastime, and, until very recently, had but few devotees, who were gene ally regarded as "cranks," or at best as "illctantt. Of late years, however, the educational value of the pursuit has been recognised, and it is to meet this conviction, and assist collectors, that Mr. Lincoln has issued the very complete catalogue which bears his name. The volume itself is a handsome 4to., consisting of about 150 pages, beautifully printed on toned paper, and giving illustrations of nearly every known stamp, and sells at 2s. 6d. In the catalogue the stamps are alphabetically arranged according to the countries and localities from which they issue, beginning at Alghanistan, and ending at Zululand. Each bears a footnote giving the date of issue, the different colours of the different values, the watermarks, perforations and all information regarding those now in use and those that have gone out of use. In cases where stamps bear portraits, such as those issued by the United States where nearly every one bears the impress of some man distinguished in American history, full particulars are given of the date of issue and the portraiture adopted in each instance. The very rare stamps which now command phenomenal prices are dealt with, so that collectors may be guided in their purchase of these prizes. The catalogue is illustrated with 1900 committee of these prizes. logue is illustrated with 1,800 engravings of stamps, and contains an adus of sixteen maps, engraved by W. & A. K. Johnston, the well-known geographers, showing nearly every stamp-issuing country in the world; and is so arranged that the collector may distinguish the various issues of every country at a glance. In the future such a volume as that now produced will be necessary for exhibiting specimens of the stamps of nearly every nation, so frequently are changes now made, sometimes necessarily, as in countries which have experienced a change of constitution, and often, as in America, where the present, philatelists, who have had to pursue their studies to a certain extent in the dark, will find the volume handy and useful; and a really handsome and useful article is in the hands of the trade, for which there ought to be a large and ready sale.—The Stationery Trades Journal.

THE LINCOLN STAMP ALBUM, prepared and published by Mr. William Lincoln, of High Holborn, has room in it for 5,000 stamps; and maps and an illustrated catalogue at the end make it an excellent one of its kind.—Daily T legraph.

The ninth edition—just published—is a most complete album, and gives a description of every known stamp, and compartments of different sizes are arranged for their reception, additional room being left for the insertion of new stamps. It contains a catalogue of Foreign, British and Colonial postage stamps, giving dates of issue, value and colours, and illustrated by one thousand eight hundred engravings of various stamps; it also contains sixteen coloured maps, carefully got up.—The British and Colonial Printer.

Bro. W. Lincoln, of High Holborn, has just issued a new and improved edition of his now justly celebrated Stamp Album and Catalogue, which has, perhaps, done more than anything else to raise stamp collecting from a mere ephemeral pastime into almost the rank of a science. We well remember how in our younger days we used to work comparatively in the dark as to the relative degree of rarity, and even in some cases the nationality of the various postage stamps it was our good fortune to become possessed of, and how eagerly we shuld have devoured the contents of the handsome volume before us, which, in addition to the spaces for the various stamps, contains an exhaustive list, with the value of the various issues of stamps of all countries and periods. The Album he has just published is the third edition, and is similar in shape to its predecessors, but the designs used are quite different, those in the present edition being perfectly original. One gives a representation of a gothic-shaped church window, and a second one is a fac-simile of a circular window in Lincoln Cathederal, the remainder being of a geometrical character; the spaces of all being designed to fit the various shapes of crests and monograms. The leaves are of good stout cardboard, with linen joints and the designs well printed in twelve different colours. It can be had bound in cloth, gilt, 7s. 6d.; French morocco, gilt edges 10s. 6d.; and the best levant morocco, gilt edges, 16s. each.—The Stationery Trades Journal.

Mr. Lincoln, of High Holborn, has issued a New Edition of his Lincoln Crest and Monogram Album, an ingeniously arranged book, likely to be much prized by collectors of Crests and Monograms.—Sanday Times.




