

IMPORTANT!

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

If there is any one custom more than another to which I feel I owe the retention of the good will and continued patronage of those who have dealt with me in the past, it is that of cheerfully refunding money or sending other goods whenever articles ordered are not satisfactory. The good will of old customers brings the trade of new ones. I will esteem it a personal favor on the part of all purchasers, if they will return goods that do not come up to their expectations, and I will immediately forward new selections or refund money, paying postage charges both ways.

HOW TO REMIT.

All money may be sent at my risk and expense if forwarded by any of the four following methods, provided the order amounts to \$1.00 or over, when the cost may be deducted from the amount remitted:

- 1st. Post-office money orders can be obtained from any large post-office, are perfectly safe, and will cost but a trifle.
- 2d. A draft on New York can be obtained of any bank, and is sure to come safely.
- 3d. Express money orders can be obtained at any office of the American, United States, or Wells, Fargo & Co. express companies and made payable at San Francisco, Cal.
 - 4th. By registered letter.

Small sums, less than one dollar should be sent by postal note, or by U. S. postage stamps of any denomination. One cent stamps preferred. Parties sending silver or coin in a letter in payment of goods, must do so at their own risk, as it is neither safe nor advisable. Foreign customers can remit by International money orders, made payable at San Francisco, Cil.

HOW TO ORDER.

The supply of many articles priced on the following pages, owing to my very low prices, will soon be exhausted; in order to avoid any delay in filling your orders, always state whether others can be substituted in case those ordered cannot be supplied.

No matter how often you write, always give your name, post-office, county and state plainly and in full.

Postage.—The postage on all goods mentioned in this catalogue will be paid by me, except on orders less than 25c. in which case postage must be paid by purchaser. Small orders for birds' eggs, less than 50 cents, must contain 6c. for packing and postage.









Missouri Defense Bonds.



No financial scheme ever had a more infirm basis, nor was so short lived as that which gave forth what are known as the Missouri Defense Bonds.

The act under which they were issued was one of the few passed by what is known as C. F.

Jackson's Senate.

Pursuant to a proclamation issued on September 26, 1861, by Claiborne F. Jackson, then Governor of the State of Missouri, the Senate convened at Neosho, Newton county, Missouri, on the

21st day of October, 1861.

The proclamation stated that a state of war existed between Missouri and the Federal Government, and that the purpose of convening the General Assembly was to give the representatives of the people of Missouri an opportunity of determining whether or not they desired to dissolve the constitutional bond which bound them to the Government of the United States.

The session was a short one. Despite the wishes of the Governor and those legislators who desired to see the name of Missouri on the Confederate roll, the strong Union sentiment of the people

saved the State to the Union cause.

The act referred to was entitled "An act to provide for the defense of the State of Missouri," and its first section read as follows: "The sum of ten millions of dollars is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury, or which may hereafter be paid into the treasury, for the purpose of repelling invasion and sustaining the State in her efforts to maintain her sovereignity."

Very few of the bonds were put in circulation, and these few had scarcely any value as an

investment.

Of the many changes of government which have been made by the French people, and no people have been more prolific than they in experiments of that kind, there was none brought on by a revolution which slumbered so long to finally break forth with such great fury as that which at the close of the last century took France from the list of kingdoms, and placed her temporarily among the republics.
