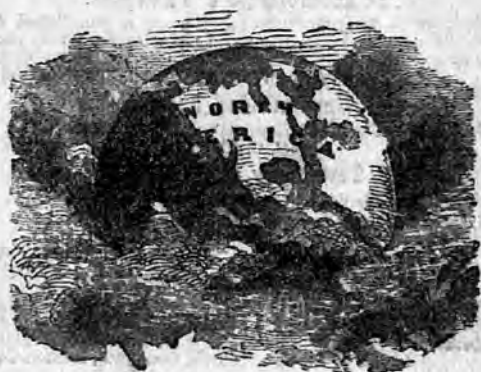

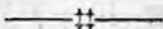

Suet Pudding.—One cup of molasses; one cup of chopped suet; one cup of raisins; one cup of sweet milk; four cups of flour; one teaspoonful of salt one teaspoonful of soda dissolved in the milk. Steam three hours.

Sauce.—Three tablespoonfuls of flour; four tablespoonfuls of sugar; two tablespoonfuls of butter; mix thoroughly and add two cups of boiling water and season to the taste with lemon.

A Nice Breakfast Dish.—Slice a few cold biscuit, or some dry, light bread; fry them slightly in a little butter or rice gravy. Beat three or four eggs with half a teacupful of new milk and a pinch of salt. When the bread is hot, pour the eggs over it and cover for a few minutes; stir lightly, so that the eggs may be cooked. This is a nice dish, besides saving the dry bread.

Cream Pie.—Three eggs; take the yolks; six spoonfuls of sugar; three spoonfuls of flour; one teaspoonful of lemon extract; one pint of sweet milk; cook in a tin on the top of the stove till the thickness of cream.

FROSTING.

Beat the whites of the eggs to a foam; add one teaspoonful of lemon and two teaspoonfuls of sugar. Bake the crusts separate, add the cream and frost them, set them in the oven until they are a light brown.

Cranberry Jelly.—To one quart of cranberries put a quart of water, and boil them to a pulp; mash them with a wooden ladle whilst boiling; then strain them, and, to each pint of the juice, add half a pound of loaf sugar; set it over a slow fire, and stir with a silver spoon; try it often, by taking some of it in a saucer. When cold, if it is not a fine jelly, continue to boil until it is so.

Jelly Cake.—One-half cup butter; two cups of sugar; one cup sweet milk; two eggs; two teaspoons cream tartar; one do. soda. Bake thin. When cold spread with jelly. Roll it up or leave in square cakes.

Cottage Pudding.—One teacup of sugar, butter large as an egg, one cup sweet milk, one egg, one teaspoonful cream tartar, one half soda.

Bake till a light brown color. When the pudding is done, beat the whites of these four eggs to a stiff froth with four tablepoons sugar. Spread currant jelly over the top of the pudding, then spread over this the beaten whites of eggs, and set it in the oven long enough to brown it. Serve cold.

Dried Beef Gravy.—Slice two teacups of dried beef very thin, add one quart of sweet cream; let it boil a minute or two; then thicken with one tablespoonful of flour, one egg, and a little sweet milk, (beat well the thickening before pouring it in,) and stir until done, which will be two minutes. Sweet milk will do in the room of the cream by adding butter. This is a capital dish to serve with baked potatoes.

Custard Pie.—Beat the yolks of four eggs and the white of one with three spoonful of sugar and milk enough to fill the tin. Beat the whites of three eggs to a froth and add one spoonful of sugar, spread over the top when done.

Hemorrhoid Piles.

The symptoms of Piles are painfully familiar to many of us, for the disorder is a very common one. A determination of blood to the lower portion of the rectum, where it accumulates in the form of *bleeding tumors*, is one of the features of the disease. When they are within the bowels the complaint is called *internal piles*, and *external piles* when they appear outside, around the anus. Sometimes tumors are developed which do not bleed. This latter form of Hemorrhoids is known as *blind piles*. Generally there is a sense of weight and fullness in the lower part of the back and loins, with a painful itching at the anus: The act of evacuation produces a burning, cutting pain, which is followed by bearing down and tenesmus. If the complaint be bleeding piles, the little tumors bleed at every motion of the bowels. There are frequently alarming sensations in the head and an irritable mental condition, with great uneasiness in the stomach.

The causes of the malady are various. Among them may be named *drastic purgation*, which is but too often resorted to as a means of relieving habitual costiveness, another source of disease. Horseback exercise carried to excess, tight lacing, lifting and carrying heavy weights, induration of the liver, and sedentary habits have also a strong tendency to generate piles. Females during pregnancy are often afflicted with the disease and suffer greatly from it.

The treatment should be dietetic, as well as medicinal. The food should be of a laxative nature—such as corn bread, rye pudding, unbolted flour, mealy potatoes, milk, ripe fruits, and a little very tender and not overdone meat once a day. The same remarks with regard to diet and treatment which apply to piles are also applicable to *Anal Fistula*, *Falling of the Lower Intestine*, *Fissures*, *Warts*, *Anal Eruptions*, and to all inflammations of the rectum.

Great mischief is sometimes done, in what is called "regular" practice, by *pushing medication too far*. Costiveness should be corrected.
