was the Denver Philatelic society officered by practically the same men as of yore. Internal dissension caused a disruption and again Denver was nothing philatelically. It was at this time that *The Philatelist* appeared for four numbers. Its non-appearance as a publication can be explained by the Lewis Bishop affair.

The L. A. W. meet in Denver in 1894 revived the interest of the collectors and Sept. 15th, 1894 the Q. C. P. S. was organized with J. E. Zahn, E. H. Hall, O. K. Carstarphen, C. C. Harrington, R. M. Gottsleben, E. H. Pierce, J. W. Thoreau, C. B. Bovier, D. A. Callahan, W. J. Stephens, H. R. Foster, L. Meyer, E. W. Plummer, N. Keller and C. F. Musgrave as charter members. At its first election the following officers were elected: Pres., J. E. Zahn; Vice Pres., E. H. Hall; Sec'y., O. K. Carstarphen; Treas., C. C. Harrington; Ex. Supt., J. W. Thoreau; Count. Det., R. M. Gottsleben; Trustees, C. B. Bovier, D. A. Callahan, H. M. Foster, E. H. Pierce and J. W. Stephens. Jos. O. Davis was later appointed Librarian.

In March, 1895, Mr Carstarphen resigned as Secretary and Mr. T. A. Hayward was elected to the vacancy. The society increased very rapidly and at its first convention, held in Denver, Aug. 30th, 1895, had a membership of over 130 members.

The officers elected were: Chas. B. Bovier, Pres.; E. H. Hall, Vice Pres; T. A. Hayward, Sec'y.; J. W. Thareau, Treas.; Jos. S. Davis, Ex. Supt.; R. M. Gottsleben, Count. Det.; Librarian, W. J. Stephens; Trustees, E. S. Engle, A. Rensch, Chas. Couzens, E. H. Pierce.

In January, 1895, the first number of *The Rocky Mountain Stamp* was published with C. C. Harrington as publisher

and Joseph S. Davis as Editor. It was at once chosen as official organ for the Q. C. P. P. and has proved a very satisfactory one. In May, 1895, Mr. Davis retired as editor and J. E. Zahn was appointed editor. Later Mr. Zahn bought the entire good will and now conducts the paper under his own name.

Aug. 14th, 1896. Mr. Oney K. Carstarphen was elected President of the Philatelic Sons of America.

At the second annual convention of the Q. C. P. S. held at Colo. Springs, Sept. 10th, 1896. The following officers were elected: Pres., T. A. Hayward; Vice Pres., E. H. Hall; Sec'y., M. E. Whitehead; Treas., J. W. Thoreau; Ex. Supt., Jos. S. Davis; Count. Det., R. M. Gottes'ben; Librarian, W. J. Stephens; Trustees, C. B. Boyer, C. C. Harrington, Fred Haberl, Capt. C. A. Coolidge and Jacob Gauff.
