Treasurer's Report.

MR. PRESIDENT AND FELLOW-MEMBERS:

For the sixth time I come before you to give an accounting of the funds you have entrusted to my care, and take pleasure in reporting a steady increase in value. Compared item by item, you will find, with few exceptions, a uniform gain. We commenced the year with (omitting cents) \$183 in bank. We now have \$329. Dues in 1900 amounted to \$1,010. This year I have received \$1,097. Entrance fees, \$170, against \$100. Interest, \$60, against \$5 the previous year.

The only unsatisfactory feature is in the matter of house receipts, which have decreased nearly one hundred dollars, owing to the small attendance.

The Club is recognized throughout the civilized world and while members and visitors from afar are certain of a hearty welcome, the city members do not frequent the building as its merits demand.

The sleeping rooms have been occupied the greater part of the year and one member practically makes his home in the house.

The assembly room should never be without an occupant, and I strongly recommend that each governor in turn should be required to spend an evening in the building. This would insure company at all times, at the expense of one evening in nine to each gentleman intrusted with the management of the establishment.

Since the last annual meeting held on Wednesday evening, Dec. 11, 1901, the Governors of the Club have held thirteen meetings.

On October 13, 1902, Mr. Lyman H. Low resigned from the Club and the Governors appointed Mr. J. C. Morgenthau to fill the vacancy on the Board.

The average attendance of the Governors to each meeting was 5 3-13.

Since my last yearly report to you fourteen applications for membership have been

received, all of which have been duly elected and are now subscribing members of the Club, five of them being resident and nine non-residents.

During the year the Club has lost fifteen members, three by reason of death, nine having resigned and three have been dropped for non-payment of dues.

At the present time the Club has a total membership of 128, of which 40 are resident stockholders, 30 are non-resident stockholders, 30 are resident and 28 non-resident subscribing members.

Compared with last year the Club shows a loss of 10 in its resident membership, but has gained nine non-residents, while the total shows a net loss of one member.

The minutes of the Governor's meetings are printed monthly in *The Metropolitan Philatelist*, *The American Journal of Philately*, *The Weekly Philatelic Era*, *Mekeel's Weekly Stamp News*, *The London Philatelist* and *The Stamp Collectors' Fortnightly*.
