### Secretary's Report.

Since the last annual meeting held on Wednesday evening, October 12th, 1904, the Governors of the Club have held 14 meetings, the attendance of each Governor being as follows:

The average attendance to each meeting was 65-7.

On March 13th last, Mr. J. M. Andreini resigned from the Board. Mr. Charles Gregory was appointed by the Governors to fill the vacancy and Mr. P. F. Bruner was elected to the Presidency. Mr. B. von Hodenberg was elected Vice-President.

During the past 12 months 17 applications

for membership have been received, all of which have been favorably acted upon and the applicants duly elected. Of these 15 are resident subscribing members and two are non-resident subscribers.

On April 10th, the Earl of Crawford was elected to honorary membership, he being our first and only honorary member; in addition, a resident subscribing member has become a resident stockholder.

During the year the Club has lost 12 members, eight having resigned and four having been dropped for non-payment of dues. At the present time the Club has a membership of 108, divided as follows: 34 resident stockholders, 19 non-resident stockholders, 29 resident subscribing members, 25 non-resident subscribing members, one honorary member.

Compared with last year the Club shows a gain of eight resident members and a loss of two non-resident, making a total gain of six members during the year.

News, The London Philatelist, The Stamp Collectors' Fortnightly and Gibbons Stamp Weekly.
