## CONSSTITUTTION AND BF-LAWS OF THE <br> St. Louis Philatalic Soc'ty <br> ARTICLE I.

TITLE.
This Association shall be known by the name and style of the St. Lovis Philatelic Society.

## ARTICLE II.

## OBJECTS.

'This Society is formed for the purpose of encouraging and promoting :

First.-The collection and preservation of stamps employed for postal or fiscal purposes, whether issued by National or State Governments, corporations or individuals.

Second.-The study of such characteristics of design, paper, engraving, printing and other details of such stamps, the procuring of such information relating thereto, and to the history and purposes of their use as shall serve to establish their true character, to distinguish the genuine from the false and determine the proper classification and arrangement.

Third.-The exchange of duplicates between memhers under such regulations as may be provided by by-laws.

Fourth.-The undertaking of any such matters as may contribute to tue attainment of the above objects.

## ARTICLE III.

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Section 1. This Sociely shall be compused of three classes of niembers.

1. Active members.
2. Corresponding members.
3. Honorary members.

The first class shall constitute the governing body of the Society, from which all officers and committees must be chosen. No qualifications are required of members of this class, except an election by the Society and the observance of the rules thereof.

The second class shall comprise those who desire to ally themselves with the society and aid in promoting its objects by contributions or information, and enjoy the priviledges of membership, but by reason of residence abroad or distance from the place of meeting, cannot attend to the duties of active members.

The third class shall comprise those who the society may desire to recognize as having rendered exceptional service to the cause of l'hilately hy conferring upon them the distinctive title of honorary members.

Sre. 2. Proposals for membership in either of these classes must be made in writing by an active member of the society, at a regular or called meeting, and shall be referred to the Executive Committee who sliall report thereon the next regular meeting, and the society shall proceed at once, either to ballot thereon or to designate the time when such action will be taken. 'The ballots of three-quarters of the members present, shall be requisite to elect, and no candidate shall be balloted for upon whom the Executive Committee may have made an adverse report. The member making the nomiantion may bowever withdraw the canclidate at any time prior to the casting of the ballot, but no rejected candidate can again be proposed until after the expiration of one year.

Sber. 3. Any member whose conuection with the society shatl be deemed by the Fxecutive Committce injurous to the inter-

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est of the society, may be excluded or otherwise dealt with as the society may resolve, but no action shall be had upon any sach case, unless a full months notice shall have been given to such member by the Executive Committee that they propose to submit the matter for action, stating the character of the charge and the time when action is proposed to be had. No member expelled by the society shall be re-admitted, except by a unanimous vote, notice having been given of the proposed action at the preceding regular meeting.

Sec. 4. Any member in good standing who may desire, may withdraw at any time by giving written notice to the secretary and exbibiting a certificate of the Treasurer, that he has paid all obligations to the Society. Any member in arrears for three months' dues, who shall not pay the same within one month after being notified by the Treasurer, shall be considered to have tendered his resignation and his name shall be striken from the books.

## ARIICLE IV.

offictirs.
Section 1. The Olticers of this Society shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Tressurer and Librarian, who
with two other members shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Sec. 2. The terms of all officers shall be for one year from the date of the annual election, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

Sec. 3. The Presirlent shall preside at all meetings of the society and on all committees

Skc. 4. The Vice-President will assist the I'resident in the discharge of his duties and in his absence coniluct the meetings of the society. In the absence of both the President and Vice-l'resident a temporary Chairman slaall be appointed.

Sk.c. $\mathrm{D}^{2}$. 'The Secretary shall keep accurate tninutes of all transactions and proceedings of the sociely. He stall condarct all its correspondence, keeping copies thereof in a book provided for that purpose. All letters received hy him in his official capacity, sliall he filed among the archives of the society.

Sr.c. 6. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all moneys; provided that no moneys shall be expended by him, except by resolution therefor, duly adopted by the society. He shall keep a strict account, in writing, of all moneys which he may so re-
ceive and disburse, and his books of accounts shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of the society or any of its members.

Szc. 7. The Librarian shall take charge of all books and papers belonging to the society, and shall keep the same in good order.

Sec. 8. The Executive Cominittee shall act as a standing committee for the transaction of any business that does not require the action of the whole society, or which may be duly referred to it by the society. It shall inquire int) the merits of all persons proposed for membership and report thereon. It shall take charge of such duplicates as may be offered for exchange under the By-Laws of the Society and conduct all exchanges in accordance therewith, and may at any time submit any matter for the consideration of the society, taking precedence of all other business. Four members of this committee shall conotitute a quorun for the transaction of business.

Sec. 9. The secretary, treasurer and librarian shall turn over at the termination of their othices all letters, moneys, vouchers, documents or other papers belouging to the society to their successors.

## ARTICLE V. <br> ELECTIONS.

Section 1. 'I'he annual election for officers shall take place at the regnlar meeting in July. Whenever a vacancy occurs in any of the offices, the same sball be filled at the next regular meeting.

Sec. 2. The election of ofticers shall be by ballot, a majority of a whole number of votes cast being necessary for a choice.

## ARTICLE VI. <br> meletings.

Section 1. The regular meetings of the Society shall be held on the second and fourth Saturday of each month from October to April, and on the second Saturday of the remaining months, at such time and place as may be lesignated by By-Laws,

Special meetings shall be called by the president, at the written request of three members, due notice of which must be given by the Secrelary.

Skc. 2. Five active members shall constitute a quorum to transact all the necessary business of the society.

## AR'IICLE VII.

subsoriptions.
Saction 1. The anuual subscription
for active and corresponding members shall be $\$ 1.00$ per year, one-fourth of whict is payable in advance at the first meetings in January, April, July and October, allt no assessments shall be marle at any time, except by the consent in writing of two-thirds of all inembers of the class to be effected.

## ARITCLE VIII.

From time to time as cecasion shall require, By-Laws may be passed for the management and direction of the affairs of the society and the good govermment thereof.

## ARTICLL IX.

This Constitution shall not be altered, modified or amended, except at a regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present, and no action shall be taken or valid unless the amendment proposed, or the substitute or amendment thereof shall have been submitted to the society. in writing at least one monith previons to such meeting, but adjournment may he had to any time, and such proposed amendment male the special order of hosiness.

## BY-LAWS.

I. Any of these By-laws may be temporarily suspunded at any meeting of the society by the unanimous vote of the members present.

## exfecutive committee.

IV. The Executive Committee may if they find it more conducive to the transaction of business sub-divide itself into sub-committees to which certain classes of the regular business of the committee may be intrusted, such as the department of exchanges, investigations of the qualifications of candidates, etc. . but such sub-committee shall report to the whole committee before report is made to the Society.

PLACE OF MEETING.
V. The meetings of the society shall he held at the office of the Philatelic Publishing Co., Room 71, Turner Building, unless otherwise directed by the executive committee.

TIME OF MEFTING.
VI. The first regular meeting of the society in each month shall be at $3: 30$ o'clock in the afternoon, and the second meeting of the month shall be at $\times$ o'clock
ill the evening at the room of the society, unless otherwise specified by the Society at the previous regular meeting, and in case of a clange, notice shall be given to all active members who were not present at the time of making the change.

## sales and exchanges.

VII. No stamps shall be bought, sold or exchanged at the place of meeting of the Society during any of the meetings of the Society, except during the recess and in accordance with the following rules.

## RULES.

Rule 1. All stamps shall be placed on sheets and priced, the postage stamps by Durbins' catalogue and the U. S, revenue stamps by Sterlings' catalogue. 'These prices being the exchunge basis, All sheets shall bear the owners' name.

Rule 2. All stamps sold for cash shall be at $2 \overline{5}$ per cent. discount from the exchange prices.

Rule 3. These sheets sliall be in charge of the Librarian, the members having access to them at his offlce. No sheets to be taken from the room.

Ruar 4. The Librarian shall deduct 10 per cent. from all cash sales, for the benefit of the society.

Role 5. The Librarian shall have the right to refuse any undesirable stamps, returning same to owner.

Rule 6. Each member may remove such stamps as he desires from any of the exchange sheets, marking the space with his initials.

At the first meeting of each month, each member shall be credited with the value of all stamps taken from his sheets whether by sale or exchange, and charged with the stamps taken by him, and shall pay any amount due from him to the Librarian, who shall therefrom pay to each exchanger the balance due him.
