Continued from page 43, First Annual Report. Meetings held in the Assembly Room of the Board of Trade, unless otherwise stated.

Forty-Second Meeting, September 15th, 1893.

Vice-President Hayden presiding, six members and one visitor in attendance.

A paper on "The Mexican Postal System," by C. W. Mexia, was read, and afterwards discussed.

Forty-Third Meeting, October 20th, 1893.

President Major Dutton presiding, eleven members and three visitors in attendance.

A paper on "The Collecting of Postal Cards," by George H. Watson, was read, and afterwards discussed.

An auction sale of stamps followed.

Forty-Fourth Meeting, November 17th, 1893.

President Major Dutton presiding, eleven members and one visitor in attendance.

An exhibition of stamps was held, consisting of the collections of the Society, of Major Dutton, Messrs. Steves and Heusinger.

The meeting was held at the residence of Major Dutton.

Third Annual General Meeting, December 15th, 1893.

President Major Dutton presiding, thirteen members and seven visitors in attendance.

The proposition of the Texas Philatelic Union to amalgamate with the Alamo City Philatelic Society was accepted.

The annual reports of the Secretary-Treasurer, Librarian, and Manager of the Department of Sales and Exchanges were read and accepted.

Forty-Sixth Meeting, January 19th, 1894.

Vice-President Hayden presiding, eight members and one visitor in attendance.

A paper on "The Coahuila State Tax Stamps," by Pablo Lopez Bosque was read, and afterwards discussed.

Forty-Seventh Meeting, February 16th, 1894.

President Major Dutton presiding, eight members in attendance.

A general discussion of philatelic subjects took place and a number of rare stamps were shown.

Forty-Eighth Meeting, March 16th, 1894.

President Major Dutton presiding, seven members and three visitors in attendance.

A paper on "The Invention and Introduction of the Postal Card," by Adolph Lohmeyer, was read and afterwards discussed by those present, following which Messrs. Cervantes and Hensingler showed their collections of the Revenue Stamps of Mexico.

Forty-Ninth Meeting, April 20th, 1894.

Vice-President Hayden presiding, eight members and two visitors in attendance.

An auction sale of stamps was held.

Third Anniversary Meeting, April 28th, 1894.

President Major Dutton presiding, thirteen members and three visitors in attendance.

The evening was spent in discussing subjects relating to the Society, etc., after which Major Dutton and Mr. Steves showed their collections of stamps.

The meeting was held at the residence of Major Dutton.

Fifty-First Meeting, May 18th, 1894.

Mr. Jermy presiding, five members and one visitor in attendance.

The evening was spent in discussing philatelic matters, after which Mr. Lazo showed his collection of foreign stamps.

Fifty-Second Meeting, June 15th, 1894.

Mr. Huberich presiding, seven members in attendance.

Appointments of Mr. Bosshardt as Manager of the Department of Sales and Exchanges, Mr. Roemer a member of the Governing Committee and Mr. Cervantes a member of the Literary Board, were made to fill vacancies, after which a general discussion of Society matters took place.
