TERMS OF EXCHANGE.

In order that our exchange relations may be mutually satisfactory, it is necessary that the following rules be strictly understood and adhered to:

1. The following list is compiled for our correspondents who have stamps in quantity which they desire to exchange for Stamps, Albums, Catalogues and Scrap Pictures, such as are mentioned herein.

2. A detailed list of all consignments, with prices annexed, must be sent with letter separate from the package. The exchange order should be of at least double the amount required, to allow for such stamps as we may be unable to supply, or which can only be supplied for cash. In sending parcels of common used stamps the exchange order will be expected to be for about the same class of stamps. We could not undertake to supply unused and scarce stamps in exchange for common used ones. If in any case the selection is left to us, we shall send the best possible exchange, giving you advantage of any special bargains we may have to offer.

3. Only such books and periodicals as are offered in this list will be given in exchange for stamps; orders for others must be accompanied with remittance.

4. We shall be glad to buy any stamps which are not enumerated and priced in this list, it being impossible to mention all. Such stamps should be sent to us on approval, with price named; if same is not satisfactory they will be promptly returned.

5. Prices quoted herein are for either used or unused stamps, unless otherwise specified. Where the denominations are not all enumerated, it is understood that the stamps shall be fairly assorted, and must not consist entirely of the commonest varieties.

6. We cannot attempt to assort and value consignments; they must be assorted and each lot put up in a separate package according to the detailed list, so they can be easily examined. Stamps must in no case be stuck on sheets; no single transaction must be less than \$3.00. Too much care cannot be taken in wrapping and addressing. If possible use linen envelopes, and in no case use pasteboard boxes; they are sure to become broken, and the contents more or less damaged and possibly lost.

7. All packages must be sent by letter postage, fully prepaid and registered. Name and address must be plainly written on the outside of each package, and should also be placed on a card on the inside. Letter with detailed list and order should be sent under separate cover. To avoid delay in the Custom House, more than 3,500 stamps should not be sent in one package; if you have more to send put them in several packages. Stamps must be in good condition; imperfect and soiled ones are useless. Postal cards, whether entire or cut, are not wanted.

8. Postage must be sent in low denomination stamps of your country to prepay either the stamps ordered in exchange or to return your package if it does not meet with our approval. Prices named in this list are for exchange and not cash. These prices are subject to change without notice, and we reserve the right of returning consignments which are not sent in accordance with our rules. We buy scarce stamps for cash, but they must in all cases be submitted for our approval, accompanied by your price; we cannot quote prices from a list, as so much depends upon the condition.

9. Exchange business as per these terms is done by mail only. Letters and parcels must be sufficiently prepaid; if not, they are invariably refused. We particularly request that your full name and address be plainly written on every communication. We shall not hold ourselves responsible for letters or parcels lost in transit, but take every possible precaution. Our exchange shall in all cases be sent by registered mail where value of same is \$3.00 or over.

TAUSCH BEDINGUNGEN.

Um unser Tauschgeschäft zur gegenseitigen Befriedigung führen zu können, müssen folgende Regeln gefolgt werden.

1° Die folgende Liste ist für solche Correspondenten bereitet, welche grosse Posten von Marken haben die sie gegen andere Marken, Alben, Catalogen und Bilder, wie unten angeführt, umzutauschen wünschen.

2° Ein volles Verzeichniss der Sendungen nebst Preisen muss in einem besonderen Brief geschickt werden. Die Tauschordre sollte um das doppelt gewünschte lanten, falls wir einige der Marken nicht zur Hand hätten, oder sie nur baar verkaufen könnten. Für gemeine, gebrauchte Marken können wir nur gleiche schicken; seltene und ungebrauchte Marken können wir unmöglich für gemeine umtauschen. Wenn die Wahl uns überlassen wird, werden wir immer unser Bestes thun, und vortheilhafte Posten in unseren Sendungen einschliessen.

3° Nur die Bücher und Zeitungen die unten angeführt sind werden für Marken umgetauscht; wenn andere gewünscht werden muss stets die Bezahlung die Ordre begleiten.

4° Wir sind bereit auch solche Marken zu kaufen die hier nicht angeführt sind, da es unmöglich ist sie alle zu nennen. Solche Marken können uns zur Auswahl, mit den Preisen geschickt werden; wenn unbefriedigend, werden sie gleich zurückgeschickt.

5° Unsere Preisen sind für gebrauchte oder ungebrauchte Marken, wenn nicht anders angegeben. Wenn die Werthe nicht alle angeführt sind, so ist es verstanden dass die Marken gut gemischt sein sollen; die Auswahl muss nicht nur gemeine Marken einschliessen.

6° Es ist uns ganz unmöglich die Marken zu sortiren. Jedes Posten muss besonders sortirt werden dem Verzeichniss gemäss, so dass es leicht untersucht werden kann. Niemals sollten Marken auf Papier geklebt werden. Umtausch für weniger als \$3.00 ist nicht angenommen. Die Marken sind sorgfältig zu adressiren und einzupacken; wenn möglich sollten Leinwand Converte gebraucht, niemals aber Pappschachteln, da sie gewöhnlich gebrochen werden, und die Marken gehen dann verloren.

7° Alle Sendungen per Briefpost, franco und eingeschrieben. Der Name und die Adresse müssen auf jedem Packet erscheinen und auch auf einer inwendigen Karte. Der Brief mit dem Verzeichniss der Marken sollte separat gesendet werden. Um Verspätungen beim Zollamt zu verhindern, sollten nicht mehr als 3,500 Marken in einem Packet eingeschlossen werden; wenn man mehr umzutauschen hat, so schicke man sie in verschiedenen Packeten. Alle Marken müssen in gutem Zustand sein; zerrissene oder beschmutzte Exemplare sind ganz nutzlos. Post Karten wünschen wir nicht zum Tausch.

8° Jede Sendung sollte von ungebrauchten Marken niedrigen Werthes begleitet werden um den Tausch zu frankiren oder die Marken wenn nothwendig retourniren zu können. Die Preise hier angeführt sind für Tausch und nicht für baare Bezahlung; sie können immer verändert werden. Wir behalten das Recht alle Sendungen zu retourniren, wenn unsere Regeln nicht gefolgt werden sind. Seltene Marken kaufen wir für baare Bezahlung; solche Marken sind an uns nebst dem Preis zu schicken. Den Preis können wir selbst nicht angeben.

9° Tauschgeschäft unter solchen Bedingungen ist nur per Briefpost geführt. Briefe und Packete müssen hinreichend frankirt werden, sonst nehmen wir sie nicht an. Es ist nothwendig dass Name und Adresse auf und in jedem Brief und Packet erscheinen. Wir sind nicht verantwortlich für Briefe oder Sendungen die in der Post verloren gehen, obgleich wir alle möglichen Vorsichtsmassregeln nehmen. Unsern Tausch werden wir immer einschreiben lassen wenn derselbe mehr als \$3.00 beträgt.

CONDITIONS D'ÉCHANGE.

Afin que nos échanges puissent se faire à la satisfaction mutuelle des parties, les règles suivantes doivent être comprises et observées:

1^o La liste suivante est préparée pour ceux de nos correspondants qui possèdent des quantités de timbres à échanger contre d'autres timbres, albums, catalogues ou images, mentionnés ci-dessous.

2^o Une liste de taillée avec prix attachés et sous enveloppe spéciale doit accompagner chaque envoi. La commande pour échange devrait être au moins du double de ce qu'on désire, pour parer aux timbres qui ne sont plus en magasin ou qui ne peuvent être livrés que contre argent comptant. En échange de timbres communs, nous ne pouvons donner que des timbres de la même nature, et non des timbres neufs et rares. Lorsqu'on s'en remet à nous pour le choix, nous faisons toujours de notre mieux accordant à nos clients les avantages des offres spéciales que nous pouvons avoir à faire.

3^o Les livres et les journaux mentionnés dans cette liste sont les seuls que nous envoyons en échange de timbres; les commandes pour d'autres doivent être accompagnées de leur montant en argent comptant.

4^o Nous sommes toujours prêts à acheter les timbres qui ne sont pas énumérés ici; c'est impossible de les mentionner tous. Ces timbres—là peuvent nous être envoyés au choix avec prix attachés; s'ils ne nous vont pas, nous les renverrons promptement.

5^o Les prix mentionnés ci-après sont pour timbres neufs ou vieux à moins d'une note spéciale. Quand les différentes valeurs ne sont pas toutes énumérées cela signifie que les timbres doivent être bien assortis et ne pas consister en timbres des variétés les plus communes seulement.

6^o Nous ne pouvons ni classer ni évaluer les envois; ils doivent être assortis d'avance, chaque variété séparément, d'après la liste de taillée qui les accompagne, afin que nous puissions les vérifier facilement. Il ne faut jamais coller les timbres sur des feuilles; aucune affaire ne peut se faire pour moins de \$3.00. On ne peut prendre trop de soins dans l'emballage et l'adresse. Si possible on devrait se servir d'enveloppes de drap, et en tous cas jamais de boîtes de carton, car elles sont presque toujours défoncées, et leur contenu plus ou moins endommagé sinon complètement perdu.

7^o Tout envoi doit se faire par lettre recommandée et franco. Le nom et l'adresse doivent se trouver lisiblement écrits sur chaque paquet, et devraient être reproduits sur une carte placée à l'intérieur du paquet. La lettre contenant la liste de taillée et la commande d'échange doit être mise à la poste séparément. Afin d'éviter tout retard à la douane on ne devrait jamais expédier plus de 3,500 timbres dans un seul et même paquet; si l'on désire en envoyer d'avantage on peut le faire en différents paquets. Les timbres doivent être en bonnes conditions, ceux qui sont déchirés ou salis ne nous sont d'aucune utilité. Nous ne pouvons faire usage de cartes postales, ni entières, ni coupées.

8^o Des timbres de basse dénomination doivent accompagner chaque envoi pour affranchir les timbres envoyés comme échange ou pour renvoyer ceux dont nous ne pouvons nous servir. Les prix mentionnés ci-après sont pour échange et non pour argent comptant. Ces prix sont sujets à être changés sans autre avis; nous nous réservons le droit de refuser tout envoi expédié contrairement aux présentes règles. Nous désirons acheter contre argent comptant des timbres rares; ceux-ci doivent nous être envoyés pour inspection, et toujours accompagnés de leur prix; nous ne pouvons en aucun cas faire de prix d'avance, car tout dépend de la condition du timbre.

9^o Nos relations d'échange d'après ces conditions se font par lettre seulement. Les lettres doivent être suffisamment affranchies, sans quoi elles seront invariablement refusées. Nous requérons spécialement le nom et l'adresse de notre correspondant tout au long et lisible. Nous ne sommes pas responsables des lettres ou paquets perdus en route, cependant nous prenons toujours toutes les précautions possible. Notre échange sera toujours enregistré dès que sa valeur dépassera \$3.00.

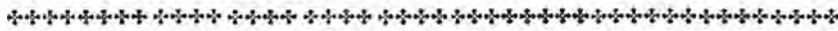

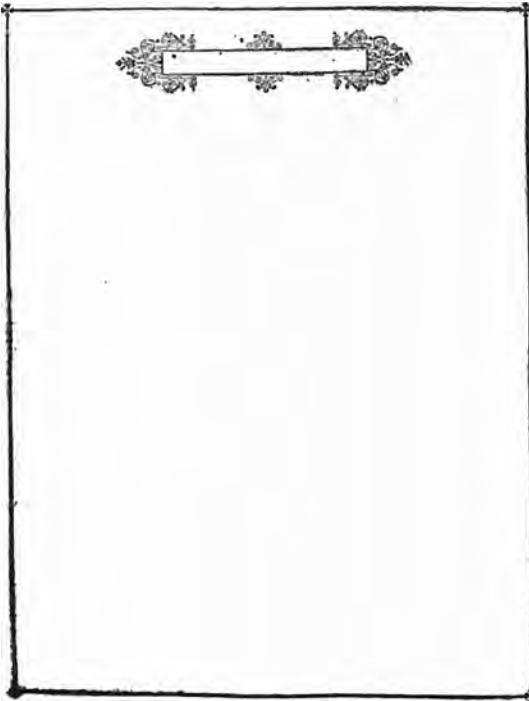
