I have had placed in my hands for sale what I believe to be the only sheets of these stamps ever printed that have been preserved. One entire sheet of 100 stamps of each value. The originals are priced in the 59th Edition of Standard Catalogue as follows: The 15 cent, \$200; 24 cent, \$200; 30 cent, \$600; and up to this time no copy of the 90 cent has been catalogued, seen or priced. These are space fillers. There are places for them in your album which are, and probably will forever remain vacant, unless you secure one of these sets to fill them. They belong in the 1869 set as much as do the others, and no set is complete without them. When the opportunity to fill these spaces presents itself, you should avail yourself of it.
