REMITTANCE must in all cases accompany Order, which may be made as follows :—Post Office or Postal Orders, Bankers' Draft or Bank Notes at the current rate of Exchange. Small amounts may be made up of unused stamps of *lowest* current value, EXCEPT STAMPS OF CANADA AND CONTINENTAL COUNTRIES, WHICH WILL IN NO CASE BE ACCEPTED. Twopence extra for registration should be enclosed if required, as I do not *under any circumstances whatever* hold myself responsible for letters, parcels, &c., lost in transit either from me or to me.

Correspondence in English and French **only**.

Special Notice to Correspondents Abroad.—It being prohibited by the postal authorities to send stamps by Book Post to *Countries in the Postal Union*, a sufficient amount must therefore be sent in all cases to cover the cost of letter-rate to those countries, (excepting always those places where a Parcel Post has been established, and when the parcel exceeds 1lb. in weight it would be advisable to send the stamps by that medium), as the Post Office absolutely refuses to take stamps sent by Book Post to Countries in the Postal Union, and they are returned to sender if found in the mails. If sufficient postage by letter or parcel rate is *not* enclosed the *stamps* will be sent by **LETTER rate, UNPAID**. The attention of Correspondents is therefore particularly directed to the above notice.

Wholesale Parcels or Sheets of Rare Stamps sent on approval against deposit or satisfactory ENGLISH References.

Price List post free on receipt of postage. Exchange List post free 2d.

Letters must in all cases be prepaid or they will be invariably refused. Business conducted by post *only*. **Letters requiring a reply must contain sufficient postage for return**, or they will not be attended to, and those containing coin *must* be registered. Orders above 20s. are sent in registered envelopes, all others *not* registered unless 2d. for that purpose is sent. Agents wanted in Schools, Colleges, &c., and abroad. Good commission.

I shall always be glad to receive some stamps of each of any new issue unused when any should appear, and a quantity of Provisionals or surcharged stamps especially desired, and for all rarities a premium will be given.

Although my stock is very large, it may happen that some goods may be sold out at the time of ordering, it is therefore advisable to send a supplementary list to avoid disappointment, otherwise cash will be returned, if desired.

Good collections of 1000 varieties and upwards purchased for cash, providing they are sent on approval with lowest cash price, and sufficient postage for return if not approved of.

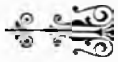

As I have always in stock a number of the Rarest Stamps, advanced collectors are respectfully solicited to send a list of their wants for quotations, which shall receive the best attention. Plate-marks, water-marks, and minor varieties also kept in stock. Commissions taken for the London periodical Stamp Auction Sales. Terms moderate. Catalogues sent on application. Collectors wishing to secure Rarities for their collections as they may be offered for sale are invited to send a list of their wants and prices they are willing to pay, Stamps of the rarest kind being continually sold by auction. Collectors wishing to purchase collections complete are invited to make application for same.

OPINIONS OF THE PRESS.

Mr. Brown's Etchings.—Mr. William Brown, of Salisbury, has sent us a set of examples of his etchings, a series of which he is publishing in illustration of his own beautiful Cathedral City, Canterbury, Edinburgh, and other picturesque scenes. The precincts of Sarum supply excellent subjects for the etcher's needle, notably the two gates (Exeter Street and High Street), which Mr. Brown has reproduced with much artistic feeling. Then there is a delicious "bit" in the picture of the old sculptured and many-niched Christ Church Gateway at Canterbury, with its time-worn, crumbling aspect, very felicitously rendered in the engraving before us. A good contrast, on the other hand, is afforded in the stern drawing of the Canon Gate, Edinburgh, and the lonely grandeur of his Stonehenge.—*The Bookseller.*

SOME NEW ETCHINGS OF SALISBURY.—Mr. William Brown, of Salisbury, to whose etchings of local objects of interest we have frequently referred in terms of praise, has issued several additional prints, which will be found very pretty reasonable presents for those wishing to give their friends some memento of the ancient and picturesque city of Salisbury. These new etchings include admirable views of the Old George Inn, the Joiners' Hall, and the old house in Minster Street, now occupied by Mr. Carter. The plates are carefully and artistically executed, and excellently printed on India paper. Another etching gives, in an effectively arranged group, six views of the Cathedral, the Canonry, the Training College, Mrs. Hussey's house, and Old Gate place, in Castle Street. The etchings, which are as cheap as they are pretty, are published locally by Messrs. Brown and Co., the Canal, Salisbury. They are issued separately or in a case with four other earlier etchings of the series.—*Salisbury and Winchester Journal.*

NEW PRINTS.—Mr. Brown's "Eight Etchings of Salisbury" (Salisbury: Brown) is published at six shillings, and contains some clever and taking work; the "Joiners' House", the "George Inn," and the "Old House in Minster Street," are perhaps the best of the set, but the "High Street Gate" and "St. Thomas's Church"

will have plenty of admirers, and a good deal might be said for Mr. Brown's view of the "Cathedral."—*Art Journal.*

We have received from Mr. William Brown, of Castle-street, Salisbury, a series of really charming etchings delineating the ancient city and Cathedral of Salisbury. There are also to be obtained, from the same publisher, four views of the older parts of Edinburgh, and an excellent etching of Christ Church Gateway, Canterbury.—*The Artist.*

Mr. Brown, a local artist, has selected for illustration some of the most notable relics of antiquity in the old cathedral town, and although his etchings vary in excellence, they all display power and force of expression, while some are very delicately finished.—*Pall Mall Gazette.*

"A series of etchings of Salisbury," by Mr. W. Brown (Salisbury), comprise several meritorious views of old houses and churches in that city, but they are somewhat heavily etched and printed. Apart from these defects, which are not considerable, the prints are well worth having. We prefer the "Six Views of Old Houses and the Cathedral," as comprising some capital etchings of desirable subjects. "Joiners' Hall" deserves much praise; it is full of colour, and shows a crisp and firm touch and the taste and tact which were in Mr. Bird's etchings of Glasgow. Perhaps the best etching is that of "St. Thomas' Church," most excellent, but a little heavy.—*Athenæum.*

Mr. Brown, of Salisbury, has published "Eight Etchings of Salisbury," which contain some clever and taking work. They include the "Joiners' House," the "George Inn," "High Street Gate," "St. Thomas' Church," "Old House in Minster Street," and a plate called "Salisbury," made up of vignettes. They are all beautifully executed.—*Llangollen Advertiser.*
