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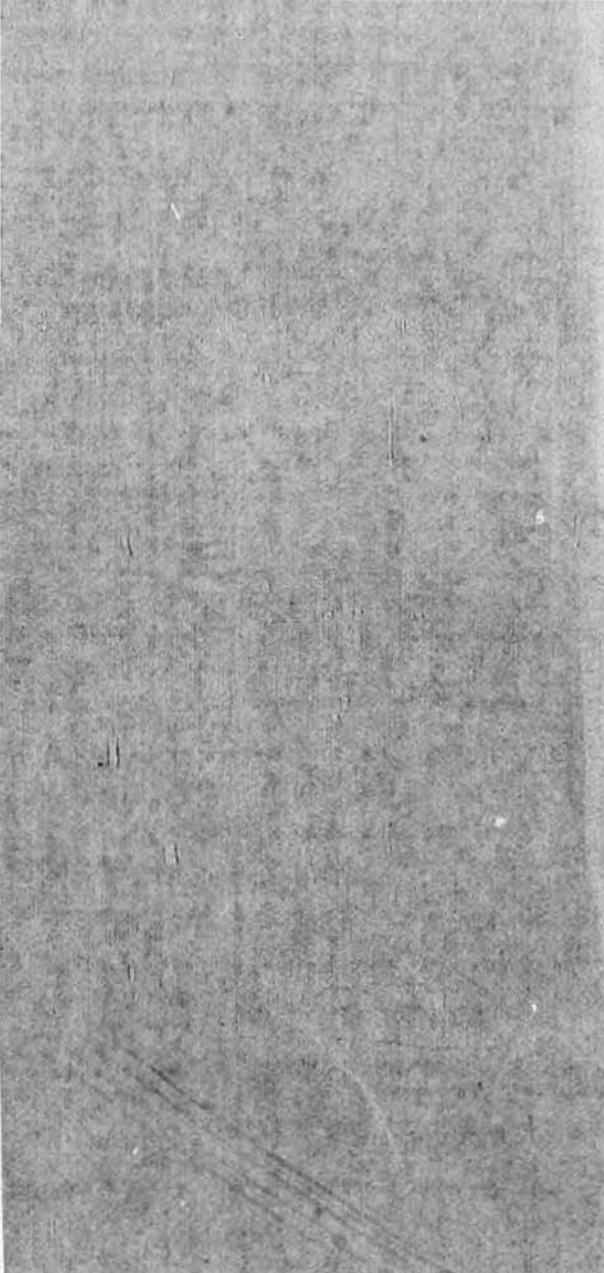

HYDROMETER LABELS.

A hydrometer is a glass instrument used for determining the specific gravity of liquids. Those used in the manufacture of spirituous liquors contain a label inserted under the supervision of the Internal Revenue authorities certifying to their accuracy.

All these labels are printed in black and with the exception of No. 2 and No. 3, bear the portrait of Washington. These two bear the portraits of the Commissioners.

CIGARETTE STAMPS.

From 1868 to March, 1879, cigarettes were put up in packages of 500, the tax upon which was paid by strip stamps which do not come within the limitations of this list. The act of 1879 brought into existence four new stamps, strip stamps for packages of 50 and 100 respectively and rectangular stamps for 10 and 20 cigarettes. It is to the rectangular stamps that we confine our list. Unless otherwise noted all are rouletted.

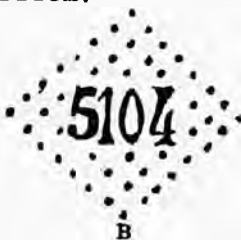
During the Crimean war a cancellation was made use of which was similar to the above but containing in the center a star with an "o" on each side. o*o
