The Departunent is prepared to furnish, upon application, at face value, specimens of adhesive postage stamps issued under its auspices, as follows:

## ORDINARY STAMPS FOR USE OF THE PUBLIC.

2. Fasue of 1851 .--Denominations, $1,3,5,10,12,24,30$, and 90 cents; also two separate designs of 1 -cent carrier stamps. Value of set, sic. $77 .{ }^{2}$

 5. Is 8 ue of 1870 , (current series.)-Derominatome, $1,2,{ }_{2}$ (brown, 2 , (vermilion,) $3,5,6,7,10,12$, $15,24,30$, and 90 cents. Value of set, 2.07 .

3. Treasury Dcpartment.-Denominations, $1,2,3,6,7,10,12,15,94,30$, and 90 cents. Value of set, 82 .

## NEWSPAPER AND PERIODICAL STAMPS.

1. Trsue of 1865 .-Denominations, 5,10 , and 25 cents. Value of set, 40 cents.
2. Is8ue of 1874 .-Denominations, $2,3,4,6,8,9,10,12,24,36,48,60,72,84,96$ cents, $\mathcal{P} 1.92$, $* 3,86,89, * 12, \$ 24, * 36,48$, and ${ }^{*} 60$. Valne of set, 8204.66 .

The 1847 and 1851 stamps are obsolete, and no longer receivable for postage. The sulseguent issues of ordinary stamps are still valicl. The newspaper and periodical stamps of 1865 are also uncarrent; thuse of the issue of 1874 can he used only by pulishers and news arents for matter mailed in bulk, under the Act of June 23, 1874. The ofticial stamps camnot be used extept for the official buefress of the particular Department for which provided.

All the specimens furzished will be ungumed; and the official stamps will have printed across the face the word "Specimen", in small type. It will lee nseless to apply for gnumed stamp, or for official stamps with the word "Specimen" omitted.

The stamps will be sold liy sets, and application must not be made for less than one full set of huy isbue, except the State Department official stamps and the newspaper and periodical ptamps of the issue of 1874 . The regular set of the former will embrace all the denominatione, from 1 cent to 90 cents,
 or sold separately from the regular set, an denired.

The newspaper and periodical stamps of 1874 will be sold in quantities of not less than two dullars' worth in each case, of any denomination or denominations that may he orlered.

Stamps of any one denomination of any issue will be sold in 'quantities of two dollars' worth and upward.

Under no circumstances will stamps bo sold for less than their face value.
Payment must invariably be made in advance in current funds of the United States. Mutilated carrency, internal revenuo and postage stamps, bank cherks and dratts, will not be necepted, bat will in all cases be returned to the sender.

To insure greater certainty of transmission, it is atrongly urged that remittances be made either by money order or registered letter. Ipplicants will also include "sulficient umont for return postuge and registry fee, it being desirable to send the stamps by registered letter. Losses in the mails or by any mode of tranemission inust be at the risk of the purehaser.

No other stamps will be sold than are ineluded in the above list; and specimens of stamped envelopes, (either ofticial or ordinary;) or of envelope stanps, fustal cards, or used stampr, will not he furnished in any chace.
