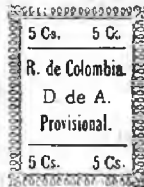

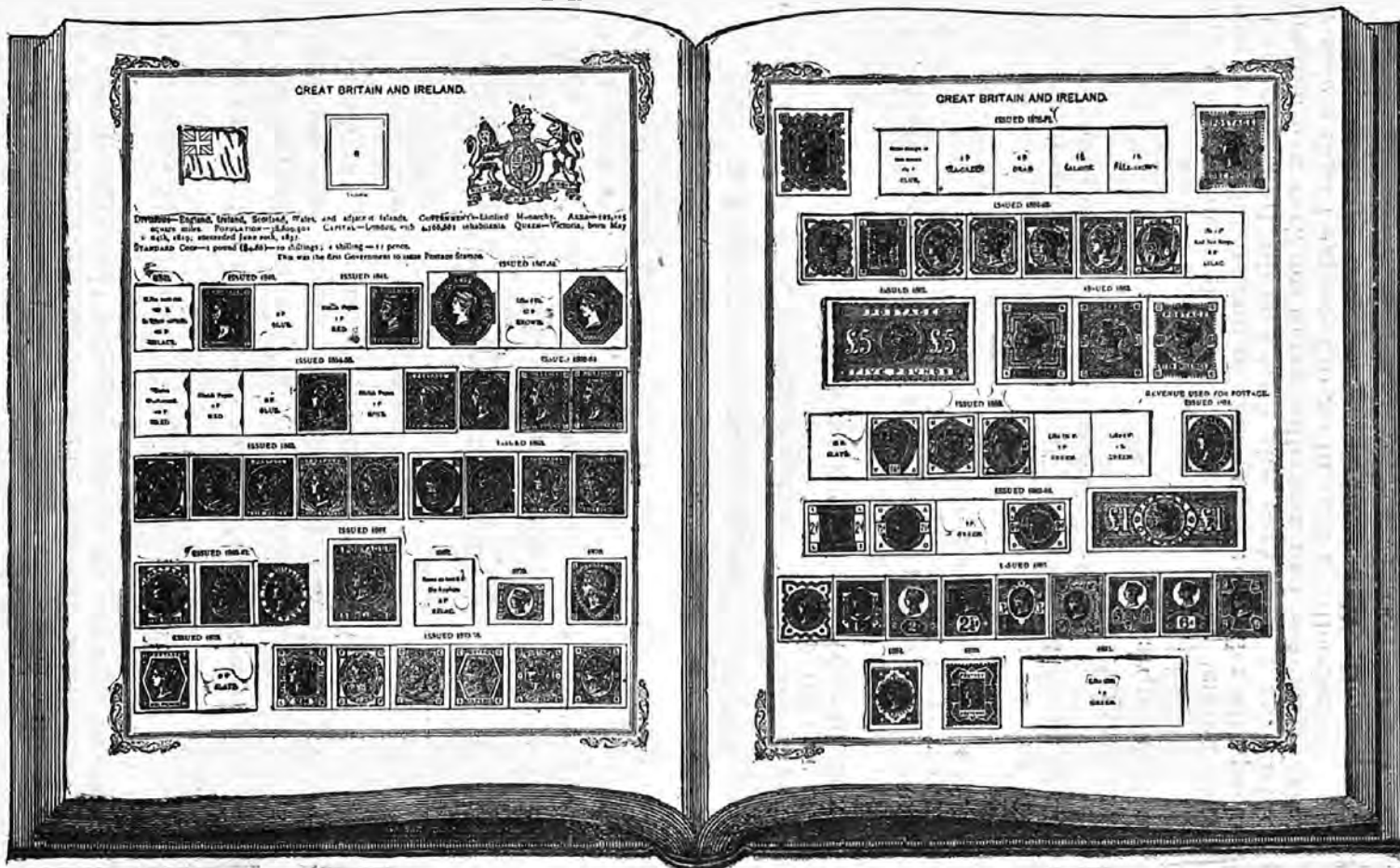

Over one-half of our entire stamp business is carried on through this department alone, and the great advantage of transacting business on this basis is, that each collector has an opportunity of examining a stamp before paying for the same; furthermore, he is entitled to a discount by purchasing in this way that is not allowed when sending a specific list.

Our practice is to make all our stamps as low as possible regardless of quotations in various catalogues; sometimes we are enabled to import a certain variety, which is perhaps listed at twice the price we could afford to sell and make reasonable profit; in such cases we reduce the prices accordingly. On the contrary it is frequently a necessity for us to buy stamps of certain countries which are difficult to obtain, but are especially required to keep our assortment of the superior grade, for which it has become famous; in these instances quotations are somewhat higher.

All things considered, our prices will compare favorably with those of any other firm.

It is our purpose to treat each request for sheets with care, and endeavor to give satisfaction to all whom it is our privilege to serve.

The systematic arrangement of all details relative to this portion of our business, is such that mistakes of any kind are rare, and due attention given to all worthy communications.

It is not our object to advertise enormous discounts, and disappoint our customers with an inferior selection of stamps consisting principally of reprints, bogus surcharges, and specimens of suspicious character, which make up a large proportion of the sheets sent out by some dealers. Our stamps are guaranteed to be genuine and neatly mounted on the finest paper with gummed hinges.

All our stamps are classified according to issues, with the exception of the 1, 2, 3 and 5c stamps; these are mounted on sheets according to value.

In cases where collectors wish special lots, we make them up with the understanding that all are to be kept which prove satisfactory in condition and reasonable in price.

To the reader, advanced or otherwise, give us a trial, and satisfy yourselves that what we say is true.

Discounts.

Our regular discount has been increased to **50** per cent. on our 1, 2, 3 and 5c sheets, **33 $\frac{1}{3}$** per cent. on our Foreign and United States Revenues, and **20** per cent. on our United States postage and envelopes. U. S. stamps and others of the rarest kinds are sent (at *net* prices) to parties desiring same and sending cash on deposit, of not less than \$5.00 with request.

Returns for sheets must be made 10 days after receipt unless for some good excuse they are especially desired longer, under which circumstances, a postal must be sent explaining delay. It is positively prohibited that stamps should be retained more than twenty days.

We insist upon these restrictions being observed as it is only in this way we can carry out our plans successfully.

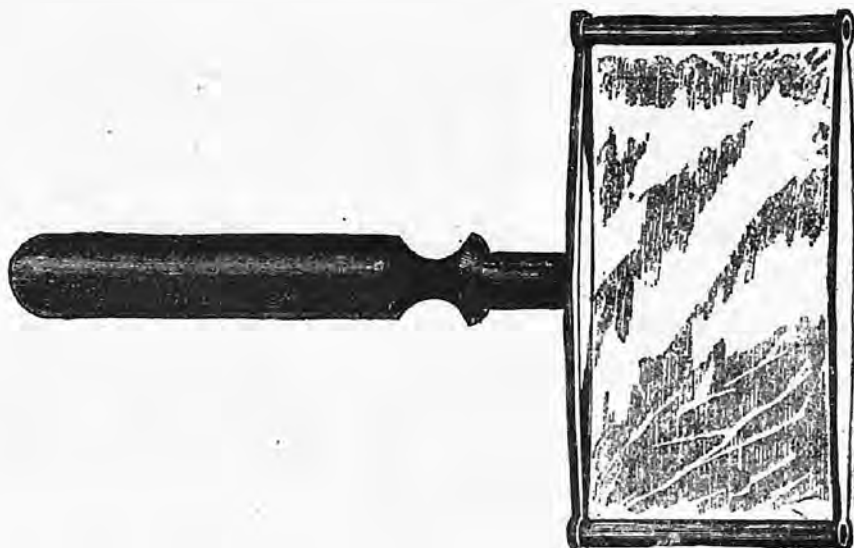

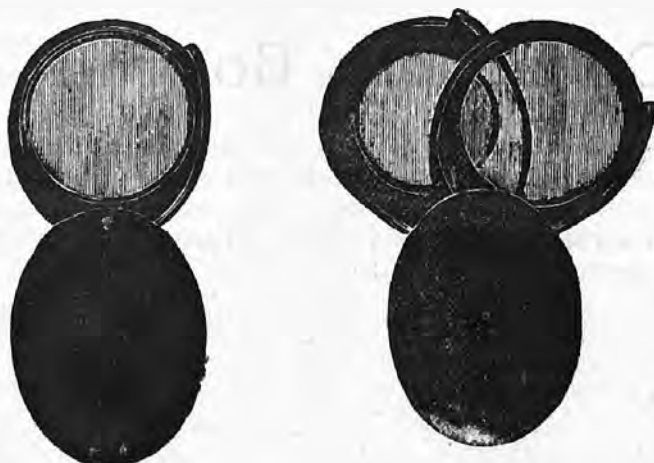

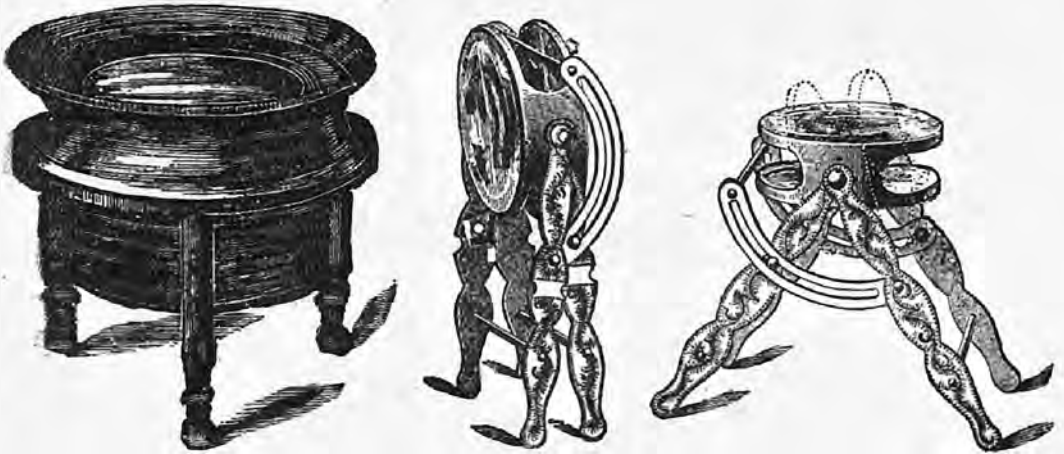
