If the reference is satisfactory; a selection will be sent you, which you are allowed to keep ten days; but should you desire to keep the same longer, a postal card should be sent us stating the reason the stamps are desired for a longer time. For rare stamps, new issues and provisionals, we allow 25 per cent. For advanced collectors, and those wanting net sheets, we have a separate assortment of many thousand varieties, and at very low prices.

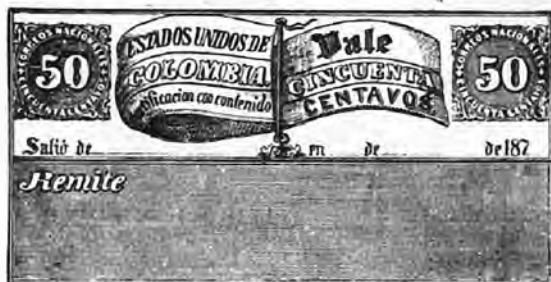
