The results have proved that neither the paper nor adhesive matter contain anything likely to cause harm to the mouth and tongue, and no action results even upon such sensitive colours as are employed notably in stamps of Russia, Cashmere, dc. Even the green colour in the present issue of Great Britain is unchanged, hence I can thoroughly commend them to all collectors who need have no fear in their use, and as regards their adhesion their is no liability of chipping off or cracking.
