The reliable and interesting hints to colectors have been considerably increased in this edition, the numerous notes being simply invaluable. The two works in tue one volume, Album and Catalogue, may be had for 5 s , 6 s. , or $8 \mathrm{~g} .$, according to binding, or the Catalogue and Maps alone for 3s. (Post free 6-d. extra.) The establishment of Mr. W. S. Lincoln is at 2, Holles Street, Lontou, W., the addreas being very knowingly arranged within two squares, the one beving hollies, and the other an ox crossing faford; a bieroglyphical study of an ingenious character. Bro. Lincoln has had several medals in recognition of his Albums, and has just been awarded one at the Paris Exhibition of Books and Printing, now being held st the Palais de l'Industrie."

Crest and Monograst albeyg.-Mr. Willigm Lincoln has alreadg done good gervice in the cause of collectors of curious monograms and crests, but his latest effort quite eclipses his previous productions. The album he has just publisbed is the third edition, and is similar in ahape to its predecessors, but the designs used are quite different, those in the present edition being perfectly original. One gives a representation of a gothic-shaped churoh window, and a second one is a fac-simile of a circular window in Lincoln Cathederal, the remainder being of a geometrical character; the spaces of all being designed to fit the parious shapes of crests and monograms. The leaves are of good stout cardboard, with linen joints, and the designs well printed in twelve different colours. It can be had bound in cloth, gilt, 73.6d.; French morocco, gilt edges 10s. 6d.; sad the best levant morocco, gilt edges, 16s, each.-The Stationery Trades Journal.

If English Postmarks are collected, one page should be devoted to each county, and name of county written on top of page.

The Boys' Own Paper says:-We have seen many good Collections of Postmarks. They do not look so ornamental as Stamps, but they give a better knowledge of geography; for while Stamps deal only with countries, Postmarks deal with towns.
