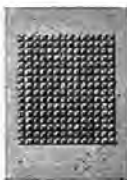

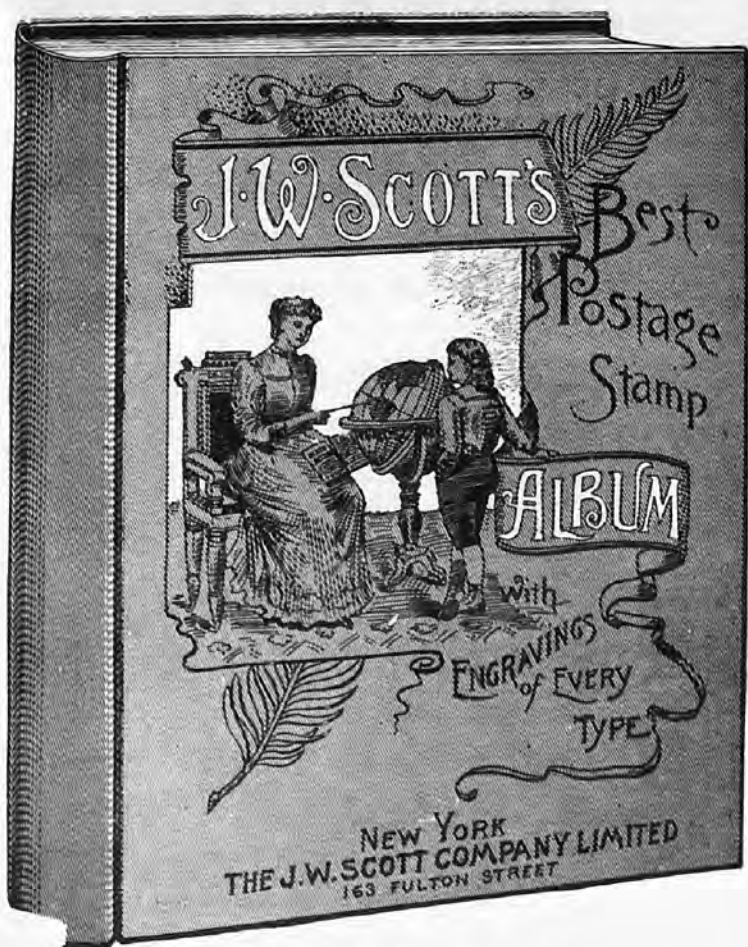

## REVIEWS OF BEST ALBUM.

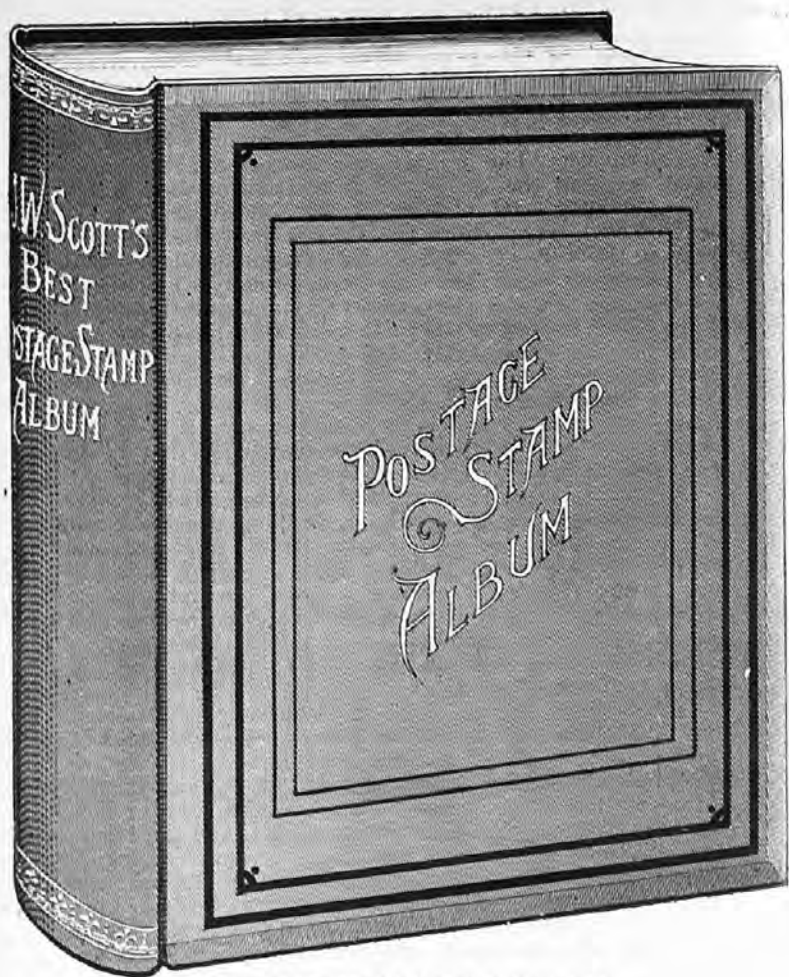
The *Record and Review* of December 15th, 1890, Says On opening it we find many changes for the better from Mr. Scott's 'International' album, and changes that all collectors will, we think, be as favorably impressed with as we are. The first striking improvement we notice is the maps of the geographical position of each stamp issuing country, each engraved to its correct scale, at the head of each page where the stamps are to be put, thus showing the correct relative size of each country. This fills a long felt want, and will be appreciated by parents and teachers who have to answer so many questions from young collectors as to where the different countries are, questions that frequently bother the old heads quite as much as the young ones. \* \* \* Another striking feature in this connection, and a good one, is that Mr. Scott has placed the name of the person whose portrait is on the stamp, over the square made to receive it, so that it will always be in full view after the stamp is in its place.

With the arrangements of the squares made to receive the stamps throughout the album, we fancy every one will be pleased, they are very neatly ruled, with a liberal amount of room for each stamp and a beautiful little picture in miniature of it. There is also a description of its color and denomination which will be a great help to collectors in arranging their sets, as the colors are not given in the International Album where the types were, which is very confusing.

*Plain Talk* (Alvah Davison) February, 1891, says: The illustrations of the various issues are about one half the size of the spaces, and they are made in outlines, so the eye is not deceived by taking them for the real stamps as they appear in the spaces. The catalogue value of each stamp is given in the space devoted to it, and the album thus combines all the good features of a stamp catalogue, while retaining its identity as an album. In albums heretofore published the different maps of the countries were printed about the same size, without regard to the size or area of the various places, but in the "Best," all maps are drawn to a scale showing the relative size, and at a glance it will be seen that China is only half the size of the United States, while Angola is hardly the size of Florida. This is a very valuable feature and one which would place the book "way up head" as a desirable album. The spaces for flags, coats of arms, etc., have been retained, and all issues brought up to date. The work appears in various bindings, the prices ranging from one dollar and a half to seven dollars and a half. It is impossible to get an album which will be able to suit all collectors, but the one which I think will suit the greatest number and which combines more desirable qualities than any other, is Mr. Scott's "Best" Album.

The *Metropolitan Philatelist* of January, says: One of the earliest issued of this, the newest departure in American Stamp Albums, lies before us. The general get up and appearance of the album is very attractive and effective.

We notice several new features in Mr. Scott's new Album. There are never more than two countries on the same page, and not even that number unless the series is small and the countries in the same division of the globe.
