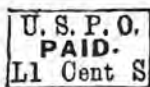

When a stamp is still attached to the original letter or envelope, we will pay from five to ten per cent more **than the highest price mentioned**, provided the stamp is *in good condition*.

All envelopes should be sent entire. These rare stamps always command a better price when they are left on the original letter or envelope.

In all cases it is better if the stamp or stamps which you have for sale are submitted to us for inspection, as we can then form a better idea as to what they are worth to us.

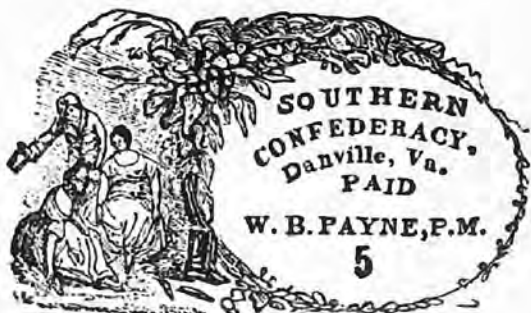


