REMITTANCES.—Of sums of two dollars or more should be by post office order, registered letter, or draft. For sums under one dollar send one cent stamps.

From abroad, unused stamps of the lower denominations may be sent for small sums and larger amounts by post office order or draft.

RETURN POSTAGE.—All letters **MUST** contain a stamp for return postage.

GUARANTEE.—Every stamp sold by me is warranted genuine!

TERMS.—As I issue no catalogue of my own, persons ordering single stamps may take the prices from any standard catalogue (I use the English catalogues, which I consider best) and I allow no discount except from approval sheets.

WANTED.—All kinds of U. S. and foreign postage and revenue stamps, and U. S. proprietary stamps (especially those printed on pink paper) in any quantities, for which a good price in exchange will be allowed.
