GUARANTEE.—Every stamp sold by me is warranted genuine, with the exception of the Hamburg, Confederate, and U. S. Locals, and those marked imitation.

TERMS.—As I issue no catalogue of my own, persons ordering single stamps may take the prices from any standard catalogue and I allow no discount except from approval sheets.
