Presuming you have a catalogue and album, by all means subscribe to some stamp paper, and obtain intelligent information on a reming your favorite pursuit, for there can be but little interest in amassing a collection of labels the history of which you are totally ingrorant of, we can assure you that independent of the knowledge which you will derive, which will snable you to kny scarce stamps from your acquaintances for a mere trifle, and detect counterfeits, and so asve yourself being swindled; you will find more pleasure in receiving a co-y of a paper containing interesting news about your stamps every week or mouth for a year, as the case may be, than you would for the same dollar expected in stamps, which would add bus little to the number of your collection.

EXTRACT FROM PREFACE.

In the present state of knowledge concerning revenue stamps, it is simply impossible to make the book perfect, nor would it be advisable to do so, if the necessary data were at hand, as the supply of there labels is, at present, very limited, which would in that case, make it impossible to fill the Album. Perhaps the greatest charm in collecting revenue stamps consists in the uncertainty and romance countered with it; nearly every amsterr having specimens in his album which are totally unknown to his be there collectors, and there being no definite value or degrees of value yet established; but, of course, this state of thiogs is rapidly passing away, and ere many years, or even menths have clap ed, collectors will awake to the knowledge that they have some priceless rarities among their revenue stamps which, perhaps, have only con them two or three cents.

Taking these facts into consideration, spaces have only been prepared for well known and obtainable series of foreign revenue stamps; but by the plentiful distribution of bank pages throughout the book, ample room has been seemed for all fiscal stamps that may be acquired by the owner. In regard to the emissions of the United States the case is very different, as a early every American Philatelist is desirons of comining a complete set of the fiscal stamps of his own country. Therefore great case has been taken to provide space for every stamp that had ever been to need by our own country, with the exception of beet, spirit, and tob ecco stamps, which it has been permounted filegal to collect, but as large numbers do collect them, sufficient blank pages have been left for their accommodation, and taking into consideration their large size, they can be arranged with equal facility without the ail of lines.


