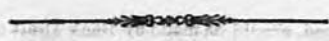

 A perusal of the following is requested, as non-attention to the various Rules may lead to disappointment, and the conditions named, must in all cases be conformed to.

All previous quotations are hereby cancelled.

All stamps are *Warranted Genuine*, and in good condition. Reprints are marked as such.

Terms :—Nett Cash in Advance, (or, Value Payable Post, for India and Burma only). The prices *do not* include postage, for which purpose, sufficient must be sent in *all cases*, (with 2 annas extra for registration, if order is for over Rs. 5.) I do not hold myself responsible for any letters lost in transit, to, or from me.

Remittances from Abroad, should be made by Bank Draft on Calcutta, Post Office Order, or Bank Notes, (in the latter case, only the amount realized by their sale will be credited.) Stamps will not be accepted for amounts over 1 Rupee, unless 2½ per cent. be added, to cover loss in cashing.

All insufficiently paid letters or parcels, refused.

16 annas = 1 Rupee; about equal to 1s. 4d. or 33 cents. (U. S. A.)

No discount whatever off these prices.

It is particularly requested, that *all* letters, should bear the sender's name and address *in full*.

Foreign correspondents, are requested to note, that under the new Postal regulations, all stamps, envelopes and post cards, either used or unused, must be forwarded either by letter or parcel post, sufficient must be sent to cover this, or part of the order, will have to be deducted. The rate is about, 2½ as. for every 100 stamps, and 50 for every 10 post cards or envelopes.

All enquiries must contain a stamp for reply, or they will not be attended to.

STAMPS ON APPROVAL.

Selections of stamps, both Foreign and Indian, ranging in prices from 1 anna (1d.) upwards, attractively mounted on sheets and in books, will be forwarded on application. All stamps are good, clean, *Genuine* specimens, and are generally priced far below Catalogue value.

As this system is open to considerable risk, all applicants are particularly requested to take care of all consignments received, and return them within one week from receipt with payment for all retained.

Selections will only be sent, to responsible parties, or on receipt of satisfactory references, (which must be confirmed), and against a Cash Deposit.

Foreign Correspondents are requested to note, that responsible Indian references must be given in all cases—it is useless to give any who live abroad, as too much time will be lost in getting them to confirm it.

Prices marked are strictly nett—no discount will be allowed off.

Special Offer.—To all purchasers of over Rs. 3, will be presented, a splendid set of 11 used India Service stamps, Catalogued at over 2s. 6d. This set will only be issued, *on application*, when returning the books or sheets.
