PREFACE.

A convenient list showing what exists and what is lacking in the library of a specialist is almost a necessity. The advantage of designating the works by numbers instead of long descriptions can only be attained by a chronological arrangement. The consideration that most stamp collectors' libraries will consist of the works in a single language, and most libraries in the United States, works published here or in Canada, leads to a division of this list into parts, and a further division of the lists of English publications into those of the United States, the English Colonies, and of Great Britain itself. As it is often important to know that a publication advertised or alluded to was in fact never published, these have been noted, but designated by letters instead of numbers. The number of the part followed by that of the publication in the first column will always clearly designate the work desired.

The second column notes the title of the publication, and as there are frequently several of the same name, the publisher and place of publication are added in the fourth and fifth columns. The division into volumes and numbers is indicated in the sixth column as clearly as space will permit, and the date of the first and last number is given in the seventh or last column. To avoid the uncertainties caused by the double numbers, omitted numbers, etc., of many papers, the third column gives the exact number of separate issues of each actually published.

The space left blank on the right hand page is intended to be used for notes. If the list is employed as a *catalogue of a library* the word "complete" may be written opposite the completed volumes, or the numbers actually in the library, or the numbers missing may be inserted, with such other memoranda to assist in finding the work (shelf, etc.) as the owner finds most convenient.

If the list is to be used as a *list of wants* the insertion of the lacking numbers in the proper lines will at once inform the party to whom it is sent just what the library contains, and may lead to the discovery of other publications not named.

If the list is to be used as a *list of duplicates* the numbers offered can be inserted in the proper lines. Parties exchanging with each other and possessing these lists will often find it necessary only to designate the particular publication by the number and part.

In these ways it is hoped much unnecessary labor may be saved to all who are attempting to form stamp collectors' libraries, and a uniform system of numbering be gradually introduced. As opinions will vary as to whether or not certain amateur papers devoted to various branches of collecting should or should not be preserved, only those papers which claim to be published exclusively or chiefly for stamp collectors have been included. The editor recommends cataloguing all others separately, as he has done with some 200 different papers of the kind in his own collection.

The work will be electrotyped, and if demanded, new editions, carefully revised, will be issued as occasion may require. Information concerning any errors or omissions discovered will be welcomed by the editor or publishers.

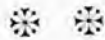

PREFACE.

A convenient list showing what exists and what is lacking in the library of a specialist is almost a necessity. The advantage of designating the works by numbers instead of long descriptions can only be attained by a chronological arrangement. The consideration that most stamp collectors' libraries will consist of the works in a single language, and most libraries in the United States, works published here or in Canada, leads to a division of this list into parts, and a further division of the lists of English publications into those of the United States, the English Colonies, and of Great Britain itself. As it is often important to know that a publication advertised or alluded to was in fact never published, these have been noted, but designated by letters instead of numbers. The number of the part followed by that of the publication in the first column will always clearly designate the work desired.

The second column notes the title of the publication, and as there are frequently several of the same name, the publisher and place of publication are added in the fourth and fifth columns. The division into volumes and numbers is indicated in the sixth column as clearly as space will permit, and the date of the first and last number is given in the seventh or last column. To avoid the uncertainties caused by the double numbers, omitted numbers, etc., of many papers, the third column gives the exact number of separate issues of each actually published.

The space left blank on the right hand page is intended to be used for notes. If the list is employed as a *catalogue of a library* the word "complete" may be written opposite the completed volumes, or the numbers actually in the library, or the numbers missing may be inserted, with such other memoranda to assist in finding the work (shelf, etc.) as the owner finds most convenient.

If the list is to be used as a *list of wants* the insertion of the lacking numbers in the proper lines will at once inform the party to whom it is sent just what the library contains, and may lead to the discovery of other publications not named.

If the list is to be used as a *list of duplicates* the numbers offered can be inserted in the proper lines. Parties exchanging with each other and possessing these lists will often find it necessary only to designate the particular publication by the number and part.

In these ways it is hoped much unnecessary labor may be saved to all who are attempting to form stamp collectors' libraries, and a uniform system of numbering be gradually introduced. As opinions will vary as to whether or not certain amateur papers devoted to various branches of collecting should or should not be preserved, only those papers which claim to be published exclusively or chiefly for stamp collectors have been included. The editor recommends cataloguing all others separately, as he has done with some 200 different papers of the kind in his own collection.

The work will be electrotyped, and if demanded, new editions, carefully revised, will be issued as occasion may require. Information concerning any errors or omissions discovered will be welcomed by the editor or publishers.



The auctioneer reserves the right to reject any lot that has, in his opinion, too high a limit. No commission is charged to buyers; ten per cent. commission is charged on sales. The auction catalogues have a regular circulation of not less than 2400 copies each, thus reaching a large number of purchasers.

THE COST OF MEMBERSHIP

In the Chicago Philatelic Society is very low in comparison with other societies offering equal inducements. Passive membership, giving all the privileges of the Exchange and Auction Departments, costs but one dollar a year. The main expense falls on the local, or active members, who pay nine dollars a year. The passive members enjoy every privilege except that of taking part in the meetings.

All members regularly receive, without charge, two or more Philatelic Journals.
