





## PREFACE.

The collecting of Postage Stamps has become a matter of such general interest, that it is believed the publication of an Album, affording facilities for their arrangement and preservation, in a convenient and elegant form, will be warmly welcomed by the community. It has been sought in the volume here offered to the public, to combine instruction with amusement, and to render the collection, valuable in itself, doubly valuable as the nucleus of a large amount of important geographical and statistical information.

In pursuance of this design, we have arranged the different countries sepa rately, and given under each its area, population, capital, and form of government; the name of its ruler, together with the date of his birth and succession; its several coins, and their value in sterling and in federal money. Ample space has been left for all the varieties of Postage Stamps; nor only these, but also for revenue, local and non-official stamps, which are often of a very interesting character.

To aid the collector, condensed descriptions of the issues of the different countries are prefixed, and in some cases, where it seemed desirable, these descriptions have been extended to former issues. Under the head of the United

### PREFACE.

States will be found a complete and accurate account of all the stamps thus far issued, from those first authorized by Act of Congress of March 3d, 1847. These descriptions are not given in technical, but in intelligible language, and great pains have been taken to make them at once complete and correct.

Another important feature in this work, and one that must greatly enhance its value as a book of reference, is the introduction of Maps. It is further embellished with representations of the flags of many of the countries considered, and the seals of the several States of the Union. These illustrations will catch the eye, even as the leaves are casually turned, and will thus, without any effort or consciousness on the part of those consulting the Album, be the means of fixing important facts in the mind.

Facilitated by the use of such a volume as this, the collection of stamps will be invested with fresh interest, whether for the youthful amateur or the adult. Few gift-books, it is believed, will be a source of greater satisfaction, or do more to produce a critical taste and a healthy spirit of inquiry.






# MAP OF THE WORLD, Showing the Grand Divisions and the Oceans.

# STAMPS

### ADHESIVE STAMPS.

By Act of Congress of 3d of March, 1847, Postage Stamps of the denominations of 5 and 10 cent were prepared, and issued in July of that year. These were the first ever issued by the U.S. Government. By Act of Congress of 3d of March, 1851, it was made the duty of the Postmaster General to furnish Deputy Postmasters with stamps of the denomination of three cents, and such other denominations as might be deemed expedient.

All adhesive stamps are oblong, and of uniform size.

- One Cent.—Issued July, 1851. Profile of Franklin in oval, looking to the right. U. S. Postage at top, and one cent at bottom. Blue.
- Three Cent.—Issued July, 1851. Profile of Washington in oval looking to the left. U. S. Postage across the top, and words three cents at bottom. Red.
- Five Cent.—Issued July, 1847. Portrait of Franklin in oval. U. in left, and S. in right upper corner.

  Post Office around top, and five cents around bottom of the oval. Light-brown.
  - Do. Issued Jan. 1856. Portrait of Jefferson in oval. U. S. Postage at top, and five orners at bottom. Brown.
- Ten Cent.—Issued July, 1847. Portrait of Washington in eval. U. in left upper and S. right corner; and X in each lower corner. Post Office around top, and ten cents around bottom of the eval. Black.
  - Do. Issued May, 1855. Stuart's Portrait of Washington in oval, partly surrounded by 13 stars; X in each upper corner, and words ten cents at bottom, and U. S. Postage, very obscure, at top. Green.
- Twelve Cent.—Issued July, 1851. Portrait same as above. U.S. Postage at top, and Twelve Cents at bottom of oval. Bluish-black.

### UNITED STATES POSTAGE STAMPS.

- Twenty-four Cent.—Issued June, 1860. Similar portrait. "U. S. Postage. Twenty-four cents" surrounding the portrait. Lilac.
- Thirty Cent.—Issued August, 1860. Profile of Franklin looking to the left, in oval. Thirty on left and cents on right. U. S. Postage at top, and 30 at bottom of the oval. U. S. arms in each corner. Orange.
- Ninety Cent.—Issued August, 1860. Trumbull's Portrait of Washington. U. S. Postage at top of portrait, and NINETY CENTS at foot. Indigo-blue.
- The use of all of the foregoing issues was discontinued, and new ones, as follows, were issued in 1861:
- One Cent.—Profile of Franklin in oval, looking to the right. U. S. Postage at top, and one cent at bottom of oval. Light-blue.
- Three Cent.—Profile of Washington, looking to the left. U. S. Postage, in two lines, at top, and three cents, in two lines, at bottom. Carmine.
- Five Cent.—Stuart's Portrait of Washington, in oval. U. S. Postage at top, and five cents at bottom of the oval. Two kinds. Alike, except in color: one is brown, and the other bronze.
- Ten Cent.—Portrait as above. U. S. Postage at left, and ten cents at foot of oval. Five stars above, and four on each side of the oval. Green.
- Twelve Cent.—Portrait as above. U. S. Postage above, and twelve cents below the oval. Nearly black.
- Twenty-four Cent.—Stuart's Portrait of Washington in hexagonal frame. U. S. Postage inside and at top, and TWENTY-FOUR CENTS at bottom of the frame. Two kinds. Alike, except in color. One is brown, the other lilac.
- Thirty Cent.—Profile of Franklin looking to the left, in circle. U. S. Postage above, and Thirty Cents below the circle. Orange.
- \*\* All of the above (Issues of 1861) have their respective values expressed in figures, in each upper corner; and U. in left, and S. in right lower corner.
- Ninety Cent.—Trumbull's Portrait of Washington in oval frame; 90 in two places, and NINETY CENTS on frame; U. S. POSTAGE across top of stamp, and U. in lower left, and S. in lower right corner. Blue.

### STAMPED ENVELOPES.

Stamped Envelopes, of the respective denominations of 1, 3, 4, 6, 10, 12, 20, 24, and 40 cents, have been issued. Each stamp has the profile of Washington, embossed in blank, in the centre, and surrounded by an oval. On the one-cent the profile is looking to the right; on all others to the left. These stamps are printed on note, letter and official envelopes. They are all printed on white paper and also on buff. The three-cent is likewise printed on a bluish paper.



# ADHESIVE STAMPS.

- Five Cent.—Issued July, 1847. Portrait of Franklin in oval. U. in left, and S. in right upper corner.

  Post Office around top, and five cents around bottom of the oval. Light-brown.
  - Do. Issued Jan. 1856. Portrait of Jefferson in oval. U. S. Postage at top, and five orners at bottom. Brown.
- Ten Cent.—Issued July, 1847. Portrait of Washington in oval. U. in left upper and S. right corner; and X in each lower corner. Post Office around top, and TEN CENTS around bottom of the oval. Black.
  - Do. Issued May, 1855. Stuart's Portrait of Washington in oval, partly surrounded by 13 stars; X in each upper corner, and words ten cents at bottom, and U. S. Postage, very obscure, at top. Green.
- Twelve Cent.—Issued July, 1851. Portrait same as above. U.S. Postage at top, and Twelve Cents at bottom of oval. Bluish-black.

### UNITED STATES POSTAGE STAMPS.

- Twenty-four Cent.—Issued June, 1860. Similar portrait. "U. S. Postage. Twenty-four cents" surrounding the portrait. Lilac.
- Thirty Cent.—Issued August, 1860. Profile of Franklin looking to the left, in oval. Thirty on left and cents on right. U. S. Postage at top, and 30 at bottom of the oval. U. S. arms in each corner. Orange.
- Ninety Cent.—Issued August, 1860. Trumbull's Portrait of Washington. U. S. Postage at top of portrait, and ninety cents at foot. Indigo-blue.
- The use of all of the foregoing issues was discontinued, and new ones, as follows, were issued in 1861:
- One Cent.—Profile of Franklin in oval, looking to the right. U. S. Postage at top, and one cent at bottom of oval. Light-blue.
- Three Cent.—Profile of Washington, looking to the left. U. S. Postage, in two lines, at top, and three cents, in two lines, at bottom. Carmine.
- Five Cent.—Stuart's Portrait of Washington, in oval. U.S. Postage at top, and five cents at bottom of the oval. Two kinds. Alike, except in color: one is brown, and the other bronze.
- Ten Cent.—Portrait as above. U. S. Postage at left, and ten cents at foot of oval. Five stars above, and four on each side of the oval. Green.
- Twelve Cent.—Portrait as above. U. S. Postage above, and twelve cents below the oval. Nearly black.
- Twenty-four Cent.—Stuart's Portrait of Washington in hexagonal frame. U. S. Postage inside and at top, and TWENTY-FOUR CENTS at bottom of the frame. Two kinds. Alike, except in color. One is brown, the other lilac.
- Thirty Cent.—Profile of Franklin looking to the left, in circle. U. S. Postage above, and Thirty Cents below the circle. Orange.
- \*\* All of the above (Issues of 1861) have their respective values expressed in figures, in each upper corner; and U. in left, and S. in right lower corner.
- Ninety Cent.—Trumbull's Portrait of Washington in oval frame; 90 in two places, and NINETY CENTS on frame; U. S. Postage across top of stamp, and U. in lower left, and S. in lower right corner. Blue.

### STAMPED ENVELOPES.

Stamped Envelopes, of the respective denominations of 1, 3, 4, 6, 10, 12, 20, 24, and 40 cents, have been issued. Each stamp has the profile of Washington, embossed in blank, in the centre, and surrounded by an oval. On the one-cent the profile is looking to the right; on all others to the left. These stamps are printed on note, letter and official envelopes. They are all printed on white paper and also on buff. The three-cent is likewise printed on a bluish paper.

### UNITED STATES POSTAGE STAMPS.

One Cent.—Oval. Length and width of adhesive stamp. Printed in blue; one cent above, and U. S. Postage below, and a star on each side of profile. Issued in 1857.

Two Cent.—This will be issued during the year 1863.

Three Cent.—Of this there are three kinds.—Issue of 1853; size and shape same as one-cent, and lettering similar. Red.—Issue of 1857; same shape, but a little larger: THREE at top, cents at bottom, and ornamental work on each side. Carmine.—Issue of 1861, size and shape same: United States above, and three cents below, and figure 3, in circle, on each side of profile. Vermilion. This stamp is sometimes printed on a bluish paper. There are, therefore, seven varieties of the three-cent envelope.

Four Cent Envelope has printed upon it both the one-cent stamp and the three-cent stamp. Issued in 1853.

Six Cent.—Three kinds. Issue of 1857, of the size, and similar to last described three-cent stamp. Red.—Same, Green.—Issue of 1861; size and color same as three-cent stamp of 1861; lettering similar. Of the six-cent there are six varieties.

Ten Cent.—Three kinds: Issue of 1853; of the size and similar to the one-cent. Green.—Issue of 1857; of the size and similar to the six-cent. Green.—Issue of 1861; an upright oval enclosed in a horizontal one, TEN CENTS above and U. S. POSTAGE below, and 10, enclosed in small circle, on each side of profile. Green. There are six varieties of ten cent envelopes.

Twelve Cent.—An upright oval enclosed in a horizontal one; TWELVE CENTS above, and U. S. POSTAGE below, and 12 in a small circle on each side of profile. Red-and-bronze. Issued in 1861.

Twenty Cent.—Similar. Red-and-blue. Issued in 1861.

Twenty-four Cent.-Similar. Red-and-green. Issued in 1861.

Forty Cent.-Similar. Black-and-red. Issued in 1861.
