Some of the most knotty Philatelic Problems have only been solved by researches among stamps on Original Covers (the older issues of which are becoming much scarcer)—the recent finds of St. Louis stamps in this condition are a proof of this, solving, as they did, at once and quite satisfactorily, a puzzle which had perplexed philatelists since 1869.


