In the following pages the Regulations of the Post Office, for carrying into effect the Uniform Penny Postage, are given in ample detail; and all exceptions to the Penny Rate in the cases of Foreign and Ship Letters, &c. enumerated.

The "Parliamentary Directory," commencing at page 33, has been corrected to the present day; it includes all Peers as well as the Members returned at the different Elections since the assembling of Parliament—each address given is that occupied by the Peer or Member during the PRESENT SESSION.

The "Supplement," commencing at page 69, furnishes an account of all firms established since the publication of the Directory; and of important changes in those previously existing.

THE POST OFFICE LONDON DIRECTORY FOR 1840,

May now be had completed to the present time. It is *the only Work containing the Post Office Regulations with reference to the Uniform Penny Postage, and the most recent Parliamentary information.* It is FIFTY PER CENT CHEAPER, and will be found infinitely more correct, than any other similar work.

MUCH MISREPRESENTATION

has been made with reference to the "Post Office Directory." The improvements introduced into the later Editions have caused an immense increase in the circulation, and its success has probably instigated the statements so industriously propagated. The mode of disparagement adopted precluded the possibility of such being any longer quietly submitted to.

The Public are therefore thus acquainted with the true value of Robson's (the only other *London Annual*) Directory, and to prevent the possibility of its being charged that any *selection* has been used, an Analytical Review has been made and published, of CONSECUTIVE names taken equally from the commencement and conclusion of 'ROBSON'S COMMERCIAL DIRECTORY FOR 1840.' It will be found at page 91 of this Supplement. That Review has now been in the possession of the Proprietors of Robson's Directory for several weeks, and in their communications on the subject ITS TRUTH *has not been disputed.* While that remains unquestioned little value will be attached to calumnies circulated where they cannot be met, and by persons interested in detaching Purchasers from the *Post Office Directory.*

PEERS AND MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT

no longer despatch or receive correspondence FREE. Members of either House are entitled to receive free of charge Petitions to Parliament, provided that each Petition is sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the sides, and does not exceed the weight of Six Ounces.

ADDRESSES TO HER MAJESTY PASS FREE.

With these exceptions, **ALL INLAND LETTERS OR PACKETS**, including those from the Channel Isles, and the Isle of Man, if **PREPAID**, are subject to the following

RATES OF POSTAGE,

Not exceeding Half an Ounce in Weight	One Penny.
One Ounce	Two Pence
Two Ounces	Four Pence
Three Ounces	Six Pence, and so on, Two

Rates being added for every ounce up to **Sixteen Ounces**, beyond which, with the following exceptions, no **PACKET** whether subject to postage or not, CAN BE RECEIVED.

1. PARLIAMENTARY PETITIONS and ADDRESSES TO HER MAJESTY,
2. PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS,
3. LETTERS and PACKETS addressed to or received from Places beyond Sea.
4. LETTERS and PACKETS to and from PUBLIC DEPARTMENTS, and to and from PUBLIC OFFICERS who formerly franked by virtue of their offices, for list of which see page 20.
5. DEEDS if sent open, or in covers open at the sides. They may be tied with string and sealed in order to prevent inspection of the contents, but they must be open at the sides that it may be seen that they are entitled to the privilege.

With these exceptions, **ALL PACKETS ABOVE THE WEIGHT OF SIXTEEN OUNCES** will be immediately forwarded to the DEAD LETTER OFFICE.

INLAND LETTERS OR PACKETS PUT INTO THE UNPAID LETTER BOXES ARE CHARGED DOUBLE THE AMOUNT OF POSTAGE TO WHICH, HAD THEY BEEN PREPAID, THEY WOULD HAVE BEEN LIABLE. The Scale of Weight in force for General Post Letters is equally applicable to Letters passing through the local penny posts throughout the Kingdom and to those passing through the local Posts of LONDON and DUBLIN, the Regulations which restricted the weight of these latter to Four Ounces having been abolished. They are subject to the same Rules and the same Charges as General Post Letters, and must be paid in advance, or they will be liable to double the rate to which they would otherwise be subject.

LETTERS TO PASS BY THE INLAND MAILS

can be posted at the Receiving Houses till 5 P.M.; by the Letter Carriers ringing bells (on payment of one penny with each) from 4 to 5 P.M.; at the Branch Post Offices, at Charing Cross; Old Cavendish Street, and 266 Borough High Street, till three-quarters past 5 P.M.; at the General Post Office in St. Martin's le Grand, and at the Branch Post Office in Lombard Street, till 6 P.M. Letters are received at the General Post Office St. Martin's le Grand only from 6 P.M. until 7 P.M. upon payment of one penny, and from 7 till half-past 7 upon payment of sixpence with each.

LETTERS TO PASS BY THE FOREIGN MAILS

except those for India, *via Marseilles*, which must be posted at the same hours as Inland Letters, are, on *Tuesdays* and *Fridays*, received at the Branch Offices, Charing Cross; Old Cavendish Street, and Borough High Street, until P.M.; at the General Post Office, St. Martin's le Grand, and at the Branch Office in Lombard Street, until 10 P.M.; and at St. Martin's le Grand only from 10 until 11 P.M. on payment of a fee of one penny and after 11 and until half-past 11 P.M. on payment of a fee of sixpence.

LETTERS ADDRESSED LONDON ONLY,

for persons whose residences are not known, are copied into lists which are hung up daily in the hall of the General Post Office. Parties writing their addresses opposite to their names will receive their letters on the following morning.

LETTERS TO NON-COMMISSIONED OFFICERS, SEAMEN, AND SOLDIERS,

to and from the East Indies by the Overland Mails, "*via Falmouth*," can send and receive Letters, under the weight of half an ounce, on their own private concerns only, while they are employed on her Majesty's Service, or in the service of the East India Company, for one penny.

Letters coming from a Seaman, or from a Sergeant, Corporal, Trumpeter, Fifer, or Private Soldier.

The Penny must be paid at the time it is put into the Post Office.

The name of the Soldier or Sailor, his Class or Description, and the name of the Ship or Regiment, Corps or Detachment, to which he belongs, must be specified.

And the Officer having the Command must sign his name, and specify the name of the Ship or Regiment, Corps or Detachment, he commands.

Letters going to Seamen or Soldiers.

The Penny must be paid at the time it is put into the Post Office, and the direction must specify the class of person, and the Ship, Regiment, or Corps to which he belongs.

Three pence Postage is charged on Letters addressed to Soldiers and Seamen to either of the following places:—River Gambia, Sierra Leone, Goree, Senegal, Cape Coast Castle, Fernando Po, Coast of Africa, Ascension (Isle), and China. To St. Helena, the East Indies, and New South Wales, one penny. Seamen's and Soldiers' Letters from Abroad by private Ships are chargeable with 3d. each.

* * WARRANT OFFICERS either in the ARMY or NAVY, or MASTERS MATES of the NAVY, are not entitled to receive or transmit Letters at less than the usual rates of Postage.

Any Person endeavouring to evade the Rates of Postage by law established, by certifying improper Letters, or obtaining certificates on Letters which are not strictly on the private affairs of the Seamen or Soldiers from whom the Letters purport to come: or any Person addressing to any Seaman or Soldier, having the privilege of receiving his Letters at a reduced Rate, a Letter which shall be concerning the affairs of another Person, is liable for every such offence to a penalty of FIVE POUNDS.

LETTERS REGISTERED

TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES.

The practice adopted by the Post Office in France, of charging double the rate of Postage to which Letters are liable as the price of registering them, will hereafter be substituted in this country for the present regulation of requiring half-a-crown as a fee, in addition to the Postage on such Letters, provided the extra Postage to be so charged shall not exceed half-a-crown, which is still to be the highest sum demanded for the Registry of any Foreign Letter in this country.

The Registry of Letters will not make the Postmaster General responsible for the loss that may be sustained in consequence of the failure of any Letter with which this precaution may have been adopted. Letters intended for Registration must be brought to the General Post Office, before 10 o'clock P.M. on Tuesdays and Fridays, and before 6 P.M. on other days.

OVERCHARGED LETTERS.

Overcharges returned between the hours of ten and five, on presenting the overcharged letters at the window in the Hall of the General Post Office. Overcharges may likewise be obtained at the Branch Office, Lombard street; or the letter may be sent to the Office by the letter-carrier of the district, and the overcharge will be returned with the letter in two days.

PRINTED VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF THE IMPERIAL PARLIAMENT, OR OF THE COLONIAL LEGISLATURES,

re charged Under Four Ounces One Penny.

Above Four and under Eight Ounces Two Pence.

Above Eight and under Twelve Ounces Three Pence, and so on.

Such Votes and Proceedings pass at these rates between places in the United Kingdom as well as to the Colonies by packet. They are not, however, forwarded to the East Indies, *via Falmouth* and Alexandria, nor to places through France under the full rates of Letter Postage. The Postmaster General is authorized (if he shall see fit) to delay the transmission of Printed Votes and Proceedings in Parliament for any space not exceeding Twenty-four hours from the time at which the same would otherwise have been forwarded.

DELIVERY OF LETTERS IN LONDON.

The morning delivery of General Post Letters (including despatches from every Post Town and place in the United Kingdom, and those Foreign, Ship, and Packet letters which have arrived in sufficient time) commences in every district within three miles of St. Martin's le Grand rather before nine o'clock, A.M., and is completed within two hours, except on Mondays, or on other days when there are large arrivals of Foreign or Ship Letters, when the period of commencing and concluding the delivery is unavoidably retarded for a space varying from thirty to sixty minutes. Letters from all those places to which despatches are conveyed by the Birmingham Railway Morning Mail likewise arrive by the same route at 2 P.M. They are delivered in Upper Thames street, St. Paul's Church yard, Newgate street, Cloth Fair, Aldersgate street, Redcross street, Finsbury place, Eldon street, New Broad street, Bishopsgate within, Houndsditch, Minories, Haydon square, and Tower hill, and in all places within the limits of those streets, by the General Post Letter Carriers, and the delivery is completed within an hour and a half from the time of the arrival of the Mail. All despatches by the Railway Mail for places beyond the above limits are sent out by the four o'clock Twopenny Post delivery, as are the despatches by the Portsmouth and Southampton Morning Mails, which arrive at 28 minutes past 2 P.M. Those by the Dover Morning Mail, which arrive at Four o'clock, and by the Brighton Morning Mail, arriving at a quarter past Four P.M., are sent out by the Twopenny Post Six o'clock delivery; and the despatches arriving by the Cheltenham Morning Mail, at a quarter past Six, are sent out by the Eight o'clock Twopenny Post delivery. Foreign Mails arriving after the morning despatch of the Letter Carriers are (provided they arrive before two o'clock, P.M.) sent out within the before-mentioned limits by the General Post Letter Carriers, who complete their deliveries in about an hour from the time of their despatch. For places beyond those limits, all Foreign letters arriving subsequent to the Morning despatch of the Letter Carriers, are delivered by the Twopenny Post Letter Carriers, as are all *Letters which arrive later than two P.M. by any Foreign Mail.*

BANK NOTES, BANK POST BILLS, DRAFTS, &c.

The most secure mode of transmitting Bank Notes, Bank Post Bills, or Drafts, is to *divide each* and send the halves by different posts, waiting the acknowledgement of the one-half before forwarding the other.

COIN SHOULD NOT BE SENT BY POST,

The great increase in the number of *Money Letters* having rendered it impossible, without hazard to the punctual despatch of the Mails, to continue the former practice of entering the addresses of such Letters, and of taking receipts for them on delivery to the parties to whom they were addressed,

THAT PRACTICE HAS THEREFORE CEASED,

and persons having occasion to transmit *small sums*, will avoid all risk by sending the money through the medium of

THE MONEY ORDER OFFICE.

which is carried on by the Post Office on the public account, at the north-west corner of the General Post Office, and at the several Branch Offices in Lombard street, Charing Cross, Old Cavendish street, and High street, Borough. The charge for such Orders will be *sixpence* on sums of *two pounds and under*, and one shilling and sixpence on sums between *two and five pounds*. To avoid trouble it must be understood that the party in whose favour the order is drawn must attend *personally* to receive it.

No order will be given for sums beyond this amount.

Money Orders will be given on all Post Towns in England, and the undermentioned Post Towns in Scotland and Ireland.
 They can also be drawn by these Towns on each other and London, but those drawn upon London can *at present*
 only be paid at the General Post Office; Arrangements are, however, in progress for their payment at the *Branch Offices*.

BOTTLES CONTAINING LIQUID, AND OTHER ARTICLES OF A BRITTLE NATURE

should not be forwarded through the Post, as they are almost invariably broken, either by the operation of stamping or by the friction of the Mail Coaches. It is besides improper so to transmit such articles, as by accidents to them, the seals of Letters in the bags may be damaged, the Letters mutilated, or their Addresses entirely effaced. For similar reasons, articles having

SHARP OR HARD EDGES

should not be transmitted through the Post.

STAMPS.

The date shows when the letters were received at the Post Office.

The circular stamp of black ink, at the back of the letter, is used when the postage is to be paid on delivery.

Ditto of red ink, on the face of the letter, with the word "paid," when the postage has been paid at the time of posting the letter.

NEWSPAPERS**AND SUPPLEMENTS TO NEWSPAPERS.**

It is not compulsory to send Newspapers or Supplements to Newspapers by the Post, but those that are intended to be so transmitted, and are entitled to pass free, must be put into the Receiving Houses before 5 P.M.; at the Branch Post Offices, before half-past 5 P.M.; or at the General Post Office, St. Martin's le Grand, before 6 P.M. Each Newspaper given with a penny to the Letter Carriers ringing bells, from 4 to 5 P.M.; or put into one of the late Newspaper Windows, at St. Martin's le Grand, from 6 until half past 7 P.M., with a halfpenny, will be despatched the same evening. All Newspapers must be sent in covers, open at the sides. No words or communication may be printed on such papers after the same shall have been published, nor must there be any writing or marks upon any Newspaper, or the cover, other than the name and address of the person to whom it is sent; nor any paper or thing enclosed or concealed in, or with such newspaper, or the cover, nor any printed words or communication on the cover, except that News-venders only may print their names and addresses thereon. Newspapers may be examined by the Officers of the Post Office; and if there be any breach of the above regulations, the packet is chargeable with treble the amount of postage which a letter of the same weight would have been liable to. And any person who shall write or enclose any thing in any Newspaper or the cover thereof, or shall print any words or communication on a Newspaper, after it shall have been published, to be sent by the Post, or any person who shall knowingly send, or cause to be sent, by the Post, a Newspaper in respect of which any one of those offences has been committed, may, at the option of the Postmaster General, be prosecuted as for a Misdemeanor.

Clause of the Act of 1st Victoria, cap. 34, sec. 32.

"And be it further enacted, that in all cases in which a question shall arise, whether a printed Paper is entitled to the privileges of a Newspaper or other Publication hereby privileged, so far as respects the transmission thereof by the Post under the Post Office Acts, the question shall be referred to the determination of the Postmaster General, whose decision, with the concurrence of the Lords of the Treasury, shall be final."

NEWSPAPERS**FROM THE BRITISH COLONIES**

are delivered free of Postage at any place within the British dominions: those for Persons who have removed may be forwarded by Post free of charge, provided they have not been opened at the place to which they were originally addressed.

NEWSPAPERS TO THE BRITISH COLONIES AND FOREIGN PARTS.

NEWSPAPERS liable to the Stamp Duty may be forwarded to the British Colonies and Possessions by Her Majesty's Packet Boats, free of the duty of Postage, provided the same be duly stamped and made up open at the ends, and put into any Post-Office within seven days after the day of Publication.

Newspapers may also be forwarded to the Colonies by Private Ships for a Postage of One Penny each, to some Foreign Parts free, and to others for a Postage of Twopence each, to be paid at the time of putting in, under the same regulations as to date, &c.

Newspapers printed in the British Colonies, brought to Great Britain or Ireland by Packet Boats, if made up without covers, or in covers open at the ends, are delivered within the United Kingdom free of Postage.

NEWSPAPERS TO THE EAST INDIES

are forwarded by the Packet *via* Marseilles, on payment of Twopence with each. The Mail is made up on the Fourth of every month, except it happens to fall on a Sunday, when it is made up on the following day.

are forwarded free of charge to the sender. A rate of four centimes (nearly equivalent to One Halfpenny) will be charged upon delivery in France.

NEWSPAPERS FROM ABROAD.

Newspapers arriving from those "FOREIGN PARTS" to which Newspapers are despatched free, are delivered free of Postage, except those from France, which are charged One Halfpenny each. All Newspapers must be printed in the language of the Country from which they are sent; those for Persons who have removed may be re-directed to them at any place within the United Kingdom, free of Postage, provided they have not been opened at the place to which they were originally addressed.

NEWSPAPERS BY PRIVATE SHIPS,

if put into the Office within seven days after the date of publication, are forwarded to the Cape of Good Hope, Mauritius, or Isle of France, Sydney, New South Wales, Van Diemen's Land, Swan River, South Australia, Chili, Peru, Guatemala, and the Western Coast of America, and the East Indies, on payment of one penny with each paper; to St. Helena and the Western Coast of Africa, viz.: St. Mary's, River Gambia, Sierra Leone, Cape Coast Castle, Fernando Po, and Ascension (Isle), at the same rate; to China, and places not British, on payment of twopence each, under the above regulations as to date, &c.

* All Newspapers forwarded through the Ship Letter Office, except those between Ports in Great Britain and Ireland must be paid for when put in.

PRINTED PRICES CURRENT

pass through the Post Office at one penny each, provided the publications have been submitted to and obtained the sanction of the Lords of the Treasury, and contain simply the names and prices of the articles; the names and addresses of the parties dealing in such articles must be excluded.

Each copy to be made up in the same form as a Newspaper, with covers open at the end.

The words "PRICE CURRENT" to be written or printed immediately above the address; otherwise the paper will be liable to full letter postage.

Every Price Current to be posted within seven days after its publication; and no one can be forwarded a second time without being charged with full letter postage.

Any writing, or mark for reference, or initial on such papers or their covers, beyond the address, and the designation "Price Current," will subject them to the full rates of letter postage.

The rate of one penny each paper may be paid by either the sender or the receiver; but in the latter case they must be given in at the lobby of the *Inland Office* before 6 p. m.

Those which are paid for when put into the Post must be delivered at the *Paid Window* before 6 p. m.

Letters to the British West Indies and North America are forwarded at the charge of one shilling for each single letter and so on in proportion from all parts of the United Kingdom, without any charge for Inland postage.

Letters to Guadaloupe, &c., if put in at Falmouth are charged two-pence on each single rate less than from London or from any other part of the Kingdom, viz. 1s. 3d., under half an ounce; 2s. 6d. under an ounce; 5s. under two ounces, and so on.

SHIP LETTERS.

The single uniform rate on Letters between the United Kingdom and places beyond Sea, when conveyed by **PRIVATE SHIPS**, is 8d., in whatever part of the United Kingdom the Letters may be posted or delivered. This is the rate now taken on Letters between the United Kingdom and the East Indies, &c. &c. when conveyed by *Private Ship*, the former distinction between these and other descriptions of Ship Letters having been abolished.

The rates of Postage on "Ship" as on other Letters are taken by weight:—

Under half an ounce.....	Single.
Under an ounce.....	Double.
Under two ounces.....	Quadruple.
Under three ounces.....	Sextuple, and so on.

PERSONS EXEMPT FROM SHIP LETTER POSTAGE.

The **OWNERS, CHARTERERS, or CONSIGNEES** (resident in the United Kingdom), and the **OWNERS, CONSIGNEES, and SHIPPERS** of Goods on board Vessels inward bound, are entitled to receive their Letters free from SEA Postage, to the extent collectively of Six ounces in weight, by any One Vessel to any One such PERSON. In the case of Vessels coming from *Ceylon, the Mauritius, the East Indies, or the Cape of Good Hope*, for an **OWNER, CHARTERER, or CONSIGNEE** of such Vessel, the letters may be collectively Twenty ounces in weight. The **OWNER, CHARTERER, or CONSIGNEE** must be described as such on the address and superscription; and in the case of **OWNERS, SHIPPERS, or CONSIGNEES** of goods, it must also appear by the Ship's Manifest that they have Goods on board the Vessel. Such persons are entitled to have their Letters which come within the above Conditions before the Master of the Vessel delivers the other Letters in his charge to the Post Office.

•• Every Person who shall, with intent to evade any Duty of Postage, falsely superscribe a Letter as being the **OWNER, or the CHARTERER, or the CONSIGNEE** of a Vessel conveying the same, or as the **OWNER, or the SHIPPER, or the CONSIGNEE** of Goods shipped in such Vessel, shall for every such offence forfeit **TEN POUNDS**.

MAILS MADE UP IN LONDON.

Letters (except those for India *via Marseilles* which must be posted at the same hours as Inland Letters) for the Foreign Mails are received at the Branch Offices, Charing Cross; Old Cavendish street and the Borough High street, until 8 o'Clock at Night, on Tuesday and Friday, and till 10 at St. Martin's-le-Grand and Lombard Street: at St. Martin's le Grand only they will be received *after 10, and up to 11 P.M., on payment of a fee of one penny; and after 11 until half-past 11 P.M., on payment of a fee of sixpence.*

The Mails despatched *every Saturday* for Vigo, Oporto, Lisbon, Cadiz and Gibraltar; *every second Saturday* for Malta, Greece and the Ionian Islands; *every fourth Saturday* for Egypt and the East Indies, are forwarded by Steam Vessels from Falmouth to Gibraltar.

The Mails for Malta, Greece and the Ionian Islands, are conveyed from Gibraltar to Malta *every fortnight*, by Her Majesty's Steam Packets employed in the Mediterranean.

The Mails for Greece and the Ionian Islands are conveyed from Malta *every fortnight*, by Steam Packets, which start after the arrival of the Mails from England.

The Mails for Egypt and India are forwarded from Malta *once a month* by Steam Packets, after the arrival at that island of the Mails from England of *every fourth Saturday*.

The RETURN OF THE PACKETS is calculated thus: To and from Jamaica, 12 weeks—America, 9—Leeward Islands, 12—Brazils, 20—Mexico, 18.—Gibraltar, 20 days.

From August to January inclusive, the Packet touches at **PERNAMBUCO** and **BAHIA**, on her *outward* passage to **RIO JANEIRO**, and the other Six months on her *homeward*.

RATES OF POSTAGE UPON

FOREIGN LETTERS

NOT EXCEEDING HALF AN OUNCE; beyond that weight the charge, so far as the British rates are concerned, increases in the same proportion as the charge for Inland Letters increases. It is, however, to be remembered that the French mode of charging is a single rate for each QUARTER of an ounce; therefore all letters, either for places within France, or that in their transit to their respective destinations must pass through France, to go for the single rates set down must be UNDER a QUARTER of an ounce. The following Tables show the postage on French letters, or letters sent by the way of France,

From Falmouth to the places marked * the postage is two pence less than the above rates, which apply to all other parts of the United Kingdom.

To the places marked † the rate is UNIFORM, from whatever part of the United Kingdom letters may be despatched. To Holland the postage to or from any place in the United Kingdom beyond the limits of the "London District Post" is 1s. 6d. To Germany, Denmark, Sweden, and Russia, 1s. 10d.

The rate to Belgium to and from any part of the United Kingdom, except London or Dover is 1s. 6d. There are some few exceptions to this charge in favor of places so near the Metropolis that the postage did not, previously to the adoption throughout the Kingdom of the Uniform Penny Postage, amount to so much. In those instances the rate will be as formerly. The same exception is made in favor of letters passing to or through France. Where the postage was less than the present Uniform rates the lower rates will be received. In all other cases the higher Uniform rate will be taken.

When Letters, &c., (ordinarily despatched by Falmouth Packet) are specially addressed "*via* France" they are (in whatever part of the United Kingdom they may have been posted) forwarded by Dover and Calais.

The Public are not required to pay the Postage upon Letters for France at the time of putting them into the Post;— they have the choice of sending their Letters Unpaid; or of paying the whole Postage, both British and French, to the Place of Destination; or of paying the British Postage only to Calais, viz. 10d. each Letter under the weight of half an ounce; 1s. 8d. under an ounce; 3s. 4d. under two ounces, and so on.

Letters, if forwarded by every fourth Saturday from February 15, by way of FALMOUTH and Her Majesty's Packets in the MEDITERRANEAN, are subject to an *uniform* rate of 2s. 5d. under half an ounce, 4s. 10d. under an ounce, 9s. 8d. under two ounces, 14s. 6d. under 3 ounces, and so on in proportion, *from whatever part of the United Kingdom they may be despatched.* Letters for the above destinations in the MEDITERRANEAN, if specially directed "via Marseilles," are liable to an *uniform* British rate, wherever they may be posted, of 10d. under half an ounce, and the French rate of 1s. 10½d. under a quarter of an ounce—in all 2s. 8½d. if under a quarter of an ounce; and Letters to the EAST INDIES by the same route, and addressed "by French packet," in addition to those Rates, to the further charge of 1s. under half an ounce, and so on in proportion.

THE EAST INDIES.

In accordance with the Convention concluded with France, for sending the Indian Mail through that country, Mails will be made up in London, for India, via Marseilles, on the 4th of every month, except it happens to fall on Sunday, when the Mail will be made up the following day.

The uniform rate on Single Letters to and from India by this route will be 2s. 8d. under a quarter of an ounce, and so on in proportion.

The Postage by this route will be taken on the same principle that is now in force with French Letters, and the charges of all despatches must be paid in advance.

LONDON DISTRICT (OR TWOPENNY) POST OFFICE.

The Principal Office is at the General Post Office, St. Martin's-le-Grand, where Letters may be posted One Hour later at each Despatch than at the Receiving Houses. At the Receiving House in Cornhill half an hour later, and for the accommodation of the Western parts of the Metropolis, Letters may be put into the Office at Charing Cross, corner of Craig's Court, and the Office in Regent Street, near Langham Place, half an hour later at each despatch than at the other Receiving Houses.

There are 7 Deliveries and 7 Collections of Letters in London daily, and by a recent Regulation, the Eight o'Clock Delivery has been extended to all places in the environs of London within the circle of three miles from the General Post Office. These places have now 5 Deliveries and 5 Despatches daily.

The following are the Places, within the Three Mile circle, that have 5 Deliveries and 5 Despatches:—*Camden Town; Dalston; Hackney; Islington; Kent Road (Old); Kennington; Kentish Town*, as far as Mansfield Place; *Kingsland; Newington Butts; Pentonville; Shacklewell; Somers' Town; Vauxhall; and Watworth.*

The Time by which Letters should be put into the Receiving Houses, or the Principal Office, for each Delivery of the Day, and that by which they are despatched for Delivery, are as follows:—

To Places having but 2 Deliveries a Day, Letters are sent off at the Hours of 10 in the Morning, and 4 or 8 in the Afternoon. Such as go off at 10 are delivered at noon; those at 4 are delivered the same Evening; and such as go off at 8 are for delivery early next Morning. To Places having only one Post a day, they go off at 10, and are delivered the same day at Noon. The initials N. A. E. & M. in the subjoined List, show the periods of Delivery, and the number of Deliveries at each place Daily.

The Deliveries in the Country should be completed, generally, between the hours of 11 and 1; between 2 and 3 in the Afternoon; between 6 and 8 in the Evening; and by or about 9 in the Morning.

From the Country to London.

Letters put into the Post in time for the Morning Despatch, are sent out at 12 from the Principal Office, for Delivery in all parts of London. If put in for the Noon Despatch, they are sent out for Delivery at 4 o'clock. If for the Afternoon Despatch, they are sent out for Delivery at 8 o'clock in the Evening; and if put in for the Night Collection, they are despatched the following Morning, and are sent out for Delivery at 10 o'clock.

From one Part of the Country to another.

If going from one part of a Ride or District to another part of the same Ride or District, and put in for the Morning Despatch, they are delivered, through the means of a Bye-Post arrangement, the same Day at Noon. If put in for the Afternoon Despatch, they are delivered the same Evening, where an Evening Delivery is given. If going to parts not belonging to the same Ride, they come to London: such Letters put into the Post for the Morning Despatch, are delivered in the Country the same Evening, where an Evening Delivery is given; if for the Afternoon Despatch, the next Morning, where a Morning Delivery is given; or otherwise at Noon. The Deliveries given to each will be found in the List of Places.

STAMPS.

The Date Stamp on Letters, or, if there be more than one, that having the latest hour, shows the Day and time of Day they were despatched for Delivery; that on Returned Letters excepted, which shows the time they were returned to the Office as Dead Letters. Persons having occasion to complain of the Delay of their Letters, are requested to transmit to the Superintending President (R. Smith, Esq.) the Covers, with a statement of the Time of Delivery, as the Date and Stamp will assist materially in tracing their course.

Newspapers

pass free by the London Twopenny Post, except in those cases where they shall be posted and delivered within the limits, for the time being, of the General Post Delivery, when the postage is one Penny on each Newspaper.

Letters not to be Delivered Back.

And to prevent the possibility of Letters being surreptitiously obtained from the Offices where put in, Office keepers are strictly forbid returning, to any persons whatsoever, Letters that may be applied for, under whatever circumstances the recovery may be urged. This is moreover forbid by the established principle, that the instant a Letter is committed to the Post, it is no longer the property of the Sender.

Penalties.

1. In the 1st Victoria, cap. 36, sec. 2, any Person illegally conveying Letters incurs a Penalty of £5. for every offence; and £100 for every Week the practice is continued. The Sender also incurs a Penalty of £5 for every offence, with full Costs of Suit.

THE GENERAL AND TWOPENNY POST RECEIVING HOUSES

were, by an arrangement which came into operation on the 11th of December 1838, consolidated. Consequently, all Receiving Houses are now for the receipt of General, Foreign, Ship, and Twopenny Post Letters, both paid and unpaid, with the exception of the Receiving Houses at 24 Cornhill; 21 Charing Cross, and 313 Regent Street, near Langham Place, at which places General Post Letters cannot be received. Unpaid Letters must be dropped into the box, and Paid Letters taken into the Office. Letters for the London Delivery of the Twopenny Post are despatched from all the Receiving Houses to the Chief Offices at 8, 10, and 12 o'clock every morning; and at 2, 4, 6 and 8 o'clock every afternoon. Letters for the Country Delivery of the Twopenny Post are despatched at 8 and 12 in the morning, and at 2 and 6 in the afternoon. From 24 Cornhill, 21 Charing Cross, and 151 Oxford Street, the Letters are despatched half an hour later than from the other Receiving Houses. General Post Letters posted after 5 o'clock cannot be forwarded the same evening. Newspapers intended to pass by the General Post THE SAME NIGHT must be put in before 5 o'clock.

. General Post Letters for the Day Mails can be put into the Receiving Houses till eight o'clock in the morning of the day on which the Mails are despatched.

ROUTES OF THE MORNING AND EVENING MAIL COACHES

FROM AND TO LONDON;

Shewing the time at which the Mail passes through each place on its journey outwards and inwards. The Preston and Liverpool and Manchester MORNING MAIL (by Birmingham, Grand Junction, and North Union Railway), which conveys despatches to Ireland, leaves the General Post Office at *nine in the morning*, as do the Cheltenham, Dover, Portsmouth, and Southampton (DAY) MAILS. The Brighton (DAY) MAIL leaves at thirty minutes past ten. The Evening Mails leave London at eight o'clock every day except Sunday, when they set out one hour earlier; they all arrive between the hours of six and seven in the morning, with the exception of the Preston and Liverpool and Manchester (by Railway) (Day) Mail, which arrives at two, the Portsmouth and Southampton (Day) at twenty-eight minutes past two, the Dover (Day) at eight minutes past four, the Brighton (Day) at a quarter-past four, and the Cheltenham (Day) at a quarter past six in the afternoon. To ascertain *exactly* the time in the morning at which any other Mail reaches the General Post Office, it is only necessary to add the difference between eight o'clock and the time at which the Mail passes through the first-named town, on its outward route, to the time mentioned in the inward column opposite the same place. The distances are calculated from the General Post Office.

The names have been, as before mentioned, taken equally from the commencement and conclusion, that it may be obvious that no *selection* has been made. It can be scarcely asserted that the *first* 125 and the *last* 125 names give an improper idea of the proportion of error throughout the Work; if it be so contended, as before stated **ANY 250 CONSECUTIVE NAMES will be analyzed AND THE RESULT PUBLISHED.**

The calculation does not include the *self-evident* blunders, viz. the *variations* between the different lists, "Zox, Ellis & Sublin," for instance. Of this latter *description* merely, there are in only 250 names reviewed, **FIFTY-TWO DISCREPANCIES.**

The insufficient description of residence, as Abel H. bootmaker, Curtain road, which it is shewn in the Review should have been Abel H. bootmaker, **1**, Curtain road, *Shoreditch*, have not been included in the above summary, and the following names, exactly reprinted from the Post Office, are not to be found in Robson's, London Directory for 1840, and we request attention to the *superior manner* in which *all names* appear in the work we print. Full Christian names, are always inserted, and in the cases of females, it is stated whether *Mrs.* or *Miss*—information so necessary to the precise addressing of circulars; and it will be seen that each line in the Post Office Directory is so filled out as to convey the best possible description that the space admits of.

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It cannot be denied that within the space occupied by 250 names, those names are omitted in Robson's Directory for 1840; they are nineteen in number *exclusive of those at Putney, Hammersmith, and Richmond.*

That the rest of the Work is worthy of the part reviewed, it can only be necessary to refer to the list of Bankers at page 1005; only two firms have discontinued business during the past twelvemonths, and they are printed in as though they still existed. And for a specimen of skill in adaptation and compilation, page 1041 is referred to. In the first long paragraph (line one) it is stated that "All single postage rates between places within the United Kingdom which now exceed four pence will be reduced to that sum." On the same page, that is contradicted by the names of eighty four towns in England being given with postages attached, varying in amount from 4 pence to 13-pence. On the same accurate page, the Editor not satisfied with the mode in which the Lords of Her Majesty's Treasury had spoken of the *Twopenny & Threepenny Post* in the line

"London district Post, including 2d and 3d delivery,"

has deemed it better to employ conspicuous capital letters, and has converted into

"SECOND" AND "THIRD" DELIVERY.

There are the departure of steam-boats and steam-arrivals, the postage of letters according to the new regulations, to all parts of France, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, &c., the railroads of France, with the length of line completed, and all the line that branch from the Metropolis, with the time of departure from London and the different stations, and as a proof that the work itself has caught a little of the spirit of the age, and goes on at railway speed, we may mention that 10,000 copies of about 600 pages each, and containing most complicated matter, were thrown off within thirty days from the receipt of the manuscript. But we cannot enumerate even the details of the work, which contains such a variety of matter, and which is adapted to all trades and professions. As far as we have had time to examine it, the details seem to be correctly given, and up to a late date. The compiler certainly has advantages which no other person could well obtain. Independent of the patronage of the Postmaster General, two hundred and fifty persons possessing local knowledge have been employed during the month of September in collecting information, and consequently he must have much later information than those who could afford to employ only a smaller number of hands."
