Earée has earned the right to be regarded as the Philatelist's friend, philosopher, and guide, for his labours on behalf of the stamp collector have been many and great. As evidence of this it is only necessary to refer to the volume before us, which shows in its 568 pages of closely-printed matter an amount of painstaking study, research, and acumen by no means too often met with.

"With regard to the Author's method of dealing with his subject, it may simply be stated that in each case he describes firstly the genuine stamp, and then its relative forgery, in such a manner—i.e., so fully and clearly—that the amateur is at once enabled to decide for himself, from any single specimen he may possess, whether it be good or bad. Sparring no pains to ensure accuracy, the Author's dissection of the stamps and counterfeits included in his book is singularly complete, and his descriptions show a keenness of analysis which is, in its way, masterly. Only an expert of the widest experience and utmost vigilance could so nicely demonstrate the points of difference between genuine and spurious.

"The contents of Mr. Earée's volume are arranged, according to countries and states, in alphabetical order, beginning with 'Angola,' and ending with 'Württemberg.' He avoids technicalities as far as possible, thus rendering his pages of the more immediate service to young collectors. A goodly number of illustrations are given in the book, which is well printed and handsomely bound, and which, it may emphatically be said, is one that no Philatelist having due regard for the integrity of his collection and the discomfiture of his enemies, the forgers, should neglect to purchase."

"The Foreign Stamp Collector's Journal" for February, 1882, says:

"This work has not come upon us altogether unexpectedly; it had for some time been announced, and has now made its appearance. When we heard that it was to be written by the Rev. R. B. Earée, we knew it would be good, but now we have the work before us our most sanguine expectations are eclipsed; and when we inform our readers that the work consists of some 568 pages of solid matter, strongly bound in good cloth cover, gilt, &c., they will readily perceive that the price (7/6) is very low for such a class of book as

L. Pemberton, but contained only 36 pages. Messrs. Stanley, Gibbons, & Co. deserve to be congratulated upon the amount of enterprise they have displayed in the publication of this work, and we trust that collectors will appreciate that enterprise by speedily procuring copies of the work."

"The Philatelic Record" for February, 1882, says:

"We hasten to set before our readers the result of the cursory inspection which we have as yet been able to make of the manner in which the Author's aim has been carried out, and we are happy to say that we have little else than praise to accord. Those commonest of all counterfeits which represent the stamps of Bremen, Hamburg, Bergedorf, and such places, are particularly well described. Even comparatively advanced collectors will do well to compare their specimens with Mr. Earée's notes, for the interest taken by Philatelists in these stamps is so small that their authenticity is too often taken for granted, or as a matter of minor importance, and a weeding is deferred to some future day, when more important and interesting issues have been studied. In treating of the so-called reprints of the United States and Transvaal stamps, Mr. Earée very properly applies to them the more correct, if less euphonious, title of forgeries.

"We congratulate Mr. Earée upon the intelligibility of his descriptions. No one who has not had some experience in the drawing up of lists, and describing the designs of stamps, can fully appreciate the weariness of the occupation or sympathise with the attendant struggle to avoid tautology and verbosity; and yet Mr. Earée has succeeded far better than could have been expected. Some of his descriptions are particularly happy.

"Last, but not least, we have to refer to the get-up of the book, which reflects the highest credit on both printers and publishers. It is the cheapest illustrated book at 7/6 which we have seen for some time.

"Messrs. STANLEY, GIBBONS, & Co., of 8, Gower Street, W.C., have just brought out a fourth edition of their well-known Album for Stamp collectors. The principles originally laid down, and to which the author attributes the success of the former issues, have been strictly adhered to; but the work has been largely added to by clear descriptions and good illustrations of various issues. Fac-similes of the Oriental and other monetary signs, together with explanatory notes, have been added; and among the illustrations (now numbering over fifteen hundred) may be mentioned, as a feature of interest, a series of eighty of the national arms of various countries.

"The interval between the publication of this and the previous edition has been remarkable for the rapid succession with which the many newly-issued postals have appeared, and this has necessitated the division of the edition under notice into two volumes. Volume I.—in consequence of the number of fresh European postal issues during the last few years—has to be devoted entirely to European countries which, owing to political changes, are now issuing stamps for the first time. Amongst these may be mentioned the Island of Cyprus, which, consequent on its having become a British possession, has had apportioned to it certain postals of our own country, surcharged in various styles, specially for use in this dependency; Bosnia and Herzegovina (which have produced a new series, bearing the Imperial arms of their Austrian protectors);

Bulgaria and Roumelia. Spaces have also been added for the various Russian Government locals, and the various issues of the Ottoman Empire have been classified in their proper order, fac-similes of the monetary signs having been added to aid collectors in the arrangement, &c.

"Volume II., which contains Asia, Africa, and America, has had several important additions and alterations made to it. Chief amongst the improvements may be noted the arrangement of the stamps of the Granada Confederation, Cabul, Cashmere, Antioquia, British Guiana, &c. In these countries the illustrations have been numbered to correspond with the designated spaces, a plan which cannot fail to be of service to even an experienced collector. The countries represented for the first time in this work include Cape Verde and the Falkland Islands, Persia, the Chinese Empire, Labuan, Samoa, Panama, Mozambique, Griqualand, and the West Indian Islands, Montserrat, and Tobago.

"Both volumes, which contain 350 and 360 pages respectively, are handsomely bound, and have clasps so arranged that if the books were increased to double their thickness by the addition of stamps and post-cards, they could still be kept fastened.

"The 'get up' and the whole arrangement of the work is very good, and a credit both to the author and to the firm by whom it is issued."

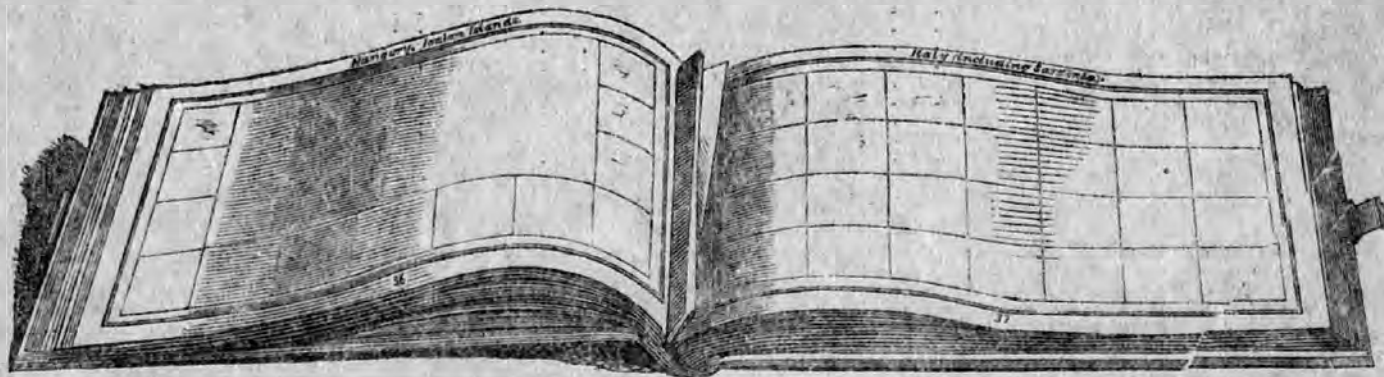

Only an expert of the widest experience and utmost vigilance could so nicely demonstrate the points of difference between genuine and spurious.

"The contents of Mr. Earée's volume are arranged, according to countries and states, in alphabetical order, beginning with 'Angola,' and ending with 'Württemberg.' He avoids technicalities as far as possible, thus rendering his pages of the more immediate service to young collectors. A goodly number of illustrations are given in the book, which is well printed and handsomely bound, and which, it may emphatically be said, is one that no Philatelist having due regard for the integrity of his collection and the discountenance of his enemies, the forgers, should neglect to purchase."

"This work has not come upon us altogether unexpectedly; it had for some time been announced, and has now made its appearance. When we heard that it was to be written by the Rev. R. B. Stanley, Gibbons, & Co. deserve to be congratulated upon the amount of enterprise they have displayed in the publication of this work, and we trust that collectors will appreciate that enterprise by speedily procuring copies of the work."

"We hasten to set before our readers the result of the cursory inspection which we have as yet been able to make of the manner in which the Author's aim has been carried out, and we are happy to say that we have little else than praise to accord. Those commonest of all counterfeits which represent the stamps of Bremen, Hamburg, Bergedorf, and such places, are particularly well described. Even comparatively advanced collectors will do well to compare their specimens with Mr. Earée's notes, for the interest taken by Philatelists in these stamps is so small that their authenticity is too often taken for granted, or as a matter of minor importance, and a weeding is deferred to some future day, when more important and interesting issues have been studied. In treating of the so-called reprints of the United States and Transvaal Stamps, Mr. Earée very properly applies to them the more correct, if less euphonious, title of forgeries.

"We congratulate Mr. Earée upon the intelligibility of his descriptions. No one who has not had some experience in the drawing up of lists, and describing the designs of stamps, can fully appreciate the weariness of the occupation or sympathise with the attendant struggle to avoid tautology and verbosity; and yet Mr. Earée has succeeded far better than could have been expected. Some of his descriptions are particularly happy.

"Last, but not least, we have to refer to the get-up of the book, which reflects the highest credit on both printers and publishers. It is the cheapest illustrated book at 7/6 which we have seen for some time.

Only an expert of the widest experience and utmost vigilance could so nicely demonstrate the points of difference between genuine and spurious.

"The contents of Mr. Earée's volume are arranged, according to countries and states, in alphabetical order, beginning with 'Angola' and ending with 'Württemberg.' He avoids technicalities as far as possible, thus rendering his pages of the more immediate service to young collectors. A goodly number of illustrations are given in the book, which is well printed and handsomely bound, and which, it may emphatically be said, is one that no Philatelist having due regard for the integrity of his collection and the discomfiture of his enemies, the forgers, should neglect to purchase."

"The Foreign Stamp Collector's Journal" says:

"This work has not come upon us altogether unexpectedly; it had for some time been announced, and has now made its appearance. When we heard that it was to be written by the Rev. R. B. Earée, we knew it would be good, but now we have the work before us our most sanguine expectations are eclipsed; and when we inform our readers that the work consists of some 560 pages of solid matter, strongly bound in good cloth cover, gilt, &c., they will readily perceive that the price (7/6) is very low for such a class of book as

this. It contains numerous illustrations, and is a fine specimen of typography. Doubtless many of our readers may remember that the last work of this kind published in England was by the late Mr. E. L. Pemberton, but contained only 36 pages. But now that collectors can purchase such a work relating to forgeries as the one at present under review, we see no reason why the number of forgeries in the market should not speedily diminish. Messrs. Stanley, Gibbons, & Co. deserve to be congratulated upon the amount of enterprise they have displayed in the publication of this work, and we trust that collectors will appreciate that enterprise by speedily procuring copies of the work."

"The Philatelic Record" says:

"We hasten to set before our readers the result of the cursory inspection which we have as yet been able to make of the manner in which the Author's aim has been carried out, and we are happy to say that we have little else than praise to accord. Those commonest of all counterfeits which represent the stamps of Bremen, Hamburg, Berge-dorf, and such places, are particularly well described. Even comparatively advanced collectors will do well to compare their specimens with Mr. Earée's notes, for the interest taken by Philatelists in these stamps is so small that their authenticity is too often taken for granted, or as a matter of minor importance, and a weeding is deferred to some future day, when more important and interesting issues have been studied. In treating of the so-called reprints of the United States and Transvaal Stamps, Mr. Earée very properly applies to them the more correct, if less euphonious, title of forgeries.

"We congratulate Mr. Earée upon the intelligibility of his descriptions. No one who has not had some experience in the drawing up of lists, and describing the designs of stamps, can fully appreciate the weariness of the occupation or sympathise with the attendant struggle to avoid tautology and verbosity; and yet Mr. Earée has succeeded far better than could have been expected. Some of his descriptions are particularly happy.

"Last, but not least, we have to refer to the get-up of the book, which reflects the highest credit on both printers and publishers. It is the cheapest illustrated book at 7/6 which we have seen for some time."

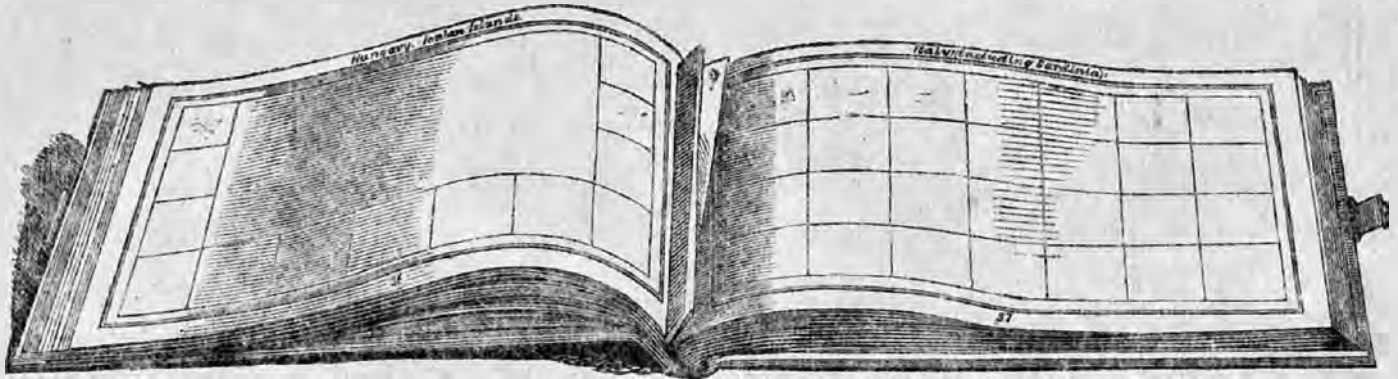

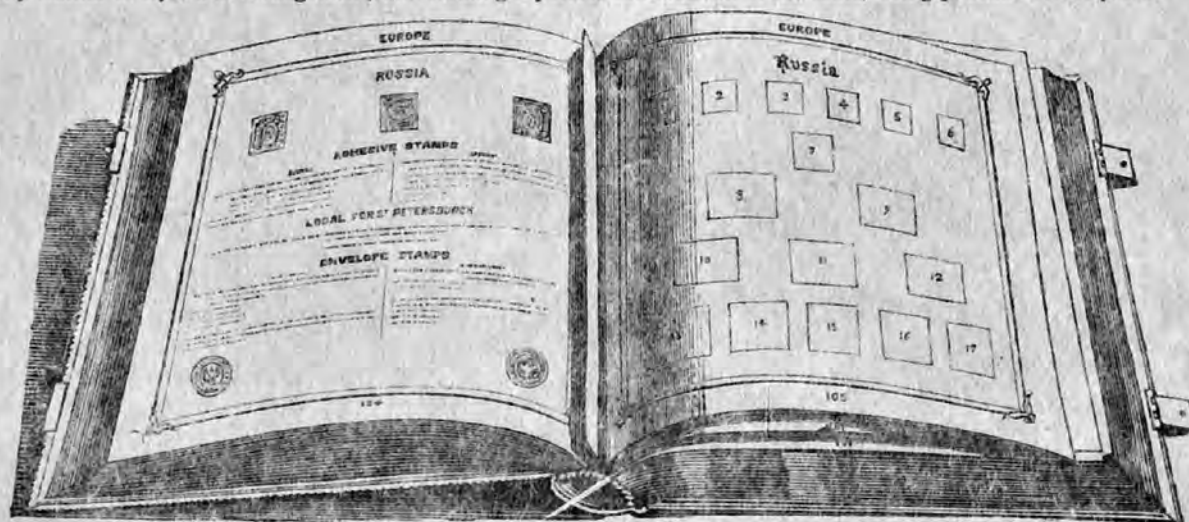

He avoids technicalities as far as possible, thus rendering his pages of the more immediate service to young collectors. A goodly number of illustrations are given in the book, which is well printed and handsomely bound, and which, it may emphatically be said, is one that no Philatelist having due regard for the integrity of his collection and the discomfiture of his enemies, the forgers, should neglect to purchase."

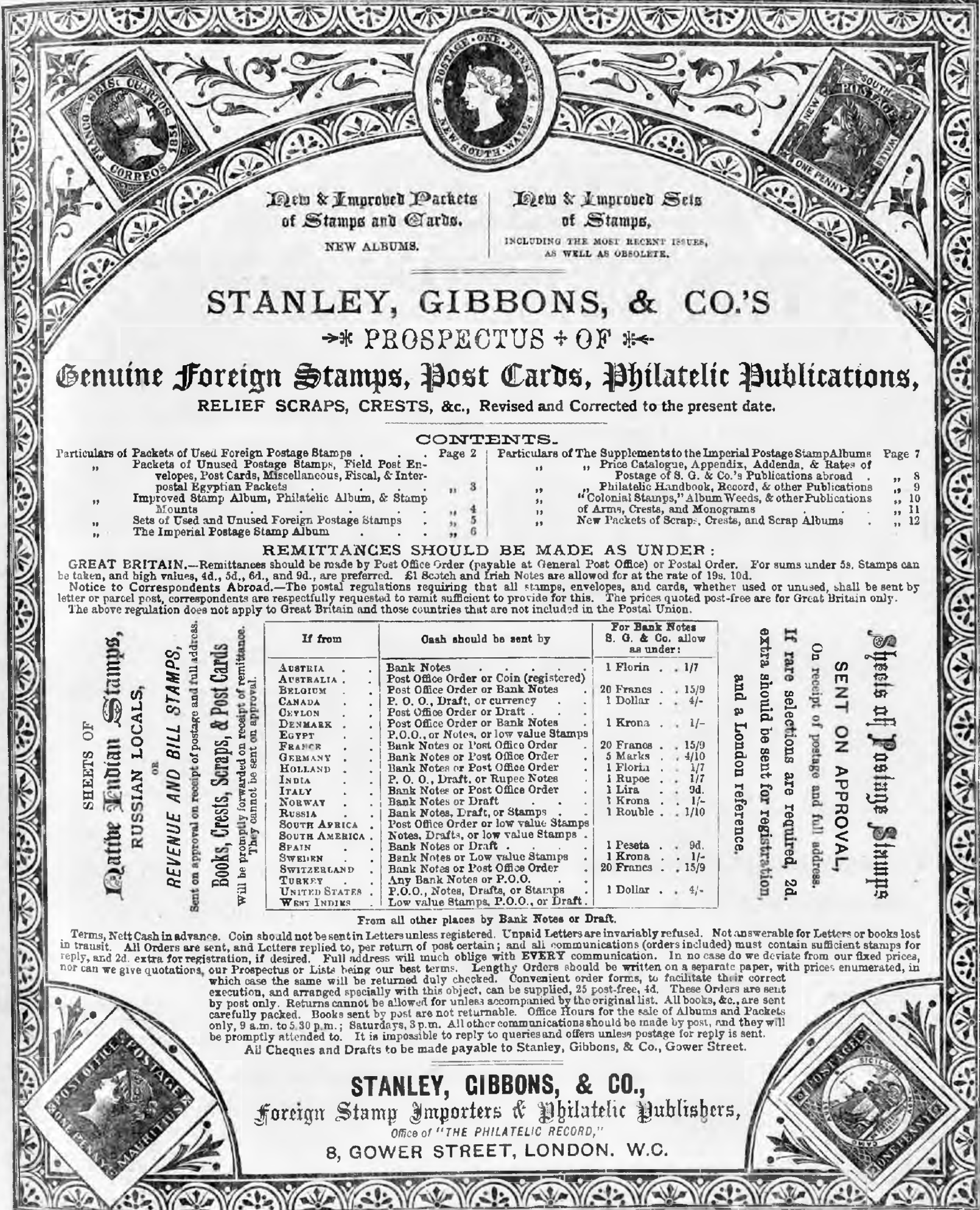

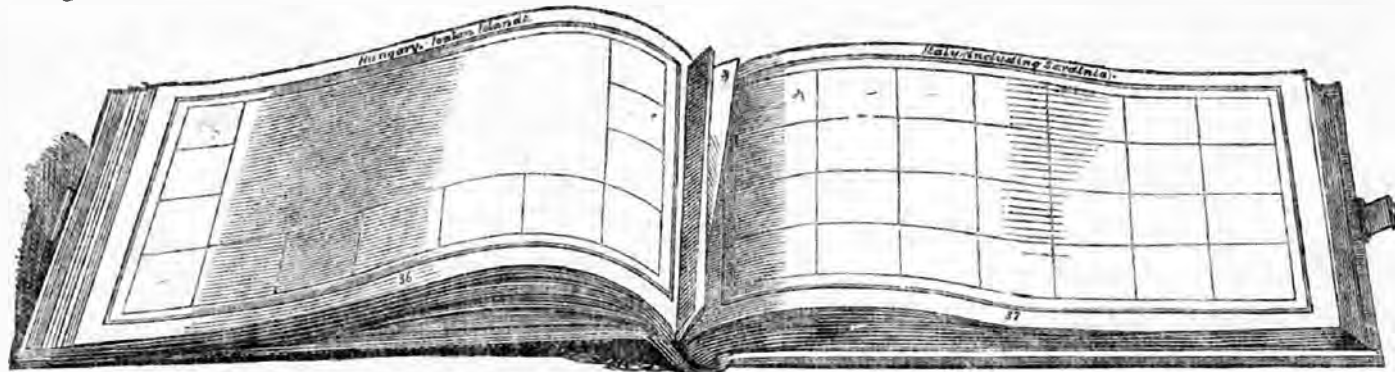

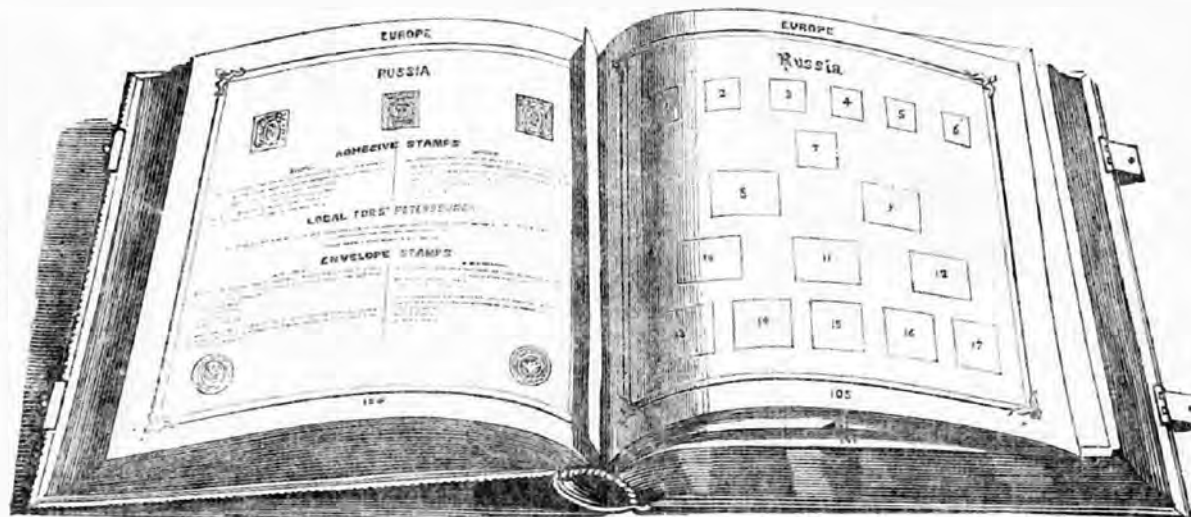

Designed to Illustrate and Identify the Colours of Postage Stamps.

The object of this work is to present a standard by comparison with which the Colour of any particular Stamp can be easily described.

THERE has always been disagreement among Philatelic Writers and Compilers of Catalogues in naming the colours of Stamps. As a single illustration: we find, on examining nine Catalogues, that seven different names are given to the colour of the 2½d. Stamp of Great Britain, 1874, although the colour of this Stamp varies as little perhaps as any that might be chosen.

About 150 colours are represented, six shades of each colour being given, running from dark to light.

Earée has earned the right to be regarded as the Philatelist’s friend, philosopher, and guide, for his labours on behalf of the stamp collector have been many and great. As evidence of this it is only necessary to refer to the volume before us, which shows in its 560 pages of closely-printed matter an amount of painstaking study, research, and acumen by no means too often met with.

“With regard to the Author’s method of dealing with his subject, it may simply be stated that in each case he describes firstly the genuine stamp, and then its relative forgery, in such a manner—*i.e.*, so fully and clearly—that the amateur is at once enabled to decide for himself, from any single specimen he may possess, whether it be good or bad. Sparing no pains to ensure accuracy, the Author’s dissection of the stamps and counterfeits included in his book is singularly complete, and his descriptions show a keenness of analysis which is, in its way, masterly. Only an expert of the widest experience and utmost vigilance could so nicely demonstrate the points of difference between genuine and spurious.

“The contents of Mr. Earée’s volume are arranged, according to countries and states, in alphabetical order, beginning with ‘Angola’ and ending with ‘Württemberg.’ He avoids technicalities as far as possible, thus rendering his pages of the more immediate service to young collectors. A goodly number of illustrations are given in the book, which is well printed and handsomely bound, and which, it may emphatically be said, is one that no Philatelist having due regard for the integrity of his collection and the discomfiture of his enemies, the forgers, should neglect to purchase.”

“The Foreign Stamp Collector’s Journal” says:

“This work has not come upon us altogether unexpectedly; it had for some time been announced, and has now made its appearance. When we heard that it was to be written by the Rev. R. B. Earée, we knew it would be good, but now we have the work before us our most sanguine expectations are eclipsed; and when we inform our readers that the work consists of some 560 pages of solid matter, strongly bound in good cloth cover, gilt, &c., they will readily perceive that the price (7/6) is very low for such a class of book as

this. It contains numerous illustrations, and is a fine specimen of typography. Doubtless many of our readers may remember that the last work of this kind published in England was by the late Mr. E. L. Pemberton, but contained only 36 pages. But now that collectors can purchase such a work relating to forgeries as the one at present under review, we see no reason why the number of forgeries in the market should not speedily diminish. Messrs. Stanley, Gibbons, & Co. deserve to be congratulated upon the amount of enterprise they have displayed in the publication of this work, and we trust that collectors will appreciate that enterprise by speedily procuring copies of the work.”

“The Philatelic Record” says:

“We hasten to set before our readers the result of the cursory inspection which we have as yet been able to make of the manner in which the Author’s aim has been carried out, and we are happy to say that we have little else than praise to accord. Those commonest of all counterfeits which represent the stamps of Bremen, Hamburg, Bergeford, and such places, are particularly well described. Even comparatively advanced collectors will do well to compare their specimens with Mr. Earée’s notes, for the interest taken by Philatelists in these stamps is so small that their authenticity is too often taken for granted, or as a matter of minor importance, and a weeding is deferred to some future day, when more important and interesting issues have been studied. In treating of the so-called reprints of the United States and Transvaal Stamps, Mr. Earée very properly applies to them the more correct, if less euphonious, title of forgeries.

“We congratulate Mr. Earée upon the intelligibility of his descriptions. No one who has not had some experience in the drawing up of lists, and describing the designs of stamps, can fully appreciate the weariness of the occupation or sympathise with the attendant struggle to avoid tautology and verbosity; and yet Mr. Earée has succeeded far better than could have been expected. Some of his descriptions are particularly happy.

“Last, but not least, we have to refer to the get-up of the book, which reflects the highest credit on both printers and publishers. It is the cheapest illustrated book at 7/6 which we have seen for some time.”
