One of the most popular as well as the best known Philatelistis in Denver is the subject of this sketch, Dr. H. A. Davis. Prime among the movers for a regenerated philatelic spirit in Denver, he has always been ready and eager to put the collectors in better touch with each other and was the organizer of both the present Philatelic Clubs in the Queen City.

He has been the Secretary of the Denver Stamp Club ever since its organization, and the Junior Club thought so well of his efforts in putting them on a firm footing that they elected him as their permanent Honorary President.

The United States Revenue Society owes its present high standing to the efforts put forth by Dr. Davis in putting it in such fine shape. He has been nominated for Secretary for a second term of the U. S. R. S., but has re-



spectfully declined the honor again thrust upon him.

Dr. Davis has always been a close observer of stamps and he has confined himself to the emissions of our country. Hardly a collector but has read with pleasure and some profit the fine articles written by Dr. Davis, both in Mekeel's and the Philatehe West. The writer knows him as the best of friends, the close student of Philately, and the bardest worker for the betterment of each society he has been associated with, no matter in what position he might be placed.

Dr. Davis is the candidate for Secretary of the American Philatelic Association on the "New England Branch" ticket. No one could, or would, bring our Association up to a greater glory than the Doctor. That he will be elected to this office and prove an ornament to the Society is the wish, hope and ambition of all who have met him and know his qualifications for the successful fulfilment of this office.

In the home he is gentleness itself, the kindest and truest of friends, the soul of honor in business, and a gentlemen through and through wherever you meet him. In Philately he has experienced a very active career. He began collecting in 1883. His first collection he sold in 1889, and immediately puthis eneries in a second which he sold in 1893. His third collection was made while a resident in New York City and a member of the Collectors' Club, this when completed was also disposed of, and the fourth which is now engaging his attention consists of oddities on original covers and bids fair to out class any of his former efforts.

His name has been associated prominently in all Philatelic organizations in Denver. Hewas an officer in the old Q. C. P. S. in 87. Treasurer of Rocky Mountain Stamp Society in '90, a member of the Executive Committee of the Denver Philatelic Society in '93, the organizer and first secretary of the Queen City Philatelic Society in '94. President of the P. S. of A. in '96. President of the Trans-Mississippi rhilatelic Society in '99, and the present Vice President of the Denver Stamp Club organized in 1905. He is also the President of the Colorado Branch A. P. A., to whom the largest share of credit is due in organizing the Association members of Denver and Colorado into an active body for the promotion of the "Grand Old Society."
