The system of sending to collectors upon approval stamps mounted upon sheets and in books has been very tmuch abused by both dealers and collectors. We wish to state our rules and regulations in regard to this department of our business very plainly:

Accounts Opened by Minors Must be Approved and Guaranteed by Parents or Guardian.
All stamps that we forward by registered mail must also be returned to us registered.
Correspondents are expected to pay return postage, registration and cost of draft or money order.
Coin must not be sent by mail, on account of the danger of loss through breaking the envelope or theft.
Canada silver will not be accepted. Canada currency is 2 per cent discount, and unused Canadian stamps 5 per cent discount.

The most desirable form of remittance is express or post-office money order. Unused United States stamps 3 per cent discount. This form of remittance is undesirable

We have not tire time to devote to petty approval sheet business, and furtber selections will not be sent to parties whose net remittances are below $\$_{1} 00$, unless there is a reasonable excuse The trade of the class of people who are in the habit of requesting sbeets to buy a few cents' worth of stamps is respectfully declined.

Selections of stamps should not be kept more than 5 days, and in extreme cases 10 days. Parties who are slow and in the habit of being dunned for returns will not request stamps.

Unless you bave an open account or are known to us, good business or bank references are required
We sball take pleasure in devoting our time and attention to collectors who are buyers of stamps, and are always glad to make new friends.
