


Introduction.



T is perhaps hardly necessary for me to enlarge upon the significance of proofs and essays, or their importance as a complementary part of a Stamp-collection, whether from a philaletic or historical or any other point of view.

From the very earliest days of collecting, collectors both in London and Paris as far back as 1852 - 53, evinced an interest in proofs and essays, as may be seen by referring to the pages of the earliest catalogues and periodical publications, and of late years Herr Oberlandes gerichtsrat Lindenberg has rendered very valuable service to philately, by the publication of the results of his researches as well as by his energy in forming the Imperial Collection of Proofs and Essays in the Post-Office Museum in Berlin.

The formation of the Schroeder collection of Proofs and Essays was begun none too soon, as year by year it becomes increasingly difficult to gather together specimens, made at a time when the cost of production was of more importance than it is to-day. Such an undertaking deserves special recognition not only on account of the time and money expended, but also from the fact that this class of production never existed in large numbers, and in many instances from the moment of their birth, some were practically if not actually unique.


The chief sources of supply from which the Schroeder collection was compiled, were first, the celebrated collection of the father of French philately, Dr. Legrand, and afterwards the wonderful stock of that renowned patriarch of stamp-dealers,

Monsieur J. B. Moens of Brussels from which many treasures were unearthed — Monsieur Arthur Maury, — the doyen of the French dealers — was after much persuasion at length induced to part with original sheets of essays, which had been described in French philatelic works as a "national treasure". Messrs. Stanley Gibbons furnished some very fine specimens of British proofs and essays, while from many German firms were obtained specimens of the different German States, particularly those of Brunswick and the unique essay of the Saxony 3 Pf. in black.

The compiler of this Catalogue desires to express the hope, that this collection may be preserved to German Philately and find a permanent resting place in Germany, for he is fully assured, no one, whatever means he might possess could form a collection to compare with it for beauty and completeness.

Fig. 4. Essay, 10 Pf., pink. Similar to issued type of 1889, but different lettering. Wide margins (imperf.)

The last three specimens show the impression of the surrounding part of the plate as in the illustrations. Type of 1873. 30 Groschen (3 shades) imperf. **Fig. 6.** 3 Pf., green. Type of 1889, overprinted "Probe" diagonally, 3 shades (with gum but imperf.).

Type 1875. 5 Pf., black (with gum but imperf. rare).

Fig. 7. Type of 1871-72. Essay of 2 Gr. blue with lettering in straight lines instead of a semicircle. The eagle is over the net-work, and superimposed on a separate piece of paper is a small eagle on a dotted ground, embossed in fine relief. (Value 150-200 Mk.)

Fig. 8. Proof of the 2^{1}_{2} Pf., brown of 1874, but with figure only 5^{1}_{2} mm high. Fine condition with gum. (Worth several hundred marks.)

Fig. 9. 10 Pf., rose.

Essay with wide margins, background of radiating lines.

Fig. 10. Similar head to last, but in an ornamental frame. (With gum and perforated.)



Fig. 1. Essay for 10 Pf. with gum and perforation. 4 different shades.

" 2. Similar essay for 50 Pf. but more finely engraved. 12 different shades.

" 3. Essay. 5 Pf., green, similar to issued type of 1889. Wide margins (imperf.)

Fig. 4. Essay, 10 Pf., pink. Similar to issued type of 1889, but different lettering. Wide margins (imperf.)

Fig. 5. Dieproofs of the 1889 set as issued (wide margins imperf.)

10 Pf., pink (1).

20 " blue (I).

25 " orange (2).

The last three specimens show the impression of the surrounding part of the plate as in the illustrations. Type of 1873. 30 Groschen (3 shades) imperf. Fig. 6. 3 Pf., green. Type of 1889, overprinted "Probe" diagonally, 3 shades (with gum but imperf.).

Type 1875. 5 Pf., black (with gum but imperf. rare).

Fig. 7. Type of 1871-72. Essay of 2 Gr. blue with lettering in straight lines instead of a semicircle. The eagle is over the net-work, and superimposed on a separate piece of paper is a small eagle on a dotted ground, embossed in fine relief. (Value 150-200 Mk.)

Fig. 8. Proof of the 2^{1}_{2} Pf., brown of 1874, but with figure only 5^{1}_{2} mm high. Fine condition with gum. (Worth several hundred marks.)

Fig. 9. 10 Pf., rose.

Essay with wide margins, background of radiating lines.

Fig. 10. Similar head to last, but in an ornamental frame. (With gum and perforated.)

(The last three are very rare.)

German Colonies.

Essays of Surcharge.

Fig. 11. The 3, 5, 10, 20 and 50 Pf. of 1889. Surcharged 2, 3, 5, 10 and 25 Pesa respectively, and "Deutsch-Ostafrika" in a circle.

Fig. 12. Similar set, but with "Deutsch" at left and "Ostafrika" at right in straight lines.

Fig. 13. As last, but in two lines at top.

" 14. As last, but in one line diagonally.

" 15. As last, but "D.-Ostafrika" in one line.

" 16. As last, but "D.-O.-A." diagonally.

These essays for German East Africa are very rare.

The same set of stamps, surcharged "Marocco" diagonally (without surcharge of value).

Post Cards, 5 Pf., green and 10 Pf., rose surcharged with the six varieties of surcharge shown in Figs. 11-16. (Very rare.)

Bavaria.

I Kr., black. Sharp and clear impression, a first print from the original plate on thin white paper.

I Kr., Six colour proofs on white paper (some with gum).

I Kr., black. Specimen from a rejected sheet.

3 Kr., black (1849-62). Two proofs, and another from a rejected sheet.

6 Kr., black (first type). Proof in fine condition.

6 Kr., an albino or colourless impression (of great rarity).

9 Kr., black, (proof). Less clearly printed Proofs of all values I Kr. (4), 3 Kr. (2), 6 Kr. (7), 9 Kr. (6), I2 Kr. (1), I8 Kr. (2), mostly in the issued colours, the I8 Kr. are in pink and blue, and the I, 3 and 6 Kr. with vertical silk threads.

The same set in black, on glazed paper with wide margins, a second specimen of the 9 Kr. shows a small circular engraver's mark close to the figures of value in the centre.

The same set in pink on glazed paper.

Two specimens of the 9 Kr. in blue as last.

Two specimens of the 9 Kr in brown as last.

Fig. 17. Dieproof for the 1867 issue, with figures 1, 3, 9 and 12 in each corner respectively in black, shewing impression of surrounding plate.

Three impressions in colour of the same and another cut to shape.

Type of 1867 issue (no thread), clearly printed. 9 Specimens in various shades (some with gum), one being printed on both sides.

Type of 1876 issue in very fine and clear relief on watermarked paper (Large letter and laid lines).

3 Pf., green, watermarked perpendicular wavy lines.

Fig. 18. A pair of essays for 7 Kr. (1867) in a smaller size than issued, in black, printed without embossing (highly interesting).

Three similar pairs in colour on white and another pair on yellow paper (some with gum).

Fig. 19. Essay for 3 Kr. in pink. Head to the right, in fine relief.

Another in black, the margins of the paper show further traces of engraving. **Fig. 20.** Essays for a figure "3" in two colours on white.

, 21. Three essays embossed on white envelopes for a "special postal delivery", values: 1, 2 and 3 Kr.

Two pairs of the 5 and 20 Pf. of 1876 on yellow paper.

Essay for the 3 Kr. oval envelope stamp in colour, on a large piece of laid paper.

Fig. 22. Essay for a local stamp. Six specimens in colour on thick glazed paper.

Fig. 23. Six specimens of another essay similarly printed.

Six envelopes (white), each having Fig. 23 in the left upper corner and Fig. 22 in the right upper corner. "Probe" in ornamental letters in the middle of the envelopes. Each envelope in a different colour.

As last, but on yellow, diagonally-laid, paper.

Fig. 24. Essay for 3 Kr. envelope in colour and in relief on white diagonallylaid paper.

An entire envelope with 7 impressions cut square and attached to the left upper corner.

Four impressions on white and five on yellow paper, cut square and attached to the right side.

Essay of a Fiscal stamp. Three blocks of four, rouletted in various colours, value $3^{1/2}$ Kr. in block.

Similar block of four, two being $10^{1}/_{2}$ Kr. and two $3^{1}/_{2}$ Kr.

Two single specimens without value (imperf.).

Fig. 25. Essay for Kreuzer values. Figures 9, 18, 6 and 3 in each corner respectively.

Fig. 26. Another essay, having the figures 6, 3, 9 and 1.

" 27. Another essay, having the figures 6, 3, 6 and 1, the figure "1" being reversed.

These three essays are of high artistic merit and are among the gems of the collection.

Bergedorf.

Fig. 28. First essay for the 3 Schillinge (with final "e") on white paper. Design showing in the colour of the paper.

Eight similar specimens in different colours.

Fig. 29. Essay for a 4 Schilling stamp in 5 different shades.

Type of 1861. Six proofs in black finely executed (one a double impression). Same type. 29 Specimens in colour on white (all the values are represented in various shades).

Brunswick.

This portion of the collection is extremely fine and complete, so much so that it would not be possible even for a museum to form another to equal it.

Reprints of the proofs of the 1853-56 design in black, on white and coloured paper.

Five specimens, three of which have a dot after "vier".

Fig. 30. 10 Specimens of an original essay of a proposed 2 Gr. value (of considerable rarity).

A specimen in colour on white (without embossing), and 9 others (with embossing) on white, yellow and buff papers, one of which on vertically laid paper has "Probe" overprinted on the back.

Fig. 31. Similar to Fig. 30. Essay for 1 Gr. Two specimens in green and deepcarmine on greyish-white so called China paper. These are original prints from the wood-block made in 1863.

Reprints, 4 Specimens hand-printed in black on tinted paper, 1 with sharp embossing, machine-printed in light blue on white.

Reprints of Fig. 30, 4 Specimens hand-printed in black on white and coloured paper.

3 Specimens in beautifully preserved condition machine-printed in brown, blue and yellow on yellowish-white paper.

15 Specimens (originals) in various colours on thin white paper, and in black on tinted paper.

Fig. 32. Essay for 3 Gr. in blue on yellowish-white paper (one of the rarest Essays in the collection).

Fig. 33. Essay for 2 Gr. (subsequently modified for the 1865 issue). Two specimens in different colours on China paper.

2 Specimens in black on paper coloured on one side only.

I Specimen, machine-printed in black on yellow.

(These eight essays are rare).

Fig. 34. Essay for 2 Gr., closely resembling the issued stamp, the crown and

horse being somewhat larger. The engraver's secret (?) mark is the white dot below the body of the horse.

Fig. 35. Essay for 2 Gr. similar to last, but having a scroll ornamentation under the ground, in black on ordinary thick paper.

Fig. 36. Type of 1865 as issued. I Gr. Printed from electro-types surreptitiously taken from the plates (consequently not to be had in the regular way).

Fig. 37. Essay for the design of the 2 Gr. (of similar design) but with the central oval without design. (This is rare).

Fig. 38. Type of 2 Gr. as issued. Two "artists" proofs, taken by the engraver from the original die.

A black print from an illegally-made electro type, showing traces of the wooden frame. 15 original prints of sheets containing the above essays, in black on variously coloured paper.

Proof with two impressions of 2 Gr. in blue,

A sheet of the $\frac{4}{4}$ Gr. stamps prepared in 1857, brown on white, watermarked. I Set of prints of the above taken from the electro types and platino types used for No. 9 of the "Deutsche Briefmarken-Zeitung" in 1897, in black. A similar set with corrector's marks.

Hamburg.

Although not of equal importance to Brunswick, the essays and proofs of Hamburg are of considerable philatelic value, all issues being represented by fine and perfect specimens. The essays of the first issue call for special notice being shown in many varieties of shade and printing.

Fig. 39. Very clear first print in fine condition of the 4 Schilling in black showing engraver's marks (which afford a test of genuineness in the issued stamps) a minute dot over "E" of "Postmarke" and another over and between "S" and "c" of "Schilling".

21 Specimens of all values from $\frac{1}{2}$ Sch. to 9 Sch., in various colours (some with watermark). The papers and lettering show considerable variety.

II Essays of the first issue in black on yellow paper.

Fig. 40. 2 Proofs in black on yellow paper of the $1^{1}/_{4}$ Sch. of 1864. 24 Essays of the same type in colour on white, and in black on coloured papers.

2 pairs with watermark (arms of Hamburg and wavy lines).

2 Specimens (watermarked) on very thin paper.

19 proofs of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ Schilling of 1864 in various colours, five of which are on coloured paper, the rest on white. (In mint state.)

19 Specimens of the perforated stamps of the same type in various colours, with 2 Essays of the 1866 issue.

Hannover.

This country is represented by over 300 Specimens, and although generallyspeaking these essays and proofs are not rare, this collection contains many of great rarity, representing no small money value.

Sheets showing horizontal rows of different values.

Fig. 41. Five rows of 4 in black, showing I g. Gr., $\frac{1}{10}$ Th., $\frac{1}{15}$ Th., $\frac{1}{30}$ Th. and 3 Pf. Fine clear print in black on white.

Four vertical strips of above in black, pink, blue and yellow.

6 strips of 1_{10} Th., 1_{15} Th. and 1_{30} Th. in single colours and in bi-coloured impressions. Sheet with four sets of these three values in blue.

Fig. 42. 4 Sheets of 6 stamps, consisting of the same values arranged in two horizontal rows of 3 in bi-coloured impressions on white.

4 Strips (each strip of the 5 values) in two colours.

Fig. 43. Sheet containing rows of the $\frac{1}{10}$ Th., $\frac{1}{15}$ Th. and $\frac{1}{30}$ Th. (4 of each value) and 3 single specimens, printed in two colours.

Similar sheet in one colour.

2 strips of coloured essays of designs for the 1850-53 issue.

Fig. 44. Sheet containing 2 rows of three of the 1 g. Gr. in black on grey.

Sheet containing 3 rows of 4 in a row, of the fractional Thaler values in black on pink.

Single strips and single stamps of the same in black on blue, yellow and brown papers.

Fig. 45. A pair of impressions of the Local Frank-stamp "Bestellgeld-Frei" in black on China paper, much clearer print than on the envelopes.

This insignificant piece of paper has escaped destruction for half a century.

The specimens of essays for the issued stamps here represented are very fine and valuable.

Four blocks of four of the 1_{10} Th., 1_{15} Th. and 1_{30} Th. respectively in issued colours. 2 single specimens of the 1_{10} Th. and 1_{30} Th.

Fig. 46. Specimen of 3 Pf. with coarse network.

" 47. The same with fine network.

Pair of $\frac{1}{10}$ Th. in grey back-ground with yellow coarse network.

Fig. 48. Specimen of 1_{15} Th. with fine network in blue from the corner of the sheet, showing a wavy-lined pattern border at the top.

Specimens of $\frac{1}{10}$ Th., $\frac{1}{30}$ Th. and 3 Pf. with fine network (horizontally).

Fig. 49 and 50. The 1 g. Gr. and $\frac{1}{30}$ Th. with fine network (vertically). The rarest essays of Hannover.

Fig. 51 and 52. 7 pairs of the 1 g. Gr. each pair showing different grades of execution without network; single specimens etc. in many combinations of colour. Fig. 53. Artist's proof on a large piece of paper of the last issue (with Head)

without figure of value before "Groschen". This piece must be considered the chief among these proofs and essays.

Same design, value inserted in black. Finely executed. 11 other specimens in black on coloured papers, execution not so fine.

Print from the plate after defacing with cross-cuts.


2 blocks of six and 4 first impressions of the 1/2 Gr. of 1860, in yellow and in black.


Fig. 54. Envelope essays. 18 Specimens (without numeral of value) in various colours, in pairs and singles.

Fig. 55. Device of the "rampant horse of Hanover" for Local envelopes. 4 Specimens on a sheet arranged in pairs tête beche. In various colours.

Fig. 56. 16 impressions of the Trefoil device similarly arranged, in green, blue and rose on black.

Three impressions on small pieces of paper. 2 first impressions of the I Gr., envelope, carmine, (head type), with small green overprint at left.





Volume II. Germany (continued.)

Heligoland.

The essays and proofs here represented are superior in execution and finish to those specimens usually found in collections. The illustrations do not do full justice to them, but only examination of the specimens themselves can do this. **Fig. 57.** Block of 4 of $\frac{1}{2}$ Schilling in black (imperf.) a similar block showing traces of rouletting.

Fig. 58. Block of 4 of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Schilling in the issued colours, but with head inverted.

Fig. 59. Block of 4 of the 2 Pf. in green, head embossed on white background. , 60. Block of 4 of the 1 Pf. in red and green, but with head inverted.

There are 21 blocks of 4 in all in the collection.

Single essays, including one with double impression.

Fig. 61. Sheet containing 8 Specimens of the 5 Pf., in one colour, arranged in two rows of four, foot to foot.

Specimen of 3 Pf., green, yellow and red. perf. $12^{1}/_{2}$ and a specimen of 20 Pf. violet-red, yellow and red also perf. $12^{1}/_{2}$. This perforation is not known on any issued stamp.

Proofs of 1 M. and 5 M. in the issued colours, very fine impressions. (These two are very rare.)

Lübeck.

The essays of this country are so rare, that it is doubtful whether any other collection in private hands can show them. Even in this fine collection they are not numerous.

Fig. 62. A strip of the five values, $\frac{1}{2}$, I, 2, $2\frac{1}{2}$ and 4 Schilling of the 1859 type in black on the paper watermarked rosettes with wide margin. This piece is of very great value,

Mecklenburg-Strelitz.

Fig. 63. Essay in intense black on China paper. Of great artistic and philatelic value.

North German Postal District.

The collection contains no less than 210 essays and proofs, to describe which all in detail would occupy too much space in this catalogue. Suffice it to say, they are all in very fine condition, many occurring in sets, which materially enhances their value.

Fig. 72. 10 Specimens of 1 Gr. somewhat similar to 1868-69 issue, in various colours, imperf.

A very fine collection of high artistic merit and fine workmanship.

Fig. 89. Essay for I Sgr. A strip of 3 in black on yellow pelure paper, also a single specimen. This was the first design submitted to the Prussian Postal Authorities.

2 Specimens for 2 Sgr. in black on yellow and on thin pink paper.

2 " " 3 Sgr. " " and in yellow on thick paper.

8 ,, of the same value and type in various colours on thin paper, with gum.

2 Specimens of the same, perf. $11^{1}/_{2}$.

Fig. 90. Artist's proof of the 1859 issue (uncompleted) in black on thick paper. A very interesting and valuable specimen.

Fig. 91. Similar design (with solid background) in black and in blue.

Another specimen, and a finished print. 10 proofs in colour of the 1, 2 and 3 Gr. of the 1857 type (with solid background). An impression in black.

8 Specimens of 1, 2 and 3 Sgr. and 4 Pf. of the 1858 type (cross-lined background), one on thick paper.

3 Specimens of 4 Pf. colour on white, and of the 6 Pf. in red-orange on blue. 5 Specimens of the 2 and 3 Sgr. in black on coloured papers.

8 Specimens of the 6 Pf. of the 1861 type in various colours, rouletted.

Essay for envelope stamp, cut square.

12 Specimens of Sgr. values, imperf. 7 of which are printed in gold.

Fig. 92. A pair of 3 Sgr. with trial obliteration.

I Specimen with small overprint in diamond-type at back, another without, both rouletted.

6 Specimens of 1, 2 and 3 Kr. of 1867 issue in black, imperf.

Specimen of envelope stamp of 6 Kr. cut-square.

Of the 10 and 30 Sgr. on laid paper there are 2 Specimens of each value on ordinary paper and I each of the same values of similar design but with large coloured figures, on very thin pelure.

Four strips each with four impressions in black, pink, blue and yellow of the 1, 2 and 3 Sgr. of 1857, and a specimen of Fig. 91.

Fig. 93. 2 Specimens on small sheets, the whole sheet being perforated.

Saxony.

As a native of this Kingdom, the collector very justly prides himself on having brought together the most complete collection possible of its Essays and proofs. The gem of the collection is an Essay of the 3 Pf. red of 1850, finely executed and printed in black on thick paper. The owner values this at M. 1000, and as it is absolutely unique he considers this a modest valuation, when contrasted with the prices at which specimens of the Post-Office Mauritius have changed hands in recent times.

Of the 1851 type, there are no less than 16 Specimens mostly in black on grey, pink, blue or yellow paper and a few in colour on white.

Fig. 94. 3 Pf., green on white, designed for the 185' issue. A very rare essay.

Fig. 95. 3 Specimens (without value) in black on thick paper.




Fig. 105. Entire proof sheet of the 3 Kr. (50 stamps) of 1869, imperf.




Fig. 204. 3 small sheets, each containing 2 impressions of a 5 C. essay.




Fig 296. Perfect impression of on essay in black on white.




These essays or proofs were formerly the property of Monsieur Granier, who had them reprinted in 1865 for the Paris Exhibition of 1867.

The object of this process of printing was to avoid the necessity for cancelling, as any attempt to remove them from the envelope, would destroy them, the stamp impression being left on the envelope.

It is probable that the reason which prevented the adoption of this idea was the fact that they were difficult to handle, even in small quantities as moisture would at once damage them.

The difficulty of preservation therefore enhances the value of the specimens in this collection, which are in perfect preservation.

The essays and proofs here shown of Italy and Sardinia form a complete philatelic history of the stamps and would be invaluable to any one contemplating the writing of a work on the subject as the history and evolution of the designs can be followed out step by step.

From a mere monetary point of view very many of these essays and proofs are of comparatively little value as nearly every thing produced has been preserved but this collection contains so many exceptional pieces, that it may be doubted whether even the Italian Government itself could bring together such a complete collection.

Fig. 319 and 320. The illustrations show a very well preserved document of 1818. This is the oldest official notification of any country in the world referring to postage-stamps and forms a fitting introduction to this part of the collection. The second page gives specimens from the embossing dies of the three values of 15, 25 and 50 c, which were struck on letter-sheets.




Fig. 382. 8 blocks in various colours on thick paper.


Note by the reviser of the English translation.

1. Throughout this catalogue the words "Essay" and "Probe" are used with much wider meaning than in English. With English philatetic readers the word "Proof" is confined to prints and impressions, identical in design with that afterwards adopted, and the word "Essay" to everything differing however little from a subsequently adopted design. In the description of specimens not illustrated it was impossible to say in many cases which of the two words should have been used in the English version in regard to any particular specimen being described.

2. In a few cases, the description has been extended where it seemed to make it clearer for the reader.

3. In the description of the English proofs the present writer made a few corrections in the text, he having a considerable acquaintance with the subject.


