

PREFACE.

HE Science of Philately has now attained such an extraordinary development that it becomes more and more necessary to specialize its various divisions. It is hopeless to expect a general catalogue to be both minutely descriptive and up to date. The present publication is for this reason confined to British Colonial Adhesive Postage Stamps, of which the writer has been a collector and keen appreciator for seventeen years.

All Registered, Too Late, Fiscal Postals, Unpaid Letter, and Official Postage Stamps are included, but no Envelope, Newspaper, Post Card, Telegraph, or Local Issues.

The works consulted have been Moens' (1891), Lockyer's Colonial Stamps, the London Philatelic Society's publications, Stanley Gibbons', and all Philatelic Journals. These, with the results of the author's own extensive experience, have, it is hoped, formed a chronicle of every known legitimate variety of Adhesive Colonial Postage Stamp up to 1st January, 1894.

Special attention has been paid to varieties of perforation and watermark, and to errors of print. The writer will be amply rewarded for what has been a labour of love, if his catalogue is pronounced by the Philatelic Public to be more useful and complete than any which has preceded it in the same department of the Science.





















ANTIGUA

(AMERICA).

NTIGUA is the seat of government and the residence of the Governorin Chief of the Leeward Islands. Its area is nearly 108 square miles, and it is situate about 50 miles east of Saint Christopher. The population is 36,699. Discovered by Columbus in 1493, settled by the Exports: Sugar, rum, molasses, tamarinds, and English in 1632. arrowroot.

BAHAMAS THE

(AMERICA).

GROUP of islands in the West Indies, near the east coast of North America, with an area of 5794 square miles, and a population of 47,565, mostly white. Discovered by Columbus in 1492, the islands were originally settled by the English, but were surprised by the Spanish in 1781, and restored to the English at the Peace of Versailles. The chief industry is sponge gathering; the fruit trade is also important. The fibre plant is extensively cultivated.

BARBADOS

(AMERICA).

THE most windward of the West India Islands is about 78 miles east of St. Vincent. Area 166 square miles, and population 182,322. The principal exports are sugar, molasses, and rum. The island was formerly the head-quarters of H.M. forces in the West Indies. Unlike most of the neighbouring Islands, Barbados has always remained in the pressession of Great Britain since it was cattled in 1825. In 1825, it was possession of Great Britain since it was settled in 1625. In 1885 it was constituted a distinct government. It is said to have been discovered by the Portuguese.



BERMUDA

(AMERICA).

THE Bermudas, or Somers Islands, are a cluster of about 100 small islands in the west of the Atlantic Ocean. They have a total area of 19 square miles, with a population of 15,013, about a third being white. These islands derive their name from Bermudez, a Spaniard, who sighted them in 1527, but they were first colonized by Admiral Sir George Somers, who was shipwrecked there in 1609. The nearest point in the mainland is Cape Hatterss. in North Carolina, 580 miles distant. Bermuda possesses a strongly-fortified dockyard, where the British North American squadron refits. The climate is healthy but the land is poor, the chief products being onions and potatoes.

BRITISH BECHUANALAND

(AFRICA).

BECHUANALAND lies to the north of Cape Colony, and is partly a British Colony and partly a Protectorate. It is bounded on the east by the South African Republic, or Transvaal. It has an area of 222,000 square miles, 60,000 of which are the Colony, the remainder being Protectorate. The Colony was annexed in 1885. The chief industry is agriculture, and the exports are maize, wool, hides, cattle, and wood for the Kimberley market. White population 5211.



BRITISH COLUMBIA AND VANCOUVER'S ISLAND

(AMERICA).

RITISH COLUMBIA occupies the western frontier of North America, and includes Queen Charlotte Islands and Vancouver's Island. It has an area of 383,300 square miles. Vancouver's Island is celebrated for the quality of its coal. Its population is 85,000 whites, 31,000 Indians, and 7000 Chinese. The city of Vancouver was in 1881 a forest, and in 1891 it had a population of 18,000. The industrial establishments have increased about 300 per cent. since 1881. Exports: tinned salmon and fruits. British Columbia and Vancouver's Island were originally two separate governments, but they were united to the Dominion of Canada as one province in 1871.



BRITISH EAST AFRICA.

THE Imperial British East Africa Company was incorporated in 1888. Their territories include the coast from the Umba River to the Jub, granted on a fifty years' lease by the Sultan of Zanzibar; as also the vast territories inland, bounded in part by international treaties. Estimated area 468,000 square miles, and population 6,500,000. Owing to disturbances, Uganda, a district in the interior, has been placed under a Commissioner. Exports: ivory, hides, rubber, cloves, gums, woods, &c. The importation of arms is prohibited, and spirits are heavily taxed.

BRITISH GUIANA

(AMERICA).

A LARGE country on the north-east coast of South America, having an area of 109,000 square miles, bounded on the south by Brazil, on the west by Venezuela, and on the north and north-east by the Atlantic Ocean. The Venezuelan boundary is not yet defined, the territory in question containing the valuable Venezuelan mines. The population is 288,328. The chief product is sugar, forming 82 per cent. of the export trade of the Colony. It was first partially settled by the Dutch in 1580, and was from time to time held by the Dutch and the French, but was surrendered to England in 1814.

CANADA

(AMERICA).

THE Dominion of Canada includes the North American provinces of Ontario and Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, British Columbia, and Vancouver's Island, the regions formerly under the quasi-government of the Hudson Bay Company, now styled Manitoba and the North-West Territories; in fact, the whole of British North America except Newfoundland and Labrador. Canada has an estimated area of 3,315,647 square miles, exclusive of great lakes and rivers. The total population is nearly five millions, and is rapidly increasing. Canada has increased greatly during the last few years, especially in Winnipeg and Vancouver's Island, which latter city had no existence in 1885, but had a population in 1891 of 18,685. Canada was discovered by Sebastian Cabot in 1497, but its history only dates from 1534, when the French took possession of it. The first settlement was founded by them in 1608. In 1759 Quebec succumbed to a British force under General Wolfe, and in 1763 the whole territory became a British possession. Nova Scotia was ceded in 1713, the provinces of Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick being formed out of it. British Columbia was formed into a Crown colony in 1858, having previously been part of the Hudson Bay territory, and was united to Vancouver's Island in 1866. By Act of Parliament passed in 1867 Canada (Ontario and Quebec), Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick were united under the title of 'Dominion of Canada.' In 1870 Manitoba and North-West Territories were added to the Dominion. British Columbia followed in 1871, and Prince Edward Island in 1873. The name Canada was taken from 'Kanata,' an Iroquois word meaning a group of huts. Exports: timber, nickel, silver, gold, cobalt, asbestos, &c., &c. The chief industries are agriculture and the fisheries.



CAPE COLONY

(AFRICA).

THE Cape of Good Hope, strictly speaking, is a small promontory near the south-west extremity of Africa, but the Colony of that name, or Cape Colony, is bounded on the west, south, and south-east by the Atlantic and Indian Oceans, and on the north by the German Protectorate and other states and colonies of South Africa. Its area is 221,311 square miles, and its population 1,527,224. Its chief historical events are: Discovered by Portuguese in 1487. Colonized by the Dutch in 1650. Introduction of British settlers in 1806-20, the colony becoming British in the former year. First Kafir war 1834. The colonization of Natal and the Free States in 1836. Second Kafir war in 1847. Representative government in 1853. First diamond discovered in 1867. Griqualand West proclaimed a colony in 1871. Responsible government 1872. Gaika rebellion 1877-8. Basuto war 1879-81. Amalgamation of Griqualand West with the Colony in 1880. Separation of Basutoland in 1883. Establishment of German Protectorate on the west coast to the north of the Orange River 1884. Incorporation of all the Transkeian territories except part of Pondoland completed in 1885. The Dutch preponderate in the west and the English in the east districts. The principal industries are the production of wool and wine, the rearing of horses, cattle and ostriches, and the culture of wheat, barley, and oats. The Colony is also rich in minerals. Reptiles abound, and wild animals are found in the remote parts. The shief exports are copper and diamonds, the latter being by far the most valuable. 1853. CEYLON

(ASIA).

A N island in the Indian Ocean, south-east of India, having an area of 25,365 square miles. The population numbers 3,008,466, the most important element being Cingalese. Ceylon has an ancient history, records of events existing for twenty-four centuries among its annals. The Portuguese landed in 1507 and formed settlements, but were ousted by the Dutch 150 years later. In 1796 the British ousted the Dutch and annexed their settlements to Madras, but six years after Ceylon was creeted into a separate Colony. In 1816 the King of Kandy was deposed and banished, and his dominions annexed. The island possesses some ruins of extraordinary age and size, one being a Buddhist pagoda a quarter of a mile in circumference. Ceylon is celebrated for its jewels, but its chief exports are coffee and cinnamon, and of late years tea, tobacco, and cinchons.

THE largest of the Leeward Islands, is 95 miles South of Antigua, comprising an area of 291 square miles, and having a population of 26,841. The island was discovered by Columbus in 1493, and after having been twice seized by the French, was recovered by Great Britain in 1783. It is very mountainous and picturesque. A slight volcanic eruption took place in 1883, destroying 6 miles of forest. Its chief products are rum, coffee, sugar, arrowroot, wool, honey, and wax. The island forms the third presidency of the Leeward Islands.





In 1820 the Buenes Ayres Republic established a settlement, which was destroyed by the Americans in 1831. In 1833 they were again to the horocassion of by the English and colonized. The islands were formally annexed by Sir Hercules Robinson in 1874. They were discovered by Tasman in 1643. Sir Arthur Gordon, the first Governor, landed in 1875. The population is 121,180, about 2000 of which are Europeans. Exports: sugar, fruit, tea, &c. The jurisdiction of the Government extends to the islands in the Pacific Ocean which are British, viz. Cato, Raine, Bell Cay, Bramble Cay, Pilgrim, Ducie, Bauman, Roggewein, Teinhoven, Coral, Dudosa, Suwarrow, Starbuck, Little Scrub, Palmerston, Surprise, Vostoc, Willis's Islets, and many others; annexed in 1888 were Fanning and Penrhyn Islands, and in 1892 the Hervey or Cook Islands (Protectorate) and Gilbert Islands. The jurisdiction also extends to those islands that are not within the jurisdiction of any other civilized power, viz. Southern Solomon Islands, New Hebrides, Tonga or Friendly Islands, Samoa or Navigator's Islands, and other small groups.

THE valley of the River Gambia, which rises in the mountains at the back of Sierra Leone, flowing first northwards, and then west, joining the Atlantic about 100 miles south of Cape Verde. The chief town, Bathurst, is on an island at the mouth of the river. Discovered by the Portuguese in 1447, first settlement was made in 1686 by the English. The English merchants had formidable rivals in the Portuguese and French, but the river was recognized as British by treaty in 1783. It was put under the government of Sierra Leone in 1807, and annexed to that colony in 1841. In 1888, however, it was erected into a separate colony. Population 14,266, of which 45 are white. GIBRALTAR

(EUROPE).

A ROCKY promontory, three miles in length, three-quarters of a mile broad, and 1396 feet high. It is connected to the southern extremity of Spain by a low isthmus. It is about 14 miles from the opposite coast of Africa, and is the key of the Mediterranean. It was captured in 1704 by the combined Dutch and English forces from the Spanish, and ceded to England in 1713. There have been many attempts to take it, the most celebrated being that of 1779-88, when General Elliot held it under siege for three years and seven months against a combined force of Dutch and Spanish. The town lies at the foot of the rock, and has a population of 19,100. The garrison stands at 5896. The rock is practically impregnable, and is perfectly honeycombed, making it a vast fort. There are said to be over 1000 cannon there.



This Colony comprises the coast of the Gulf of Guines, with a protectorate inland to an average distance of 50 miles. Area, 89,060 square miles; population, 1,500,000. The natives are almost all Pagans. The first settlers were the Portuguese, the Colony being taken from them by the Dutch. English traders came in 1618, the first chartered company dating from 1662. The settlements were transferred to the Crown in 1821, and placed under the Government of Sierra Leone, from which they were separated in 1874. In 1872 the Dutch transferred all their rights to Great Britain. It was out of this transfer that the last Ashantee war arose. Exports: Gold, ivory, gum-copal, skins, cotton, grain, and oils.

It has an area of 183 square miles, with a population (inclusive of the Grenadines) of 53,209. The Grand Stang Lake is 1740 feet above the sea, a most remarkable natural curiosity. It was discovered by Columbus in 1498, and named Ascension. It was afterwards colonised by the French, but was seized by the English in 1762, retaken by the French in 1779, and finally became a British colony in 1783. THE total area of British India may be taken at 1,600,000 square miles, of which 643,000 square miles are under native administration. This is by far the most extensive and important of the possessions of Great Britain. It has a population of 288,000,000; of which 66,750,000 belong to the native states. There are in all 2,284,380 Christians, the remainder being composed of Hindus, Mahomedans, and Buddhists. There are 78 different native languages, excluding those which are spoken by less than 1000 people. Burmah, a large territory to the east of the Bay of Bengal, and forming no part of the Indian peninsula, was annexed in 1886. India affords limitless sport to the hunter in large and small game. The first English East India Company was incorporated by Queen Elizabeth in 1600, and owed its origin to a difference with the Queen Elizabeth in 1600, and owed its origin to a difference with the Dutch about the price of pepper. From that date to 1858 the country was administered by successive Viceroys, acting under the authority of the "Honourable East India Company," among them Lord Clive, Lord Cornwallis, Warren Hastings, Lord Wellesley, Lord Hardinge, and many other well-known names. It was on the 10th May, 1857, during Lord Canning's viceroyalty, that the "Indian Mutiny" broke out. The "Great Mutiny" proved the death-blow to the East India Company, whose glorious annals were brought to a close by a transfer of its entire authority and administration to the Crown. Since the mutiny the country has been tolerably quiet. The Prince of Wales visited India in country has been tolerably quiet. The Prince of Wales visited India in 1876, and received a loyal welcome from the people. In the same year the Queen was proclaimed Empress of India. Conflicts between the French and ourselves were frequent from 1746-61, the former being completely defeated at Pondicherry in 1761. When Charles II. was married to Catherine of Braganza, in 1661, a part of his dowry from Portugal was the island of Bombay. It was formally made over to the English monarch in 1666, and was sold by him to the East India Company in 1668 for an annual payment of £10. The supreme government is at Calcutta, the provincial administrations at Madras, Bombay, Bengal, North-West Provinces and Oudh, Punjaub, Central Provinces, Burma, Assam, Berar, Ajmere-Merwara, Coorg, British Baluchistan, and the Andamans. Exports: Grain, cotton, opium, jute, tea, hides, indigo, coffee, and wool.

ADEN.

Aden is subject to the Government of Bombay, and is situated in the south of Arabia, about 100 miles east of the Straits of Bab-el-Mandeb. It was captured by the British in 1839. The town is in a hollow formed by the crater of an extinct volcano. It had an enormous trade in the 11th, 12th, and 13th centuries, but the discovery of the passage round the Cape ruined its trade. Nothing is manufactured except water and salt. The Aden presidency includes the Koeria Mooria Islands, east-north-east from Aden; Island of Perim, at entrance to Red Sea; Socotra, an island 150 miles east-north-east from the eastern extremity of Africa; Somali coast, and the coast tribes from Perim to Ras Sair.

It is the largest and most valuable of the British West Indies, having an area of 4193 square miles. The population is 639,491. It was discovered by Columbus in 1494, who called it St. Iago. It was taken possession of by the Spaniards in 1509, but surrendered to British arms in 1665. It was formally ceded to England in 1670. Exports: Sugar, rum, coffee, fruits, and drugs. The more recent history includes the defeat and dispersal of a large hostile band of negroes who had existed in the island for nearly a century, and a revolt of the negroes in 1865, when the ringleader Gordon was hanged, together with all prisoners, by order of Governor Eyre, who was recalled for his severity.





A N island in the Malayan Archipelago, about 6 miles N.W. of Borneo. Its area is about 31 square miles, with a population of 6000, and about 30 Europeans. It was ceded to England in 1846 by the Sultan of Borneo, being then uninhabited. A settlement was established in 1848, the first governor being the late Sir James Brooke. The island has a fine harbour and extensive coal mines, which are now being developed by the Central Borneo Co., Ltd. Its manufacture is flour made from raw sago. Its government was transferred from the Colonial Office to the British North Borneo Co. on Jan. 1st, 1890.

MALTA

(EUROPE).

N island in the Mediterranean Sea 58 miles from Sicily and 180 from the African coast. Area (inclusive of Gozo, &c.), 116; square miles; population, 165,662, exclusive of 8000 troops. The islands are highly cultivated, the chief products being cotton, corn, oranges, melons, grapes, seed, and potatoes. Lace is largely made in Gozo. The harbour of Valetta is one of the finest in the world, and is just half-way between Gibraltar and the Suez Canal. There is an extensive arsenal and large dockyard. The island is strongly fortified. In ancient times Malta was occupied by Phoenicians, Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans, and Byzantine Greeks. It was especially noted in Roman times for its textile fabrics. It is said to have been converted to Christianity by the shipwreck of St. Paul there in 58. In the Dark Ages it was taken by the Moors, and its commerce destroyed. It was conquered by the Normans in 1090, and in 1530 was handed over to the Knights of St. John. In 1565 it withstood the famous siege by the Turks. The Knights of St. John were expelled by Napoleon in 1798. The French were ousted in 1800, and the island ceded to England in 1814. There are 31 native families of Gold filigree jewellery is a well-known industry. The island was formerly called Melita.

MAURITIUS

(AFRICA).

A N island in the Indian Ocean 500 miles east of Madagascar. Area 708 square miles; population 377,986. It was discovered in 1505 by the Portuguese. The Dutch visited it in 1598 and named it Mauritius. In 1644 they established a small colony, but in 1712 they abandoned the island. In 1715 the French took possession of it. In 1789 it was the seat of the French Government in the East. It was taken by a British force in 1810. The French called it the Isle of France, and the French language and law are preserved under British rule. Hurricanes are frequent. The chief exports are sugar and rum.





(AFRICA).

THIS colony was discovered by the Portuguese in 1497 on Christmasday, hence its name. Two unsuccessful attempts were made at colonization by the Dutch in 1688 and 1721. The first settlement was made by the English in 1824, who established themselves where Durban now stands. Natal was then part of the great Zulu kingdom. In 1835 and 1837 the Dutch Boers came overland and settled. In 1841 the governor of the Cape took possession, and after severe fighting defeated the Dutch, and declared the Colony British in 1843. In 1856 it was erected into a separate colony. It lies on the S.E. coast of Africa. Durban being 800 miles from Cape Town. Area, 20,461 square miles; population, 543,913. The coal fields of the colony are large. The chief exports are wool, gold, sugar, hides, angera hair, and skins.







NEW BRUNSWICK

(AMERICA).

PROVINCE of Canada on the East Coast of America, having an area of 28,200 square miles, and a population of 321,263. NEWFOUNDLAND

(AMERICA).

THIS is the twelfth largest island in the world, and lies on the northeast side of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, and has an area of 42,200 square miles. Its population is 197,934 (not including Labrador, its dependency in the most easterly part of America). This is the oldest English colony. It is said by some to have been discovered by Norwegians and taken possession of by John Cabot in 1497, and by others to have been discovered by Sebastian Cabot in 1497, and taken some time after by Sir Francis Drake. It became a British colony in 1713. Industries: Fishing and mining.



NEW SOUTH WALES

(AUSTRALIA).

THE whole of the eastern part of Australia, including the several colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, and Queensland, received the name of New South Wales from its first explorer, Captain Cook, in 1770. The present colony of New South Wales originated in a penal settlement formed by the British Government, when its first governor, Captain Arthur Phillip, R.N., arrived at Botany Bay, in 1788, with stores, but subsequently proceeded to Port Jackson, a more suitable spot for the new settlement. He there landed 750 "persons," and the British ensign was hoisted at Sydney Cove, now the capital and seat of government. The present colony comprises an area of 310,760 square miles, with a population of 1,132,234. Gold was discovered in 1851, and the country has produced gold up to the present to the value of nearly forty millions sterling. Many other minerals are found, the annual value in 1891 being £6,395,561. The soil is rich and the climate genial, and agriculture forms a large industry. Victoria was separated in 1851, and Queensland in 1859.

NEW ZEALAND

(AUSTRAL'ASIA).

COLONY in the South Pacific Ocean, consisting of three islands known as Northern, Middle, and Stewart's Islands, about 1200 miles east of New South Wales. Portions of them were explored by Tasman in 1642, and in 1777 by Captain Cook. The first European settlement was made in 1814, but no colonization till 1839. In 1841 New Zealand was erected into a separate colony, distinct from New South Wales. Area (inclusive of the Auckland and the Kermadec Islands) 104,471 square miles. European population 626,658, natives (Maoris) 41,993. In 1840 a treaty was concluded with the native chiefs ceding the sovereignty to Great Britain. Gold, copper, and coal exist plentifully, and wool is one of the largest exports, and frozen meat another.

NIGER COAST PROTECTORATE

(AFRICA)

THIS Protectorate, somewhile known as the "Oil Rivers Protectorate," includes the whole of the maritime region lying between Lagos and Rio del Rey, excepting the mouth of the Niger, assigned to the Royal Niger Co. The region was secured by treaties with the native chief in 1884. The leading merchants form the "African Association," which has its head-quarters in Liverpool. Exports: Palm oil and kernels, rubber and ivory. The Protectorate was placed under an Imperial Commissioner in 1891.

NORTH BORNEO

(ASIA).

THE northern part of the island of Borneo, from the Lipitong River on the west to the east coast, together with all the islands within three leagues. Its area is about 30,000 square miles, and the population is estimated at 150,000, consisting principally of Malays. The country was ceded to the British North Borneo Company in 1881. The territory has a coast line of 987 miles. The soil is rich, producing rice, sago, sugarcane, coffee, &c., &c. Quicksilver has recently been found, and the land also possesses gold, copper, coal, and other minerals. By arrangement dated 1st January, 1890, the colony of Labuan is administered by the British North Borneo Co., whose territories, together with Sarswak and the native state of Brunei, were placed under a British Protectorate.





PENINSULA connected with New Brunswick by a low fertile isthmus, 16 miles wide, having an area (with Cape Breton Island) of 20,600 square miles, one-fifth of which consists of lakes, rivers, and inlets. THIS was the last province admitted into the Dominion of Canada (1873). It lies in the southern part of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, between New Brunswick and Cape Breton. It has an area of about 2000 square miles, and a population of 109,078. It was discovered simultaneously with the neighbouring countries (by Cabot?), and was first settled by the French as a fishing station. It was taken from them by the British in 1745, but afterwards restored. It was seized again, however, in 1756-63 (the SevenYears' War). It received its present name in 1799, having previously been known as St. John's Island. Industries: Agriculture and fisheries.





ST. HELENA

(AFRICA),

PROBABLY the best known of all the solitary islands in the world, is situate in the South Atlantic Ocean, 1140 miles from the nearest point of Africa, and 1800 from South America. Area, 47 square miles; population, 4116. It is of velcanic origin. It was discovered by the Portuguese in 1501 (St. Helena's Day), and was visited by Cavendish in 1588. The Dutch colonized it in 1645, seized by the English in 1677, retaken by the Dutch in 1672, seized again by the English in 1673, and held by the East India Company till 1834, when it was ceded to the Crown. From 1815 to 1821 the Government held it as the residence for Napoleon Bonaparte, who died there in the latter year. It was then an important station on the route to India, its trade being destroyed by the opening of the Suez Canal. It is now heavily fortified. There are no exports. Oats, barley, root crops, and flax are grown.



In 1846 a large number of Portuguese labourers emigrated hither, proving a valuable acquisition to the island. Often the scene of warfare, it became finally British in 1783. It is one of the last islands upon which a struggle took place between the aboriginal Caribs and the white man. The chief products are sugar, molasses, rum, arrowroot, cocos, coffee, cotton, and spices. The island was the scene of a tremendous eruption in 1812. The principal mountain, Souffriere, is 3000 feet above the sea, its crater being 8 miles in circumference.

The government was obtained from the Sultan of Borneo in 1842 by the late Sir James Brooke, well known as "Rajah Brooke of Sarawak," uncle to the present Rajah, Sir Charles V. Brooke. Other concessions were made in 1861, 1882, 1885, and 1890. The country came under a British protectorate on 1st January, 1890. STRAITS SETTLEMENTS

(ASIA).

THE name given to the British Possessions on the west coast of the Malay Peninsula, of which the whole southern portion is now under protection, and a large portion under direct control of the British Government in Singapore. The name is derived from the Straits of Malacca, on which the Settlements are situated. The colony has an entire area of 14722 square miles, and a population of 512,342, the great bulk of which consists of Chinese and Malays. Singapore, the seat of Government, is an island situated three-quarters of a mile off the southern extremity of the Malay peninsula, 27 miles by 14. It was first occupied in 1819, but formally ceded in 1824 by the Sultan of Johor. Penang is the northernmost of the Settlements; it includes the island of Penang, and the strip of mainland opposite known as Province Wellesley, and the Dindings, a group of islands 80 miles south of Penang. province is on the west coast of the peninsula, and was ceded to the Government of India in 1786, and was the first Straits Settlement. Province Wellesley was ceded in 1800. The Dindings also include a strip of land on the mainland opposite them, cut out of the State of Perak, 22 miles long by 10 wide. Malacca, the largest of the Settlements, is on the west coast, and 110 miles north-west of Singapore. Taken by the Portuguese in 1511, by the Dutch in 1640, and by the English in 1795. Restored to the Dutch in 1818. Ceded to England in 1824, being exchanged for settlements in Sumstra. Exports: Rubber, horns, tin, &c.

Perak, Selangor, and Sungei Ujong extend from Province Wellesley to Malacca; Pahang is on the cast coast, and Negri Sembilan is inland near Malacca. Bangkok and Johor are two independent neighbouring states.

TASMANIA

(AUSTRALASIA)

A N island in the South Pacific Ocean, separated by Bass Strait from the southern extremity of Australia. Area, 26,215 square miles; population, 152,619. The Aborigines are extinct, the last one dying in 1876. The island was discovered by Tasman in 1642; and named by him after his patron "Van Dieman's" Land. It was subsequently partially explored by Captain Cook. In 1803 a penal settlement was formed by New South Wales on the spot where Hobart now stands. The Colony was severed from New South Wales in 1825. Transportation was abolished in 1853, and the name officially changed to Tasmania. The climate is the healthiest in the Australasian group. The chief products are wool, gold, silver, tin, and fruit.





TRINIDAD

(AMERICA).

THIS is the most southerly of the West Indian Islands, being only 16 miles north of Venezuela. It has an area of 1754 square miles, and a population of 205,753. It was discovered by Columbus in 1498, and was colonized in 1588 by the Spaniards. It capitulated to the British under Abercromby in 1797. The "Port of Spain," its chief town, is one of the finest towns in the West Indies. The island contains a remarkable phenomenon in the shape of a pitch lake 110 acres in extent. The exports are sugar, cocoa, molasses. rum, &c. After Jamaica it is the most valuable of the British West Indies.





VICTORIA

(AUSTRALIA).

THIS territory originally formed part of New South Wales, from which it was separated in 1851; and although one of the youngest and smallest of the Australian colonies, it is the most populous and most wealthy. It comprises the S. E. corner of Australia, bounded on the N. by New South Wales, and on the W. by South Australia. The entire area is 87,884 square miles; the population 1,140,405, three-fourths of whom are Protestants. The aborigines number 565. This is the principal gold-producing colony of Australia, having produced gold up to 1891 to the value of 230 millions sterling. Wool is another of its chief exports. Victoria was first colonised from Tasmania in 1834.

THE VIRGIN ISLANDS

(AMERICA).

THIS group of islands forms the fifth presidency in the Leeward Islands, and belongs partly to Denmark, partly to Great Britain, and partly to Spain. They form a connecting link between the Greater and Leeser Antilles. Such of the islands as are British became so in 1666, and have an area of 58 square miles and a population of 4639. They were discovered by Columbus in 1494. The exports are sugar, cotton, and rum, fishing and poultry rearing being the chief industries. A valuable mine of copper has been worked at Virgin Gorda in past years.

PORMERLY called the "Swan River Settlement," occupies the whole western portion of Australia, having an area of 1,060,000 square miles. A large proportion of this is heavy timber country. The climate is one of the most healthy in the world. The population amounts to 53,285. The exports are wool, gold, timber, minerals (especially copper), whale oil, pearls, skins, &c. Transportation was discontinued in 1868. The "Swan River Settlement" was founded in August, 1829.


