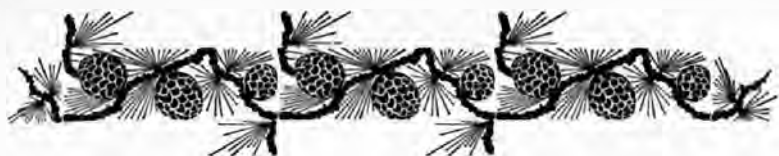

PHILATELIC ADVERTISING.

ONE almost wonders whether it can be possible to say anything new on this well-worn subject. In a general way the point of deciding how far to go—or not to go—in this line must be left to the advertiser's own judgment. In stamp-dealing, the largest advertiser is necessarily the man who does his business chiefly through the post; the firm with City offices or shop, and doing a trade—more or less large “over the counter” can, to some extent, dispense with advertising. The great development of the stamp business of late years has had the effect of altering the methods of advertising, and dealers now go into the daily papers with their announcements to quite a large extent—a thing which they would not have dreamed of doing a few years ago. In the early days of stamp-dealing, advertisers were confined to the philatelic journals and a few boys' magazines; now they appear in many of the leading dailies, weeklies, and monthlies.

We hardly know—although, as a matter of fact, we started out to do it—whether it is advisable here to attempt to offer counsel to dealers on the subject of advertising. Our readers who are “in the trade” will probably think their own theories the best, whilst our amateur friends will be disinclined to bother their heads about it. Anyone, therefore, reading these lines who may be in need of advice is invited to write to us, when we will willingly assist him so far as lies in our power. We charge no “consultation fee” to our correspondents provided they are regular clients in some way or another, but we do ask that reply postage—or, better still, a stamped directed envelope—shall accompany enquiries.

On the following pages we give a list of stamp journals published in the United Kingdom, which we believe to be correct and up-to-date.

The Philatelic Press Agency, established by Messrs. Smyth & Co. in 1896, is the only one which offers all-round advantages to its clients, and which, to use a somewhat hackneyed phrase, has “stood the test of time.” Many such agencies have been started from time to time, but they all seem to have come to grief very soon—perhaps because their promoters got tired of them. The “Smyth” Agency is now carried on by C. J. Endle & Co., and it embraces practically every imaginable branch of philatelic business save auctioneering; namely, advertising, publishing, printing, and any matters which may be classified under those heads. Commissions of all kinds are undertaken and promptly and carefully executed, and British-made goods of every description dealt with. Philatelists in all parts of the world who desire to carry through any business matter will find it to their advantage to place it in the hands of this firm.

PUBLISHERS' ADVERTISEMENTS IN ALBUMS.

THERE is one point on which much “soreness” has been felt among stamp dealers for years past, but for various reasons no one appears to have cared to make public mention of it. We refer to the practice of wholesale dealers who are also album publishers, of binding up with their albums a Price List of their own stamps. In some cases the List consists of several pages, all containing advertisements of the publisher's goods. We will suppose a retail dealer gets an order from a customer for one of these albums, priced at, say, half-a-crown. He obtains the album from the publisher, paying the latter perhaps 1/4 or 1/6 for it, including postage, etc.—nett profit, one shilling; possibly even less. But the 2/6 Album contains a twelve-page Price List of the publishers' packets, sets, single stamps, and sundries, offered probably at

prices lower than those of the dealer through whom the album is ordered.

The only too likely result of this is that the retail dealer loses his customer, and all for the sake of securing a paltry shilling of profit! It is the old story of the big monopolist crushing down the small trader, and surely the latter ought to have some means provided for his protection. We think that all publishers of Stamp Albums who are also dealers should state distinctly in their lists and advertisements whether their albums do or do not contain notices of their own goods—stamps, sets, packets, etc. We invite correspondence from the trade on the subject, and shall be glad to do what we can towards setting the matter right.


