## INTR0DUCTION.

Postagestanp collecting is a fashion not confined to this country, or to a single class; for collections are frequently to be seen in the drawing-room of the luxurious, the study of the enlightened, and the locker of the schoolboy. The fashion has been ridiculed, as all fashions will be; but if postage stamps are properly studied, collected, and arranged, there is no reason why they may not be quite as iustructive and entertaining as a collection of birds, butterflies, shells, books, engravings, coins, or other objects.

The use and charm of collecting any kind of object is to educate the mind and the eye to careful observation, accurate comparison, and just reasoning on the differences and likenesses which they present; and to interest the collector in the design or art shown in their creation or manufacture, and the history of the country which produces or uses the objects collected. Postage stamps afford good objects for all these branches of study, as they are sufficiently different to present broad outlines for their elassification, and yet some of the variations are so slight that they require minute examination and comparison to prevent them from being overlooked. The fact of obtaining stamps from so many countries suggests the inquiry, what were the circumastances that induced their adoption, the history of the countries which issue them; and the understanding why some countries have considered it necessary, in so few years as have passed since they first came into use, to make so many changes in the form or design of the stamp used, while other countries have never made the slightest alteration.

The changes referred to generally mark some historical event of importance : such as the accession of a new king, a change in the form of government, or the absorption of a smaller state into a larger one, a change in the currency, or some other revolution. Heace, a collection of postage stamps may be considered, like a collection of coins, an epitome of the history of Europe and America for the last quarter of a century; and as they exhibit much variation in desiga and in execution, they may also be regarded as a collection of works of art on a small scale, showing the style of art of the conutries that issue them; while the size of the collection, and the manner iu which the
stamps are arranged and kept, will show the industry, judgment, neatness, and thiste of the collector, who should always bear in mind that every accessory that is showy and bright takes away from the appearance and interest of the stamps themselves.

I began to collect postage atamps shortly after the system was established, and before it had become a rage, as I twok great interest in their use and extension; and I believe I was the first who proposed, in 1834, the system of a small wriform rate of postage to be p:epaid by stamps, having satisfied my own mind that the great cost of the post office was not the reception, carriage, and delivery of the letters, but the cumplicated system of accounts that the old system required; and having learnt from the best writers on political economy that the collection of money by stamps was the most certain and economical. It was, in fact, the mere application of the syatem used with regard to newspapers to letters in general.

For several years previous to 1834 the improvement of the postoffice had been called for, and a royal commission was appointed to consider the subject. The Duke of Richmond, the postmastergeneral, in 1834, issued a paper, showing the reforms that had been introdnced ints the post-office during the last three years. (See Times, March, 1834.)

Early in 1834 Mr. Charles Knight, either from his own impulse, or from what he had heard from me, proposed through Mr. Matthew Hill, in the deputation on the abolition of new-paper stamps in March, that the newspapers should be circulated free by pennystamp covers; but the plan was not adopted, the stamp remaining on the japer.

In January, 1837. Mr. (now Sir) Rowland Hill circulated among his friends a pamphlet marked "private and confidential," in which he advocated a unifomn penn! postage, to be prepaid in money at the receiring-hnuses. In March, 1837, Mr. Hill published an second edition of this pamphlet, enlarged and altered, in which he added a second mode of collecting the postage by means of stamped covers; reierring to Mr. Knight's auggeation, in 1834, as the origin of the plan.

The royal commissioners took notice of the suggestion, and examined Mr. Hill, Mr. Preesly, and Mr. Wood, of the stamp-office, and Mr. Smith, of the post-office, and recommended the adopition of the post-ofice covers, stating that the enforcement of prepayment by law was impossible. They circulated with the evidence the first. specimen of the corers made by Mr. Dickenson, which they recommended. (See Ninth Report of the Post-attice, 1837.)

A mercantile committee was established to induce the government to adopt Mr. Hill's plans as then stated. They made a subscription, established a new paper, and there were one or two parliamentary committees, and a systematic agitation, by deputations, \&e., through the country, in imitation of the Reform Bill agitation, which had only recently passed over. In the earlier days of the committee the stamp ocrer was chiefly urged, but the opposi-
tion of the paper makers and stationers to the nunopoly, as they called it, of Mr. Dickensm, made the committee pay more attention as they proceeded to the adhesive stamps; and they issued some parti-chloured stamps or lakels, made by Mr. Whiting, on their circulars, as a specimen of whit adhesive stamps might bo.

The government, on the 5th of December, 1837, adoptea a uniform system of postage, as an experiment, charging fourpence for each letter, to be prepaid in money. On the 10th of Jamuary; 1840 , the rate was reduced to one penny on a balfonnce letter, and on the foth of May, 1840, the "Mulready" envelope" was issued; for Mr. M. Hill still haxd his predilection for a corer. The public called for adhcsive stamps, and these were at length issued ; aul their general adoption by other conntries, and for other purposes beside collecting postage, shows the general advantage of the systerm over the prepayment by money or the covers originally suggested by Mr. (now Sir) Rowiand Hill.

Large as in the balance carried to the revenue from the post-office, the system proposed and advocated by me has never been completely carried ont, consequently a large staff of clerks and other officials is atill retained at the pot-office, at a large expense, to keep the complicated accounts that a few upaid letters require, which, if the system were fully carried out, would not be necessary.

I am anare that to enforce by law the prepayment of all letters by stimp is very difficult, if not iunpossible; but this is not necessary. There is no necessity for any acconnt of unpaid letters to be kept, except in casts where the official suspects some unfair play; otherwise it might be left for the postmaster, through whose hands the unstanped letter last passes, to place the requisite special stamps upon it. and to collect the cost of those slamps from the person to whom the letter is directed. 'Jhis he is likely to do with care, as each postmaster is allowed a commission on all the stamps he sells; and to prevent, as rouch as possible, the sending of letters that would require this treatment, the system of paying doulle the usual poinge, or even a higher fine, shonld be enforced on all letters nat paid for in stamps before they are despatcherl. It is said that the postmaster may lose, as many of the letters on which he has piaced atamps may be refused. If so, they would be returned to the deadletter affice, and his stampls allowed for; but this will not be often requisite, as the pust-office can now enforce the payment against the sender, if it be refused by the person to whom the letter is directed.

This system is now in use, to a certain extent, in France, Italy, Bavarin, and the North German Confederation, where special stamps are officially employed for letters insufficiently or not at all prepaid.

THe system of prepaying postage by stampa has beev adopited, as this catalogue will prove, by all civilized countries, and has been extended into other liranches of the government and the law courts. It is also used in the clectric telegraph service, and by severul errand and carrier companies in Europe and America.

In 1840, two printed envelopes were iesued, bearing a design by Mulready, the Royal Acadumician, "with the hope of spreadiug the taste for high art," but they cailed forth such an outburst of ridicule, aud such a number of caricatures, that they wete soon disused. Then the engraved profile of the Queen was adopted as an andhesive stamp for affixing on letters; and after some time an emboswed profile of the Queen was issued, stamped on paper as an envelope, which had long before been suggested by Mr. Whiting.

When the first adhesive stamps were issued they were printed in black ink; but it was found difficult to properly obliterste them either with black or red ink, and they were afterwards issued printed in a different coloured ink, so that they can all be obliterated with the same black hand or machine stamp.

Some of the colonies commenced with manufacturing their own stamps, and used emblematic designs, as Hope reclining, for the Cape of Good Hope; a Swan, for Swan River; the Queen on her throne, for Victoria; but by degrees they bave generally adopted a simple profile of the Queen, like the English; and the stamps now used in the colonies, and indeed in many parts of the world, are not only designed and engraved, but also printed or embossed, in England. Many of these are executed by Messrs. De La Fue \& Co., of Bunhill Row (who call thernselves in the Directory, "Envelope Makers and Manufacturers of Government and Colorial Adbesive Starnpa"), and Perkirs, Bacon, \& Co., in Fleet Street, "Bond and Bank Note Engravers." They are printed in these establishments under the supervision of an officer of the Inland Revemue department, or an inspector appointed by the colonial or foreign governments.

The majority of foreign governments, as they have adopted the system, have also adapted the profile or portrait of their sovereign for the stanip. Other governments use the arms of the state or sovereign for the purpose. Some states, which began by merely using, as a atamp, a numeral eurrounded by a more or leas complicated frame, have since adopted the royal portrait.

In England, the manner in which the stamps have been obliterated has undergome many changes. Now they are obliterated by a block, which, by the form of the internal disk, and the number in it, marks the postal district in which it was originally stamped. Eich continental state cancels in its own manner; several have undergone considerable change during the time the stamps have been in use. In France they formerly obliterated with a hatnd-stamp that had acute prominences on it , so an to puncture the atamp which it obliterated. The study of the means employed for this simple purpose affords an interesting object of contemplation. In some of the outlying offices in India, Ceylon, Canada, \&e, the stamp ів obliterated by a pen-and-ink mark before the letter is despatched.

A few stanps-such as the old four annas of Tudia, the "toolate" and "registered" stamps of Victoria and New South Wales, the early ibsues for the Swiss cantons, Ruesia and Poland; one or
more values of the more modern stamps of Roumania, Heligoland, Finland, Livonia, Spain, and the United States of America-are printed in inks of two colours.

Some of the German states issued their first stamps printed in black ink on different coloured papers; but they have, one after another, given up the practice, and now issue them printed in different coloured inks on white paper. The different states seem to have changed the colour of the paper, or the ink with which they printed the stamps, at different times very capriciously; bence the same stamp occurs of very different colours. They are said to have now adopted is uniform colour for stamps of the same value," thus4 pfennige, or $\frac{1}{\frac{3}{3}}$ silbr. gr., or 1 kr . -Green.

In England, the adbesive stamps are printed on paper with a peculiar watermark, different in the varions stamps; and the envelopes isaued by the English stamp-office are all printed on a peculiar paper. Formerly, there were three lines of coloured silk iuserted in the paper, so as to form lines across the stamp; and several foreign governments adopted the same plan. It has now been disused in England and Germany; but in the latter they priat in amall letters the value of the envelope, in three lines, over the stamp, thus: Post couvert, drei graschen; cin groschen, post couvert. The envelopes stamps of Russia, Switzerland, Hamburg, and the Uniterl States of America, are embossed on apecially-prepared watermarked paper, bearing, respectively, a spread-eagle, dove, castle, and the initials P.O.D., U.S.

In England, the regulation now is that the stamp be placed on the right-hand upper corner of the letter or euvelope. In Saxony, Hanover, Baden, Brunswick, and Austria, like those first issued by Mr. Hill's Committee, the stamp was formerly placed on the left-hand side of the envelope; now they are usually placed, as in Englind, on the right-band upper curner. In lhassia and Finland the envelope stamps were at one time impressed on the flap; and in the Brazils, the adhesives were occasionably used as a seal, which caused them sometimes to be overlooked by the puat-offce officials.

During the late terrible civil conflict in the United States, postage stamps formed almost the only currency of small value in circulation; and the government issued them without being gummed fur the purpose of their being so used, as it was found that the gummed stamps were apt to adhere together when carried and handed. 'They afterwards issued fac-similes of postage stamps printed on larger paper, with full directions; these were termed poatage currcncy.

[^0]Defore stamps are printed, it is usual to talse off from the plate one or more impressions on common paper, and in ink of different colours from those in which the staups are officially used, to see if the plates are in a condition to print, se that none but perfect stamps shonld be issued, and that the goverument may not be cheated by these prior impressions being used as postane stampls. Such impressions of an umsual colour have been called proofs-they are so in a printer's use of the word, but not in that of a collector of engravings.

The head post-office sends stamps round to the local offices to show what are in official use. In England the stamps so sent are marked across with the word "specimen," to prevent their being used for postrige purposes. In Germany they circulate for this purpose stamps which are printed in black or some other colour not officially used. Such stamps were at one time catalogned as stamps of identification.

Some clubs, as the "Oxford Union Snciety," and others, that supply their menbers with stamps, hand-print on the stamp the sign or inipial of the society. lil Western Australia the gtamps supplied to the govermment officials are perforated in the centre, to prevent their being used by them to prepay private letters.

Stamp collecting-which, when this introduction was first written, was in its infincy-now numbers its followers in almost every part. of the world. It possesses also a literature of its own, including several catalognes in different languages, works on furged stamps, and well-conducted periodicals: besides which mumerous alhams, compiled by exper:enced amateurs, have been publishen. These facts indicate the undiminished attraction which stamp collecting atill exerts, and which, as a beneficial recreation, I trust it always will.

## PREEACE TO THE FIF'IH EDITION.

Tre great increase in the number of stamps, the remarkable adrances which have been made in what is not imaptly styled the "science of philately," and the cbanges which have taken place in the views of collectors generally as to what ought, and what ought nut, to find a place in their albums, have combined to render necessary a thorongh revision of Dr. Gray's catalogue. The descriptions have consequently been much curtailed, only the more prominent points of each design being enumerated; aud abbreviations bave been employed, in order to further economise space. Room has thereby been obtained for the insertion of the many series which have been issued since the appearance of the last edition, and also for reference to the principal secondary characteristics of stamps, viz, watermark and perforation. Variuties of perforation are not, however, included, nor (with some marked exceptions) differences in the texture of the paper on which stamps are printed, the Editor believing that as sumll varieties are accepted only by a few, it would have been out of place to notice them in a work, like the present, destined for the use of the great body of collectors.
"Essays" being no longer collected, and being for the most part designs engraved only to sell, the appendix describing them which appeared in the last edition has been omitted from the present.

The second appendix, containing descriptions of "Locals," has been entirely re-arranged, and has also been enriched by a full catalogue of the Califoroian and British Columbian frank stamps, from the pen of Mr. E. L. Pemberton.

Note.-The Findish stamps offer many difficulties to collectors, For the first two series, it will be observed, the same designs and colours respectively were chosen for bath adhesives and envelopes. Originals of the first series are of great rarity, and even the reprints from the retonched dies are far from common. Forgeries alone are easily to be obtained. There are two varieties of each of the adhesive stamps of the first series, one set having 37 lines on the shield, and being printed on lad paper, with the lines running vertically; the other baving 39 lives, and being on paper the lines of which run horizontally. The envelopes are only found of the first type, and the lines of the paper in them run obliquely.

Of the envelopes No. 8 two setr may be distinguished, one with the waved lines on the shield wider apart and fewer in uumber than in the other. There are also in existence very intereating varieties, consisting of envelopes bearing on the flap the design No. 7, and on the back, in the left upper corner, the design No. 8. These envelopes formed the remainder in stork of the 1856 issue, and were utilised by the impressions of the new type on the back.

Note--Specimens of many of the stamps issued anterior to 1862 exist with one line each way, drawn across with pen and ink, or with three printed bars, crossing transversely, and obscuring the desigu to a considerable degree. These specimens formed part of the remainders of their respective series in hand when the same werw withlrawn, and the obliterating mark was made by order of the authorities (by whom, as may be presumed, these remainders were sold to dealers), to prevent their being used by any chance for prepayment of postage.

In addition to the stamps above datalogued, there are known to
 exist certain hand-stamped devices, of the type of which the annexed illustrations will give an idea. These stamps were impressed on letters written by members of the Cortes at their seasion-honse, and such letters were thereby franked. The interest attaching to these stamps is not
 sufficient to warrant the insertion of a-detailed description; and they are so rarely to be met with, moreover that few of our readers can hope to obtain a apecimen.

Note - The obsolete stamps of New South Wales have long formerl an interesting object of study to stamp collectors. The first issue contuius a representation which I, adopting the general opinion, have termed a view of Sydney, but which some consider to be entirely allegorical. The design looth of this and of the laureated series was not carefully engraved, and instead of one original matrix being made, several copies of the design were drawn, all differing from each other; neither were all the impressions taken from one original plate, as are those of most stamps. There are, consequently, many more or less marked varieties. The varieties here emumerated are the most marked; but many parsons place all stamps showing the slightest differences in detail-such as in the point of commencernent of the wotto, the position of the houses, the size of the letters, the shades of colour, \&c-in their albums. The variations in the laureated series are the pusition of the profile, the shape of the profile itself, and of the ornaments in the upper margin, the size of the lettering, \&c. These distinctions, though interesting in themselves, if made in the catalogne, might tend rather to confuse and dishearten most collectors ; as few could hope to obtain all the varieties, except at an expense of time and money which their acquisition would hardly justify. Those who require a complete guide to the types and varieties are referred to the papers, by Mr. Pemberton, which have appeared in The Stump.Collector's Magazine; they are the result of years of study on the author's part, and are thoroughly trustworthy.

## APPENDIX.

## LOCAL STAMPS.

## INTRODUCTION.

Local stamps are stamps issued by private persons or companies, with or without the authority of the state, for the purpose of prepaying the proprietors' charges for the cariage of letters from one particular town to another, or from one part of a town to another; the Russian local stamps, however, have an exceptional origin, they being issued by the local postal anthorities of the goverument in which they are current. Of the local emissions with which collectors are acquainted, and for which spaces are allutted in all the principal albums, scarcely one half are genuiue, the remainder leing the fraudulent fabrications of dishonest engravers and speculators.

The following catalogue (excepting that portion devoterl to the United States) includes only stamps whose clairas to authenticity are generally admitted, the collection of which may be justitiably recommended. The United States local stamps are the subjects of a special arrangement, which is explained in the sub-preface which precedes them. Lastly, for the guidance of collectors a list of the names of spurious local stamps for other countries than the United States is added at the end of this appendix.

From the present edition I have entirely omitted the stampsissued by British railway companies, for the prepaynent of newspapers, siagle or in packets, from station to station; and also the stamps issued by Circular Delivery Companies, for the purpose. at the name implies, of covering the charge made by the companies for the delivery of circulars, believing that neither the one nor the other are in any respect entitled to be considere 1 as postage stamps. The Circular Delivery stamps were but mere advertising labels affixed by the company to circulars, the charge for delivery of which had been paid in money by the sender.

Note.- A set of four samps, printed in eolours and value 1 c ., 5f.. 20 c , and 40 c ., is said to have been emitted by the Company, but I believe then to be spurious. It is stated that they were withdiaw'n immediately aiter their emission; but it is very improbable, bat the Company realiy established a system of postal conmmication for the benefit of its employes, that it would have given up the experiment after a three weeks trial. The fact that the values also are in the French currency gives additional ground for suspicion.

## UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

The local stamps of the United States may be divided into two classes: 1. Those used in California and Oregon. 2. Those used in the other states of the union. The former, with the exception of the set of Pony Express stamps, the Humboldt Express label, and Adam's 25 c . stamp, consist entirely of hand stamps on ordinary envelopes, or imprints on envelopes learing the United States embossed postage stamps. Those on plain envelopes are but few in number, and were used before the government issued stamped envelopes; but there are a large number of imprints, most of which consist simply of the name of the issuing firm or company, enclosed in an oblong label, or scroll; sume few, however, in addition to this, comprise a
representation of a mail coach, or a miner. All the stamps or imprints of this class are genuine; the companies by whom they are issued undertake the carriage of letters to places which are not served, or are inefficiently served, by the govemment post-office. The law forbidding the transport of letters by private $\mu$ crsons renders it necessary that the United States rate of jostage should be praid on the letters forwarded by these companies, and this rate is represented by the embossed U.S. postage stamp; the senders of letters have therefore to pay the $\mathbb{U}$. S. rate and the company's charge in addition; and the compound postage is coflected by the sale of the U.S. envelopes bearing the company's frank. As genuine starop, then, these emissions, constituting the first class, are worthy of collection; but the great similarity of design existing between nearly all these emissions, renders it unnecessary to give more than their names, and the number of known varieties of each, except in the few instances where the tyre is peculiar.

The second class comprises nll those labels which were issued by private persons or firms, for one or other of the following purposes: 1. For prepayment of postage from one town to alnother. 2. For parment of charge on letters deposited in a box, and taken by its proprietor to the post-office. 3. To cover the collection of letters at the post-office, and their delivery at the receiver's house, the U. S. postal rates riot including such delivery. These stamps number between two and three hundred. At the present time, originals are rarely to be had; nearly all the lalels, however, have eitber been reprinted (and that in divers colous too) or counterfeited, or both; and many pretended local stamps have been concocted by unscrupulous American dealers. The collection of these stamps leing rendered at once difficuit, unsatisfactory, and uminteresting, by reason of the duubts which, unier such circumstances, most collectors must feel as to the value of specimens offered to them, I am disposed to recommend the abandonment of any attempt to obtain them; and as a mere list of the names of these rtamps cun be but of very slight service to collectors, I have suppressed the catalogue which bas appeared in previous editions. In its place is inserted a list of those slampe of the second class which bave been ascertained to be false; philatelists, therefore, if they find any given stamp is not included in this list, will have negntive evidence that such stamp, or a similar onc, once existed; though even to this extent there can be nothing approaching to certainty, as the number of doubtful stamps is as large as that of the decidedly false.

Note.-The government of Venezuela gave the contract for the conveyance of the mails between La Guaira (the seaport of the Venezuelan capital, Caraccas), Porto Cabello, and the West Indian island, St. Thomas, to Captain Robert Tod. This gentleman transferred his rights to a resident at Curacoa, who caused a ship to be built in England for the purpose of carrying the letters, and called it the Robert Tod. The stamps No. 1 were also made in this country by Waterlow \& Sons, and serve to prepay the postage from La Guaira to St. Thomas. The stampe No. 2 were probably manufactured on the island last-named, and are intended to frank letters rand newspapers from thence to the Venezuelan ports. Both series having been emitted by the special authority of the state, they may justly be considered to be government issues. In the jaland of St. Thomas they are known as the "Robert Tod" stamps. The third series is probably of equal value with its predecessors, but no details as to its bistory have yet been received.
