The Editor of "Oppen's Postage Stamp Album," on subraitting this Catalogue for public approval, begs to remark that it does not profess to comprehend all the numerous varieties of perforation, watermark, \&c., collected by many philatelists. All primary issues and marked variations in colour, \&c., will, however, be found duly noted, and the list made up to date of publication.

Little mention is made of essays or fictitious stamps, and none of forgeries: so many of the former, and, we regret to add, of the latter also, are rife, that a partial notice would be incomplete, and a full one exceed our bounds. Berger Levrault on essays, and the contributions of Pemberton, Stourton, Atlee, \&c., on forgeries, in separate works, or in the pages of the " Philatelist" and "Stamp Collector's Magazine," should be well studied. We retain our own essays, from patriotic motives; that of New Brunswick, for its singular history ; those of Zurich, as being the first foreign postal emanation; and a few others in expectation of official issues.

The Editor and Publisher hope this work will find favour in the eyes of the philatelic public, and trust their patronage will soon afford opportunity for the adoption of any friendly suggestions towards the improvement of future editions.

# CATALOGUE OF STAMPS. EUROPE. 

(All Stamps are rectangular unless otherwise specified. This Catalogue not being intended for collectors of every slight variation in hue, paper, perforation, §c., the more decided varieties only are specified.)

## AUSTRIA.

Issue of 1850.-Arms (double-headed eagle, crowned) on shield; foliage at side, and crown on top. Yellow, orange, 1 kreuzer. Black, 2 kr . Red, 3 kr . Brown, 6 kr . Blne, 9 kr .

Issee of 1858. - Embossed profile of Emperor to left; ornamenial work round, different in each stamp. Yellow, orange, 2 kr . Black or green, 3 kr . (with nambers in corners). Vermilion, 5 kr . Light brown, 10 kr . Blue, 15 kr . (with numbers in opper corners).

Issoe of 1861 .-Oval: similar, to right, in frame composed of engine-turned lines; "Kreazer" at top, and figure denoting value at bottom, in small oval. Pale yellow, 2 kr . Pale green, 3 kr . Red, 5 kr . Brown, 10 kr . Blae, light and dark, 15 kr .

Issee of 1863.-Oval: embossed double-headed eagle crowned, in frame similar to 1861 issne. Pale yellow, 2 kr . Pale green, 3 kr . Rose, red, 5 kr . Blae, 10 kr . Light brown, 15 kr . Do. 1864, larger perforations.

Issee of 1867.-Nearly square: Emperor to right in circle; value below. Values and colours as before, with the addition of 25 kr . in shades of violet. Larger type. Pale salmon, 50 kr . The same, values in soldi for postal circuits employing that denomination.

ENVELOPES.-Isste of 1861.-Oval : embossed, similar to adhesive 1861 issue. Pale green, 3 kr . Red, 5 kr . Brown, 10 kr . Blae, 15 kr . Orange, 20 kr . Dark brown, 25 kr . Violet, 30 kr . Light brown, 35 kr .

Issoe of 1863.-Oval: embossed, similar to adhesive 1863 issue. Pale green, 3 kr . Pink, 5 kr . Blae, 10 kr . Light brown, 15 kr . Violet, 25 kr .

Issof of 1867.-Nearly square. Values and colours as before. Type similar to the labels. The same in soldi as above, for use in the Levant.

NEWSPAPER STAMPS.-Issoe of 1850.-Inland Postage. Squate: profle of Mercury to left, in square frame, inscribed "K. K. Zeitungs post Stämpel." Blue, 1 kreazer. Yellow, 10 kr . Pale red, 50 kr . 1856.-Deep red, 10 kr .

Issoe of 1858.-Inland Postage. Embossed profile of Emperor to left. Blae, 1 kr .

Issoe of 1860- Do. The same, lilac.
Issue of 1860- Do. Similar to 1858; to right, instead of left. Grey, lavender, 1 kr . (No value specified on any of the preceding journal stamps.)

Issues of 1850-58.-Foregen Newspaper Duty. Square: double-headed eagle, crowned, in square frame, inscribed "Kais. Kön. Zeitungs Stämpel;" small circle in each corner. Blue, black, 1 kr . IRed, brown, green, 2 kr . Brown, red, 4 kr .

Issue of 1863.-Octagon: embossed doable-headed eagle, in oval frame, inscribed "K. K. Zeitangs post Strompel." Pale Violet, 1 kr . (Not specified.)

Issoe of 1867.-Rectangular: head of Mercury in circle. Pale lilac, deep violet, 1 kr .

POST-CARDS.-Issue of 1869.—Directions for use inscribed; 2 kr . stamp, yellow, on the right.

Issee of 1871.-Variation in type; 2 kr . orange. Ditto, with inscriptions in Bohemian, Polish, Italian, Ruthenian, Slavian, five varieties.

Issoe of 1872.-Similar: type slightly varying. Ditto, 2 soldi, orange; for the Levant.

Issoe of 1875.-For Mllyria. Similar: slight variation. Yellow on baff, black frame, $2 \mathbf{k r}$.

LOCaLS.-Leitmeritz Express Compant.-Rectangular, 5 kr . Square, 10 kr . Irregalar Octagon, 15 kr . Triangular, 25 kr ., Octagon, 50 kr . These stamps are issued each on eleven differently coloured papers, forming 55 varieties. Ditto rectangular; all fictitions.

## AUSTRIAN ITALY (Lombardo-Venetia) (now superseded by the Italian).

Issue of 1850.-Double-headed eagle, crowned; foliage at side, and crown on top. Orange, yellow, 5 centesimi. Black, 10 c . Red, 15 c . Dark brown, yellow-brown, 30 c. Blae, 45 c.

Issus of 1858. - Embossed profile of Emperor to left; ornamental work round, different in each stamp. Yellow, 2 soldi. Black, 3 s . (with numbers in cornors). Vermilion, 5 s. Brown, 10 s. Blue, 15 s. (with numbers in upper corners).

The black 1 kr . and red 2 kr . and 4 kr . journal stamps noted above in italics were for Lombardo-Venetia; the red was continned for Venetia only.

VENETLA ALONE.-Issue of 1861.-Ozal: Emperor's profile to right. Red, 5 s. Brown, 10 s. The 2 s., 3 s. and 15 s. were printed bat not issued.

Similar to 1858 issue, to left. Light green, 3 s.
Issea or 1863.-Oval: embossed doublo-headed eagle, in frnme composed of engine-tarned lines. "Soldi" above; and figure denoting value at bottom, in oval. Pale yollow, 2 s. Pale green, 3 s. Pink, 5 s. Blae, 10 s. Light brown, 15 s.

ENVELOPES.-Issus of 1861.-Oval: embossed profile of Emperor to right; figare denoting value at bottom, in amall oval. Light yellow, $2_{\text {s. }}$ Pale green, 3 s. Red, 5 日. Brown, 10 s. Blue, 15 s. Orange, 20 s. Dark brown, 25 s. Violet, 30 s. Light brown, 35 s.

Issue of 1863.-Oval : embossed, similar to adhesive 1863 issue. Pale green, 3 s. Piuk, 5 s. Blae, 10 s. Light Brown, 15 s. Violet, 25 s.

## BADEN (superseded by the stamps of the German Empire).

Issue of 1851.-Square: figure denoting number of kreuzers in circle in centre ; inscribed "Baden" above ; date of decree (6th April, 1850) on right side; black printing on coloured paper. Buff, white, 1 kreazer. Green, blue, yellow, 3 kr . Yellow, green, 6 kr . Pink, 9 kr .

Issue of 1860.-Square : coat-of-arms, with crown and supporters, on ground composed of fine horizontal lines; inscribed "Baden" at top; "Freimarke, Postrerein" at sides. Black, 1 kr . Bluc, light and dark, 3 kr . Yellow, orangered, 6 kr . Pink, 9 kr .

Issues of 1862-65.-Square: similar to 1860 issne; some on lined, and some on white ground. Black, 1 kr . (white). Pink, 3 kr . (white). Blue, 6 kr . (lined). Blue, 6 kr . (white). Brown, 9 kr . (lined). Pale, now dark brown, 9 kr . (white). Green, 18 kr . (white). Yellow, 30 kr . (white).

Issues of 1868-9.-Type slightly altered. Light green, 1 kr . Pink, 3 kr . Blue, 7 kr .

POST-CARDS.-Issue of 1870.-For field-service. Black on buff.
Issue of 1871.-For general use. Black inscription on buff, stamp to be affixed.

ENVELOPES.-Issue of 1857.-Oval: embossed profile of Grand Duke to right; value above in words, and in figure in oval at bottom; inscription printed in small type, in yellow, to left of stamp; patterns of frame different in each stamp. Blue, 3 kr . Yellow, 6 kr . Pink, 9 kr . Brown, 12 kr . Red, 18 kr .

Issoe of 1862.-Oval : embossed, similar to 1857 issue ; inscription to right of stamp. Deep Pink, 3 kr . Blue, 6 kr . Light and red-brown, 9 kr .

STAMPS FOR UNPAID LETTERS.-Square: figure denoting number of kreazers, with ornamental work on inside of frame; printed in black on yellow paper; "Land Post" above, and "Porto-Marke" at bottom. 1 kr .3 kr .12 kr .

## BAVARIA.

Issue of 1849.-Square : figure 1, denoting value in krenzers, in square frame inscribed "Bayern Franco;" black printing on white paper. 1 kreazer. There are varieties of this stamp differing in the groundwork on which the figare stands.

Issue of 1850.-Square : large figure denoting value in circle in centre, and small figure in each corner; same inscription as 1849 issue; silk thread runs perpendicularly down the stamp. Rose, 1 kr . Blue, 3 kr . Brown, 6 kr . Green, 9 kr . Red, 12 kr . Yellow, 18 kr .

Issue of 1862.-Square: similar in every respect, except the changea in colour. Yellow, 1 kr . Rose, 3 kr . Blue, 6 kr . Stone, 9 kr . Green, 12 kr . Vermilion, 18 kr.

Issoe of 1867.-Rectangular; royal arms; "name" above; "krenzer" beneath; figure of value in each corner ; embossed on colour. Green, I kr. Pink, 3 kr . Blue, 6 kr . Pale brown, 9 kr . Lilac, 12 kr . Red, 18 kr .

Issue of 1868.-Same type. Pale brown, 6 kr . Blue, 7 kr .
Issues of 1871-2.-Same type, perforated. Green, 1 kr . Pink, 3 kr . Pale
brown, 6 kr . Blue, 7 kr . Red-brown, 9 kr . Yellow, 10 kr . Lilac, 12 kr . Red, 18 kr .

Issus of 1874.-Same type, larger. White embossed on violet, 1 mark. POST-CARDS.-Issue of 1870.-Large sized, for adhesive stamp. Black on baff. Do., double for reply.

Issues of 1872-4.-Stamp impressed, Green, water green, 2 kr ; Yellowgreen, 1 kr . (two types). Double for reply. Dull green, 2 kr .

ENVELOPES.-IsSDE of 1869.-Arms in white relief in oval. Inscription crossing stamp. Pink, 3 kr .

Issue of 1874.-Same type, no inscription. Deep rose-pink, 3 kr .
NEWSPAPER BAND.-Issue of 1874.-Type of adhesives. Green, 1 kr .
STAMPS FOR UNPAID LETTERS.-Issee of 1862.-Figure 3, denoting value in kreuzers; frame inscribed "Bajer Post-taxe" at top, and "Von Empfänger Zahlbar" at bottom. Black on white, 3 kr . Same type, perforated, 1871. 1 kr. 3 kr .

LOCALS FOR RETURNED LETTERS.-Issoe of 1866.-Rectangular; arms in oval; black impression; "Commission für Retoarbriefe." "Manchen" (Manich). Similar device and inscription. "Bamberg," "Augsburg," "Narnbarg," "Warzbarg," "Speyer." Oblong; several types, inscription only. "Regensburg," " Augsburg," "Nurnberg," "Bamberg," "Munchen," "Wurzburg."

Issue of 1869.-Locals for Kissingen and Schweinfart. Arms in central oval; frame inscribed with designation; figures of value at angles. Green, $1 \mathbf{k}$. Pink or red, 2 k , Sky-blue, 3 k . Fictitions.

## BELGIUM.

Issoe of 1849.-Portrait of King Leopold; "Postes" at top, and value in words at bottom, printed in white letters. Figures denoting value in circle in apper corners. Dirty brown, 10 centimes. Blue, 20 c.

Issue of 1850.-Similar portrait, in oval frame; "Postes" at top in white letters; value in words at bottom in coloured letters. Dirty brown, 10 c. Blue, 20 c. Red, 40 c.

Issue of 1861.-Similar to the preceding and green, light and dark, 1 c.
Issues of 1865-66.-Profile of King to left in circle; "Postes" above; value below. Grey, 10 c. Blue, 20 c. Brown, 30 c . Pink, 40 c . Lilac, 1 franc.

Issues of 1866-67.-Belgian arms; "Postes" above; value in cipher at the sides. Grey, 1 c. Blne, 2 c. Brown, 5 c.

Issues of 1869-70.-Portrait of King Leopold II. Green, 10 c. Blue, 20 c. Amber, 30 c. Carmine, 40 c. Lilac, 1 franc. Belgian arms and figore of value. Green, 1 c. Blqe, 2 c. Amber, 5 c. Lilac, mave, 8 c.

Issue of 1870.-Chifferetaxe adhesives : numerals of value within broad oval frame inscribed "à percevoir-centimes;" Belgian crown above; motto beneath. Green, 10 c. Blae, 20 c.

POST-CARDS.-Issoe of 1871.-Armorial bearings in centre; impressed stamp to the right. Brown on buff, 5 c .

Issue or 1872.- Do. Without inscription at sidea.

Issue of 1873.- Do. Violet on buff, 5 c . The same double for reply. (Réponse-Antwoordt). Do. Having the t. scratched out.

ENVELOPES.-Issue of 1873.-Profile of King embossed within oval frame inscribed "Belgique" and value. Green, 10 c.

## BERGEDORF (superseded, see p. 23).

Isste of 1861.-Square: the size of stamp increasing in proportion to value; half eagle and half towers in circle, with a letter at each corner; black printing on coloured paper. Blue, violet, $\frac{1}{2}$ schilling. White, 1 s. Yellow, $1 \frac{1}{2}$ s. Black, or blue on pale pink paper, 3 s . Brownish orange, 4 s .

BREMEN (superseded, see p. 23).
Issoe of 1855.-City only. Arms (key in shield), with crown, large figurs denoting valne on each side of shield, and small figures in each corner. Black on pale blne paper, 3 grote.

Key in oval frame ; Roman figure denoting value in lower corners. Green, 5 в. gr.

Key on shield, crowned; figure in oval frame on each side; "Franco-marke" at top; black printing on coloured paper. Pink 5 gr . Yellow, 7 gr .

Issue of 1861.-Key in oval frame, with wavy border; figures denoting value in corners. Black on white, 10 gr .

Issue of 1861.-Key in oval frame, surrounded by rays; figures denoting value in corners. Yellow, orange-red, 2 gr .

ENVELOPE.-CITY ONLY. Oval : arms, crown inscribed "Stadt-post-amt, Bremen," with "Franco" on the lower left-hand corner of envelope, on white or blue paper. (Stamped by hand.)

BRUNSWICK (superseded, see p. 23).
Issee of 1852.-Oblong: arms (horse and crown); figures denoting value in oval on each side; curved label at top, inscribed "Braunschweig," and at bottom value in words. Pink, 1 silbergroschen. Blue, 2 s. gr. Vermilion, 3 s. gr.

Issues of 1853-56.-Oblong: similar to 1852 issue, but printed in black on coloured paper. Brown, $\frac{1}{4}$ s. gr. ( 3 pfennige). White, s. gr. ( 4 pf.). Pale yellow, orange, 1 s. gr. Dark blue, 2 s. gr. Pink 3 s. gr.

Issoe of 1857.-Square : divided into quarters, each quarter forming a separate stamp, posthorn below crown, $\frac{1}{4}$ gate groschen. Brown, 3 pf.

Issue of 1862.-Oblong: similar to 1852 issue. Black on green paper, $\frac{1}{2}$ groschen. Yellow on white, 1 gr . Pink on white, 3 gr .

Issoe of 1865.-Oval : arms, coloured impression. Black $\frac{1}{\frac{1}{8}} \mathrm{~g}$. Deep pink, 1 g . Blue, 2 g . Light brown, 3 g .

Issoe of 1868.-Posthamous. Brown on white, $\frac{1}{2}$ g. g. of 1857.
POST OFFICE ORDER-CARDS.-Arms in oval to right. Carmine on Pink, 1 g. Blae on blue, 2 g.

ENVELOPES.-Isste of 1852.-City only. Circular: inscribed "St. P.

Fr.;" hand-stamped; value not indicated. Reddish brown; on dark blue, light blue, pink, green, yellow, and white papers ( $\frac{1}{2}$ s. gr.).

Issue of 1855.-Oval : arms (horse and crown) ; value in words at top, and figure in oval at bottom; patterns of frame of each stamp different; inscription printed in small type in blue, to left. Extra sized. Yellow, 1 s. gr. Blue, 2 s. gr. Pink, 3 s. gr. The same in deeper tints and smaller envelopes.

Issue of 1866.-Small oval: arms. Deep pink, 1 g. Blue, 2 g. Light brown, 3 g .

## DANUBIAN PRINCIPALITIES.

MOLDAVIA.-IssuE or 1858.-Circular: woodcut, bull's head, star, and post-horn. Pale red paper, 27 paras. Green, on green tinted paper, 54 p. Blue on blue, 81 p. Blne on pink, 108 p.

Issue of 1859.-Similar: rectangular, corners ronnded "Porto Scrisorei." Blue, 40 p. Red, 80 p. (Many varieties of type, paper, and hne.)

MOLDO-WALLACHIA, OR ROUMANIA.-IsSUE OF 1862.-Irregular octagon: bull's-head, star, horn, and double-headed cagle, inscribed with "Franco Scrisorei," and value. Yellow, orange, 3 p. Red, rose, 6 p. Blue, various shades, 30 p .

Issue of 1865.-Rectangular: head of Prince Couza to right. Yellow, orange, 2 parale. Blue, 5 p . Pale or bright red, and on bluish paper, 20 p.

Issue of 1866.-Head of Prince Charles to left. Black on colour. Yellow, lemon, 2 p. Blue, 5 p. Red, 20 p.

Issue of 1866.-Same head. Colour on white. Orange, 2 bani. Blue, 4 b. Pink, 18 b.

These sets superseded the issucs of Prussia, Saxony, Hanover, Brunswick, Oldenburgh, the Mecklenburgs, Schleswig-Holstein, Bremen, Bergedorf, Lubeck, Hamburg, the Offices of Thurn and Taxis, and that of Prussia, for its southern annexations. Themselves in turn gave place in 1872 to the stamps of the German Empire, described page 10.
