OUR ILLUSTRATION.*SEÑOR DON FELIPE NAVEDA.*

Don Felipe Naveda was born in the City of Mexico on January 11 1869, lived and studied in that city until his nineteenth year. Five years of his life were dedicated to the study of Descriptive Geography, and the city of Toluca with its surrounding features of mountainous scenery is entirely adaptable to a man of his education.

For the past ten years Señor Naveda has held the honorable position of Public Register of the District of Toluca in which city he at present resides.

He began collecting postage stamps in 1896 and now his album contains over 3000 different stamps from all parts of the world; his specialty, however, is Mexico, U. S., China, Japan and British Colonies. He has, during his spare time, dealt considerably in postage stamps and has quite an assorted stock.

As a writer he is able to hold the attention of all, the Spanish Department of this paper testifies, and translations of which everyone of our English readers enjoy.

In closing we will state that we are fortunate to have his services as a writer and know our readers will appreciate each month the production of his pen.

THE NEW ISSUE OF MEXICAN POSTAGE STAMPS.

The Following Published In The Mexican Official Daily Was Sent To Us By Señor Naveda.

Notice to the Public!

The Secretary of State Communications and Public Affairs, General Post Office Department;

In order to assist the public in sending letters, the Secretary of Public Affairs has decided to nullify until January 31, 1900, the orders accorded on the 31 of last July for the postal circulation of the stamps issued on April 1, 1895 which are at present in use; ordaining in the same manner that the following dispositions shall be made known to the public:

In compliance with the conforming rules in articles 43 of the Decree of January 26, 1899 and 184 of Postal Requirements in force:

1. (a) It is understood below that the name of *Correspondence* of all objects which are admissible through postal transmission:

(b) That shall be understood, the distinct appellation *Postage Stamps*; the stamps, post-cards and stamped envelopes.

2. The postage stamps of the issue of 1895 shall be used only and recognized by Post-Offices until October 31 coming; and the new postage stamps will be sold by Post-Offices from November 1 until further orders.

3. The letters (correspondence) deposited in the Post-Offices or letter-boxes before November 1 can be post-paid only with stamps of the issue of 1895. Any deposited from the 1 of November coming until the 31 of January, 1900, may be post-paid only with the stamps of the 1895 or 1899 issues. That deposited from the first of February 1896, until the new orders must be paid only with stamps of the issue of 1899.

4. From the 1 of November coming, until the 31 of January, 1900 the Post-Offices will exchange to those who desire the postage stamps of the issue of 1899. This exchange shall be done gratuitously by all Post-Offices to those who desire; it must be seen by his strict responsibility that those taken from the public are *genuine, never used for postage and in perfect condition*. The postal cards, envelopes and letter-sheets (stamped), on which have been printed addresses, advertisements, illustrations and reading matter are admissible for exchange providing they have the same conditions as stated above. There *shall not* be exchangeable stamps adhering to postal-cards, envelop-

es, documents or anything of similar nature.

For general use, there shall be given in exchange stamps of the new issue, equal value and class as received from the public. Only in such cases when the Post-Offices do not have the kind and value to the new issue, they shall allow in equivalent value the kind of stamps with approximate values for those presented for exchange.

Among Our Exchanges.

Just as we are beginning these notes, comes the belated Stamp Tribune, which was omitted until after the first of October in order to give accounts of the conventions. Mr. Lev has exchanged printers, and it presents a very neat appearance. Mr. Verbeck as usual, furnishes much of the copy, the principal solid article being by R. Rudificus on Canadian Revenue. The Universal Postal Union and the Great Barrier Island stamps are treated upon.

A very neat new comer, from the press of Stonell, comes to us from Chicago, the much belated Chicago Philatelist, which starts out well. It has a large number of special contributions, H. A. Chapman, receiving his Review and Perforations, which were in the Perforator, G. A. Camp has Washington Notes, F. I. Weaver, Canadian Notes, to be illustrated each month. There are also notes from Boston on the Pacific coast, a portrait of Mr. Weaver, and a

sketch of his life, and an article by Leon Cass on Reprints.

The Evergreen State Philatelist has also reappeared after resting three months, opening with a lively article by Veritas, on the Great Barrier Island and other frauds, while John Paalzou treats on "not many varieties" making us think one or two incomplete statements, perhaps the fault of the printers. Even after his long rest, Editor French, thinks he has hardly got into the harness yet.

Another visitor from the Pacific coast is Filatelic Facts and Fallacies which always strike us a little heavy. The August issue has five pages of original matter, three of them being a continuation of the Early American Post-Offices—very good for the future historian.

Of the same class perhaps, is the Philatelic Monthly and World of Philadelphia, one of the oldest published. It consists of eight pages of very neatly printed notes original, well written, and so much quoted, we scribblers must pay \$1.00 hereafter, for the chance to aid them—that is, they have raised their subscription price from 25 cents to \$1.00 per year. It seems to us if this well established house of Bogert and Durbin, would admit other advertisements secure found rates, etc., that would pay better than raising the subscription.

The Bay State Philatelist also took a rest, by issuing two numbers in one and now reappears for September, as neat and pretty as ever from Melrose Highlands,

Mas. in a pretty cover, neat type with several short articles, besides much matter by the editor, within its cover.

The Philatelic Advocate of Berlin, Ont. is on time, as usual, and has six pages of reading matter, largely original, and is very neatly printed by its editor and publisher, the Starnanean Brothers.

The New York Philatelist survived its large double number and comes to us again on time, as bright as ever for September. Five pages, the share of this issue is given to a full account of the second annual meeting of the Empire State society, but has room for an article by H. A. Chapman on some minor varieties of the Envelopes of 1899. Some good editorial notes and society news fill up the rest of the paper.

Its near neighbor, the Herald Exchange also seems to prosper, as the September issue comes out just double size on sixteen pages. Dr. Cotton has his Odds and Ends and Chicago Notes. Mr. Chapman treats on "Some Puzzling Addresses" and A. I. Walls has two articles. A good dose is given of new catalogue prices and their exposure of frauds is given plenty of room.

The Alleghany Philatelist comes to us for August, with the announcement by a full page ad, of the consolidation of the Tri Monthly Collector with it. This gives them a big circulation. It opens with a sketch by A. L. Wissman their lively St. Louis correspondent, followed by a photo and sketch of his life by the publisher.

Four pages are given up to new issues; Mr. Chapman has his department, while an essay entitled Common Sense Triumphant, is good, by the retiring Philatelist—way so modest, brother?

We have been favored with another of the new anonymous publication, entitled The Rival Philatelist, this number mailed at Dubuque, Iowa. The first number being mailed at Louisville, Ky. It is chiefly interesting as a neat specimen of pen printing copied by some process on eight pages of paper the size of commercial note, and has some very cute things. It claims to have a circulation of 20 copies, two only being subscribers.

Another new comer, in same small style in the Illinois Philatelist from Kaukakes, Illinois published by S. E. Moisant, a frequent contributor to the philatelic press. It is very neatly printed, but is largely composed of advertisements and is open to improvement.

The irrepressible J. F. Dodge, sends out a neat little 8 page semi-monthly Collector for September 2nd, to show he is alive yet and proposes to still publish an official organ for the Columbian and Sons of Philatelic Societies. We wish he had made it a monthly, for the next two numbers are missing as we write.

The last number we received of the Philatelic West and Camera News from Superior, Neb., was late and dated Aug. 31st. Brody gets out one of the largest magazines we have, and has a fine advertising patronage. This num-

ber has a long article on *The Revenue Stamps of Mexico*, by W. F. Slusser, treats the varieties in the Queens land stamps—on the dog pony express by Frank Beck. Also has an account of the Argentine Stamps of 1892 and another of notes from the Republic. It has a prize Mss. by Mrs. G. A. Crayton giving a general history of stamps. Its 25 pages of reading matter is hard to match.

The Virginia Philatelist for September is hard to beat with its beautiful new cover, and fine typography. It opens with a welcome to the Southern P. A. which met Sept. 21, 22 and 23 at Richmond. Its editorial notes are always interesting. *Lacus Viridis* begins a series on the stamps of Panama and Nicaragua has new issues of stamps and cards well written up, and best of all its advance catalogue prices are compared with the 58th. Mr. John Paalzon is given five pages for his fine review of other publications. The Southern Society is truly blest in having such a good official organ.

We have much pleasure in introducing to our readers this month, Mr. Arthur D. Grant of Kansas City, Kansas. He is now in his nineteenth year and has had many year's experience in the newspaper and magazine business being employed both "editorially and reportorially" on the Star, Sun and several other Kansas City papers.

From 1897-98 he published the Western School News and also Arthur Grant's Popular Monthly. The latter an ideal publication containing departments of interest for American youth.

Mr. Grant has studied mineralogy, botany, psychology, and other relative sciences and in his travels has picked up many valuable relics. His collection of stamps, numbers some 4000 varieties. He has spent much

time and money and by his honest exchanging with foreign collectors has amassed thousands of duplicates.

Philatelic Notes From Canada.

Three important innovations have been introduced into parliament by P. M. General Mulock.

1st. As much injury is frequently done to business and other interests by letters being posted *too late* to catch the mail; it is the intention of the department to have a *too late* fee of 1ct on payment of which letters will be sent up till the mail train has left. In larger cities special carriers will be provided.

2nd. A Provision whereby the Department provides for identifying of persons for losses of registered mail matter to the extent of \$25.

3rd. A reform in the interest of publishers by which they will be permitted to enclose in "sample copies," circulars, etc; as it is at present the law allows it to papers sent regular subscribers.

Approximate to the above, a newspaper clipping states, that in all probabilities we may expect a *special too late stamp* to cover last named fee. Regarding compensations of losses of registered mail, I understand that a maximum fee of 1 ct. in addition to registration will be charged to guarantee safe delivery.

The Stamp-Exchange Club in connection with one of the Toronto daily papers, has to date a total membership of 562, principally beginners. The editor, an old time philatelist is doing good work among the juvenile collectors and we trust his efforts to bring new aspirants into the ranks of philately will be appreciated by all, as in the beginner of to-day is the future of philately.

Stamp collectors (i. e. philatelists) are frequently being confounded with collectors of coupon, advertising stamps, etc. throughout Ontario. When you confess that you are a collector you hear such questions as these—(from the Trading Stamp Collectors):—“How many have you in your book? Did you get 10 free stamps in the *last Red Letter* to-day? What premium are you going to select when your book is filled? etc.” It sometimes takes no little time and talk to convince these people that you do not collect *gum stickers* and *spool labels* etc, and that the only way we can maintain and protect our hobby is to stick to our own true title, i. e. *philatelists*.

Since my last month's notes ap-

pear our philatelic Club of Toronto has held four very successful meetings. Auction sales are conducted each alternate week. New members are being admitted and unusual interest is being manifested both by officers and members and everything bids fair for a successful fall and winter season.

The annual D. P. A. special meeting will likely be held Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 23rd, in Hamilton, Ont. to discuss many important matters of interest to the association. A meeting of like nature was held in Toronto last year which brought out some thirty officers and members which shows that a lively interest is being taken in the organization and that meetings of this kind will become quite popular from year to year.

The surprisingly small number of Canada Special Delivery in the hands of dealers is making this stamp a scarce article in used condition.

Speaking about the new prices for 1900 to a prominent well-informed dealer, he states that it would be simply impossible for him to sell B. N. A. stamps at 1900 prices and allow the prevailing discount of 50 per cent.

Two stamps in particular, the Canada 7½ P. and 10 P. that Scott has seen fit to reduce 30 per cent. can't be purchased at full 1900 prices i. e., \$15 and \$7 from Canadian Dealers. Really fine copies of the 7½ P. have sold for \$18 to \$20 and the 10 P. has

The 3 ct. Red laid paper 1870 reduced from \$5 to \$3.50 is a stamp that heretofore has been priced too high. One has no difficulty in procuring same at 50c to \$1.50 and many good copies are slow at that price.

Again we fail to see upon what grounds Scott has seen fit to reduce the 12 1/2c 1868 from 20c to 18c. This stamp is the gem of the set. Very, very few are represented in the stocks of Canadian or U. S. dealers and whatever holding there are in quantity, it is among the dealers across the pond.

To convince yourself, dear reader, make inquiries among your local dealers. See how many 12 1/2 cents he has to sell you at 15 cents each or 2/3 catalogue and then I have no doubts but what you will agree with me when I say that not only this stamp but many other B. N. A. are actually worth over 100 per cent of Scott's prices and that the market is the only true valuator of our "wee bits."

Hay en ese país 72 oficinas autorizadas para desempeñar el Servicio Urbano; igual número para expedir tarjetas de identidad, 496 para expedir giros postales; 57 agencias de *primera* clase para hacer el servicio de certificación y 72 administraciones para entregar piezas certificadas a domicilio.

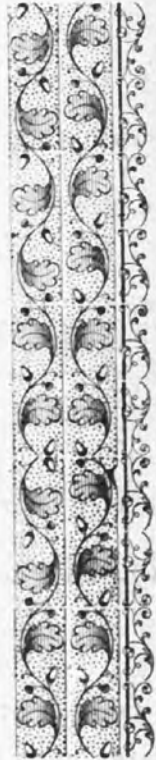
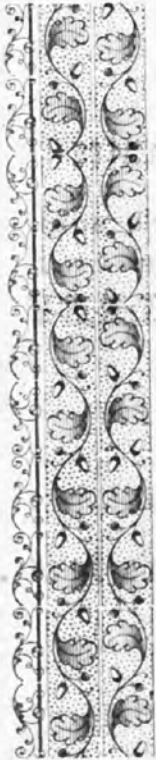

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC and her STAMP DEALERS and COLLECTORS.

By Capt. Alfonso Millard, Late from Buenos Aires.

Every stranger who stands on terra firma in Buenos Aires, will be taken aback at the quantity of Lottery Agencies or Agencia de Loteria Nacional, and they all seem to make a decent living out of this precarious mode of living; but the stranger who is interested in Philately will note, that very few of them are minus a lot of postage stamps in their windows. Oh! will not one wonder that men are not ashamed to show such glaring forgeries at catalogue prices! Naturally the Collector will enter and call to see his books of stamps and when he casually mentions that this or that stamp is a forgery, he will be winded with the reply: Why man I guarantee that stamp with my head and life. You are wrong that is a genuine stamp and I will give you a written guarantee to that effect.

If I do not tire you readers of the "International Philatelist" I will give you a little talk with one of the largest dealers (So called in his own estimation) I saw a few of the first issue Unpa'd Chilian stamps on a card; I marched in and wanted to see them at my first glance I said to the dealer; Those stamps are fakes" (Answer was) I guarantee those stamps with my head and life, I told him again that they were false, his indignation was enough to fill a good size balloon. Then I was astounded with the following question;

"On what authority do you pronounce those stamps false?" Why, I replied on my knowledge and experience of these stamps "Who are you Mister man?" I quietly took out my card and handed it with my address in Santiago. You should have seen that man started to scringe and say that he bought those stamps for genuine ones but now was very sorry he had put them in his window, he did not deal in forgeries, he would never show them again nor for sale.

A few days after this I had the occasion to pass this same shop and to my consternation I saw the stamps again and with a very neat gold edge card with these words: "Guaranteed to be genuine by Capt. Alfonso Millard of the Chilian army, Santiago."

Well reader my blood was up and I enquired of the nearest vigilante (Policeman) for the nearest Comisana (Police station) and started to tell the Inspector what had happened. We then went to the lottery agency "why yes they are guaranteed by a Chilian Officer" said the dealer. Then I had the signal to enter and was that poor devil not shaking in his shoes? The poor devil was taken to the station at once tried and fined 500 pesos and 6 months. This was a lesson to others of the same class. The majority of these so called dealers know as much about stamps as the office cat does. But on the other hand there are a good many dealers and collectors with knowledge and experience on matter that is stampic.

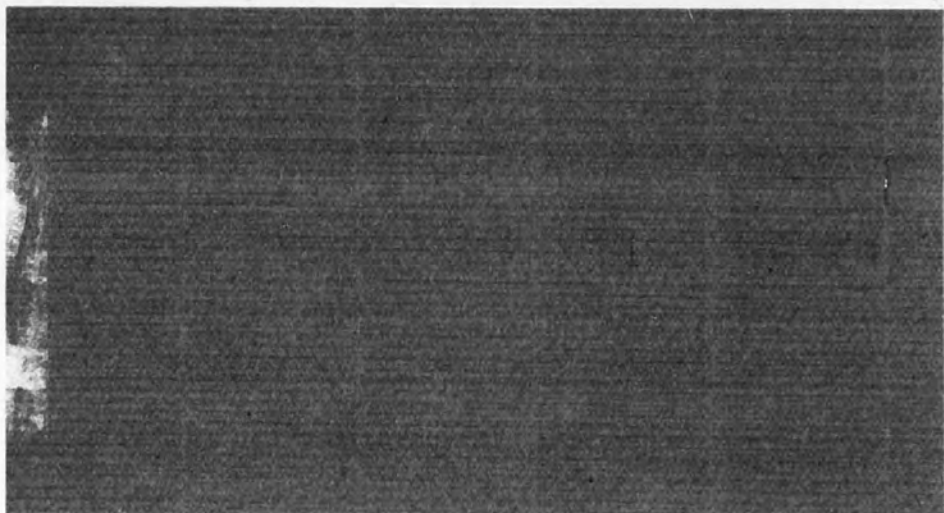

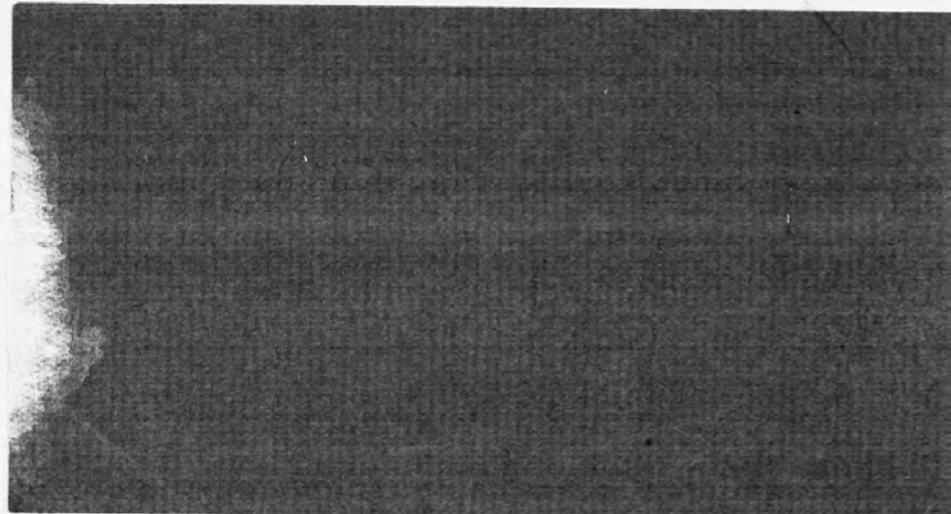

SHALL WE COLLECT FISCALS AND TELEGRAPHS.

Why do Philatelists draw the line with such severity at postage stamps? Why should not a stamp collector collect all stamps, whether used upon letters or for telegraphic purposes, or to pay the government tax due upon legal and other documents? These questions are not easily answered. Ask the average Philatelist why he does not collect Fiscals as well as Postals, and the probability is that he will quite unable to adduce any reason that will really hold water. He may run the whole gamut of the popular fallacies concerning Fiscal and Telegraph Stamps, and yet be unable to furnish any convincing argument against the collection of *all* Adhesive Stamps.

* * * * *

This idea that fiscal collecting would mean the accumulation of hundreds of thousands of specimens is very wide-spread, but wholly erroneous. No one, so far as we are aware, has ever taken the trouble to compute the exact number of obtainable varieties of the world's fiscal stamps, but rough estimates place the number of obtainable varieties at fifty thousand. This number, of course, must not be taken to include all the possible varieties of shade, type, paper, etc., but it is quite safe to assert that the possessor of fifty thousand different fiscal stamps would be as near completion as any collector is ever likely to be. Now as every school boy knows, or should know, there are at the present mo-

ment almost (perhaps quite) fifty thousand varieties of postage stamps.

* * * * *

Collect only *adhesive* fiscal and telegraph stamps! By this means all undesirable varieties, such as the unwieldy beer and tobacco labels already alluded to, and a few other "unmanageables" are excluded from one's collection.

* * * * *

In the first place fiscal stamps are every bit as interesting as postage stamps. They offer a rich variety of design and shape; they are of earlier origin than postage stamps and consequently have a far more varied and interesting history.

True, they do not provide the same bewildering array of minute varieties, but this may only be accounted an advantage. There are no plate numbers and but few provisionals. Nevertheless the careful student of fiscal stamps will find plenty with which to occupy himself in the way of varieties of paper, perforation and printing.

Nor does this by any means exhaust the list of advantages attaching to the study of fiscals. Perhaps the crowning glory of the fiscal stamp is that it has not been Seebeckised. There are no unnecessary issues either of fiscals or of telegraphs. The fiscalist again has no Chunkings nor Kewkiangs to bother him. Moreover, reprints and forgeries are an unknown quantity. On every hand in every possible way the collector of fiscal and telegraph stamps is absolutely secured against the various

forms of fraud that endanger postage stamp collecting.

Above all there is this important consideration. Fiscal collecting is not the expensive pursuit that postage stamp collecting has lately become. The present prices of fiscal and telegraph stamps are remarkably low, and in very many cases out of all proportion to the real scarcity of the stamps. One can get together quite a respectable show of fiscals and telegraphs at a merely nominal figure, though as time goes on and the study of fiscal stamps becomes more popular (and it is becoming more popular every day) prices will necessarily rise in obedience to the inexorable law of supply and demand.

We have heard it said by many persons unfamiliar with the circumstances under which fiscal stamps are issued and used, that many stamps of high face value (twenty pounds, fifty pounds, a hundred pounds, and even more), are issued for fiscal purposes only, and that these in the used condition must be very rare indeed.

This is quite a mistake, for whereas a high value postage stamp is usually worth more in the used condition more than half its face value, yet a great many high value fiscals are to be obtained at absurdly low prices. The reason is plain. Fiscal stamps of a high value are being used by solicitors and bankers and merchants every day and every hour. The using of a five-pound postage stamp is a rare occurrence, but five-pound fiscals are being used at the rate of some thousand a month. This is mentioned by way of showing the intending collector of these most interesting stamps that unlike the philatelist proper, he has not the fear of high values and bloated prices constantly before him.

Original gum is a matter of primary importance in connection with

fiscal stamps. Without original gum no fiscal described as unused can be relied upon to be what it is represented to be. Revenue stamps placed upon documents frequently escape cancellation altogether, yet the stamp having fulfilled the purpose for which it was intended, cannot properly be called unused on account of the mere absence of a cancellation.

Fiscals, however, are not very extensively collected in the unused condition.

* * * * *

Besides, all stamp collectors are *already collectors of fiscals and telegraphs!* It seems a bold thing to say, * * but what are the facts? Let us take as a familiar instance the five-pound English postage stamp already alluded to. * * Nevertheless for the sake of completeness we must all have a specimen of the five-pound stamp; so we buy one for two pounds, a used specimen, of course. But how used? In nine cases out of ten the English five-pound postage stamp is not used for postal purposes at all but is used as a telegraphic cancellation. Now the millionaire Philatelist who purchases an unused specimen is on safe ground. His stamp is a postage stamp right enough, although as a matter of strict fact, being available for telegraphic and revenue purposes as well as postage, it is a postal—fiscal—telegraph! But with the many collectors who secure specimens of this kind of stamp with telegraphic cancellations at prices ranging from thirty shillings upwards the boot is on the other leg. They are collecting telegraph stamps, pure and simple, although they may not feel disposed to admit it.

Again, let us turn to that very large and ever increasing class of stamps known as "postal fiscals." These in the unused state are unquestion-

ably fiscals; only when they have actually done postal duty and received the postal cancellation can they be said to have lost their fiscal character. Yet many postalists, for the sake of uniformity, admit into their albums unused specimens of these stamps; and many such are the men who would be most likely to repudiate, perhaps even resent, any suggestion to the effect that they collected fiscal stamps. As instances of the postal fiscals that are to be seen in so-called postal collections in the unused state we may mention the "stamp duty" issues of Victoria and the "Inland Revenue" surcharges of British Guiana, Grenada and other colonies. You will even find, in many postal albums, fiscally used specimens of these stamps. Then indeed the *reductio absurdum* is reached.

All that can be said in favor of the study of fiscal stamps applies with additional force to telegraphs.

Of course, the telegraph stamps of our own country have always been more or less earnestly collected and studied by British Philatelists. The same thing is observable to a greater or less extent in most other countries employing these stamps, but so far it has always been a case of a man going in for the fiscals and telegraphs of his own country only.

* * * * *

There is one strong inducement to telegraph collecting which cannot be claimed either for fiscals or postals.

Telegraph stamps are a diminishing quantity. This must not be taken to mean that telegraph stamps are in the habit of disappearing, although that may conceivably happen when one's collection is needlessly exposed within the reach of unscrupulous persons. What we mean to convey is that while new postage stamps are appearing weekly, almost daily,

telegraphs (and the same thing applies to certain kinds of fiscals) are increasing at a very much diminished rate, and in the case of many countries are being abandoned altogether. In Great Britain, as the reader knows, there are now no telegraph stamps, whatever, it being recognized by the authorities that a department which controls both posts and telegraphs does not need to issue two distinct classes of stamps. Our ordinary penny postage stamp of the current issue is good also for telegraphic or for Inland Revenue purposes. Thus the collector of postage stamps in such cases as the stamps of Great Britain and of other countries which are following her lead in this important respect, is also involuntarily collecting telegraph and fiscal stamps. Spain for many years has issued a stamp that is good for either postage or telegraphic purposes, as the inscription "Correos y telegrafos" indicates, and in many other countries the special stamp for telegraphic use has been allowed to lapse.

Virtually, telegraph stamps ARE

postage stamps. They prepay messages from one person to another. True, they are not placed upon the actual envelope that reaches the addressee, but they are certainly attached to the original message as it is handed over the counter of the post office. Looked at broadly, a telegraph stamp is simply a postage stamp—nothing more, nothing less; and it would, we think, greatly puzzle the average philatelist to give a satisfactory explanation as to why he collects the stamps which frank an ordinary letter, and ignores the stamp which franks the express letter—i. e. telegram.

We have shown that postage stamp collectors are forced in certain cases to admit fiscals and telegraphs into their albums. It is no less a fact that fiscalists are compelled now and then to intersperse among their fiscal stamps those which were primarily issued for purely postal purposes. Thus, dividing the study of all adhesive stamps, into three important sections, as follows:—

1. Postage stamps.
2. Telegraph stamps.

3. Revenue or Fiscal stamps.

We find that the three classes are inextricably bound up with one another. It is impossible to be only a postalist or only a fiscalist. One must to a certain extent collect all three classes of stamps, and since this is so why not make a pleasure of necessity by collecting all three?

As a further evidence of the intimate association of the three classes of adhesive stamps we may mention that in many countries the ordinary revenue or fiscal stamps are used for telegraphic purposes: "Mexico with its "Documentos y Libros" series, is a familiar case in point. Thus the great number of Philatelists who collect telegraph as well as postage stamps must in this instance collect also fiscals.

It is, in fact, an absolute impossibility to make a complete postal collection that shall be entirely free from fiscals or telegraphs.

* * * * *

We have said that fiscal stamps, while not showing such a number of intricate minor varieties as postage stamps, are yet full of interest on account of the numerous variations of paper, printing &c. Thus we find the fiscal of New Zealand printed on the paper of the postage stamps, just as the postage stamps of the same colony have been discovered on the paper intended for fiscal use, the fact being betrayed of course by the watermark. Then we have emergency is-

ues of lithographed fiscals just as in postage stamps, printed TETE BECHE, compound perforations, and other varieties galore, all combining to make the study of fiscal stamps equally as fascinating as the study which the average stamp collector would call "philately proper."—From a pamphlet issued by Walter Morley, London.

HOW TO TELL THE DIFFERENCE.

I. CONFEDERATE 5C. BLUE London and local prints.

(1) The London prints are upon a fine, highly milled glazed paper, quite thin, and when a finger is passed over its surface a greasy feeling is apparent. The local impressions are printed upon a thicker paper which has a roughish surface.

(2) The London stamps are, as a rule, very clearly printed, while the locals are rough impressions;

(3) Immersion in water fails to remove all the gum from the backs of the London stamps and the same process totally cleans the backs of those locally printed.—N. Y. Phil.

II. FIRST ISSUE OF GREECE. To distinguish between Paris prints and those printed at Athens, which followed, has been a stumbling block with many beginning the study of Greek stamps, like most other things, it is perfectly simple when explained. A broad test—which, however, cannot be implicitly trusted—is the presence or absence of figures on the

back. The values 5, 10, 20, 40 and 80 lepta in the Athens prints always have figures on the back, except in the very first printing of the 10 and 20 lep., which, however, are so rare that they are hardly likely to trouble many readers of these notes. The figures on the back of the 10 lep. Athens were only $6\frac{1}{4}$ mm. high in place of 8 mm. on the Paris. The 1 and 2 lep. values never have figures on the back; therefore, the only infallible test for all values is in the shading on the neck. This in the Paris is composed of very finely-drawn lines, more or less broken up into dots and dashes, the ends being very fine. In the Athens printed stamps these lines are heavier and *unbroken*, and the later the printing the heavier and more blotchy these lines and the whole appearance of the stamps became. Experience will teach the collector which are Paris prints by the shade of colour, as a rule; but this difference cannot be described on paper, though it may be said that the colours used for the Paris prints are all softer tones than are frequently found in the later ones.

Mr. Beckton says there are two printings of the Paris prints, the second printing showing *rather* heavier lines of shading on the neck, and dif-

fering slightly from the first in the *tone* of colour, this being deeper in all values except the 1 and 20 lepta. In unused specimens the two printings can be distinguished by the gum, which in the first is smooth and white, and in the second is slightly yellowish and "crackly."

III. LITHOGRAPHED VS. ENGRAVED
—For the benefit of those unable to distinguish between an engraved and a lithographed stamp, the following is recommended: Take the stamp you wish to test and place it upon a piece of glass or some hard, smooth substance, and cover the face with a piece of tinfoil such as comes around tobacco. Smooth out any wrinkles, and press down until very smooth. If you can see the impression of the stamp design in relief, it is engraved; if not, it is lithographed.—Philatelic West.

Wurtemberg will discontinue the use of its postage stamps April 1st, 1902, and will use thereafter the stamps of the German Empire. This will leave Bavaria the only one of the German states having its own stamps.

Owing to a big rush of business at our printer's, this number is a few days late.

We regret very much to hear of the death of E. F. Gambs, the well-known San Francisco dealer; the cause of his death was asphyxiation by gas on February 5th.

Is there any chance that a philatelic magazine containing 48 pages of good "stampy" reading matter every month, no personalities or politics, would take in enough money so that the publisher would not lose anything? Would you support it? Note—The word "stampy" is not copyrighted.

Scotts' 61st catalogue was duly re-

True, there are a few errors in it and probably the prices don't suit every buyer and seller, but it is fair, just and nearer perfect than books requiring so much labor usually are, and it is the standard catalogue and price list of the American collector, just as it has been for the past thirty years. What always surprised us was how such a volume could be prepared and sold for the price.

REMAINDERS.

Remainders in the philatelic sense of the word are stamps that have become useless on account of a change in currency, government, color or designs. Such stamps are sold in bulk at public auction or private sale, to some speculator or dealer. In years gone by such lots were bought very cheaply, so cheap in fact that some of the stamps are sold by dealers under the face value, but that time has passed, as recent purchases such as the Nova Scotia, Leeward Islands, etc., show. The cheapness of many stamps that are really remainders have caused many collectors to believe they were reprints, but there is a great difference between the two, as the remainders are legitimate stamps issued for legitimate purposes. I have compiled the following list of remainders from various sources:

Angola—A large quantity of remainders of the 1886-7 issue were sold Feb. 21st, at Lisbon.

Antigua—All stamps of this Colony that remained in the authorities hands at the time it, with Dominica, Montserrat, Nevis, St. Christopher and Virgin Islands, was merged into the Leeward Island postal government, were sold to an English dealer in 1891. The numbers of each were as follows: 41,064 $\frac{1}{2}$ d.; 110,749 1d., 26,009 $2\frac{1}{2}$ d.; 38,464 4d.; 6,300 6d.; 1,387 1 sh. and 4,545 2d and 3d postcards.

Argentine Republic—There were large lots of remainders of the 5, 10 and 15c of the 1858-61 issue sold in England some years ago.

Baden—Remainders were sold to a German dealer consisting of 1, 3, 6 and 9k of 1851; 1, 3, 6 and 3k on blue of 1854; 1k, 3k blue, 6 red and orange; 9k carmine and 9k brown of 1860-4. The quantity ranged from 1474 of the 1k 1860-2 to 4486 of the 1k of 1851. There were also 12 of the 6k blue 1860-2 included, and large quantities of the Land Post sets.

Bavaria—Large quantities of the 1870-6 and return letter stamps were thrown on the market years ago, also of the Unpaid Letter stamps.

Bergedorf—Remainders were sold in 1866. The number was small but the plates were also sold at the same time.

Bolivia—1869-71 issue; numbers were comparatively small and the stamps were quickly absorbed.

Brazil—In 1897 the Brazilian government sold lots of the following stamps: 10r, 20r of 1883-85; 80r of 1878-79 (582 copies); 700r of 1888; 50r (331,026), 200r (84,360), 300 r (194,641), 500r olive-green (239,442), 700r and 1000r (740,806) 1890-93; 100r 1893; 10r, 20r, 100r of 1894-97; Newspaper 50r, 100r, 200r, 300r, 500r, 700r, 1000r of 1889; 10r (379,479), 20r, 100r of 1890-91, 10r, 20r and 50r of 1891-94; Unpaid 1889 10r (1,314), 20r 1890 (791). The exact number of the varieties after which no number in parenthesis appears is not known.

British Bechunaland—When this Colony was incorporated with Cape Colony the remainders were bid upon by two English dealers, but I have never been able to find whether or

not they were lucky enough to get them. The number was small.

British Columbia—Small quantities of all values were sold when the postal administration was taken over by Canada.

British East Africa—1890-91 issue.

British Honduras—Surcharged stamps of 1890-91 issues were sold when the regular issue was received from London.

Brunswick—1855-66 issue; numbers reasonably large.

Central American Steamship Co.—Full set was sold to an American dealer.

Cape Verde—A large quantity of remainders of the 1886 issue were sold at Lisbon, February 21st.

Ceylon—1 sh. 9d of 1861, perforated and all stamps surcharged Service.

Chili—In September, 1899, the government sold its remaining stock of Unpaid Letter Stamps. Immense quantities of the 1, 2, 4, 10 and 20c pink were sold and smaller quantities of 1, 2, 6, 8, 10 and 20c red on yellow. Also quantities of 10c, 1, 5 and 10 dollar Telegraph Stamps.

Colombia—1866 1 peso, 1879 to 1891 issues of Bolivar. Many were cancelled to order. Lots of Columbia and Departments are being thrown on the market now; they are brought out by the war now going on in that country.

Confederate States—Many sheets were found in post-offices and thrown on the market at various times after 1865.

Corea—1886 5 and 10m. Rest of set are also considered remainders, but they were never used postally.

Costa Rica—First perforated issue when sold to the buyer of the remainders were surcharged "Official." The 1892 set has lately been thrown on the market.

Cuba—1855-70 issues; sold pen-marked. Large quantities of many other values have been thrown on the

market since the Spanish-American war.

Cyprus—The 1880 issue surcharged on English stamps were sold to a large English firm when that issue was superseded by the regular Cyprus stamps.

Dominica—(See Antigua). The numbers of each stamp was as follows: 18,807 ½d; 19,290 1d; 9,238, 2½d; 9,498 4d; 3,608 6d; 1,428 1sh. and 2,600 postcards, 1, 1½, 2d and 3d.

The 1d, 6d, and 1 sh., surcharged revenue were sold to an English dealer in 1897.

Ecuador—It is announced that large quantities of remainders of many issues will be offered to the dealers for their bids.

Finland—In 1898, the government offered large quantities of remainders of obsolete stamps to the highest bidder. I have not been able to find whether they were sold or not.

Fiji Islands—In 1889 the following were sold by the crown agent: 3,244 3d green C. R. overprinted V. R. and surcharged, 2 pence; 11,895 3d. green V. R. surcharged, 2 pence; 495 3d green C. R. overprinted V. R. in black; 146 3d green C. R.; 796 3d purple C. R. overprinted V. R. and surcharged, 4 pence in black; 4,496 6d red C. R. overprinted V. R. in black, 46 6d, red C. R.; 3,495 1d blue C. R. overprinted V. R. in black.

Germany—Thurn and Taxis, Northern and Southern Districts, North German Confederation official stamps, Alsace and Lorraine, German Empire 1871 and 1872 issues.

Greece—1 l. brown on cream; 10 l. orange on greenish paper, figures on back.

Guatemala—1871 to 1882 issues. 1897 set was sold to a prominent dealer in 1898; there were 81,000 of each stamp except the 75 and 150 of which there were none and the 18c of which there was only 1,339.

Hawaii—The Department of Foreign Affairs stamps were sold in 1898: 6,100 2c; 22,450 5c; 3,150 c; 36,050 10c; 4,250 12c; 4,300 25c.

Heligoland—1867-73 issues and 1, 2 and 3 pf. of 1875-90. Quantities comparatively small.

Honduras—1865-78 issues. All the Seebeck issues.

Hungary—3 and 10 kr. envelopes of 1871.

Ionian Isls—Full set.

Italy—156-63 issues. 50 l and 100 l. Unpaid were sold in 1896.

Jamaica—A few 1 sh. (about 85) and 2 sh. (about 425) and about 375,000 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. 165,000 1d and 6,000 2d surcharged "Official" in ordinary type were offered to English speculators in 1899.

Japan—1871-2 issues.

Leeward Isls—The remainders of the Jubilee set were sold to the highest bidder December 31, 1897. 2,637 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 2,789 1d; 5,407 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 1,493 4d; 1,030 6d; 793 7d; 600 each of the 1 and 5 sh.

Liberia—1870 issue.

Lubeck—Large numbers of the 1861-55 issues.

Mauritius—1849, no value expressed, red, blue and vermilion; 1859-61 6d purple, 1862 6d, 1863-77 full set surcharged "cancelled."

Mecklenburg Schwerin—Remainders were sold in 1875 to G. Schnelle, of Schwerin, 1856 4-4, 3, 5s; 1864 4-4, 5; 1866 2 and 3; envelopes all except the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ s.

Mecklenburg Strelitz—Sold at same time as above, and to same party, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, 1, 2, 3 s. gr.

Mexico—Large quantities of 1864, 1879, 1882, 1886-92 issues. Also Porto de Mar stamps.

Modena—Full set.

Montserrat—(See Antigua). The numbers of each stamp are as follows: 5,437 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 5,463 1d; 4,977 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 7,232 4d; 1,166 6d and 2,100 postcards.

The 1d Revenue remainders were sold in 1897 to an English dealer.

Montenegro—In 1899 obsolete stamps were offered; also the Jubilee set. There is a large quantity of the 1897 issue on hand that will probably be thrown on the market soon.

Nevis—(See Antigua). The number were as follows. 7,227 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 5,872 1d; 5,045 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 4,332 4d; 2,944 6d; 1,457 1 sh., and 2,800 postcards. The 4 and 6d surcharged Revenue were sold to an English dealer in 1897.

New Brunswick—Several thousand sets of 6 stamps of 1860-61 were discovered in 1899 and sold to a syndicate.

New Foundland—1857-63 sets.

Nicaragua—There were remainders of first issue, both perforated and rouletted. All Seebeck issues.

North Borneo—1886-92 were sold both unused and cancelled to order.

Norway—Quantities of many stamps was sold in 1888, but the following stamps were the only ones that any large quantity was sold: 24sk. brown of 1864; 2sk. yellow of 1867; 1sk. green; 2sk. blue; 4sk. mauve and 7sk. brown of 1872. There was an even half million of each. 2,633 3sk. rose of 1872 and 1,411 4sk. blue of 1867 and quantities of from 8 to 629 of other stamps were in the lot.

Nova Scotia—An unknown quantity of stamps of the 1860-4 issue were found among government papers and sold some years ago. No 5c. were found.

Nyassa—In 1899 a large lot of the 1894 issue was offered to dealers. There were from 11,000 to 31,000 of of each value, with a total face value of \$16,000.00. They were bought for \$3,000.00 by a Paris dealer.

Oldenburg—Comparatively small numbers of the 1862 were sold to dealers when stamps of this country became obsolete.

Paraguay—1870 1c. and 1884 issues. Have no reliable data.

Parma—The 1859 Provisional Government issues; quantities were small.

Peru—A large quantity of stamps were offered to highest bidder, May 31st, 1897. There were very few of some stamps, ranging from four upward, and the entire lot of each stamp was offered as a lot; the list would occupy three pages of this paper and I only give the numbers where there were over 500 in a lot: 1c yellow, black triangle 39,560; 1c yellow, Chil-

Porto Rico—A large stock of remainders were sold in Paris a couple of years ago. What they were, I have been unable to find.

Prince Edward Island—1865-72 issues, quantities were comparatively small.

Prussia—1861-67 issues; there were no large quantities except of 1 sg. rose, 2 sg. ultramarine and 3 sg. bistre of 1861-65 issue.

Romagna—599,400 stamps were forwarded to Turin when stamps of Romagna became obsolete; they were thrown on the market later. I have no data as to quantities of each value.

Roman States—When these stamps were superseded in October, 1870, by the stamps of Italy, large quantities of 10 and 20c perforated were sold to the dealers.

Roumania—1862-66 issues, quantities were small except 30 pa. 1862, 20 pa. 1865, 2 pa and 20 pa. 1866.

St. Christopher—(See Antigua).

The numbers are as follows: 36,821 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 42,631 1d; 13,944 $2\frac{1}{2}$ d; 29,122 4d; 2,505 6d; 1,580 1 sh., and 8,000 post-cards. The 4d, 6d and 1 sh. News-surcharged St. Christopher Revenue and the 1d, 3d, 6d, 1 sh., 5 sh. St. Christopher surcharged Saint Kitts Nevis Revenue remainders were sold in 1897 to an English dealer.

St. Helena—In 1895 9,600 6d green surcharged 1 sh. were sold by the Crown Agents; March 15, 1898, the following were sold to the highest bidder by the Crown Agents: 208,320 surcharged in words, half-penny, green; 142,560 surcharged in words one penny, red; 34,080 surcharged in words, two pence, yellow; 104,400 surcharged in figures, $2\frac{1}{2}$ d, blue; 75,840 surcharged in words, three pence, purple; 82,800 surcharged in words, four pence, brown; 18,120 surcharged in words, one shilling, green; 5,328 surcharged in words, five shillings, yellow; 58,400 6d. and 72,690 $1\frac{1}{2}$ d 1890.

Salvador—1867-74 and the Seebeck issues.

Samoa—The remainders of the 1877-81 issue were sold to Whitfield King & Co. in 1884 and consisted of 22,500 1d, 13,500 2d, 2,500 3d, 6,000 6d, 800 9d, 1,500 1 sh, 550 2 sh, and 750 5 sh.

San Marino—The remainders of the Commemorative Stamp of 1894 was sold in 1901. Numbers not known.

Saxony—1863 issue. Small quantities of 3 pf., 1851 and $\frac{1}{2}$, 1, 2, 3, 5 and 10 ngr. 1857 were offered in 1890 and in 1897 the same were still offered except the 10 ngr.

Schleswig-Holstein—1864-66 issues.

Servia—1866-94 issues sold at different times: have no reliable data.

Spain—Some of the values of 1854, 1857, 1859, 1860, 1862, 1865, 1869, 1870-72, and are always found cancelled with a bar.

Stellaland—All remainders were sold to Whitfield King & Co. Quantities must have been small.

Surinam—The government offered in December, 1898, a few sheets of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ on 50 of 1892; they were nothing but printer's waste.

Switzerland—1881 full set, were all surcharged "Ausser Kurs."

Tobago—March 20, 1900, the following postage stamps were sold to the highest bidder; 10,927 $\frac{1}{2}$ d green; 2,833 1d rose; 6,989 $2\frac{1}{2}$ d blue; 4,775 4d gray; 3,941 6d orange; 7,553 1 sh. ochre; 9,489 2d registration envelopes and 12,000 postal cards. The following revenues were sold at the same time: 1,924 1d; 7,184 3d; 7,800 4d; 847 6d; 4,073 1 sh.; 6,400 5 sh.; 5,534 1 pound.

Trinidad—22,606 Postal Cards of values of $1\frac{1}{2}$ and 2d and reply cards were sold to highest bidder in 1900.

Two Sicilies—Sicily 1859 issue; Naples-Sicily 1861 issue. Numbers were small.

Venezuela—Almost all the stamps were offered at different times; have no date. Private advices from Germany show there is a big deal on the string now. The 1896 map set has been thrown on the market in the last few months.

Virgin Isles—(See Antiqua). Numbers were as follows: 17,364 $\frac{1}{2}$ d; 38,969 1d; 100,007 $2\frac{1}{2}$ d; 8,746 4d; 6,408 6d; 3,801 1 sh. and 3600 1 and $1\frac{1}{2}$ d post-cards.

NOTES.

There are also small quantities of some British Colonials, mostly printer's waste, etc., thrown on the market at various times from 1887 to 1894 by employes of the stamp printing firms. The list is long and the numbers of each few. And then there are the Seebecks' like the poor, always with us. All unused are, and we regret to say many of the unused ones come under the head of remainders.

Branca Bros. of Italy, have just sent back to this country 20,000 of their proprietary stamp. Will the Government buy them back; I hope so.

And, then there is our Government's brilliant deal in Periodicals. Remainders and reprints all rolled into one. It was enough to make the stamp collector take to the brush.

German States.

Apropos of Wurtemberg's discontinuance of its postal issues April 1, it may be interesting to the readers of the I. P. to know the dates of the discontinuance of the stamps of the other states.

In 1866 Hanover became a province of Prussia and therefore discontinued its stamps; the Duchies of Schleswig and Holstein were annexed to Prussia in the same year and their stamps were also superceded by those of Prussia.

On July 1, 1867, the monopoly possessed by the Counts of Thurn and Taxis, who had control over those small states, and free cities not having their own postal systems, was ceded to Prussia, the stamps of Prussia being used thereafter.

In 1867, Hamburg acquired Bergedorf; its stamps were succeeded by those of Hamburg.

January, 1868, the following stamp issuing states and others joined their postal systems under the name of the North German Confederation: Bremen, Brunswick, Hamburg, Lubeck, Mecklenburg-Schwerin and Mecklenburg-Strelitz, Oldenburg, Prussia and Saxony. The stamps of these various states were succeeded by those of the Confederation. The only states not joining in the Confederation were Baden, Bavaria and Wurtemberg.

In 1871, the German Empire took over the management of the postal system and its stamps superceded those of the Confederation January 1, 1892. Baden joined its postal ad-

ministration to that of the Empire at that time and its stamps became obsolete.

April 1 of this year, Wurtemberg became a part of the Empire, postally, thus leaving Bavaria the only German state enjoying its own postal system and stamps.

NOTES.

Most of our readers are doubtless familiar with the special envelopes used by the Dead Letter Office for returning misdirected or unclaimed correspondence, each bearing a geometrical figure in black at the upper left-hand corner. These are adopted to facilitate the business of the office and save a second examination of the contents in case the letter should be again sent to the Dead Letter office, which happens every day in vast quantities. The *circle* shows that the letter was opened at the Minor Division, and contains no enclosure. The *triangle*, Returning Division. The *square*, Property Division, containing money, etc. The *six-pointed star*, Minor Division, special.—R. S. Hatcher, Am. Phil.

The highest value postage stamp in use in Germany is 5 marks (\$1.25), in Austria 4 kronen (80c), in Belgium 2 francs (4c), in Russia 7 rubles (\$3.85), in Great Britain 5 pounds (\$24.25), in France 5 francs (\$1.00), in Italy 5 lire (\$1.00), in Spain 10 peseta (\$2.00), in Portugal (1000 reis (\$1.00)), in Japan 1 yen (50c), in Norway 2 krona (54c) in Sweden 1 krona (27c).

in Holland 5 gulden (\$2.00), in Denmark 100 ore (27c), in Turkey 50 piastres (\$2.50), in Brazil 2000 reis (60c), in Greece 10 drachmas (\$2.00) and in the United States \$5.00.

Wise and Otherwise.

The 4c Pan-American has been discovered with the center inverted. Government officials report only one sheet issued that way, and claim each stamp was surcharged with the word "specimen," but copies have been seen without the surcharge. Inverted copies of the 5c and 10c are possibilities.

The first law regarding registered letters was passed March 3, 1855, and provided for a registration fee of 5c.

Labuan is an island with an area of about 30 square miles, situated about 6 miles northwest of Borneo in the East Indies. It was acquired in 1846 by Great Britain and has been governed by the British North Borneo Co., since 1890. It has a population of about 6,000. The capital is Victoria.
