Members receive a rubber stamp with their number and the Bulletin of the Club. Members are only obliged to answer cards received from other members, the stamp of the Club being placed in the upper left-hand corner on the address side of the cards sent out as a means of identification. While it is not absolutely necessary to write your name and address on the cards you send out, as every member has a list of all the members with their numbers, we deem it advisable to do so, as the Bulletins sometimes go astray in the mails. All members are requested to answer cards received from other members as quickly as possible and any member not receiving an answer within a reasonable time should report the facts to the secretary who will inquire into it, but members should take into consideration the time taken in transit as it takes about forty-five days each way from New York to get answers from certain parts of Australia.

In sending cards to countries where the English language is not spoken, French is the language universally understood and should be used if possible, but those members who have no knowledge of French should make use of the words and phrases that appear in another part of the Bulletin and which will be added to from time to time, and which will be found ample to make one's self understood. In publishing the names, members who collect certain kinds of cards and those who desire them from certain countries will be allowed to state so in an announcement of not more than ten words exclusive of their name and address. Those who are making a general collection should simply have their names and addresses published. Collectors of stamps are requested to make use of the Small Announcement Column.

TO COLLECTORS

When sending a number of cards out the words "Post Card" can be crossed off and the words "Printed Matter" substituted therefor and the cards can be mailed to foreign countries for one cent, but nothing more than the name and address should appear on the reverse side. This will amount to quite a large sum when a number of cards are sent out.

English collectors should not write on the address side of the cards they send to the United States as this is a violation of the United States Postal Rules and such cards always arrived surcharged 6 cents which is hardly over the value of the card.

Post cards can be sent around the world on a two-cent stamp if the cards are directed to yourself care of some collector who you can request to redirect it to some other collector you know of. As for instance, a card sent from New York is directed to yourself care of John Smith, Melbourne, Australia, with the request (on the reverse side of the card) that he redirect it John Brown, London, England, and with the request that John Brown redirect it back to you in New York. The time occupied by a card sent like the above is about four and a half months.

NO EXCHANGE

TO COLLECTORS

When sending a number of cards out the words "Post Card" can be crossed off and the words "Printed Matter" substituted therefor and the cards can be mailed to foreign countries for one cent, but nothing more than the name and address should appear on the reverse side. This will amount to quite a large sum when a number of cards are sent out.

English collectors should not write on the address side of the cards they send to the United States as this is a violation of the United States Postal Rules and such cards always arrived surcharged 6 cents which is hardly ever the value of the card.

Post cards can be sent around the world on a two-cent stamp if the cards are directed to yourself care of some collector who you can request to redirect it to some other collector you know of. As for instance, a card sent from New York is directed to yourself care of John Smith, Melbourne, Australia, with the request (on the reverse side of the card) that he redirect it John Brown, London, England, and with the request that John Brown redirect it back to you in New York. The time occupied by a card sent like the above is about four and a half months.
