It makes no difference to us whether the collection sent us is worth \$100 or \$5000, but it is understood that we run no risk of loss in transit.

Parties having small lots of coins of uncertain value to sell should send us rubbings or lists of them from which we can usually tell if it would be worth while for them to send them to us.

City Express Post, Washington City, Overtons, Priests, Roches, Russells, Snows, Staten Island, Steinmeyers, Stringer and Morton, 3d Avenue, Union Post, Walton and Co, Whartons, Whittelseys, Williams, Wood and Co.

We needed it specially just now to advertise our new Stamp Catalogue, and to answer for a price-list to those who send a stamp for that purpose.

During the past year the business in coins and other curiosities has been rather dull compared with former seasons, and we find a majority of the heaviest collectors are desirous to sell, but unwilling to bear the expense of a public sale, which eats up from one-fourth to one-third of the expenses. As an instance, at the last coin sale, the proceeds of which were less than \$1,000, after the owner had spent months of time in preparing the manuscript, the Catalogue cost him \$160, besides the auctioneer's fees of ten per cent. We think there is a growing propensity to neglect dealers, to the great detriment of collectors. A dealer can afford to sell good collections for ten per cent., and ought to be able to get auction prices on the average. If some dealer who had the public confidence would enter the lists, and give those who wished to

sell a chance to do so without such a ruinous loss, we think collectors would be greatly encouraged and the trade revived.

In postage-stamps, the trade has far exceeded our expectations. Although many dealers have started up all over the country, there has been business enough for all, the prices of stamps have greatly increased, and multitudes are added to the number of collectors every year. Very few of the leading collectors are willing to dispose of their albums unless at an exorbitant price, knowing that the old issues are constantly becoming more difficult to obtain, and where a dollar was formerly looked upon as a very high price for one stamp, from five to ten dollars is now frequently realized, and we have sold two within a year at twenty-five dollars each.

We understand that in Europe there has been a *furor* lately for revenue stamps of all kinds. In this country, the demand for foreign and U. S. government revenues has kept up, but the private match and medicine stamps, except the very rarest, which we have sold as high as two dollars, are in very little request. The demand for local stamps, Northern, Southern, and Western, is as great as ever, rarities often bringing five, ten, and fifteen dollars each. They always bring more when preserved on the original envelope, or, in case this cannot be saved entire, with enough to show the postmarks.

CONFEDERATE PROVISIONALS.

For some time past there has been a great demand for all kinds of literature published at the South during the late war of 1861, 1862, and 1863, single copies of newspapers bringing from \$1 to \$5 each, pamphlets and books selling at exorbitant rates, and the postage stamps issued at that time have been still more eagerly sought for. Of the regular series of Confederate stamps, there is only one which may be considered rare, that is, the small size ten cents blue with the head of Davis and value spelt in words; but some of the Provisional stamps issued by the postmasters of some of the principal cities for local use, being found very scarce, bring the highest prices of any known stamps.

We give in this column illustrations of six varieties of these stamps. Of the Livingston only two copies are known to exist, and of the Greenville only one. These would probably bring at auction from \$25 to \$50 each; the others, although valuable, are not so rare, but all of them would bring from \$5 upwards. The following towns all issued stamps during the war: Athens, Baton Rouge, Charleston, Columbia, Fredericksburg, Greenville, Knoxville, Livingston, Lynchburg, Macon, Madison, Marion, Memphis, Mobile, Nashville, New Orleans, Petersburg, Pleasant Shade and Rheatown, and all, except the New Orleans and Memphis, are rare, and bring from \$5 upwards.

There are many of these stamps lying on envelopes in files of letters at the South, and it will pay well those who have the facility to look them

up. We have bought a great many during the past year at from \$4 to \$10 each, and shall be glad to purchase more. They should be preserved on the original envelope, or at least with enough of it to show the postmark. Parties sending them to us should always register.

There is a much larger number of them, and many that are quite common, such as Boyd's, Hussey's, etc., which are scarcely worth saving, but there are also many, such as Browne's city post, Browne's Easton despatch, Bronson & Forbes, Cheever & Towle, City despatch (head of Washington), Carrier's, Gordon's, Honour's, Jefferson Market, Martin's, Overton & Co., Priest's, Penny post, Price's (small), Russell's, Snow's, Steinmeyer's, Teese & Co., U. S. P. O., Washington City, which are very difficult to obtain, and bring, especially on the original envelopes, from \$3 to \$15 each. There are also many of the franked envelopes of Western express companies in the territories which bring as much.

We have at our store a great many things which it is impossible for us to advertise in the country, as it would interfere too much with our other business. REVENUE STAMPS.

For the past three or four years a great many collectors of postage stamps have kept also as far as they could obtain them, the Revenue stamps of all nations, and we consider them of nearly equal interest. Our own government has recently discontinued the use of all but the small values, we shall not in this short article discuss its propriety, but it is certainly the least expensive method of taxation ever adopted.

Although far less prepossessing in appearance than our own the revenue stamps of Great Britain are more practically useful, being printed in colors that are destroyed by acids, the use of which has been a source of great loss to us.

Postage stamps being cancelled with ink containing oil, anything that will efface the postmark destroys them, while revenue stamps of fast colors cancelled with ordinary writing ink can be easily cleaned and regummed so as to pass the most careful scrutiny.

One great reason which prevents the collection of revenue stamps is the want of suitable catalogues and albums. We have had so many calls for a catalogue that we have commenced one several times, although it would necessarily have been very incomplete, for no one seems to have any idea of their number. We give a schedule of our own collection of 1187 varieties of fiscal and telegraph stamps, not including shades of color, which we think comprises about half the real number.

United States, old issue unperforated 54, perforated 99, new issue 47, Matches 78, Proprietary 139, Cards 9, Sew. M. Co. 32, California 28, do. round 52, Nevada 7, Alabama 1, Canada 53, do. Law Stamps 20, do. Reg. 3, Nova Scotia 14, Austria 98, Antigua 7, Brazil 7, British Guiana 1, Bolivia 2, Belgium 5, Bremen 6, Ceylon 1, Cape of Good Hope 16, Cuba 21, Denmark 8, Dutch Indies 1, French 33, Finland 3, Great Britain 90, German 33, Hong Kong 4, Hungary 17, Italy 53, India 20, Jamaica 3, Lombardy 4, Mauritius 1, New South Wales 6, New Zealand 4, New Granada 1, Natal 3, Prussia 9, Peru 14, Portugal 31, Queensland 3, Russia 3, Switzerland 38, Sts. Settlements 1, Saxony 6, Sweden, 1, Spain 20, Tasmania 5, Turkey 6, Uruguay 2, Venezuela 1. We could have stated a much larger number that we have heard of in other collections, but think the above will be more useful, as it describes those which are most practicable to obtain.

Some of these are of superior execution and the most delicate colors, often excelling the postage stamps of the same country. Prominent in this respect are those of Canada, Antigua, India, Cuba and Turkey. The greatest variety is displayed in our own Match and Medicine stamps, which will always be of great interest for their

curious designs. We have also a collection of 90 varieties of Tobacco and Liquor stamps, but do not consider them of much interest. Some one has facetiously remarked that the more fashionable way to collect the latter is to preserve them on original barrels in the cellar.

N. B. Some people think the stamp fever is dying out, we wish they could look into our store to day, Saturday, Dec. 7th., for while we are writing this article our clerks are waiting on 13 boys, all eager to exchange their currency for stamps.

It seems to be a matter of surprise to many people where we obtain all our stamps. If we were to depend entirely on those brought into our store by boys who get them from the letters of business houses in our emporium, we should lose two thirds of our trade. We are constantly sending gold to all parts of the world for unused stamps and exchanging with other dealers, besides the collections which are sent or brought to us for sale, and every once in a while buy out some dealer, last year we bought out the stock of Messrs. C. and H. Gloyd, the well known dealers of Manchester England, now dry goods merchants in Burlington, Colorado, for \$1000, and seldom a week passes that we do not pay out from \$50 to \$100 for stamps and coins. We are now offering our stamps cheaper than ever before, as we wish to continue to reduce stock until the first of April, when we shall stop buying, until then we shall be glad to purchase all good stamps as heretofore. Parties out of town having collections to sell should always write a letter of enquiry before sending.

We receive a good many letters from boys who in their haste omit to sign their names. Always give the full address each time on the same page with the letter, and it is best when sending money or stamps to keep a record of the exact date, as we keep all our correspondence on file, those without signature are marked unknown, and any enquiry with regard to a previous letter of a certain date received by us, can be answered at once, otherwise we have to wait for a leisure day to attend to it.

We have had such a great demand for the Third edition of our Catalogue, that although we printed 2000 copies we have none left. Our Fourth Edition, thoroughly revised and improved, with prices changed to correspond with the market, will be ready Feb. 1st. 1873, and sent post-paid on receipt of FIFTY CENTS. The above are illustrations of six of the Provisional stamps issued by the Confederate postmasters in 1861, in the states of Va., Tenn., Ga., La., Ala., and S. Carolina, of which the following are all that are known at the present time:

Athens 5 cents (2 colors), Baton Rouge 5c., Charleston 5c. and Envelope stamp 5c.(5), Columbia Env. 5c. (2), Fredricksburg 5c., 10c., Greenville 5c., Kingston 5c., Knoxville 2c., 5c., Env. 5c., (4), Livingston 5c., Lynchburg 5c., Macon 5c., Madison 3c., Marion 5c.(2), 10c., 15c., 20c., Memphis 2c., 5c., Env. 5c., Mobile 2c., 5c., Nashville 3c., 5c.(3), 10c., New Orleans 2c.(2), 5c.(3), Petersburg 5c., Pleasant Shade 5c., Rheatown, 5c., Uniontown 5c., in all 49.

All of the above except the Memphis and New Orleans are now in such great demand for collections that we have bought great numbers of them at from \$3. to \$10. each, and shall be glad to purchase more, especially those of Madison Fla., Greenville and Livingston Ala., for one of the latter we gave a boy last summer \$20. There are plenty of these stamps on old letters in the South, and those boys who have the facility, would find it profitable to make search for them. When found they should be preserved on the entire envelope, or at least enough to show the whole postmark, we always give 50c. more for them in this way.

The ordinary Confederate stamps with the heads of Davis, Madison, Washington and Jackson are hardly worth saving except those of the large size, for which in good order we are paying ten cents each. There are a great many imitations of these stamps, especially in the collections of boys in the Northern states. Genuine ones should be sent in Registered letter and we will

remit by P. O. order if our offer is accepted.

There are also a great many of the local Express or Despatch stamps used by various mail agents from 1845 to 1850 which bring from \$1. to \$10. each, but since we have advertised for them have had so many Boston counterfeits sent to us, without any stamp to pay the return postage, that, although we are glad to buy them if real, we must insist on a three cent stamp being sent with them. We also do considerable trade in the franked Envelopes of Express Companies in the Western territories, some of these bring from \$3 upwards.

REDIVIVUS.

IN the last issue of this journal, published January, 1873, we informed our readers of the suspension of our business in stamps and curiosities, and engagement as printer in Yokohama, Japan. We returned last month, having been over two years in that country, but did not find the demand for job-printing as great as we had anticipated. The Japanese Government and native printers, having bought a great many of our printing-presses and commenced manufacturing type, are able, on account of the cheapness of native labor (about twenty-five cents per day), to print at so low rates that it hardly pays a foreigner, except in charge of newspaper-offices, where the profits arise from advertising, to spend his time.

During the last three years business in Yokohama has been so dull that merchants from abroad have very few of them been able to pay expenses, the market being overcrowded with European goods, and only a very few commission agents and teachers, etc., receiving salaries from the Government, are really making a profit.

We found the Japanese, although until so lately secluded from foreigners, a very ingenious people, much neater in their habits than the Chinese, and having a great taste for curiosities of every sort, which will be seen by the exhibition of bronzes, porcelain vases, lacquer ware, etc., which we saw them forwarding to the Centennial. They are also very rapidly adopting the improvements and customs of Europeans; and, although these are restricted to a very few places in the empire, we hear by our last advices, dated Yokohama, March 8, 1876, that it is expected that Tôkiô, the capital city (formerly called Yedo), will shortly be opened to foreigners for residence.

We collected a large quantity of coins, illustrated books, pictures, and other curiosities, but, having sent them by sailing-vessel around Cape Horn, they will not probably arrive until June, when we shall exhibit them for sale.

As a residence, however, we did not like the country, the people generally being very poor and the houses small, only a few temples here and there, when filled with worshippers, being worth seeing, and business being carried on in such an old-fashioned, slow-coach way that we are glad to return to this busy, bustling metropolis, and to our old business in curiosities, which we commenced sixteen years ago, and hope once more to receive as liberal a patronage as we have had from our customers in past years.

We found that the removal of the Post-Office to the City Hall Park necessitated a change of locality, and we have chosen our present place in the Park Building, No. 145 NASSAU STREET, with entrance also at 37 Park Row, opposite the new Post-Office, as a central position, being about one block from the terminus on the New York side of the Brooklyn extension bridge, and handy for people calling at the Post-Office to drop in.

We do not intend to neglect our business in postage-stamps and coins, but shall somewhat extend that in curiosities, especially in books, paintings, engravings, etc.; for these we have engaged the services of William Erving, Esq., formerly bookseller at No. 28 John Street.

We must apologize at the commencement for the limited variety of curiosities we have to offer for sale, having sold out everything except a portion of our postage-stamps when we discontinued our business, and shall be especially obliged to our old friends if they

will give us a chance to purchase whatever they have in our line, and hope soon to have our usual complement.

We publish a list of what we have on hand in the way of postage-stamps, which, as they are so few, we offer at very low prices, and hope soon to purchase enough more, including new varieties, to issue another edition of our Descriptive Price Catalogue.

During our absence, owing to the illness of the person with whom we left the charge of winding up our accounts, a few persons who were in our debt, not receiving replies to their enquiries, have failed to pay us the amounts due, which we hope they will now do at once, and be ready to help us during the present centennial campaign.

STAMPS ON APPROVAL.

WE are unable in this number to make out our usual list of packets and cheap sets of used stamps, but will issue them simultaneously with a new edition of our Descriptive Price Catalogue, which we expect to have ready in time for the July Centennial.

At present our stock is in a very disorganized condition, almost entirely lacking in new issues, but we are purchasing largely every day, and hope soon to be able to fill out orders from Catalogue as well as we have done in years past.

Until then we shall continue the plan adopted in our circular of April, 1873, of making up sheets of used and unused stamps of which we have a surplus, at much less than catalogue rates, and sending them on approval to those of our customers with whom we are acquainted through former business transactions, and also to new parties who furnish satisfactory reference.

These sheets of stamps for selection have 48 on each, ranging in price as follows: 1 cent, 2c., 3c., 4c., 5c., 8c., 10c., 15c., 20c., and 25 cents; also sheets with miscellaneous higher-priced stamps.

Those who have heretofore acted for us in that capacity will please let us know immediately if they wish to continue to do so; otherwise we shall be liable to appoint others in their place.

It is not necessary to send us the amount for these in advance. We send with them an invoice bill, showing the amount sent, which should be returned with the stamps not wanted and money for those kept. Where the value of the letter is over \$3, to avoid danger of loss, it should be registered at our expense. In sending cash have it in as few pieces as possible, with unused United States postage-stamps of low values instead of cents. RARE U. S. COINS OF 1785.

Among the coins we have recently added to our stock is a silver coin, milled edge, intended for a U. S. quarter dollar. On one side is a seated female figure holding scales, liberty pole and flag, legend "Immune Columbia, 1785"; on the other an eye surrounded by rays and stars, "Nova Constellatio." Of this interesting coin of *Free America* only five are known in silver, and one in gold, which is in the mint cabinet. The same coin is also found in copper, one variety having a star at the right of the word "Constellatio" and period at the left.

The other coin is in copper, on one side an Indian holding a bow and arrow and stepping on a skull, legend *Americana, Inimica Tyrannis*, on the reverse 18 stars surrounded by circle and rays, "Confederatio 1785." Both of these coins are now very scarce, the silver one was obtained in the way of business a few days ago by a Wall street broker.

OUR COTEMPORARIES.

We have been pleased to receive from all quarters journals similar to our own, ranging from one quarter to four times our size, mostly intended for the various branches of Curiosity collectors, and many of them published by boys. The increase of this class of papers within the last few years has been very rapid, and from their contents we perceive that the rising generation is being early instilled with the mania for Curiosities.

Thus it has always been, in newly settled countries people have to work hard to build houses, roads and bridges, break up the land, fight with neighboring provinces, construct machinery, shipping and manufactories, and have little time for literature and the fine arts, but as they become settled and the mantle of antiquity falls over their early history, up springs the Antiquarian; at first regarded as a lunatic, hoarding up old pennies, letters written by the founders of the state, (as if they contained the recipe for elixir vite!) copies of crumbling epitaphs, (doubtless required as a model for his own rude portraits and drawings of dilapidated houses, temples and forts, and holding mysterious conclave with old grandmothers about the pedigree of their family; then follows the lover of art, with his stately mansion, costly paintings, and elaborately carved furniture; of literature, with his library of books, magazines and periodicals; of nature, with his collections of minerals, fossils, shells, plants and insects; and of science, with his telescope, microscope, and study of the wonderful.

At this stage our nation has arrived, and let no collector of natural, historical or scientific mementos be considered engaged in a foolish pursuit, for it is by means of the preservation of a knowledge of the past that we accelerate our progress in civilization, and the collection of any thing that requires study adds to the attractions of home, and to our love of country and distinguishes us from the roving barbarian.

We annex a list of thirty journals we have received during the past year which relate wholly or in part to curiosities, and know there are many others, which if sent us in exchange we shall from time to time be happy to notice; an article in one paper says that "about 800 American youths are engaged in the business of Amateur journalism." Persons sending a stamp to the publishers of any of these will doubtless obtain a sample copy if still in existence.

RARE U. S. COINS OF 1785.

Among the coins we have recently added to our stock is a silver coin, milled edge, intended for a U. S. quarter dollar. On one side is a seated female figure holding scales, liberty pole and flag, legend "Immune Columbia, 1785"; on the other an eye surrounded by rays and stars, "Nova Constellatio." Of this interesting coin of *Free America* only five are known in silver, and one in gold, which is in the mint cabinet. The same coin is also found in copper, one variety having a star at the right of the word "Constellatio" and period at the left.

The other coin is in copper, on one side an Indian holding a bow and arrow and stepping on a skull, legend *Americana, Inimica Tyrannis*, on the reverse 13 stars surrounded by circle and rays, "Confederatio 1785." Both of these coins are now very scarce, the silver one was obtained in the way of business a few days ago by a Wall street broker.

OUR COTEMPORARIES.

We have been pleased to receive from all quarters journals similar to our own, ranging from one quarter to four times our size, mostly intended for the various branches of Curiosity collectors, and many of them published by boys. The increase of this class of papers within the last few years has been very rapid, and from their contents we perceive that the rising generation is being early instilled with the mania for Curiosities.

Thus it has always been, in newly settled countries people have to work hard to build houses, roads and bridges, break up the land, fight with neighboring provinces, construct machinery, shipping and manufacturing, and have little time for literature and the fine arts, but as they become settled and the mantle of antiquity falls over their early history, up springs the Antiquarian; at first regarded as a lunatic, boarding up old pennies, letters written by the founders of the state, (as if they contained the recipe for *elixir vitae*) copies of crumbling epitaphs, (doubtless required as a model for his own) rude portraits and drawings of dilapidated houses, temples and forts, and holding mysterious converse with old grandmothers about the pedigree of their family; then follows the lover of art, with his stately mansion, costly paintings, and elaborately carved furniture; of literature, with his library of books, magazines and periodicals; of nature, with his collections of minerals, fossils, shells, plants and insects; and of science, with his telescope, microscope, and study of the wonderful.

At this stage our nation has arrived, and let no collector of natural, historical or scientific mementos be considered engaged in a foolish pursuit, for it is by means of the preservation of a knowledge of the past that we accelerate our progress in civilization, and the collection of any thing that requires study adds to the attractions of home, and to our love of country and distinguishes us from the roving barbarian.

We annex a list of thirty journals we have received during the past year which relate wholly or in part to curiosities, and know there are many others, which if sent us in exchange we shall from time to time be happy to notice; an article in one paper says that "about 100 American youths are engaged in the business of Amateur journalism." Persons sending a stamp to the publishers of any of these will doubtless obtain a sample copy if still in existence.

Canada used Revenue stamps first in 1864, when *Bill and Tobacco* stamps were issued by the Dominion government. In 1876, when the Supreme Court was established, the General government assumed the supervision of gas administration and of the correctness of weights and measures, and issued *Supreme Court, Weights and Measures* and *Gas Inspection* stamps.

Besides these stamps of the Dominion Government the Quebec Provincial Government issued two series of Law and Law Registration stamps, and one series of Assurance stamps; the Ontario Government issued two series of Law Stamps, and the Manitoba Government a series of Law stamps.

It is contemplated to introduce the word "Canada" on the Gas and W and M stamps, either by surcharging them or making new plates.

TOBACCO STAMPS.

Duty on Tobacco in Canada was first imposed in 1864, under Act of 27th & 28th Victoria, Chapter III. To designate the tobacco on hand at that time, which was exempt from tax, a provisional stamp was used, diamond-shaped, and printed in GREEN, with D in angles for *dutiable* and M for *manufactured* tobacco. The first labels used to indicate the payment of tax on tobacco were similar to the above printed in BLACK or RED for EXCISE, or duty on home manufactured, and BLUE for CUSTOMS, or duty on imported tobacco; the colors of the stamps being a distinctive feature denoting the use to which they are applied.

The stamps in BLACK are used on tobacco sold direct from the factory. When the manufacturer makes up a large stock for which there is no ready market, and does not wish to pay the duty long in advance of its sale, he is required to send it to the Government warehouse, where it is stored at trifling cost, and may be removed whenever a market is found by paying the duty, the stamps for which are RED.

Following the above, which we call the GARTER SERIES, came small lozenges, and ribbons with lozenges printed in centre, which appear to have been used contemporaneously with the garter series for several years.

These comprise the early issues of the Canada tobacco stamps, which are now very difficult to obtain in anything like fair condition, especially the ribbon stamps, as they were made of very thin paper, and glued on in a way evidently not intended to accommodate stamp collectors, and require patient soaking with warm water to get them off entire. The Canadians themselves seem to have entirely neglected until the past year, these interesting mementos of their own country, but through the enthusiastic efforts of a gentleman of this city, who has ransacked the Dominion to obtain a collection of them, we are able for the first time to give a description of these rarities, which we are satisfied is very nearly complete.

These early issues were followed by the more elaborately engraved stamps in present use, consisting of a set of diamond-shaped stamps with the Queen's profile at the top; a set of ribbons with the Queen's head over a central medallion; six oblong stamps with figures of weight at sides for packages up to 15 lbs. weight; rectangular stamps marked "CADDY" for packages of from 15 to 60 lbs., and "BOXES" for over 60 lbs., and a small "CUSTOMS" stamp for parcels of imported tobacco.

Throughout the various series all stamps are found in red and black for Excise, and in blue for Customs, except that several of the styles used for Excise are not used for Customs, such as the "Ponnds" series, and the "Caddy" and "Boxes" stamps. In two or more instances an error has been produced by the engraver inserting "Excise" in a "Customs" stamp.

In the description of the stamps, the year in italics shows the earliest date we have seen of that variety.

Those stamps which have the color in italics we have not seen, but presumptively, they exist.

Our prices are for entire used stamps in fair order, for unused we usually charge an advance, and for damaged stamps a lower rate. Those priced in italic figures we have not in stock.

List of U. S. Stamps for tobacco, spirits &c.

In 1864, stamps were first issued for tobacco, which was then taxed 16c. per lb for cheap smoking tobacco and 32c. for snuff and all tobacco above \$1 per lb, the rate being afterwards changed as shown in the list.

We have lately seen an old tobacco caddy marked with stencil: "B. E. Rooker, U. S. Tobacco Inspector 3d. Dist. Va. July 15, 1866, 40 cts. per lb. in Bond."

Stamps for cigars were also issued in 1864, the rate of tax then being \$3 per 1000 on those valued at \$5 and increasing in proportion to the valuation. For inspecting and stamping the boxes the inspectors were paid 25 cents per 1000 until 1868, when the stamps were sold direct to the manufacturers. In April 1865 the tax was made uniform at \$10 per 1000, in Sept. 1866 reduced to \$4 with 20 per ct. ad. val., in March 1867 increased to \$5, and in March 1875 to \$6.

The figures at the end of the line show the relative degree of rarity of the stamp, 1 representing the most common, and 9 the highest rarity. We have seen those only with the figure of rarity in Roman figures, but those in Italics we suppose to have been issued.

Since the U. S. Govt. in 1875 recalled all the prior issues, many of the older stamps have become quite rare, some of them being valued at from \$5 to \$10 apiece. We shall be grateful to any one who will give us a description of any not mentioned in our list and will give \$5 for one of the brass Cotton stamps in good order. In using this as a check list draw a line under or around the figure showing the rarity.

Collectors of U. S. Coins have long needed a price current in condensed form, which we now undertake to supply. We do not keep all these coins in stock, but have most of the cheaper ones such as the cents and half-cents, and will try to obtain rarities when desired. Relics of the Southern Confederacy.

To those of us who have reached the period of middle life, no event in the history of our nation seems of greater importance or of more thrilling interest than the three years spent from 1861 to 1864 in the struggle for the preservation of our Federal Union. To us it seems but yesterday, but to the rising generation something in the historic past, a knowledge of which requires the study of books.

To those of Antiquarian taste what are the mementos which will give us a vivid recollection of one of the most desperate wars of modern times? For literature we have a few Reports, Novels, Schoolbooks, pamphlets and newspapers printed on primitive-looking paper; but when we search for the money of the Confederacy a wide field opens before us, whatever else they might lack, this was in plentiful abundance, in lieu of the precious metals, the less costly paper promises to pay—"Six months after the ratification of a treaty of peace between the Confederate States and the United States" spread themselves before us in great variety, bearing the portraits of the most noted generals and emblems of the Confederacy.

Although towards the end of the war its actual value became a question of doubt (\$500 or more being the price of a pair of boots) yet it was the flowing current which maintained the southern troops until they yielded to the superior hosts of the greenback. When our troops took possession of Richmond, Charleston and the other cities of the south, vast quantities of the Confederate Notes, Bonds and Postage stamps were taken possession of, most of which were burned or turned over to the paper mills, but a great deal has been preserved, and now comprise the most interesting relics of the great rebellion.

Within the last few years the number of collectors has greatly multiplied, while the difficulty of obtaining scarce notes has proportionately increased. In Europe also they are eagerly sought for, and some which when current would hardly buy a loaf of bread have sold for upwards of \$100. The first notes issued in 1861 were engraved by the National Bank Note Co. of this city, and are fully equal in execution to our own. They comprise four notes all of which are highly prized and very scarce, especially the \$500. Two others made by the Southern Bank Note Co. of Richmond early in 1861 are also finely engraved, after which the standard greatly deteriorated, those of July 25th, 1861 especially, appearing like a cheap lithograph. A few varieties of notes were imitated at the North and sold largely as facsimiles, but are easily distinguishable when compared with the genuine.

In making a collection of Confederate currency, a more or less comprehensive plan may be chosen. It may be considered sufficient simply to take one of each design, which would number about 50 notes, by adding those of different dates about 60, or including the same notes engraved by different firms about 120, while a complete collection with all the different series and letters would contain nearly 2000. The most complete catalogue which has been issued is that of Mr. Hazeltine, we have thought best to avoid confusion by conforming our Index Nos. with his; by an examination of our own stock and the assistance of Mr. Gill and others we have made some additions, and given all the serial letters in full, so that collectors can use this as a check list, the utility of which we presume will be at once apparent. Our list of bonds we know to be very incomplete, in

another edition we hope to extend it.

Besides the regular issue of the notes and bonds of the Confederate government there are a great variety of notes, bonds and fractional currency, issued by the different Southern states during the war, which will be catalogued at some future time.

Having lately purchased the stock and business of Mr. Bechtel and added it to our own, we now have the largest assortment of Confederate money in the world, and are desirous of purchasing collections or any scarce or fine notes that will add to our stock.

We give our selling rates for those we have, our prices are for good clean notes, in many cases quite uncirculated, poor specimens being worth much less.

In ordering from our list, give the Index No. with price, and enclose 10 cents extra for Registration, otherwise they will be sent in ordinary letter at purchaser's risk. Confederate notes being signed with a pen, cannot be sent by third class mail.

THE ANTIQUARIAN.

The reader will probably say "This does not refer to me, but to some hermit who has stowed away in a garret or in old chests a lot of musty parchments, bags of ancient coins, or perhaps mummies, old armor and such trash." But this is looking altogether too far from home, there are scarcely any of us who are not more or less antiquarians.

The taste for mementos with old associations is instilled into us from our earliest recollection. The child hears from its mothers lips, "This was grand-mother's rocking chair," or "that house was our old home," and thus we are filled with the inspiration of antiquity. As we advance in years the desire to know more of our early history and of the world we live in increases, and every production of nature or art becomes of interest in teaching us what has been done in the past, and what may be done in the future.

We first acquire knowledge through our organs of sense, and from our parents and companions, after that from books and the examination of everything within our reach. From books alone especially when illustrated, we can obtain information of nearly everything, but it requires the actual examination of a large variety of objects to give us a practical knowledge. Suppose we wish to study Geology or Botany how much faster we progress when we are able to examine the rocks or the plants themselves, either in their natural state or made up into a collection.

Whoever has commenced such a collection though it be only dried leaves, shells, or even a few pictures or items of interest cut from newspapers, has commenced to be an antiquarian, and to this class of persons we owe all that we know of our past history. But there is a great difference among collectors, all do not deserve the same credit. Some make a collection because it is something they are investigating, and hope by comparing notes with other collectors to obtain a full knowledge of, and perhaps make new discoveries. Some collect paintings, engravings, statuary, a library of books or some class of curiosities, hoping to develop in their children a taste for literature and art. Either of these objects are praiseworthy, while others collect simply for the amusement of acquisition, their chief pleasure seems to be in getting something better than any one else has. Even these however are harmless people for they soon tire of their collection, and then it is divided among those who will make a better use of it.

In searching for relics of antiquity the earliest traces we can find are minerals, fossils and shells. Through these we are able to discover the different stages our planet has passed through since its formation, which is a very interesting study, but not so important as the history of our race, of which the oldest records we have are parchment histories, traditions, monuments and ruins covered with inscriptions; some of the Egyptian hieroglyphics being 3500 years old.

Approaching this remote period we have the use of coins for purposes of exchange in place of the more awkward method of exchanging one commodity for another. From that time to the present nearly every

country in the world has had its coinage and a good collection shows in a striking manner the degree of prosperity and civilization to which they attained.

There is something very fascinating about the collection of coins. Here we have in small compass something used by our fellow men as money even 2000 years ago. Perhaps we go to Asia ourselves and discover it among the ruins of Antiquity. We regard it with reverence and carefully preserve it for posterity. In modern coins too there is much of interest. We study history, and coins show us the portraits of kings, queens and emperors of whom we have read and the emblems of their nation. In our own country we have the Pine tree money of Massachusetts in the 16th century, the Colonial coins issued by the several states shortly after the Revolution, and the unbroken line of the mint coinage from its establishment in 1793. We do not however always show improvement; of the coins in current use the cent alone is equal in beauty to our earliest coinage.

The modern substitution of paper representatives of coin value, makes them also of interest to collect. We have in the United States, the Continental paper money of the Revolution; the local bank notes from 1815 to 1861; the notes and bonds of the Confederacy; the northern shipplaster currency of 1861 to 1863; our convenient but now discarded Fractional currency, and last of all and most useful to the collector, for he can easily exchange them for any of the others, the greenbacks of Uncle Sam.

Within a few years has sprung up what might be considered a new phase of coin collecting: the mania for Postage and Revenue stamps. Like coins they have portraits of reigning sovereigns, the emblems of the countries they represent, in our own the portraits of our most illustrious men, and have on them a money value, so that compared with modern coins there is hardly any choice which to collect. They have however some advantages over coins, having a great variety of color, are more portable, less expensive, and not so liable to be stolen.

In studying the early history of our own country we find it involved in mystery. Indian tradition gives us but little light and it is only by the study of mounds and their contents that we can hope to solve the problem. There was a sort of grandeur about the Indian before his contact with Europeans. Roaming over the country in tribes, engaged in continual strife, using only implements of wood and stone, and building high mounds or tombs for the burial of their chiefs, they lived a wild, free life, and soon all traces of this great nation, except the books written about them, and the axes, pipes and other relics saved in collections, will be swept away.

There is one other class of objects which have an interest for collectors, that is something characteristic of a great person, or one who has filled an important station in life, and which comes direct from them, such are Autograph letters, they not only preserve many points of history, but enable us to form a clearer idea of the person who wrote them, and please our fancy with the idea that we have in our possession something that once belonged to them.

SHORT HAND WRITING.

Is that one of your curiosities? Yes but it should not be so, for in a few years it will probably be the only method in which people will think of writing, for the present style is altogether too slow and should be classed with the hieroglyphics of antiquity. A swift writer in longhand writes from 20 to 40 words per minute, while in shorthand a skillful penman will write from 100 to 200. About a year ago we commenced in leisure moments to practise shorthand and found it very interesting and its practicability and usefulness only limited by the number of persons who will use it. To learn to write shorthand is the work of a day or two, but to write swiftly and well requires time and patience.

If with one grand sweep we could get rid of our present cumbersome method and use shorthand in its place, the labor of literature would be reduced one half. We hope this time is not far distant, for the number of persons learning shorthand is every day increasing. Many schools have introduced it as a part of their course and soon no one will be considered educated without a knowledge of it.

People have generally supposed it was only useful to those who wished to become reporters, but there is scarcely any one who has any writing to do to whom it would not be a benefit. Lecturers and clergymen use it to great advantage in writing their speeches and sermons, and it is useful for briefs, diaries and private memoranda of all sorts. Lawyers and business men have their amanuenses who write from dictation in shorthand, and afterwards copy them out in longhand. If they understood the art themselves they could write their letters as fast as they could dictate.

We use it in our business for keeping accounts, fling away letters, and minuting on letters received proper replies for our clerks to send to correspondents. But where two people who write often to each other both understand it, there the great advantage is at once apparent, and if it was only universal, writing letters would be nearly as easy as talking. It is difficult to get grown people to change a method they have all their lives been accustomed to, even if it does save half the time; but as our business is very largely among young people we have thought best to give a page of our journal to recommending this branch of education, hoping our correspondents will write to us in it instead of in the old method.


Shorthand writing was practised in the time of Julius Caesar, but has since then been greatly improved. There are now several popular methods, all of which are founded on the system of curves and dashes invented by Isaac Pitman of Bath, England in 1837: among these are Phonography, from *phono*s (sound) and *graphie* (writing); and Takigraphy, from *tachy*s (rapid) and *graphie* (writing). Both of these are written phonetically, that is from the pronunciation of the words and not from the spelling. Yellow would be written with the letter signs for y-e-l-l-o, thus saving all the silent letters.

We prefer Takigraphy to any of the other systems for several reasons. It is easier to learn, not requiring such a stretch of memory in recollecting so many combinations as the others; it is not necessary to

pay any regard to position on the paper, and when written by different persons, the writing is more nearly alike, and consequently more easily read.

The great difficulty with most persons in acquiring shorthand is that they have a little time to spare, advance a short distance in the art, and are then interrupted, which usually results in forgetting all they have gained, while in Takigraphy there are two styles of writing either of which as they are attained can be turned into practical use. One is the Simple style in which nearly all the words are written out in full, which can be learned in a few days, and is capable of being written at the rate of 120 words per minute, the other is the Reporting style, which is a more contracted form of the Simple style and containing many word signs; thus the shorthand letters t-a-k-g compose a word sign for Takigraphy, this can be written at the rate of 200 words per minute. We present to our readers the Alphabet of Takigraphy, any one can see that it is much easier to make a straight or curved line than any of the letters we now use, some of which like the letter m, require six movements.

In writing, the consonants are joined together into words with the emphatic vowels inserted, while the short vowel e as in met is usually omitted. For illustration here are the lines: — "My country, 'tis of thee; Sweet land of liberty;" written in Takigraphy, the first cut shows them in the Simple style with each letter written

 out in full, while the second cut shows the same lines in the Contracted or Reporting style; to those who have had experience in the art either is equally legible.

Shorthand may be studied out from the text books, though of course one would learn faster to take lessons of a teacher, and in learning the Reporting style this is indispensable. We have made arrangements with the author of Takigraphy, (D. P. Lindsley), Editor of The Takigrapher and Rapid Writer, to supply his books, and should any one wish personal instruction either by mail or otherwise will refer them to him.

For the Simple style there are two text books, the Elements and the Manual, either of which teaches the art, the Manual is rather the easier of the two, and for the Contracted style we have the Note Taker, which should only be studied after one has become proficient in the Simple style.

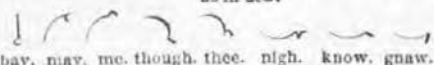

NOW FOR STAMPS, BOYS!

We have been neglecting you in our publications for the past year or two, but in the present No. we hope to make amends by giving two whole pages to cheap sets of stamps, they will be found much lower in price than when ordered from Catalogue, which we have not as yet found time to publish. When ordering, carry out carefully the number and price of each set wanted and where the amount sent is over a dollar it is better to enclose it in Registered letter. Unused U. S. stamps taken in pay for small sums. All applications for price lists, letters of enquiry or orders under 25c. should contain stamp for reply.

We are still doing a large business from our approval sheets, which we send out for selection to reliable parties. Our agents too, have found it very profitable and we are always willing to add to their number in towns not already canvassed.

RARE LOCALS.

In the first volume of the CABINET we gave a list of the U. S. locals, but since then have seen and heard of many additional ones, and our present list numbers 363 varieties, which is probably about half the real number issued. Some of these are quite rare and valuable, and it will pay those who have access to old letters written from 1845 to 1860, to look for them. They are worth more when preserved on the original letter sheet or envelope, as that fixes their genuineness beyond question.

These stamps were issued by carrier companies in the different towns until they were mostly broken up by the P. O. department for encroaching upon their prerogative, and their collection would be very popular were it not for the endless variety of imitations which have been made. Still there are quite a number of collectors who prize them, and we often sell rarities at from \$5 to \$25 apiece. Many of these stamps are now to be found in stampalbums throughout the country, and as we have a very fine collection both of genuine and counterfeits, we are willing to examine any that may be sent to us either for inspection or sale, and to purchase or exchange for any we have not a stock of at liberal rates.

We quote our selling rates for those we have on hand, which are priced in Roman figures, and give in Italic figures as nearly as we can ascertain the market value of others, of which the value is continually fluctuating as new lots are discovered.
