NEW INDOOR GAME

ARCH-BOARD

THIS will be found a very amusing pastime and through its adaptability to both sexes is suitable for parties etc.

The construction of the Arch-board is so simple that every lad is enabled to supply himself with one. In order to accomplish this, first obtain a board about 3-ft. 6-ins. by 1-ft. 6-ins. and surround same by a rim about half an inch in height. At one end of the board, about six inches from the extremity, should be placed a piece of wood from side to side across the board with holes in the form of arches cut through it large enough to allow a ball, which will also be required, to pass through

them. Between the bridge and the top of the board separate compartments should be constructed, one to each arch in the bridge, and of these there should be about nine. In order to give this a neat appearance it should be covered with green baize. On the bridge over each arch, there should be placed a name such as, - Rose, Queen, Prince &c. this may be done by neatly writing or printing the names on small pieces of paper and pasting one over each arch. The players should agree in number with the arches, one of which will be allotted to each player, who will be distinguished by the name over his or her arch. Only one ball is required which, should be of ivory or some other
