Barrel Post-office in Mid-Ocean.

About 600 miles west of Ecuador, on the equator, lie the Galapagos or Tortoise Islands. A barrel anchored securely off the shore serves as an international post-office. It has neither postmaster, regular mails, stamps nor appropriation—just an old barrel placed there by the British government for the reception of mail by passing ships.

And yet two letters have recently been received at Washington, D. C. from the barrel post office and will be duly forwarded to the persons addressed.

Having been written in October, 1905, and being rather the worse for weather and insects, these letters will probably have more interest as curiosities than as news.
