Collectors of stamps were unknown until about 1851.

THE postage stamp longest in use, and still in use is the five pence of New South Wales.

§  
Siam and Persia are almost the only countries in the Orient where the pictures of the rulers and great men put on their postage stamps. Orientals, as a rule, have an aversion to having themselves pictured in any form whatever.

The first annual convention of the Mich. Philatelic Society was held on the fifth of August.

Brazil has a new 40 reis card and a 200 reis letter card, both with the current stamp. The former is green and blue on buff, and the latter orange, black and blue on purple. back is white, with blue ruled lines.

Italy issued a 10 cent card for the exposition of arts at Venice. Only 21,000 have been issued, and the price is already five times the face value. It is not likely our collectors will get many of these prizes, except at an even greater premium.

The Columbian stamps seem to be the only U. S. stamps that will bring higher prices here than they will at home.

The originator of the Universal Postal Union was Mr Eugene Boral. He was born in 1835, appointed head of the Swiss post in 1872, and died in June, 1892.

§

The Post Office at Boston was the first to adopt the cancellation stamp in the representation of a flag. Chicago copied the design six months later and then came Washington.

§

We see by the Golden Days that the Naples stamps of 1861 with the head of Emanuel inverted, came from factory of M. Matraire, who contracted for the stamps. Upon his death, all the remaining stock, as also all values and rejected stamps, were sold to collectors and dealers

§

We see by the Post Office, that the Auckland Philatelic Society has been organized, and has also held its third meeting. At the first meeting, the following officers were elected;

There are over fifteen shades of the three cent 1861 U. S. but the shades of the 2 cent carmine almost reach infinity.

Yet we are bound to recognize the stamps as varieties

§

C n a 10 cent carmine, has been found on laid paper and is among the rarities across the line.

The dark vermillion shade is the rarest of the shades of the Interior department stamps.

Deep purple, those of the Justice department, and rich green of the State department. Water is very apt to fade the War and Navy stamps.

§

The stamps of the Corrientes were prepared from wood blocks ordered by the governor, Justo J. Urguza in the early part of 1856. Eight different blocks were engraved.

§

Judging from what we have seen, the interest taken in collecting U.S. envelopes seems to be on the decline. Envelopes hardly ever bring catalogue prices, while the other issues often bring more.

## CLIPPINGS.

In looking over an exchange circuit recently it was made plain why the sales from the books was often very small.

Scores of badly damaged stamps, priced anywhere from five cent to two dollars were attached, and while a good discount from catalogue price was offered yet the condition of the specimens would mar the beauty of any collection were they admitted.

Many collectors have an idea that if a large corner or other part of a stamp is gone, fifty per cent. off will affect a sale, but the instances I feel sure are extremely rare, collectors in these days being well aware that condition is

everything, and to believe that they will pay dollars for a badly damaged stamp is putting a low estimate on their intelligence.

The small or pocket edition of Scott's new catalogue is an exceedingly handy volume, and as the price in cloth covers is only fifty cents, this size should have a large sale, it being convenient to take to auction sales or carry about for any purpose.

The pages are identical with the larger edition, only reduced by the photographic process leaving the type and illustrations a little smaller.


